Greer's getting ready for move to new location

Greer's CashSaver Cost Plus is gearing up for the grand opening of its new location, 21951 Alabama 59, Suite D, the former location of Winn Dixie.

The Greer's family will host a ribbon cutting with the Central Baldwin Chamber of Commerce on Wednesday, June 27 beginning at 10 a.m. and will be running specials to

coincide with the move.

On Monday, June 18, the Robertsdale City Council voted unanimously to recommend the approval through the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board of the transfer of Greer's retail beer and table wine license to the new location.

Officials said Monday that Greer's planned to close its

liquor store at the old location with no plans to re-open, so only needed to transfer the beer and wine license.

Greer’s CashSaver Cost Plus will be taking over the former Winn

Dixie location after Southeastern Grocers announced in March that they would be closing 94 stores in seven states, including three Winn Dixie stores in Baldwin County and one in Mobile.

The announced closings included Winn Dixie stores in Daphne, Gulf

Shores and Robertsdale in Baldwin County, along with Mobile’s Schillinger Road location. It was also announced in March that the Orange Beach location of Winn Dixie would become a Rouse’s Market.

The closings include 57 Winn Dixie stores, 10 in Alabama. Other locations closing include Anniston, the Bessemer Road location

in Birmingham, three locations in Dothan, Monroeville and the Atlanta Highway location in Montgomery.

All of the planned closings were carried out by April 30.

Founded by Autry Greer in 1916 with the first location at the corner of Water and St. Michael Streets in Mobile, the Greer family has maintained ownership

through five generations currently operating 30 supermarkets with more than 700 employees in Alabama, Mississippi and Florida.

Greer’s also has locations in Bay Minette and Fairhope in Baldwin County, along with a location just across the Alabama/Florida border on Lillian Highway in Pensacola.

While another retail

store chain announced in March that it would be taking over the Winn Dixie store in Robertsdale, it was later discovered that it had been outbid by Greer’s and plans got underway to move that store’s Robertsdale location approximately a quarter-mile to the south.

The former Greer’s location in Robertsdale will soon become the fourth Greer’s Ace Hardware Express location, with additional locations in Mobile, Bay Minette and Quitman, Mississippi.

In other business June 18, the council:

- Approved plans to host the Second Annual Hub City Classic 10K Run Feb. 9 at Garrett Park in Robertsdale (with a rain date of Feb. 16). The run benefits the Jace Waters Foundation. Julie Waters told council members that the first run was a success and they would like to make it an annual event.
- Authorized city engineer Greg Smith to solicit bids for sewer flow monitors for the city’s sewer system.
- Authorized the disposal of equipment and remodeling actions for the Diamond Property, located off of Fairground Road behind Robertsdale High School. Part of the action included rezoning the property from business to industrial.

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What a Prayer Should Be

In Ephesians 6:19-20, Paul says to the Church at Ephesus, “I want you to pray fervently but with something very specific in view. I want you to pray this thing for all the saints, and, particularly, for me: You pray that I will take the gospel to the uttermost parts of the world. You pray that I will take advantage of every opportunity God gives me in the power of His Spirit to change the world with the gospel. That must always be the focus of your praying.”

Prayer must always be about the expansion of God’s kingdom, about the purposes of God to change the world. Go back to the Garden and the purpose of the relationship between God and the first couple: it was to change the world. God said, “I want to bless you, and I want you to be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and to rule over it. We’re going to take this Garden and we’re going to extend it together over the whole world.”

The First Adam rejected that purpose, but the Second Adam restored it. That kingdom-focus is evident in His instructions to us about how to pray: “Your kingdom come, Your will be done.” In Matthew 6, he instructs us

not to pray like the hypocrites and the gentiles. How do the hypocrites and the gentiles pray? They pray with self-focus (which is the sin of the Garden). It’s all about manipulating God to get Him on board with their agenda. Jesus says praying like that completely misses the purposes of God.

Jesus was breathing one prayer: “Not my will, but Yours.” And what was the will of God for Jesus? That the Kingdom would come through His life. In another Garden, with sweat like blood flowing down, Jesus could still pray, “If my death is the means to Your kingdom’s coming, then bring it on.” That prayer must be our prayer as we fulfill the purpose for which God created and redeemed us.

Best races of the year have been for Attorney General and Lt. Governor

The best races of the year have been for Attorney General and Lt. Governor, as well as Agriculture Commissioner and for the 2nd Congressional district.

The Attorney General post is considered the best stepping stone to Governor and U.S. Senator. It is very high profile and prosecutes bad guys who go to jail and cannot vote against you, and you look like a good guy to the rest of the law abiding voters in the state. Therefore, in recent years it has attracted ambitious politicians rather than veteran dedicated prosecutors. These aspirants were novices at being lawyers, much less prosecutors. They sought the position for political posturing rather than the job as the state's top law

enforcer. We have not had a tough former DA since the days of Bill Baxley and Charlie Graddick.

As the race began, there were three major candidates with prosecutorial experience. Troy King had been Attorney General, Alice

Martin had been the U.S. Attorney in the Northern District of Alabama and had handled numerous major high-profile convictions. Even the Bentley appointee, Steve Marshall, had been a district attorney.

Troy King had begun the race as the front runner simply because he had some name identification from having been Attorney General. Early polls showed him with around 27 percent with Martin and Marshall at 10-12 and Chess

Bedsole at 5-6.

The final results wound up mirroring the amount of money spent by the candidates. There was an amazing correlation to money equals media equals name identification, which results in votes. "Money is the mother's milk of politics."

Troy King and Steve Marshall ended up in a dead draw with 28 percent each. Alice Martin got 23 percent and first-time candidate, Chess Bedsole, got a surprising and impressive 21 percent. He got a great vote in Mobile and Birmingham, especially in the silk stocking boxes. His \$1 million media buy did not hurt.

The runoff between Troy King and Steve Marshall will be interesting. Again, it will probably boil down to money. Marshall made the runoff by outspending Alice Martin significantly. He used the

power of incumbency to strong arm contributions. Both candidates will have to go negative. Marshall is more vulnerable. He campaigned for Obama and was a Democrat only a few years ago. He was appointed DA by Democrat Don Siegelman and was appointed Attorney General by Robert Bentley. These are not good calling cards in a GOP Primary runoff. King will be the favorite on July 17.

The winner will not get a free ride in November. The aforementioned Don Siegelman's son, Joseph Siegelman, won the Democratic nomination on June 5 and will be a viable opponent in the Fall.

The Lt. Governor position has very little power. However, over the past few decades the Lt. Governor has risen to Governor quite a few times. Therefore, this race has gotten a lot of

attention from voters and campaign donors. Twinkle Cavanaugh entered the race as the favorite simply because of name identification. Will Ainsworth and Rusty Glover had very little of that. However, Ainsworth came to the dance with the ingredient to buy name ID. Money is that recipe. He had it and he spent it. Twinkle wound up with 43 percent to Ainsworth's 37 percent and Glover's 20 percent.

Twinkle will be a slight favorite in the runoff. However, if Ainsworth spends another million and stays with negative or some say comparison ads, it will be close.

Rick Pate bested Gerald Dial 40 to 30 in the Agriculture Commissioner race despite Dial outspending him with a catchy jingle ad. Alabamians inexplicably have a way of ascertaining who

is the farmer in that race. Pate was the only farmer. The Alabama Farmer's Federation Endorsement helped him in the first primary.

More than 61 percent of the 2nd Congressional District GOP voters voted against incumbent Martha Roby. Bobby Bright may very well win this rematch, which has been years in the making. Bright is well known and liked in the District, especially in the Wiregrass where he was born and raised as well as in Montgomery where he was Mayor for 10 years.

The Legacy Museum: From Enslavement to Mass Incarceration

The Legacy Museum: From Enslavement to Mass Incarceration opened to the public on April 26, in Montgomery. The 11,000-square-foot museum is built on the site of a former warehouse where enslaved black people were imprisoned, and is located midway between an historic slave market and the main river dock and train station where tens of thousands of enslaved people were trafficked during the height of the domestic slave trade.

"As a physical site and an outreach program, the Legacy Museum: From Enslavement to Mass Incarceration is an engine for education about the legacy of racial inequality and for the truth and reconciliation that leads to real solutions to contemporary problems."

The museum and memorial are part of the Equal Justice Initiative's work to advance truth and reconciliation around race in America and to more honestly confront the legacy of slavery, lynching, and segregation. EJI believes that publicly confronting the truth about our history is the first step towards recovery and reconciliation. A history of racial injustice must be acknowledged, and mass atrocities and abuse must be recognized and remembered, before a society can

recover from mass violence. Public commemoration plays a significant role in prompting community-wide reconciliation.

Civil Rights Attorney, Author and Founder/Director of the Equal Justice Initiative, Bryan Stevenson:

Bryan Stevenson was appointed in 1989 to run the United States congressionally funded Alabama operation, a resource center and death-penalty defense organization. In 1994, after Republicans gained control in the mid-term elections, the United States Congress eliminated funding for death-penalty defense for lower income people. At that time Stevenson converted the center and founded the non-profit Equal Justice Initiative (EJI) in Montgomery, Alabama. Stevenson wrote the critically acclaimed memoir *Just Mercy: A Story of Justice and Redemption*, published in 2014 by Spiegel & Grau and spoke to a standing room only crowd at the Fairhope United Methodist Church in November 2016.

Mr. Stevenson was inspired by the Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe in Berlin, Germany, and the Apartheid Museum in Johannesburg, South Africa, to create a single memorial to victims of white supremacy in the

United States. The EJI sites are designed to promote a more hopeful commitment to racial equality and just treatment of all people. "Our nation's history of racial injustice casts a shadow across the American landscape," Stevenson explains. "This shadow cannot be lifted until we shine the light of truth on the destructive violence that shaped our nation, traumatized people of color, and compromised our commitment to the rule of law and to equal justice." Stevenson reminds us that "We are all more than the worse thing we've ever done."

My Experience June 15, 2018:

When I first entered the Museum, I became part a diverse group of visitors who followed the 11,000 square feet of archival displays and technologically innovative and interactive ones which chronicle the long painful history of the treatment of African Americans in this country as it evolved from slavery to the Jim Crow and Segregation Era right up through today as evidenced by our racially biased Criminal Justice System. It is believed that during their lifetime, one in three black men will have spent time in prison.

One of the first exhibits features holograms behind glass partitions: one of an African man,

another of an African woman and another of 2 small African children all who speak of what they are feeling as they wait to be put on the auction block and sold as slaves.

The Story: How Slavery Evolved

"To justify the brutal, dehumanizing institution of slavery in America, its advocates created a narrative of racial difference. Stereotypes and false characterizations of black people were disseminated to defend their permanent enslavement as "most necessary to the well-being of the negro" – an act of kindness that reinforced white supremacy. The formal abolition of slavery did nothing to overcome the harmful ideas created to defend it, and so slavery did not end: it evolved."

Among the many rooms of archival artifacts highlighting in detail slavery's evolution are reminders of the inequity faced by African Africans in our lifetimes from separate bathrooms and water fountains to "their place" in the rear of the bus. In the museum there is a video on the Montgomery Bus Boycott which gave rise to the prominence of Martin Luther King Jr and the Civil Rights Movement. We typically associate the boycott with long time NAACP member and Civil Rights

activist Rosa Parks who was 42 years old when she was arrested on December 1, 1955 for refusing to up her seat on the bus. In the video African American attorney Fred Gray tells of the little known 15 year old African American girl Claudette Colvin and other young students, who were arrested 9 months before Rosa Parks for refusing to give up their seats on the bus to whites. It was Mr. Gray who won the case that resulted in the 1956 Supreme Court ruling that bus segregation was unconstitutional. Rosa Parks who helped organize the 381 day Montgomery Bus Boycott which help launch the Civil Rights Movement died at the age of 92 in 2005 and will forever be known as the "Mother of the Civil Rights Movement." In 2001, Mr. Gray was elected as the first African-American President of the Alabama State Bar.

An interesting interactive museum display simulates a visit with prison inmates who are seated behind glass with telephones used to communicate with their visitors. As a visitor you also have a telephone and are able to hear the inmate speak about when and why they were imprisoned and the conditions of their imprisonment. One of the inmates with whom I "visited" said he

had been just 13 years old when he was first put in prison and that 2 years later at age 15 he was placed in solitary confinement where he stayed for 18 years. He talked of knowing others who had gone mad after 6 months in solitary but that he had been able to find strength from within himself and had spent his time writing poetry. He recited one of his poems which he called "My Day Will Come."

From the Legacy Museum to the National Memorial for Peace and Justice:

As I walked through the Legacy Museum and then on through the Nation Memorial for Peace and Justice, I felt a sense of the sacred - that I was surrounded by sainted martyrs. The Memorial is located on 6 acres and begins with a pathway that leads up a hill where over 800 rusted steel columns are suspended within an enclosure. Each column represents a county in the United States where lynchings took place and each is inscribed with the names of the documented victims which numbers over 4000. Along the path up the hill visitors can read about the origin of slavery in this country, when it was abolished and how it's subtly perpetuated today.

FAIR EXCHANGE IS NO ROBBERY

Assume you get to three notrump as shown and West leads the spade five, very likely from a five- or six-card suit since he is not leading the suit his partner bid. You win East’s king with the ace and return the queen of clubs, which loses to the king. Back comes the seven of spades, and West makes the correct play of letting dummy win with the jack.

You are now headed for defeat because, when you get around to leading a heart to try to score your ninth trick, East takes the ace and returns a spade, and West cashes three spade winners for down one.

What’s wrong with this picture, you might ask? The answer is that you lost the contract at trick one, when you should have ducked East’s king of spades! True, this means that you wind up with only one spade trick rather than two, but in exchange you make three notrump instead of going down. You

lose the first two spade tricks and later lose a club and a heart, but the rest of the tricks are yours.

While it’s granted that it’s mighty difficult to play the spade six at trick one instead of the ace — you’re sacrificing a sure second spade trick by doing so — that’s what you have to do to make the contract.

The clue to the winning play lies in the bidding. East is marked by his opening bid with nearly all the missing high cards, including the ace of hearts and king of clubs. If declarer can dislodge both of these cards without going down while doing so, he can score four clubs, two hearts, two diamonds and a spade.

The lone threat is West’s presumed long spade suit. That threat is eliminated by holding up the ace until the third round. South then takes a club finesse, wins any return and next forces out the ace of hearts to secure nine tricks.

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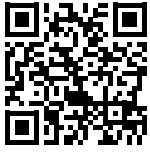

Making the cut to short, summer hair for a good cause

Renee James hair feels a little lighter and her heart is a lot fuller after donating her lengthy locks to ill children.

James donated 15.5 inches of hair to Children With Hair Loss, a non-profit that provides hair replacements for free to children.

She was inspired to grow out her hair after a child at her church was diagnosed with cancer.

"I knew I could pray for her and her treatment and that was easy for me," James said. "Other than that I couldn't physically do anything to help.

"But I thought I can grow my hair and help someone else, that's pretty easy," she said.

James said she set a goal to not cut her hair until the little girl from

her church was deemed cancer free.

This spring the good news came.

"It was super, super awesome news. I still get bumps thinking about it," James said.

The little girl was well again and James was ready to chop off her locks. The process was simple, she said. Her stylist wrapped two hairbands around the top and bottom to keep it from becoming knotted, and cut.

James said she chose the organization Children With Hair Loss (CWHL) because the organization does not charge the children for any part of their services, while some other hair donation companies do. CWHL provides free services and replacements for children with medically related hair loss until age 21.

The organizations said it can cost up to

This year was the 23rd Manning Passing Academy hosted in Thibodaux, Louisiana, on Nicholls State University's campus. Former New Orleans Saints quarterback Archie Manning, former Indianapolis Colts/Denver Broncos quarterback Peyton Manning, and current New York Giants quarterback Eli Manning are the main instructors of the camp as well as oversee the main structure of how the young quarterbacks and other skilled players develop their passing game more soundly.

Coaches and current collegiate players come into this camp as coun-

selor/instructors in developing these athletes.

Among some of the collegiate quarterbacks were Auburn Tigers Jarrett Stidham, Georgia Bulldogs Jake Fromm, Alabama Crimson Tide Jalen Hurts, Penn State Nittany Lions Trace McSorley and many more top quarterbacks in College Football.

There was an overall count of 40 quarterback counselors from the collegiate level with 10 of them coming from the SEC. Each one of the counselors and coaches had a specific drill for the campers to work on such as footwork, eye placement, releasing, arm progression, play reads, explosiveness off the ball releases and more.

Most of the college quarterbacks in the past 23 years have started out as campers and participants of the Manning Passing Academy. A few

have gone on to hone their skills past the high school level and even fewer have gone on to the professional level, whether that is the NFL, arena, or the Canadian league.

The Manning's were impressed with the demonstrating value and the precise instructions displayed by the college quarterbacks. Auburn Tigers QB Jarrett Stidham had the older students where they were in the middle to late end of their high school career. Stidham has been known to bloom with progress like he did last season when playing his first real season of football since transferring from Baylor. When asked about dealing with the unknown certainly of last season to now being a Heisman Trophy hopeful, Stidham said,

"Yeah, I mean it's good to understand how the SEC works. I got my feet wet last year so I kind of know the ins and outs of a season in which the SEC is like. It's a lot more comfort-

able this year."

Stidham is on many sports media outlet's watch list to win multiple awards including the Maxwell Award and the Heisman Trophy. Even as a top-tier college quarterback, Stidham has admitted to the advantage of training every day in order to get better.

"I think that I'm just trying to hone in on my skills every single day and get better in fundamentals and footwork, pocket presence and all that kind of stuff. You can never be too good so I'm just trying to work on everything as a whole," he added.

North Dakota State QB Easton Stick was also in attendance as a counselor for the campers. Stick currently has a 34-3 record at North Dakota State including an FCS National Championship last season since taking over for current Philadelphia Eagles QB Carson Wentz. Easton believes that learning the game of football as well as learn-

ing the position of quarterback is important for these campers as some will go on behind playing the sport of football.

"I feel like at North Dakota State, they teach you the game of football and not just at quarterback but at every position. We are learning the game and I think that's important moving forward whether you continue playing or you get into coaching whatever it is. I just think they provide a good foundation as far

as the game of football and hopefully, that can help me move forward in whatever I'm doing," Easton said.

While some of these campers are highly talented, there will be a large majority of those who will not be playing football at a professional or collegiate level. Teaching and training these campers in knowledge and guidelines is one of the most important structures of the Manning Passing Academy.

There is a free standing steel column dedicated to the thousands of undocumented victims of racial terror as well as a display comprised of a collection of soil samples taken from sites across America in remembrance of the lives lost during the lynching era whose names will never be known.

In addition to the main installation are several emotionally moving sculptures. The one at the entrance points out the disheartening reality of families in chains being torn from one another and sold into slavery. Created by West African sculptor Kwame Akoto-Bamfo it made me think of the current deplorable reality of how our government treats immigrants today.

As I wound my way toward the exit, I was struck by the final work of art, a sculpture titled "Rise Up" It was created by artist Hank Willis Thomas and depicts a group of African American boys with their arms raised in submission to law enforcement. It is a powerful reminder that we live in a culture that consciously or unconsciously views people of color regardless of age with fear and negativity and as guilty just because of the color of their skin. Today African American parents encourage their children to raise their hands in

surrender to law enforcement whether they are guilty of a crime or not for fear they will be gunned down.

What is to be gained by acknowledging our past?

It is my hope and that of others that by acknowledging our past:

We will be encouraged to reflect on racial inequality and the destructive nature of prejudice, discrimination and mob mentality, the vulnerability of our youth, the prevalence of misunderstanding and indifference to the suffering of others and the failure to recognize dangers before it becomes too late in order that we may create plans to take action in response to messages of hate that challenge our communities.

It is my hope and that

We will be reminded that by remaining silent about or indifferent to the suffering of others or to the infringement of civil rights, we may perpetuate these problems.

We will understand that slavery and the subsequent segregation laws were not historical accidents — they occurred because individuals, organizations, and governments made choices that fostered hatred, legalized discrimination, and ultimately allowed mass murder to occur.

can American and other people of color may help us learn to identify early warning signs of genocide.

It is my hope and that of others that by acknowledging our past:

Joe Manjone of Fairhope awarded state citation award

INDIANAPOLIS — The 99th annual National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Summer Meeting will be held June 28-July 2 at the Chicago Marriott Downtown Magnificent Mile in Chicago. The NFHS is the national leadership organization for high school athletic and performing arts activities and is composed of state high school associations in the 50 states plus the District of Columbia.

More than 800 individuals are expected to attend the Summer Meeting, including staff members and board members from the 51-member associations.

The 36th annual induction ceremony of the National High School Hall of Fame and discussion of several key issues affecting high school sports

and performing arts highlight this year's agenda. The NFHS Network will be live-streaming the Hall of Fame press conference and Hall of Fame banquet ceremonies. For more information, check for details at www.nfhsnetwork.com.

Twelve individuals will be inducted into the National High School Hall of Fame, including Alabama's own Buddy Anderson, Nebraska's Tom Osborne and Oregon's Dick Fosbury.

Anderson is the AHSAA's winningest football coach in Alabama history with a 329-146 record over the past 40 years at Vestavia Hills High School. Anderson was also a standout tight end at Thomasville High School and was played on the offensive line at Samford University. He becomes the 12th individual to be inducted into the National High

School Hall of Fame from Alabama. The others include: former AHSAA Executive Directors Cliff Harper (1987); Herman L. "Bubba" Scott (1990); and Dan Washburn (2011); basketball coach Wallace "Mickey Guy" O'Brien (1992); football coach Glenn Daniel (1999); track and cross country coach Jim Tate (2013); athletes Bart Starr (1989); Pat Sullivan (2012); and Ozzie Newsome (2014); and contest officials Dan Gaylord (1988); and Sam Short (2007).

In addition, AHSAA Soccer Rules interpreter and state Citation recipients are Joe Manjone of Alabama (NFHS Officials Association), Scott Evans of New Mexico (NFHS Coaches Association), Alan Greiner of Iowa (NFHS Music Association) and Tara Tate of Illinois (NFHS Speech/Debate/Theatre Association). Manjone, who has

spent more than 50 years in sports officiating, has served as AHSAA State Rules Interpreter and AHSAA Championship Officials Coordinator since 1991 and has been an NFHS Soccer Rules Committee member beginning in 2000. He has served as rules committee chairman and is the current NFHS rules consultant and interpreter. In 2012 he received the NFHS Sports Officials Association Contributor of the Year Award.

Osborne was a three-sport standout (football, basketball, track and field) at Hastings (Nebraska) High School in the early 1950s before becoming one of the most successful coaches in college football history. Fosbury developed the upside-down, back-layout leap known as the Fosbury Flop at Medford (Oregon) High School and later perfected it by winning the gold medal at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City.

Other former high school athletes in the 2018 class are Nicole Powell, one of Arizona's top all-time girls basketball players during her days at Mountain Pointe High School in Phoenix who later excelled at Stanford University and in the

WNBA, and Carrie Tolleson, who won five state cross country championships and eight individual track titles at Dawson-Boyd High School in Dawson, Minnesota, before winning individual and team NCAA titles while competing at Villanova University and qualifying for the 2004 U.S. Olympic team.

Four other outstanding coaches will be inducted with Anderson in the 2018 class, including Miller Bugliari, No. 2 nationally in boys soccer coaching victories with a 850-116-75 record in 58 years at The Pingry School in Basking Ridge, New Jersey, and Dorothy Gaters, the Illinois state leader with 1,106 career victories in 42 years as girls basketball coach at John Marshall High School in Chicago who won her ninth Illinois High School Association state title earlier this year.

Other coaches who will be honored this year are Jeff Meister, girls and boys swimming coach at Punahou School in Honolulu, Hawaii, who has led his teams to a combined 34 Hawaii High School Athletic Association state championships; and Bill O'Neil, who retired last year after winning almost 1,300 games as the boys

ice hockey, girls soccer and girls softball coach at Essex High School in Essex Junction, Vermont.

The other three members of the 2018 class are Roger Barr, who retired in 2015 after a 43-year career in high school officiating in Iowa, including the final 13 years as director of officials for the Iowa High School Athletic Association; Dick Neal, who retired in 2013 after a 34-year career as executive director of the Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association; and Bill Zurkey, who retired in 2012 after an outstanding 35-year career as a choral director in three Ohio schools, including the final 25 years at Avon Lake High School.

Among the topics that will be discussed at the 52 workshops during the NFHS Summer Meeting are esports, recruiting and retaining officials, overuse and sport specialization, crowd control, social media, inclusion, digital ticketing, and participation by students in home, charter and virtual schools.

In addition, the Legal/Sports Medicine Workshop will be held at 1:00 p.m. on June 30. This event provides an ideal opportunity to discuss current legal and medical issues, as well as an open exchange among the attendees.

The Summer Meeting will kick off on June 29 with the Opening General Session featuring Mark Wood, original member and string master of the Trans-Siberian Orchestra. Along with the 11th annual National High School Spirit of Sport Award ceremony, the NFHS will present its performing arts counterpart — the National High School Heart of the Arts Award — for the fifth time.

Marissa Walker of Waterford (Connecticut) High School will receive the National High School Spirit of Sport Award, and Cecelia Egan of Riverside St. Mary Academy-Bay View (Rhode Island) will receive the National High School Heart of the Arts Award.

The Second General Session on June 30 will feature NFHS President Jerome Singleton and NFHS Executive Director Bob Gardner, and the Closing General Session on July 2 will feature speaker and author, Aaron Davis.

The Summer Meeting Luncheon will be held at 12 p.m. on July 1 and will feature the presentation of NFHS Citations to 12 individuals.

The NFHS Summer Meeting will conclude at 6 p.m. July 2 with the induction of the 2018 class of the National High School Hall of Fame.

Requiem for a murder in Season 5 of Starz's 'Power'

In a series loaded with them, perhaps no development was more shocking than the murder at the end of last season of Raina St. Patrick, the beloved teenage daughter of Tasha and James "Ghost" St. Patrick in the hit Starz drama "Power."

Raina was the only person in the world who Ghost knew he could trust, more so than Tasha (Naturi Naughton), comrade and business associate Tommy (Joseph Sikora) or ex-girlfriend Angela (Lela Loren). So as Season 5 gets underway Sunday, July 1, his mind is set on, among other things, revenge.

"Absolutely," says Omari Hardwick, the actor who plays Ghost. "Absolutely looking to avenge her death in the way that most warm-blooded men or ... cold-blooded killers would want to handle that situation. What we know about Tasha, being the Lady

Macbeth of the series — I've always likened the show to Shakespeare with a lot of its components and a lot of its themes — she equally has that cold-blooded nature and wants the same avengement for her daughter. She just obviously doesn't want Ghost to get caught in doing so."

As Ghost plans his revenge, he throws himself headlong into his work, reaching new professional heights that could be endangered by his quest for blood. He's unaware of the new enemies that have infiltrated his circle and as the feds close in, he must remain vigilant toward those who want to take him down for past criminal activity.

He also finds himself in a deadly alliance with sworn enemy Kanan (50 Cent) and pal Tommy, who in Season 5 has his own problems as he finds his drug operation being gradually taken over by Dre (Rotimi).

"Dre has really made Tommy's life incredibly

difficult," Sikora explains. "... Tommy's hanging on by his fingernails with his relationship with Jason (Mike Dopud), who is the Serbian drug overlord who controls the ports in California and he's the plug for Tommy right now. So Dre is slowly but surely chipping away at everything. And Tommy also wants to make sure that Dre pays for what Tommy sees as being responsible for Raina's death in a lot of ways ..."

"This is truly a tragic death," he continues. "This is not a casualty of war. This is a violation. So I feel that he feels that this is a huge violation into the life and all about that life, and I think that Tommy is always ready and willing to take responsibility when it's his fault and I think he's still trying to determine where fault lies for her death. ... The resolve is going to happen in Season 5 and so we will see that resolve and we will see the plight of his investigations."

We got to Swarthmore after 902.8 miles and a lot of sweat. We largely hitchhiked and freight-trained back to Birmingham. I gained some vivid memories but Rutledge gained more, marrying my sister and raising three fine children.

"While an ensign in the Philippines during World War II, I changed

my plans from the ministry to medicine after realizing that there are some situations where a doctor who is interested in faith can be of more help to people than a minister who is interested in medicine.

"During my pediatrics residency at University Hospital in Birmingham, I started the Poison Control Center, and was its only staff for some time. One of the first in the country, it grew into the Children's Hospital Poison Control Center.

"Sylacauga rapidly accepted my being a new pediatrician there, mid-1980. School was about to start and many parents were disturbed by the newly enforced policy of required immunizations. I wrote an article for the newspaper about the importance of immunizations. From that came

a weekly column and eventually over 1,500 articles. [e.g., https://www.annistonstar.com/the_daily_home/daily-home-wins-awards-in-alabama-press-association-contest/article_9c437249-810f-552c-802b-11dd27a2f798.html: 'Dr. S.D. Palmer brought the Daily Home first-place honors in Human Interest']."

In medical practice for over a third of a century in Birmingham and Sylacauga, medical director of both Hudson Stuck Memorial Hospital in Alaska and Frontier Nursing Service in Kentucky, clinical professor of pediatrics at the University of Alabama Medical School, Cannon Medical Journalism Award, Wallace Clyde Award for excellence in pediatrics; Senior Scientist for UAB's Injury Prevention Center and much more:

Don/Dad/Dandy/Doc, Dr. Palmer brought medicine, science, teaching and writing together within caring,

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Alligator registration underway; Young has dilemma

With the application process for the 2018 Alabama alligator seasons underway, Rodney Young is now faced with a dilemma.

No, it's not that he isn't going to apply again. He's already done that. His problem is how to get the monster gator he and his team bagged last year into his house.

Young tagged a 13-foot gator that registered 667 pounds on the scale last year in the Southwest Zone, the largest gator of the year.

Young decided to have a full-body mount made and plans to put it in his home in Stapleton when the taxidermist is finished later this year.

"I'm going to put him in my man cave over the garage," he said. "I'm hoping it'll go up the staircase. If not, I'm going to have to get a crane or lift of some kind and put him through the window. I haven't figured that out yet."

Young and his team faced a similar situation last August during their gator hunt in the Mobile-Tensaw Delta. Young admits they were lucky to find a big gator because they hadn't done any scouting.

"We were just rolling the dice, running up and down the rivers," Young said. "We saw a bunch of 10-footers. This was my first hunt. I was out with some buddies of mine who had been on several hunts through the years. We'd see one and my buddy Gary Goins would say, 'Nah, ain't big enough.'"

About 2 a.m., the team was running up the Tensaw River when one of the crew shined a light on the bank and spotted a big gator in a man cave of his own.

"All we could see was the tip of his nose and his eyes," Young said. "But we knew right then it was a good one. We

were probably 100 yards away, but we knew we were onto something.

"He was in what looked like a little cove. The way the willows were, it created a little pocket and trees had grown over the top. We were having to cast sideways. We'd hit limbs and trees, and the gator would go down. That happened four times. We'd fool with him, and he'd go down. We'd back out in the river and watch for him. About 30 minutes later, he'd pop back up."

Then the big gator made a fatal mistake. He abandoned his cove.

"We were setting up to watch him again when one of the guys yelled, 'He's running,'" Young said. "He was tired of us fooling with him, and he came out into the river. We spun around and got two lines in him. That was an hour-and-a-half into the process. Of course, then the fight was on. He'd go down. We tried to keep two lines on him with treble hooks. He'd spin and pop one off. Then we'd get another one in him."

After the team finally got the gator under the boat, Young donned a pair of gloves and grabbed the large line with a snatch hook. Young hooked the gator but it didn't come up right away.

"When he finally got to the surface, his head came completely out of the water," he said. "That's the first time we got a good look at him, and we realized we had a monster."

The team finally wore the big gator down and secured him to the side of the boat at 5 a.m. Young dispatched the gator with one shot.

"At that point, we were as worn out as he was," Young said.

Then Young's team was faced with another dilemma. They were in Goins' Blazer Bay boat because of motor problems on their boat

that was designated for gator hunting, and Goins didn't want the gator messing up his almost-new boat.

"He told us, 'We can take the Blazer Bay, but we're not putting that gator in the boat,'" Young said. "We said, okay we'll tie him off. Bear in mind, we shot that gator at 5 o'clock. We realized we would never make it back to the weigh station before it closed if we had to go back to the launch and then drive to the Causeway."

"Gary was sitting there with his head in his hands. Finally, he said, 'The heck with it. Put him in the boat.' We didn't bat an eye. We weren't going to give him a chance to change his mind, so we started pulling the gator in the boat. It took all five of us to get him in the boat. Then four of us had to go to the bow of the boat to get the boat up on plane. But we got to the weigh station in time."

Although Young has applied for a tag this year, he said he knows the point system implemented in 2014 will put him at the bottom of the list for 2018.

"I'm not holding out a lot of hope," he said. "I figure it'll take another two or three years to get

another tag. It took me seven years to get the first one."

Chris Nix, Alabama Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries' Alligator Program Coordinator, said a preference points system was implemented for the 2014 season, and it is working as expected. For each year an applicant fails to draw a tag, the points are cubed with a point added for the current year.

"If you have applied since 2014 and haven't been drawn, you will have 65 points now," Nix said. "It's not guaranteed, but those people are highly likely to get drawn now. The longer the point system is in place, the quicker the turnover for people who haven't gotten a tag."

To ensure that new applicants have a shot at a tag, Nix said that 85 percent of the tags are filled with applicants with preference points and the remaining 15 percent are allocated to those with no points. Once a person is drawn, the preference points are zeroed out. Preference points are also lost if the person fails to apply for a tag.

Nix said the 2018 alligator season parameters are the same as last year with 260 total tags statewide – 150 in the Southwest Zone, 50 in the West Central Zone, 40 in the Southeast Zone and 20 in the Lake Eufaula Zone. Hunting is from sunset to sunrise.

Season dates for the Southwest Zone and the West Central Zone are sunset on August 9 until sunrise on August 12 and sunset on August 16 until sunrise on August 19. The Southwest Zone includes private and public waters in Baldwin and Mobile counties and private and public waters in Washington, Clarke and Monroe counties that lie east of U.S. Highway 43 and south of U.S. Highway 84. The West Central Zone includes private and public waters in

Monroe (north of U.S. Highway 84), Wilcox and Dallas counties.

The Southeast Zone season opens at sunset on August 11 and runs until sunrise on September 3. The Southeast Zone includes private and public waters in Barbour, Coffee, Covington, Dale, Geneva, Henry, Houston and Russell counties (excluding public Alabama state waters in Walter F. George Reservoir/Lake Eufaula and its navigable tributaries).

The Lake Eufaula Zone includes public state waters only in the Walter F. George Reservoir/Lake Eufaula and its navigable tributaries south of Alabama Highway 208 at Omaha Bridge (excludes Eufaula National Wildlife Refuge). The Eufaula season dates are from sunset on August 17 through sunrise on October 1.

An 8-foot restriction on harvest is in effect for the Lake Eufaula Zone. The other zones have no size restrictions.

Registration continues until 8 a.m. on July 11. After a computer-controlled drawing, entrants can find out if they drew a tag after noon on July 11 by logging on at the same page where they registered at www.outdooralabama.com/alligators/alligator

hunt-registration. Those who are drawn will have seven days to confirm the tags and are required to attend a zone-specific training class with a couple of exceptions.

"If you've taken the class as a tag holder or alternate in the Southwest Zone or West Central Zone, you're exempt from having to take it again," Nix said. "If your tag is in the Southeast Zone or Lake Eufaula Zone, the class is mandatory every year. We do that because of the contiguous zones with Georgia and the Eufaula National Wildlife Refuge, which is off-limits."

Nix said between 60 and 70 percent of the tags are filled annually, but it's not because of a lack of alligators, especially in the Southwest Zone.

"We could have a 100-percent success rate in the Southwest Zone every year," he said. "People pass up gators they wish they had tagged. It's just like deer hunting. Most people don't shoot the first buck that walks into the field. People usually don't take the first alligator they see."

"But to each his own. We had a couple that brought in two 4-footers last year, and they were as happy as could be."

MCI Research Shorts: Cutting-edge research stands to double immunotherapy response rate

Cutting-edge research at USA Mitchell Cancer Institute stands to double the response rate to immunotherapy without increasing side effects, but the effort's lead

investigator needs the immediate help of Gulf Coast cancer patients to determine if customized gut bacteria and nutrition regimens provide the immunotherapy boost he suspects.

"Right now, a little

more than 30 percent of patients can be put into long-term remission with this immunotherapy. We believe with the right probiotics and nutrition, we can more than double that to about 75 percent," said Dr. Arthur E. "Art" Frankel, MCI chief of medical oncology and inaugural holder of the Arlene and Mayer Mitchell Chair in Medical Oncology.

Frankel, an Austin, Texas native, who earned his medical degree from Harvard University, completed a research postdoctoral fellowship at the National Institutes of Health and a residency and medical oncology fellowship at Stanford University. Nationally renowned for his melanoma research, he is co-inventor on 12 issued patents and has authored or co-authored more than 200 publications in peer-reviewed journals.

"The more information you have, the more accurate your selection of the right probiotics and nutrition can be, but I need to get this information from patients, and that requires collecting stool samples, so we can know all of the DNA present and help design a better path forward — and ultimately better responses — for these patients," he said.

Specifically, Frankel works with antibodies that unlock T cells, a subtype of white blood cells critical to cell-

instigated immunity. About 15 years ago, he explained, researchers determined normal T cells are reined in by immune checkpoints that prevent all people from suffering from autoimmune diseases such as rheumatoid arthritis, multiple sclerosis and lupus. The downside is that the checkpoints make it more difficult for T cells to fight cancer leading to tumor growth. Antibodies have been developed, however, that remove the immune checkpoints, unlock T

cells and allow them to attack tumors with high mutation burdens. At the moment, somewhere between 30 percent and 50 percent of cancer patients respond to this approach, but certain types of cancers are resistant, and a percentage of patients still don't respond when immune checkpoint blockades, or antibodies, are administered, Frankel said.

The epidermis, or top layer of the skin, is comprised primarily of three

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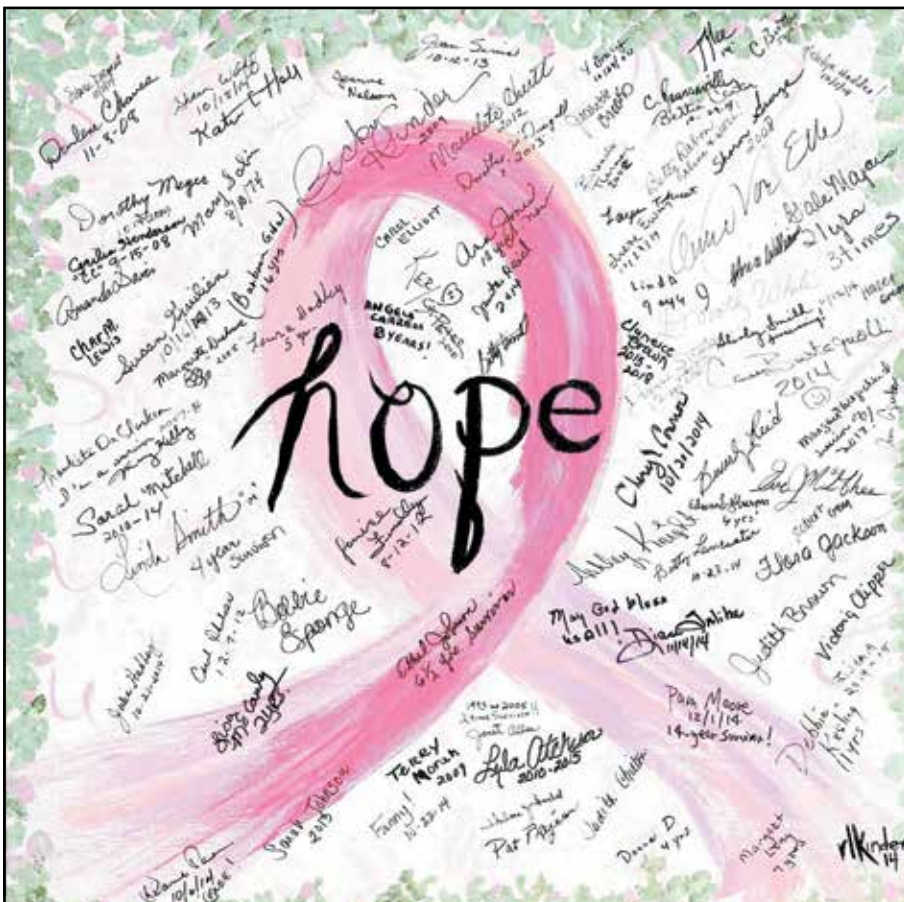

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types of cells: squamous cells, basal cells and melanocytes. As the name implies, melanocytes produce a brown pigment called melanin, the concentration of which determines the darkness of a person's skin. Melanoma is a type of cancer that begins specifically in the melanocytes, and although far less common than basal cell and squamous cell skin cancers, melanoma is more dangerous because of its

likelihood to spread to other parts of the body if not detected early. According to the American Cancer Society, cancer of the skin is the most common of all cancers, and May is recognized as Melanoma and Skin Cancer Awareness Month.

While melanoma accounts for only about 1 percent of all skin cancers, the ACS attributes the large majority of skin cancer deaths to melanoma and notes the overall melanoma diagnosis rate has increased steadily over the past 30

years. Of the estimated 91,270 new melanoma cases expected to be diagnosed in the U.S. in 2018, roughly 60 percent will be in men and slightly less than 40 percent will be in women. Meanwhile, men are expected to account for roughly 64 percent of the estimated 9,320 melanoma-related deaths projected in the United States in 2018.

At present, Frankel said there are two primary approaches for treating patients whose cancer does not respond automatically to autoim-

mune therapy. The first involves administering drugs alongside the antibodies to alter resistance pathways, but certain types of drugs affect pathways that are vital to other bodily functions, and the complementary drug regimen tends to compound side effects. In addition, those treatments can be expensive creating an added barrier to treatment.

"It's hard to stay ahead of something that is living and growing and mutating, but there is a gentler approach. It turns out we have the

ability to modulate our own immune system. It turns out (that) diet and the bacteria in your gut can allow your body to activate your immune system to fight melanoma better," he said, noting the affordability and simplicity make the approach more appealing to a broader patient base.

Frankel has led cancer research and clinical programs for three decades across the South, most recently overseeing Phase I clinical trials at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical

Center in Dallas. He is also former executive director of the Cancer Research Institute at Scott & White Hospital / Texas A&M School of Medicine and served at Wake Forest University, the Medical University of South Carolina, the Florida Hospital Cancer and Leukemia Research Center, and Duke University.

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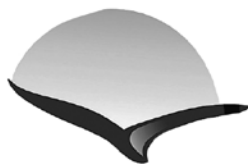

SECTION - III. Hours of Work and Attendance

3.02. Recording Time Worked

All employees must accurately record all hours worked in the manner prescribed by the City. Employees failing to accurately record time are subject to discipline. An employee may not record another employee's time or allow another employee to record his or her time. Employees shall not alter or falsify their own or another employee's time record. Violation of these rules is a ground for immediate dismissal.

Exempt, salaried employees do not have to clock in and will be paid from schedule. Exempt employees, however, must still advise the Payroll Administrator or City Accountant of sick days taken and vacation time scheduled.

3.04. Breaks and Meal Periods

Employees generally will receive one fifteen-minute paid break during the morning. Supervisors will arrange the time of the break to ensure City business and services are not unduly interrupted. Breaks cannot be combined with meal periods to extend the meal period, and employees may not leave work early in lieu of taking their break.

Meal periods are scheduled by the employee's Department Head. Scheduled meal periods may vary depending on department workloads. Employees will be completely relieved from duty during the scheduled meal period, which shall be at least 30 minutes and no longer than 60 minutes. Meal periods are unpaid. An employee may not work during the scheduled meal break unless the Department Head instructs or authorizes the employee to work during the meal break. If an employee is instructed or authorized to work during the meal period, the entire meal period time must be reported as time worked to ensure non-exempt employees are paid for the time.

All non-exempt employees (that is, employees paid overtime pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in a work week as provided in Personnel Rule 4.04) will have an automatic deduction from their regularly scheduled work hours each work day for the unpaid meal period of at least 30 minutes and no longer than 60 minutes. This includes Police support staff and Police administrative personnel working regular eight-hour shifts.

The City expects employees to take their full unpaid meal period each scheduled work day at the time designated by the Department Head. However, if an employee is instructed or authorized by his or her Department Head or immediate supervisor to work during the meal period, the entire meal period will be treated as hours worked and will be recorded as such to ensure that non-exempt employees are properly paid for the time. Thus, if an employee is instructed or authorized to work through the meal period or is directed to return to work during the meal period and his or her meal break is thereby interrupted the employee's immediate supervisor or Department Head must promptly email the Payroll Administrator or City Accountant, who are authorized to override the automatic deduction to ensure that the meal period is treated as hours worked for payroll purposes.

To ensure the accuracy of time records, each employee's supervisor or the supervisor's designated assistant is responsible for editing each non-exempt employee's time card each day. Any changes on the employee's time card must be approved and initialed by the supervisor promptly. The supervisor must digitally approve and submit to the Payroll Administrator or City Accountant each employee's time card no later than 10:00 a.m. on payroll Mondays.

Exempt salaried employees are paid to perform specific jobs, not for the number of hours worked. Accordingly, exempt salaried employees are not paid extra for performing work during the scheduled meal breaks.

Employees working extra shifts or special events (parades for example) are required to take at least a one-half hour unpaid meal period after their regularly scheduled workday and before beginning he extra shift.
