PC women - 6 All-Americans

CORALVILLE, Iowa – The Presbyterian College women's wrestling team finished off a marvelous 2025 season last Saturday night with eight of their 14 qualifiers advancing to the top 12 of the NCWWC National Championships. When the dust cleared, PC garnered a school-record six All-Americans and a sixth-place team ranking (the program's highest in history).

After claiming the Southeast Region title for the first time two weeks ago, the Blue Hose sent three wrestlers to the National Semifinals in Iowa and found their highest-ranking placer in true freshman Carina Giangeruso who nabbed 4th. Regional Coach of the Year Brian Vutianitis has directed his squad to a school record in three consecutive seasons at this tournament (which encompassed 61 other institutions), climbing from 9th place in 2023 to 8th in 2024 and now a 6th-place finish on the grandest stage this year. plaudits as rookies since 2023.

- Going the furthest of the 14 qualifiers that made it to Coralville, Giangeruso concludes her debut year in a Blue Hose singlet with an individual record of 33-5.

- Coach Vutianitis' program continues its ranking among the country's best, steadily rising up the ladder with each

Hutchinson Signs Pro Contract with MLS NEXT Pro's New England Revolution II

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. - Presbyterian Blue Hose men's soccer forward Damorney Hutchinson signed a professional contract with the New England Revolution II, an MLS NEXT Pro team.

Hutchinson was the 2024 Big South Offensive Player of the Year. He was also a First Team All-Big South selection. This past season, Hutchinson set the program's Division I era records for goals (12) in a season and a career (19). Hutchinson finished the season seventh in the nation in goals per game at .80. The St. Thomas, Jamaica native scored seven goals against Big South competition. For his stellar play last season, he was the Top Drawer Soccer's National Player of the Week on September 17 and a two-time Big South Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16 and Oct. 7).

In the 2023 season, Hutchinson garnered the Big South Newcomer of the Year award while being a First Team All-League selection.

- Sean Hollister shut down Wofford in the seventh and eighth innings before Jacob Fields slammed the door in the ninth, earning his third save of the season.

He shot 43 % from the field, averaged 2.2 assist per game, 3 steals per game, made 68% of free throws attempted, 30% of 3-point shots and was third in rebounding for the Raiders.

The senior Raider led the team is scoring averaging 14.4 per game for a total of 346 points, shot 44% from field (while being battered by multiple defenders usually), averaged 12.7 rebounds per game (305 total), 1.6 blocks per game (caused a lot more shots than that to be altered) and shot 53% from free throw line.
