

KENT COUNTY POETRY FESTIVAL RETURNS

The 16th Annual Kent County Poetry Festival will be in Chestertown on April 4 to 6. This year's featured poet is Denise Duhamel, a Guggenheim and NEA Poetry Fellow, and National Book Critics Circle Award Finalist.

The festival starts Friday with a Poetry Jam hosted by Queen D, featuring special guest Maryland Poet Laureate Lady Brion and featuring a live band at 7 p.m. at Garfield Center for the Arts (free admission at the door; sign up online to participate).

Saturday will feature a Walking Eco-Poetry Workshop with Austen Camille at noon at the Lawrence Wetlands Preserve (online preregistration required).

Saturday night is the main event: Denise Duhamel's Keynote Reading and Conversation with NPR's Maureen Corrigan at 7 p.m. at Garfield Center for the Arts (online preregistration required).

Sunday will feature the annual Poetry Open Mic for the general public, from 2 to 4 p.m. at Robert Ortiz Studios (free admission at the door; sign up online to participate).

Snic the River: CHESTERTOWN TEA PARTY FESTIVAL





The Chestertown Tea Party Festival welcomes all this Memorial Day Weekend to celebrate Kent County's historical roots and Colonial resistance to British rule.

History notes that, in response to the British Parliament's closing the port of Boston, the citizens of Chestertown met in May of 1774 and wrote a series of "Resolves" forbidding the import, sale or consumption of tea (since tea usually came from English trade) in Chestertown. But local legend goes further, suggesting that residents then gathered in town, marched down High Street to the brigantine Geddes anchored in the Chester River, and tossed her cargo of tea overboard. The annual reenactment of that local story is the centerpiece of today's Chestertown Tea Party Festival.

The festival kicks off Friday, May 23, with a Block Party at Wilmer Park. This free and local favorite brings out everyone to celebrate the start of an amazing weekend in town. Buy food from a food truck, let the kids play games, and dance to a live band. Domestic and craft beer, hard cider and wine will be available for purchase.

Saturday festivities are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., starting with the popular Colonial Parade, complete with fife and drum groups and marching bands.

Visitors can enjoy more than 100 craft vendors, plus plenty of local food options—from crab cakes and barbecue, to fried fish, burgers and tasty sweets.

The Heritage Village features skilled artisan demos, like colonial rope making, ice cream making, woodworking and more curiosities from an era before America's Industrial Revolution.

Children's activities typically include puppet shows, colonial games, crafts, storytelling, music and face painting.

Reenactors and musicians stride the streets and add to the 1700s spirit of the day. Walking tours are also offered.

On Sunday, the festivity continues at Wilmer Park from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., with live music, food trucks, craft vendors and plenty of fun for families: a Punch & Judy show, instrument making and face painting. The Beerfest (ticketed, starts at noon) adds to the festivities with drinks, food, music and dancing.

The infamous Raft Race starts Sunday at 2:30 p.m. on the Chester River, so arrive early to witness the race handmade watercraft, made of non-nautical materials. In this offbeat event, teams compete for different awards in their not-so-sleek racing machines. The coveted Tea Cup, the race's highest honor, is awarded to the raft with the best synthesis of creativity, engineering and speed. Other prizes are good-spirited, like the Fabulous Flotsam Award, presented to the raft more likely to cause a spectacle than win the race.

Downtown parking is available, but can be a challenge, so free traffic shuttles will carry people from several major parking areas throughout town. Pets are prohibited at the festival, by town ordinance. Picnic blankets and chairs are welcome, but please do not bring tables, canopies or tents.





Anglers set sail with the Smith Island Fishing Tournament

The Smith Island Fishing Tournament, founded in 2022, celebrates the culture of this iconic Chesapeake Bay community. The fourth annual tournament launches on May 16 to 18.

This year, proceeds benefit the Smith Island Fire Departments, the first responders and their equipment, dedicated to saving lives and preserving historical sites and buildings.

This three-day day tournament has prizes for the top "Smith Island Slam," which is a three-fish stringer of red-





fish, rockfish (striped bass) and spotted seatrout (speck). The longest aggregate length of all three will win.

Cash prizes will also be awarded for the longest: redfish, rockfish, spotted seatrout, oyster toad, fish caught from a kayak, fish caught by age 17 or under, and fish caught and submitted by a woman (18 and over).

The weekend includes a Competitor Welcome Reception (food and drinks on the new marsh overlook) and ends with an Awards Ceremony, both on Smith Island.

Consider staying on Smith Island for the tournament itself, with plenty of inns and boat docking.

AMC AVIATION SUMMER CAMP

In Dover, Del., the AMC Museum's educational summer camp is for children interested in aeronautics and the U.S. Air Force. The campers will discover the history and science of aviation while applying STEM principals. Learn to fly in a simulator, pre-flight an actual aircraft, and take flight with a Certified Flight Instructor aboard a Cessna 172 from the Dover AFB Aero Club. Easterseals Camp Fairlee, near Chestertown, Md., is one of the only camps in the region that provides a typical overnight camp experience for children and adults with disabilities. Camp Fairlee provides a safe and accessible camp experience for guests to have fun, make friends and meet new challenges acquire new skills, under the guidance of trained and qualified staff. While campers enjoy their time at Camp Fairlee, their families are able to take a break from caregiving.

Sessions range from 6 to 12 days during June 22 to Aug. 31. Activities include arts & crafts, music, sports, games, swimming, hiking, canoeing, hayrides, campfires and more, led by a staff of trained professionals and college students. Camps generally have a 3:1 ratio of campers to staff, but 2:1 and 1:1 opportunities are available.

Camp New Hope is a two-day summer day camp for children and teens ages 6-17 who are coping with the loss of a loved one. 

"When John comes back from Camp Fairlee, he is more independent. The skills he learns there translate when he comes home."

While campers rely on Camp Fairlee for adventure and independence, parents and caregivers depend on Camp Fairlee for high quality, professional services for their loved one, so they can also rest and recharge from daily caregiving. Each year camp counselors receive intensive training to ensure the health, safety and well-being of the participants. "Camp Fairlee is a place for people with disabilities to explore their independence in a supportive environment surrounded by peers. It's exciting to watch campers do things they've never done before," said Sallie Price, Director of Recreation and Respite Services.

This is a residential camp that provides an unforgettable experience for people of all ages with disabilities. During a typical summer camp session, guests enjoy activities including climbing tower, ziplining, swimming, walking trails, horseback riding, canoeing, kayaking, arts & crafts, fishing, culinary programs, pottery, nature programs, campfires and so much more.

Currently, Easterseals Camp Fairlee is re-designing their pool and bathhouse for summer 2025. The new pool will provide additional safety and accessibility features such as 4 feet depth, zero entry ramp, chair lift & nonslip protective surface coating for all access areas. The new bathhouse will incorporate a shaded area for fragile campers. "We appreciate people in the community who are invested in Camp Fairlee. The renovations help camp to be more accessible. They make the stay better and safer for John," Lisa says. "We are so grateful."

Summer 2025 will also include a new Sensory-Friendly cabin which will vary from the current cabin design to accommodate campers requiring more intense physical, sensory or behavioral support.

"Our new pool and sensory-friendly cabin will create decades of memories for current and future campers," said Easterseals President/CEO Kenan Sklenar. "It is thanks to our community partners we are able to continue to provide innovative services to our community."

What was once a private house, a pointed display of wealth and a place of slavery is today a wide, open, free and public park for all to visit.

Guided by volunteers, history buffs and the local government park service, Pemberton Historical Park is a fascinating 262-acre place of exploration. Just minutes from busy US Route 50 in Salisbury, Md., the manicured lawn and historic buildings are surrounded by endless, forested walking trails, peaceful streams and the meandering Wicomico River. Pemberton Hall is rich in history. Designed as a 1741 display of wealth, the plantation house's main room alone is larger than many Eastern Shore houses of the time—including the likes of the homeowner's own childhood home. Isaac Handy was a socio-economically-mobile landowner who eventually had fields, orchards, distillery and a riverfront landing to sell goods.

After much revamping, the park was created in the 1980s to blend history and nature. Amenities include 4.5 miles of trails, outdoor amphitheater, fresh water ponds, catch-andrelease fishing, public restrooms and several picnic areas—all across multiple landscapes of field, forest, tidal and freshwater ecosystems.

Walking the trails on a Friday afternoon was Brenda Parks, a local who enjoys walking with her miniature Schnauzer, named Zoe.

"It's pretty, it's calming, and she likes it!" Parks said, smiling at the small dog. Nature clearly makes people and animals happier. "When you go back home after being outside, seeing nature, it makes it a little bit better, I think," she mused.





The park is managed by Wicomico Recreation, Parks & Tourism, with support from the not-for-profit Pemberton Hall Foundation. Starting in May, the main hall and nature center will have weekend hours. Look for special events, like live music concerts and the 5K marathon. Private tours and venue rentals are available by request.

Admission is free. Hours are dawn to dusk. This is for day use only, not camping. Please respect park rules, including equestrian areas, dogs on leashes, no bikes. Bring insect repellent, sunscreen and water when planning an outdoor excursion.


