The 2024 trout season officially opens

Temperatures in the 30s failed to deter fishermen from showing up for the opening day of Trout season March 1 at Bennett Spring State Park.

The Missouri Department of Conservation reported that 2,034 tags were sold on opening day. This includes 1,870 adult tags and 164 child tags. Last year, the park reported total tag sales of 1,662 on opening day.

In addition to the cold, anglers also had to deal with the current construction at the park, which caused a portion of the fishing area to be closed to fishing and public access for the foreseeable future.

MDC staff emphasizes the area closed to fishing in Bennett's Zone 1 and 2 represents a small fraction of the approximately 1.5 miles of stream frontage within the park that is open to fishing. MDC staff say they understand the connections some anglers have with specific spots that are currently closed.

"One thing that makes Missouri's March 1 trout opener special is tradition. Some people have fished at the same spot for generations," MDC Infrastructure Management Branch Chief Jacob Careaga is quoted as saying in a Department of Conservation press release. "We know that and we appreciate everyone's patience with this construction project. The work currently underway will result in a state-of-the-art fish production facility that will be able to better serve the needs of everyone who loves catching trout at Bennett Spring."

This closed area stretches from the hatchery intake on the west bank downstream to the Highway 64A stone bridge. As a result, there will be no access to the top of the dam.






Anglers enjoy fishing on the first day of trout season at Bennett Spring State Park.

and site resiliency.

Fish availability will not be affected by the construction.

Approximately 6,500 trout were stocked on opening day to accommodate the nearly 2,000 anglers expected. Because of the disruption the construction has caused to fish production at Bennett Spring hatchery, trout from other MDC hatcheries are being transported to Bennett to support stocking activities on opening day and throughout the year.

"Trout production in MDC's cold-water hatchery system is a unified effort," said MDC Hatchery Systems Manager, Clint Hale. "Fish, eggs, and fingerlings are routinely transferred between hatcheries to meet fish production and stocking needs. When there's a shortage somewhere, one or more of the hatcheries always step up to fill in the gaps. Because we have dedicated staff, our hatchery system has worked well, even when there has

been incredible adversity, and it will continue to do so."


In addition to providing recreational activity, trout produced by MDC for fishing at Bennett Spring State Park also provide economic benefits. Each year, 140,000 people fish at Bennett Spring. These anglers are part of the more than two million visitors the park gets annually, and the economic ripple effect all this activity generates in terms of money spent on meals, lodging, gas, etc. Data from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service indicates that money spent on trout fishing in Missouri generates more than \$187 million in economic impact each year.

Trout fishing at Bennett Spring has a history dating back to the early 1900s. Currently, MDC manages the hatchery and trout fishing at Bennett Spring State Park. The state park facilities are managed by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources.





Bennett Spring exhibit to showcase agriculture in April

Bennett Spring State Park's history is deeply rooted in agriculture. To celebrate the joys and heartbreak of Missouri's agricultural heritage, the park has set aside the month of April to focus on this history.

The traveling exhibit "Deeply Rooted: Stories of Missouri Farming," produced by the Missouri State Museum, will be available for viewing at the Bennett Spring nature center Wednesday through Sunday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in April. This traveling exhibit covers a wide range of topics from prehistoric agriculture to modern gardens.

According to Missouri Grown USA, Missouri's top crop production today is soybean and corn, which contributes \$88 billion to the state economy. However, the main agricultural use at Bennett Spring State Park during the past century has been the raising of trout. The Bennett Spring Fish Hatchery was

once privately owned; around 1900, the Neosho National Fish Hatchery stocked 40,000 trout into the spring. Today, the hatchery is operated by the Missouri Department of Conservation and is under renovation.


Prior to Missouri purchasing the land, the area that currently comprises the park was known as the town of Brice. Farmers living in the area would have grain processed at the town's mill and often enjoyed outdoor activities like fishing while waiting for services to be rendered. 
