Janie Shores, Alabama's first female Supreme Court justice, dies at 85

Janie Shores, the first female member of Alabama's Supreme Court and Baldwin County resident, died last Wednesday at her home.

Shores' legal career began early in her life, starting as a legal secretary for a firm in Mobile before she graduated from the University of Alabama's law school.

Shores practiced law in Selma and worked on the legal staff for the Liberty National Life Insurance Company from 1961 to 1965. In 1965, she became the first full-time female law faculty member in the state, working for Samford University's Cumberland School of Law.

Shores ran for the Alabama Supreme Court in 1974 as a Democrat, becoming the first female member of the court upon her election win. She served on the court until her retirement in 1999 and was considered as a possible U.S. Supreme Court nominee by President Bill Clinton to the seat that eventually went to Ruth Bader Ginsburg.

In 2004, Shores served as one of seven members of a special State Surpeme Court that considered the appeal of the removal of Roy Moore as chief justice. The panel voted 7-0 not to reinstate Moore to the position.

Shores was widely respected in the Alabama legal community, as the Alabama Law Foundation awards an annual scholarship for female law students in her name. The Litigation Council of America also awards a Janie L. Shores Trailblazer Award in her honor.

Shores is survived by her daughter Laura Shores, a Washington D.C. attorney.

Fairhope Mayor Karin Wilson said she was saddened by Shores' death and praised her on a post on her official Facebook page:

"I am greatly saddened by the loss of Janie Shores, Alabama Supreme Court Justice, retired, who died after suffering a stroke last week. It was indeed my honor to have Justice Shores swear me in as mayor last year. She shared a vision for Fairhope that goes back to 1960 when she crafted an opinion that success-



fully protected our bay front park lands from development. If she had not taken this step on Fairhope's behalf, we would be a very different city today.

"Janie Shores was a model for all women today who seek personal and professional achievement in their lives. She came from humble beginnings and worked hard to succeed in life. She graciously spoke her mind and believed in the rule of law. Her opinions were delivered with classic legal clarity."

More questions from city leaders on Spanish Fort High athletic facilities

Spanish Fort city leaders continued to discuss what options they would like to see move forward with possible new construction for athletic facilities at Spanish Fort High during their last work session, with some council members continuing to question the amount the city is considering spending.

Spanish Fort High School principal Brian Williamson came to the meeting to help explain the current expansion of the school's gymnasium, something he said needed to be done to keep up with the school's growth in enrollment numbers.

The school's current gym holds around 600 people, but the school currently has around

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1,100 students enrolled.

"It's absolutely jam packed, so the purpose of this gym is just to fit everyone we have," Williamson said. "The seating arrangement will be somewhere around 1,200."

Williamson said because of the increasing number of students coming into the school, the growth would continue to be something that will have to be addressed.

"Our facilities right now, the majority seem like they were built based on the size back in 2007

and 2008," Williamson said. "We have seen a very aggressive growth in our athletic program. We're outgrowing everything we have. People are coming to our school to participate in our athletics programs. It's a wonderful problems to have, but we have to be able to fit everybody."

The proposal currently before the council asks for the city's help in constructing a potential new concession building, restrooms and a girls' field house.

Councilman J.R. Smith said he would like to see the school try to help share in the costs of those projects.

"I'm trying to be a good steward of all the citizens of Spanish Fort," Smith said. "If I was to vote possibly to build something, I'd like to see the school's athletic department share some of that cost. I want to see some give and take on both sides."

Williamson said raising funds can be difficult for the school.

"Having the capability to go out and raise those kinds of funds is very challenging for us," Williamson said. "We have so many different groups that are out fundraising throughout our community. We don't do a whole lot at the school level for

the general fund because we've got sports, clubs and other organizations out raising money for their particular needs."

All in, the city's costs for the projects could be upwards of \$800,000, an amount that several council members seemed to take issue with.

"No one is talking about the pink elephant in the room and that's 10 percent of the city's budget in one lick," Councilman Bill Menas said. "How in the world do we talk to our constituents about why they waited on their drainage projects and roads because we worked on this?"

Means said he was com-

pletely supportive of the athletics programs, but cautioned the other council members on whether the city should be funding the complete construction request.

"There has got to be a way we can do this without dinging our budget," Menas said. "There's just a lot of money going into athletics here, and this just needs to make sense in my head."

Councilwoman Mary Brabner asked if the school had considered asking parents to help out with some of the construction and labor to help bring down costs.

"If the families have

some skin in the game, they will take pride and ownership in that," Brabner said. "If we continue to hand it to them, we're putting money on someone else's balance sheet."

Williamson said if he had to prioritize construction needs at the school, the restrooms and the girls' field house would top the list.

"I'd list those as 1A and 1B," Williamson said. "That's the way I see it. The restrooms and the girls' field house are just necessities."

The council said they would continue to study the matter further.

Cyrus Dorsey Graduates from Renowned Aviation Challenge - Mach I

Huntsville – Cyrus Dorsey of Silverhill recently attended Aviation Challenge - Mach I at the U.S. Space and Rocket Center, NASA Marshall Space Flight Center's Official Visitor Center. The weeklong educational program promotes science, technology, engineering and math (STEM), while training students and adults with hands-on activities and missions based on team-

work, leadership and problem solving.

Dorsey was part of the Aviation Challenge - Mach I Program, a program specifically designed for students who have an interest in military aviation and the mechanics of flight. Dorsey spent the week training with a team that flew a simulated F-18 fighter jet. The crew learned critical land- and water-survival skills and

mastered Top Gun flying maneuvers. Cyrus and crew returned in time to graduate with honors.

Aviation Challenge opened in 1990 in Huntsville, Alabama, and uses fighter pilot training techniques to engage trainees in real-world applications of STEM subjects. Students sleep in barracks designed to resemble military bays.

More than 750,000 trainees have gradu-

ated from Space Camp and its sister programs since its inception in Huntsville, Alabama in 1982, including STS-131 astronaut Dottie Metcalf-Lindenburger, European Space Agency astronaut, Samantha Cristoforetti and NASA Expedition 48 astronaut Dr. Kate Rubins. Last year, children and teachers from all 50 states and 69 international locations attended Space Camp.



Dr. Lynn Yonge of Fairhope joined Veterans Recovery Resources as medical advisor Joins Team to Help Prevent Veteran Suicide; Promote Wellness

Dr. Lynn E. Yonge of Fairhope has joined the Advisory Board of Veterans Recovery Resources, a public charity established by veterans, for veterans. The non-profit will deliver the highest-quality, compassionate substance abuse and mental wellness services to all veterans and their families--regardless of their ability to pay.

Yonge graduated from The University of Alabama with a degree in nursing. After working five years as a critical care nurse, Yonge decided to pursue his medical degree from The University of South Alabama where he also completed his family practice residency. He practiced in Foley, Alabama for nine years before moving to Bay Medical in 1998.

With a special interest in adolescents, in addition to his private practice, Yonge is the medical director for the Baldwin County juvenile intervention program (Pathways) and the medical director for Strickland Youth Center in Mobile County. He is a Fellow in the American Academy of Family Physicians, serves as the faculty advisor for the USA Wilderness Medicine Student Interest Group, assistant clinical professor for the USA College of Medicine, and as a clinical preceptor for nurse practitioner students from UAB.

He also has a soft spot for veterans. "When I learned about the rate of suicide in veterans and the numbers here that

struggle in our own backyard, I was shocked," said Dr. Yonge. "After meeting several times with John Kilpatrick and Dr. Joe Currier, I understand the importance of the mission and I am very happy to help."

A new white paper published by the University of South Alabama and University of West Florida shows that the mental health needs of student veterans is as high as those from other age groups. In total, 538 student veterans completed the survey and 39 participated in a qualitative interview with a member of the research team. Over one-third of them exceeded a well-established threshold for gauging problem drinking. In addition, over one-third endorsed clinical levels of PTSD, major depressive disorder and/or risk of suicidal behavior that indicated a probable need for treatment.

"We are incredibly gratified to have Dr. Yonge on board to provide guidance on our medical program," said Founder, John Kilpatrick. "His depth of knowledge and experience is impressive; perhaps more so is his passion for a healthy mind as well as a healthy body. Veterans Recovery Resources will serve not only veterans, but their families as well. There are many avenues that Dr. Yonge's experience will benefit our programming for young service members, as well as adolescents in military

families." For example, veteran wilderness programs could provide significant stress reduction in veterans with PTSD and other stress-related issues and will be explored in the future.

In addition to his many other accomplishments, Yonge is a Member of the first class of Fellows of the Academy of Wilderness Medicine; a former Executive Director for the Alabama Outward Bound School; serves on the Board of Directors, Wilderness Medical Society; and was a past Chairman of the Wilderness Medical Society Environmental Council. Dr. Yonge is a coauthor of the Biodiversity chapter in the sixth edition of Auerbach's Wilderness Medicine text; a lifelong outdoorsman and an Eagle Scout. He is a Certified Burn Manager and owner of an Alabama Treasure Forest.

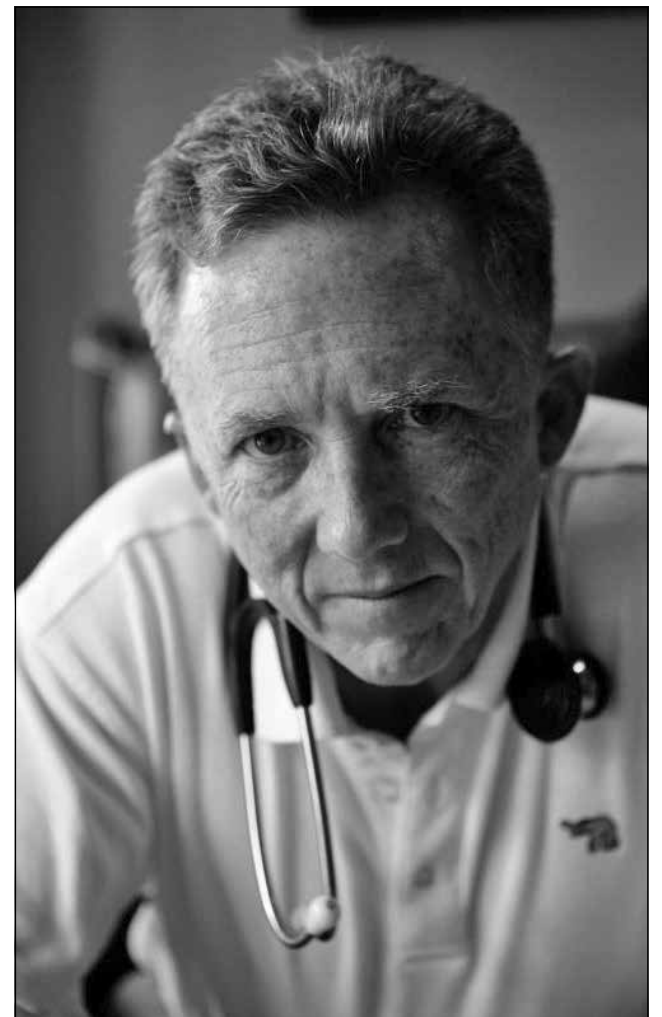

What the Masters of Suspicion Are Missing

Friedrich Nietzsche, Karl Marx, and Sigmund Freud are known in philosophical circles as "the masters of suspicion." They are often noted for their aggressive criticism of religion, specifically the Christian religion, as simply a cover for the basic instincts that actually drive all human behavior: money (Marx), sex (Freud), and power (Nietzsche). Their basic theory was that humans turned these powerful drives into gods who would bring fulfillment of these longings to a special few (the bourgeoisie). These men thought that if the blinders of religion could be pulled from the eyes of the masses, the monopoly of happiness could be ripped from the hands of the ruling classes and enjoyed by all.

Ironically, the masters of suspicion would find that the true Master would agree with them in large part. Long before the 19th century, Jesus saw how religion was being used to concentrate power into the hands of an elite minority, and he predicted its total destruction.

Money (Matt 6:19-34), sex (5:27-32), and power (5:38-48) are three of his primary targets in the Sermon on the Mount. But Jesus took "suspicion" one step further: these desires themselves were lies, false religions, ephemeral and perverted echoes of a deeper longing that could only be satisfied in the one true Father God. It is of note that all three men suffered massive disappointments with their earthly fathers. They knew that they, along with everyone else, were missing something. They just could not believe it was the Father.

In many ways, the twentieth century was one massive experiment with the ideas of the masters of suspicion: let us see if great

happiness ensues when we get rid of God and give full reign to the human impulses for money, sex, and power. What we got (as usual) instead of life and happiness was misery and death on an unprecedented scale. Marx and Nietzsche gave us Stalin and Hitler. Freud gave us the Sexual Revolution and, among many other tragedies, it's almost two billion abortions. Though they predicted His end, the carpenter from Galilee still rules and reigns, His church spreading in the twenty-first century as never before. On a subway wall, someone scribbled "God is dead—Nietzsche," only to have someone come along later, strike through those words, and write below them, "Nietzsche is dead—God." No one is a greater enemy of religion than God himself, whether it is the religion of self-righteousness, self-actualization, or science itself. God simply wants a relationship, and, if we are honest enough to admit it, the rest of us are suspicious that we do too.

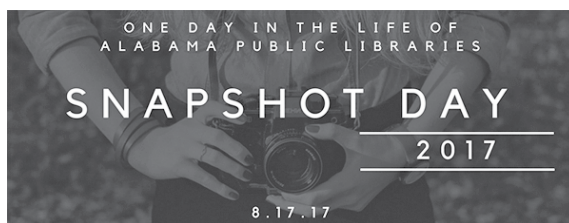

A Foley man's aspirations take him around the world

Don't stop dreaming. That's Bill Courduff's mantra.

The 88-year-old Foley man has lived many lifetimes, many dreams over the course of his years. He's traveled across oceans and nations. He has had adventures that others only dream of.

His latest dream is now a reality. On his 80th birthday Courduff, and his wife Carolyn, started writing books. So far they have published four titles.

"We're going on a new adventure," Courduff says. A youthful smile spreads across his face. "And to be 88-years-old and have a new adventure to look forward to is fantastic."

The book titles are, "History of Belforest School 1896-1950," "Chicken Talk 24-7," "Chronic Lymphatic Leukemia Remission?" and, "Butterfly on the Water," in which Courduff tells the story of his friend Thomas Soulantzos, the Koukla, and their experiences building Soulantzos' dream ship in Taiwan and sailing it to New York.

"All sailors are romantics," he says, slurring the words together in a combination of Long Island vowel-lengthening

and a gravelly southern drawl. His graying eyebrows are always raised in an animated sort of way, revealing earnest blue eyes and a youthful smile.

"If you weren't romantic, you wouldn't even like the water," he says.

And the tail of the Koukla is quite the romance – of a man's love and longing for the boat of his dreams.

And it begins, in New York.

Courduff used to eat at Thomas Soulantzos' restaurant, Poseidon, in Queens, Long Island. A long line of people were always waiting outside the door for a bite of Soulantzos's fresh-caught gourmet seafood. The wavy, black-haired Soulantzos used to burst out of the kitchen, cigar in mouth, dressed in denim overalls and a floppy sort of hat, to laugh and joke with the guests.

"Everybody loved Thomas," Courduff says, his lively face matching every inflection in his voice. "We met because he had a restaurant, and we loved the way he cooked seafood. Between going to the restaurant all the time and arranging fishing groups, we got to know each other."

But Soulantzos had bigger aspirations than his restaurant. When he

was a boy living in Egio, Greece, he used to climb the high bluffs overlooking the Aegean Sea to watch all of the colorful sailboats in the water. They captured his imagination, and he later said that the fluttering sails made him think of butterflies.

In 1956, when Soulantzos was 17, he left Greece for the United States to escape the poverty of his upbringing. He was hired on a merchant ship, where he learned to cook and jumped ship in New York, where he later married and had two children.

Soulantzos never gave up his lifelong dream of owning a sailboat.

After working his restaurant for several years, he eventually raised enough money to have someone design and build his boat. It was not just any boat. He hired George Stadel, Jr., a naval architect who was voted #1 Schooner Designer in 1983 by The American Schooner Association, to design it. Soulantzos's boat would be Stadel's 300th schooner design.

Next, Soulantzos had to find a boatyard. He began shopping all over the world for the right place, and, with the help of Stadel, he eventually settled on a bid from the President Marine in Taiwan. The Taiwanese knew how to build wooden boats, but they had never before built a schooner.

During the boat's construction, Soulantzos traveled back and forth from his restaurant in Long Island to Taiwan to monitor the boat's progress. He named his boat "Koukla," which means "baby doll" in Greek.

"That was his baby doll," Courduff says.

The boat was 75 feet long and over 60 feet high. Down beneath the stern, the galley was covered with oriental rugs, rosewood counter-tops, and green marble. It also had a gimbal table that would rotate with the motion of the boat, and a Victorian light fixture overhead.

"It was built like a classic wooden boat of 200 years ago," Courduff says.

Courduff was the first person Soulantzos asked

to join his trans-Pacific crew.

Courduff's own love for sailing began in his early days, like Soulantzos, when he and his middle school friend, Bob Crump, would go out on Crump's 19-foot Lightning sailboat. He later entered the Marine Corps in 1946 when he was 17, and played the saxophone for all of the various military bands.

"He kept volunteering to go overseas to fight, but they said, 'We need you here,'" Carolyn says. "He was in all the bands, the marching band, the concert band, the jazz band. He spent all of his time at Parris Island."

After two years, Courduff left the military and enrolled as a student at New York University, but after three years, he ran out of money from his GI Bill benefits and could not finish his degree.

Right after college, he married his first wife and they had five children. It was after that that he began his landscaping business, Courduff's Oakwood Road Garden and Landscaping Company.

"He had magic hands in creating beautiful gardens, and he came away a very wealthy man," Carolyn says. "He did landscaping for many wealthy people on the Gold Coast."

Courduff met Carolyn in 1994 and taught her how to sail. The two owned a 14-foot Catalina sailboat named Honey Chile and sailed on it for 20 years.

After a lifetime of sailing, Courduff naturally jumped at the chance to help his friend Soulantzos sail his ship across the Pacific. The strange thing about Soulantzos's passion for sailing was that he had never sailed in his life before he owned the Koukla. He knew nothing about boat construction. In fact, he gave no instructions to the President Marine about the boat's rigging and assumed it would be easy for the crew to erect the boat's two masts and six sails, along with all the wires, bolts, and lines.

"He had never sailed, but he liked sailboats," Courduff says. "He liked the look of them. That's



the dreamer part of it."

But as Soulantzos was preparing to bring the Koukla home, the boat suffered a terrible accident.

"When the Koukla was finally ready after three years of construction, the crew had just gotten there," Courduff says. "It was 54 tons of boat, all wood. They had to pick up the boat and set it in the water, and after they had it in the air, all the sudden you have this bang, bang, bang. Fourteen tons of crane fell on the boat."

By the time the Koukla was repaired, it cost Soulantzos another year and an extra \$30,000. After four years, and four crew changes, Soulantzos was finally ready to bring the Koukla home. It was the summer of 1984.

Courduff was part of the crew, which consisted of himself, Soulantzos, Captain Richard Bailey, and two others. Courduff had to fly to Taiwan to meet the crew, and he still smiles as he remembers his first time seeing the country.

"Coming out of the airport going into Taipei—it's a big place," he says. "There are Chinese all over the place. I'm a foot taller than everybody, with my big hat as out-of-place as it could be. Then a guy says, 'Courduff leans in, voice hushed, 'Are you looking for your friends? Are you going to sail that boat?'"

Courduff chuckles. "And he spoke English! From that moment on he told me what to do: go across the street, get in a cab. They have these little tiny cars."

Then suddenly, without breaking his gaze, the old man's eyes fill with tears.

"I felt safe," he says. "I always felt safe in Taiwan."

Unfortunately for the avid sailor, after so many years of antici-



tion, Courduff did not sail with the crew. His first wife wanted a divorce so he returned home to settle the legal issues concerning his marriage and property.

On July 4, 1984, the crew, minus Courduff, began their voyage across the Pacific, sailing all the way to San Diego, then through the Panama Canal to the Atlantic Ocean, and on to Huntington, N.Y. The trip took a total of six months and was mostly uneventful. They finally arrived in New York on December 16th, 1984.

Soulantzos, unfortunately, began to decline shortly after his return. His wife had to care for the restaurant while he was away, and she did not want anything to do with the boat.

"Thomas comes home with his baby doll, Koukla, and he spends every moment with her," Courduff said. "So Thomas has reached the pinnacle of his life, he's reached every goal he ever wanted to. Now, what does a man do when he reaches every achievement? He starts to drink."

Shortly after his return, Soulantzos entered hospice because of his drinking. He then bought a one-way ticket to Greece, and, after three months, was killed in a head-on collision.

"He was 45-years-old when he returned, and in 10 years at age 55 he died," Courduff says. He squints his eyes thought-

fully. His voice never loses its enthusiastic inflections. Then his face brightens.

“That’s why you don’t stop dreaming,” he says, pointing to the ceiling with a smile and a fervent expression. “You always gotta pick a new dream.”

Courduff would probably still be sailing today, but after he had heart surgery, he could no longer stay out in the sun for long periods of time. In 2005, he and Carolyn sold the Honey Chile and it was time for a new dream.

After his book about his Tawain adventures, “Butterfly on the Water” was published in 2011, Bill and Carolyn began

talking about turning the story into a movie.

“I know that the Taiwanese government is interested in building the movie industry in Taiwan,” he says. “We knew that ‘Life of Pi’ was filmed there, and it won all kinds of awards.”

So the two first decided to contact the Taiwanese Ambassador to the U.S., but with no

success.

“So we thought, ‘Let’s not fool around anymore,’” his wife says. “Let’s just go right to the president.”

And that’s what they did. Within a couple of weeks, they got an email back from the Office of the President of Taiwan, telling them they are very happy about the book and that they would put them in touch

with their Ministry of Culture about making a movie.

“They encourage their young people to have dreams,” Courduff says, “just like our book is about a dream of a Greek boy, and how the Taiwanese helped the boy achieve his dream of having a schooner.”

While he waits to see what might come of the film, Courduff says he

will continue to write books and tell stories. He calls himself a “world class raconteur and a Renaissance man.”

“There’s nothing like sailing,” Courduff says in his slow raspy drawl, a blissful smile spread across his face. “No motor, it’s quiet, you wait for the wind to blow you around—It’s a magnificent way to go.”

One Last Task

Participants in Gulf State Park’s Junior Ranger program finished one last task before earning their badge this week. The children planted milk weed and sea oat seeds to help grow more native plants for the park. Once the planting was done, the children were awarded their official Gulf State Park Junior Ranger patch. The six-week program introduced participants to the park’s six distinct ecosystems. The campers also learned to use compasses and hike safely in Alabama’s wilderness.

Who Will Build Our 355 Ship Navy

America has the most powerful Navy the world has ever seen. For centuries, our sailors have provided peace and stability around the globe. With over eighty percent of the world's population living within sixty miles of the sea and ninety percent of world trade moving by sea, a strong and capable U.S. Navy is critical to a bountiful economy and the wellbeing of humanity.

Unfortunately, due to defense cuts and a shrinking fleet size, competitors are challenging our naval superiority. This is why it is critically important we support the Navy's proposed 355 ship fleet and continue to invest in the latest technology.

In order to grow our Navy and make sure we continue to be an example of strength for the rest of the world, it is vital that we have a robust shipbuilding industry here at home.

Shipbuilding and ship repair have been an important part of our national economy since our country's founding. Nationally, the industry accounts for roughly

400,000 jobs, provides \$25.1 billion in labor income, and contributes over \$37.3 billion to the GDP. Shipbuilding is about both national security and a strong economy.

Unfortunately, we cannot build up to the 355 ship fleet of tomorrow without a skilled and capable workforce. Our nation continues to experience a severe gap in skilled workers, and the shipbuilding industry is not immune to this problem.

This is one example why career and technical education (CTE) programs are so important. They provide American workers with the development and training needed to build the ships that are necessary in order to maintain our naval superiority.

Thousands of workers in the United States look to technical education programs as a path forward in their careers. Whether it is a sudden and unexpected career change or a well-planned out career for

a high school student, CTE programs offer opportunity and growth for a wide range of Americans.

Aaron, one of my constituents in Southwest Alabama, is a great example of a CTE success story. Ten years ago, he started out as a plumber, but after going through a CTE program, he now supervises pipe and machinery for an entire shipyard in coastal Alabama. His supervisor cites him as one of their best leaders. His life was

forever changed thanks to CTE, and he is now helping build our nation's warships.

As the former chancellor of the Alabama's community college system, I have seen these CTE programs firsthand and they work like magic. Encouraging our nation's workforce to specialize in a valuable trade like shipbuilding and repair improves their lives and also provides tremendous benefits to both our economy and our national security.

Earlier this year, the House passed H.R. 2353, the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act, on a huge bipartisan vote. Our bipartisan bill updates the Carl D. you have guessed that nappy is the British word for diaper. I heard nappy years ago from the British war bride of my second cousin.

Recently with the use of Roku, an electronic device connected to my television set to stream movies and television shows through it, my son and I have been watching a number of enjoyable British TV series and movies. Numerous times we have heard a word spoken that causes us to turn to each other asking what that word means. Sometimes we figure it out by the way it is used, such as the word scarp which in UK slang means to leave very quickly. A few times he has reached

for an I Pad to search for a definition. Other times we just let it ride because we didn't want to pause the action on the screen while we searched.

For two people who often consult dictionaries when we encounter an unfamiliar word as we read, there was a simple solution to our television problem sitting on a shelf in my office; another dictionary. It is not just an ordinary dictionary, but one recommended to me by a relative. He had found it while searching for a gift for an 11-year-old and was so captivated by it that he bought himself one. I followed his recommendation and ordered myself one. It is an advanced learner's dictionary that includes American English, Australian and New Zealand English and British English. It came with a CD-Rom for a computer that has both the dictionary and a

thesaurus included. My husband often used the CD as he did research for his Reverend Alabaster Armstrong's Mystery novels. We enjoyed hearing the spoken British and American pronunciations of the words he clicked on. He was delighted when he asked me to type in "duke" and a block popped up with a list of ranks of British nobility. Another thing I like about this specialized dictionary is that it follows every definition with a sentence example which helps to clearly define the word meaning.

The dictionary also lists differences in the spelling of words by the English and Americans: British oesophagus-US esophagus, British odour-US odor.

A former Air Force Special Operations Helicopter Pilot responds to Fairhope citizen's complaints

I flew HH and MH-53J Pave Low helicopters (large rescue and special operations transport helicopters) for most of my 26-year career in the Air Force, accumulating over 4000 total flying hours. I flew rescue missions out of RAF Woodbridge, England and then Special Operations missions out of Hurlburt Field in the Florida panhandle. I logged over 200 combat hours in two wars, both in the Middle East, ending my service as an Air Advisor to the Iraqi Air Force flying Russian MI-17 helicopters. I trained at Ft Rucker, Alabama and Albuquerque, New Mexico. I often get asked why we flew so much at night? The answer was: we were more likely to survive by flying

at night. The helicopter I flew was very large and, even though fast for a helicopter, not very fast in relation to missiles or other ground to air weapons. We were safer learning to operate at night on Night Vision Goggles and using the Terrain Following Radar in our cockpit so that was when we trained. Our typical training sortie was about 4.5 hours long. In the winter when the sun goes down earlier, we could get done by 10 or 11 at night. But in the summer, I sometimes did not take off until 9 PM and landed quite often well after midnight. I bring these facts up to explain why those Navy pilots fly so much at night ("as late as midnight"). They are learning to survive in the modern battlefield. As the saying goes, train like you plan to fight.

The complaints also stated they were flying lower than FAA allowed. Let me assure them that they fly as low as they need to learn to survive. You may

not understand, but the FAA has NO jurisdiction to their flying rules. The military is not subject to the FAA as they have military rules and regulations to adhere to when flying. The FAA is a civilian regulatory body and the Military is not subject to their rules. I say this not to flout or come across as believing we are better or can do what we want, but a civilian plane flying low is dangerous and against FAA rules. A military plane or helicopter flying low is intentional and trying to train in the environment to survive. I'm sure the pilots are flying low near the airport doing multiple touch and go landings to better learn the skills of flying so they become second nature to them. That is what learning to fly is all about.

I appreciate Councilman Burrell's letter. It was thoughtful, encouraging and well-reasoned. Our nation has been at war since 2001, that's 16 years of

constant military activity (translated: fighting and dying). That's more than our nation has ever experienced in our history. Please understand that the need of airfields like the one near Fairhope is vital to their success. The main areas around Milton and Pensacola are too crowded for effective training. That's why they go to outlying strips to practice. If those strips are taken away, training will suffer and we will be less prepared to defend this great nation against all enemies.

If you hear their "noise", why not give them a break, say a prayer for their safety and then thank God they are our pilots up there at all hours of the day and night willing to spend time away from their families to defend them?

Gulf Shores School Split

"Gulf Shores having independent schools is an interesting premise," I thought.

Curious about the fate of neighborhood children I wrote the State Board of Education asking, "What are the theoretical consequences for Orange Beach students, if the City of Gulf Shores forms their own school system?"

The students from Orange Beach must have a school where they are comfortable and can grow, assuming they will not be able to attend the newly formed schools in Gulf Shores, living outside the attendance zone.

"I have to dig further," I thought.

The school initiative is not new, having fallen twice before, overwhelmingly battered in voter referendums in Orange Beach and Gulf Shores. Perhaps Gulf Shores will go it alone, succeeding without Orange Beach.

I wish the City of Gulf Shores all the best with their new project, trying to understand how a fair and equitable arrangement can be reached for Orange Beach's students is the conundrum. Living on the eastern end of the island in a geographically segregated school system

hurts the local children, adding more apprehension to their puberty. Blame will fall squarely on the shoulders of city managers, if favorable terms are not negotiated.

"The separation is usually effected by means of a negotiation between the school systems. The negotiation usually culminates in a separation agreement which governs issues such as attendance zones and other matters," said the Communications Office of the Department of Education in an email.

Planning for a new school system takes people with vision. I applaud the tenacity of the Island Education Task Force, working to see an independent-school initiative succeed, knowing they must convince their neighbors to vote in a referendum, increasing property taxes, possibly to the 29 mil level of Saraland, also a city-run school system.

Orange Beach has not been standing still, working with Eddie Tyler, Superintendent of the Baldwin County Board of Education, eliciting a promise to build a \$15 Million Middle School in Orange Beach as part of the county's pay-as-you-go \$60 Million loan program with no direct-tax burden on local residents, possibly starting construction in 2018.

Taxes are the key issue. Perhaps some families will move from Orange Beach to Gulf Shores in response to the dedicated school system, perceived as having the advantage of smaller classes and personalized tutoring, outweighing the burden of higher taxes. Choosing to pay the added property tax is a parental choice for better education. The only alternative for some Orange Beach students is transporting to the next available feeder system.

My counter proposal is about taxes, specifically lowering property taxes in Orange Beach from 4 mil to zero, using this school initiative as an opportunity to start an economic boom, driving the investor class to our city, compared to a possible 29 mil property tax in Gulf Shores to zero property tax in Orange Beach. "The city took in \$3,461,385 in Ad Valorem Taxes (on 4 mil) in 2016," according to Finance Director Ford Handley.

I argue. This loss in revenue is nominal compared to the possible economic growth, spurred on by lowering the tax rate, incentivizing business investors. The Gulf Shores City Schools initiative is an opportunity for Orange Beach to create a property boom, increasing revenue, pushing up real-estate values and attract-

ing investor-class people to a beach town with no property tax.

I digress; the issue is about the children. The Communications Department of the State Board of Education said negotiations were necessary to determine the attendance zones. What happens to Orange Beach students if Gulf Shores Middle School and Gulf Shores High School are not open to them?

Saraland has posted on the website for people living outside the attendance zone: "The policy requires tuition payment of \$1,500, as well as academic, behavior and attendance eligibility requirements. Additionally, admission is based on space availability." Perhaps Gulf Shores will offer a tuition-payment plan or scholarships for the best Orange Beach students, padding their student-body's performance.

Gulf Shores will control their educational destiny by forming their own school system. Orange Beach could choose to control their economic destiny by eliminating property taxes.

Superintendent Sentance deserves a fair shot

Though his career at Alabama began with a mediocre 6-6 record and, perhaps more notably to fans, a loss to Auburn, football coach Nick Saban was not fired after his first year--and good thing he wasn't. Today, Saban is considered by many to be perhaps the greatest college football coach of all time.

We give football coaches the time it takes to show their potential; we ought to treat our state superintendent of education the same way.

At the end of July, the vice president of the Alabama State Board of Education unilaterally and abruptly called for an evaluation of State Superintendent Michael Sentance. Sentance began his superintendency on September 12, 2016, and his contract

requires an annual evaluation no later than December 31 of each year, making a midyear call for evaluation rather strange.

To say that the evaluation was a mess is generous. Governor Kay Ivey, the president of the board, did not participate, as she did not feel she had sufficient time to evaluate Sentance's performance. Board member Betty Peters participated "under duress," and board member Mary Scott Hunter had her non-responses counted as zeroes towards Sentance's evaluation score; later the board relented and disregarded any scores from Hunter.

The evaluation sheet puts forth criteria like "speaks clearly, correctly, and coherently." On that criterion, board member Jeff Newman

scored Sentance at a "1." That's facially ridiculous. Sentance received the same score from board member Ella Bell on "models positive community involvement," whatever that means. If the board doesn't even agree on how the evaluation model came to be, you can bet Sentance was left scratching his head. In truth, the review is about as clear as mud, isn't useful as a basis for improvement, and the sparse comments from the board give the impression that the fix is in.

Michael Sentance isn't a magic cure for Alabama's education challenges, but he comes with a winning record from an exceptional state school system in Massachusetts. "Today, Alabama students stand about three years behind their peers in Massachu-

sets in 8th grade math and two years in 4th grade reading." This was mentioned in Sentance's review and is worth noting, given Massachusetts's success under his reform tactics. Prioritizing efforts directed at improving teacher quality and giving them the support they need are the cornerstone of Sentance's strategic plan. Sentance certainly isn't shying away from tough issues in Alabama education.

If we're willing to give a football coach multiple seasons to demonstrate success, we should offer at least that to a man who has inherited a failing education system. We also need a transparent and useful evaluation. It might not be as simple as wins and losses, but the targets for success need to be clearly defined. The big-

ger problem may be that the board doesn't know what success looks like. Several members have served for over a decade, and we haven't exactly wowed anyone with our public education progress.

Sentance needs a chance to show us what he can do, and the Alabama State Board of Education ought to give it to him.

Alabama team advances to national tournament in Missouri

OXFORD- The Fairhope Ozone All-Stars won the Dixie Youth World Series at Oxford with a 7-3 title-game victory over defending champion South Carolina's team out of Clinton. Representing the state of Alabama and Baldwin County, the Fairhope American League club outscored their World Series opponents 58-7 including two shutouts en route to the title. South Carolina came closest to spoiling the sweep in round three.

Alabama manager Andy Malone's previous Fairhope teams had won three state championships before this one as 8-year-olds, 10-year-olds and 12s including taking the World Series runner-up award twice. That experience along with hard work helped lead to the DYB WS championship trophy and banner this year.

"This group of kids has been together and playing as a team for several years now," Malone said. "This was the fourth time we've made it to the World Series and it's like it finally paid off for us. All that experience came through. But I think we feel like we worked a little harder and stayed more focused a little better everyday and every step of the way this year. And that makes it work."

"Having been through it before and coming up just short before, that was really pretty good motivation for us to keep focused on the goal. Everybody stepped up and did their part when we needed them to. The players, the coaches and the parents."

Malone said South Carolina never gave up and forced the best from his club.

"They had a really good team. We knew we were gonna have to play a team like that. We knew we would have to beat somebody like that along the way and we prepared for it. I'm just so proud of these guys for fighting through to the finish."

"I've been telling our team the whole time, win or lose we want to be able to say we did all we could do. (And) This year we could not have worked any harder."

Clinton's team was bidding to bring the title to South Carolina for the second year in a row.

Fairhope went 5-0 in the tournament

Fairhope had leads of 2-0 and 3-2 in the title game, but the South Carolina champions pulled even twice before the Baldwin players broke away for good with a four-run sixth.

A Chad Morris single gave them their final lead. Brooks Brasfield's fielder's choice added an insurance run and finished with three RBIs after he drove in a run in each of his three at-bats.

Tournament batting champion Steele Sims capped the offensive surge with a two-run double. Sims hit two of Fairhope's five homers in the Arkansas game, went 2-for-3 in the championship game and hit .692 for the tournament (9-for-13).

"He was our hottest hitter," Malone said. "He pounded the baseball for us."

Gatlin Pitts also had a homer and started the winning rally with a lead-off double. Josh Gunther pitched to the final out for the win. He gave up seven hits and struck out five.

Team Alabama now advances to a champion-of-champions tournament in Branson, Missouri. The Fairhope-based club will compete in the third Annual Youth Baseball Network National Championship.

The 12U Champions headed to the Show Me State represent the fol-

lowing baseball organizations: American Amateur Baseball Congress (AABC); Amateur Athletic Union of the United States (AAU); Continental Amateur Baseball Association (CABA); Dixie Youth Baseball (DYB); Dizzy Dean Baseball (DDB); National Amateur Baseball Federation (NABF); and the Jacoby Ellsbury Indigenous Champions. In addition, a host team will feature players from Greater Missouri.

The YBN National Championship will be played August 16-19 at the new, state-of-the-art youth baseball complex, Ballparks of America. Ballparks of America features five MLB replica fields, plus luxurious team suites, which will be home to the Champions for their week in Branson.

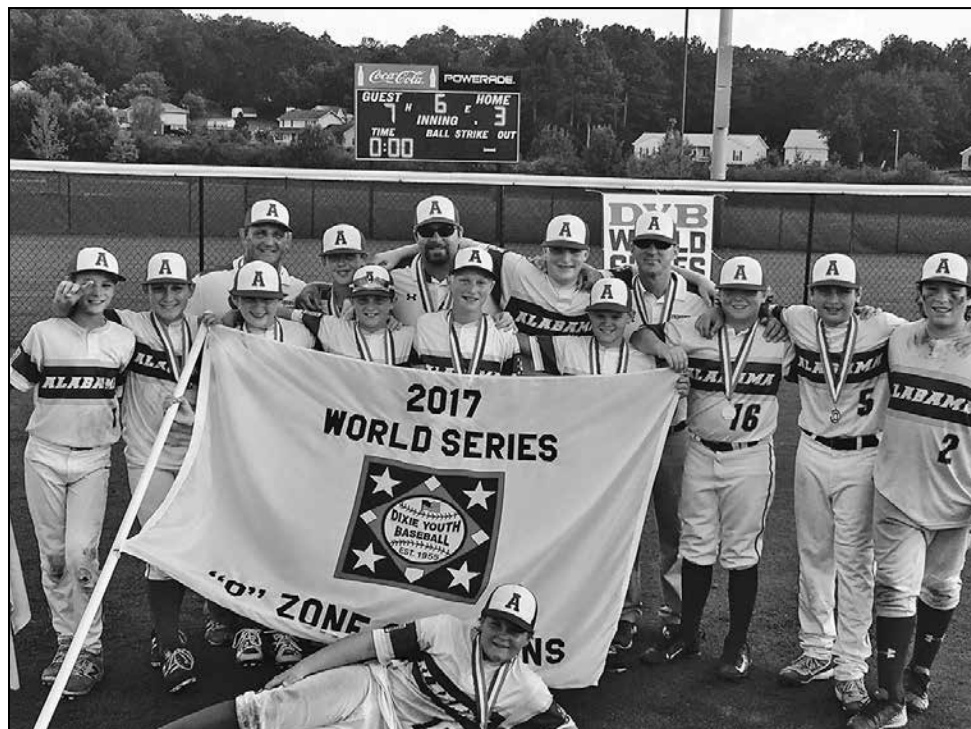

Early contests kickoff 2017 college football

Although Sept. 2 begins the full major college football schedule, there are multiple games being played before that date. There are about half a dozen games on Aug. 26 including a continuing tradition started last year with a game in Sydney, Australia.

The 2017 College Football season starts off with a matchup between the Oregon State Beavers (4-8 last year) at the Colorado State Rams (7-6 last year) on Aug. 26. The Rams will be looking to be a more efficient offense with a healthier quarterback in Nick Stevens. While the Beavers will debut their new starting quarterback Jake Lutton who hopes to make the 110th ranked passing offense better. The Rams return eight defensive starters from last year and WR Michael Gallup, who accounted for 76 receptions for 1,272 yards and 14 touchdowns last season. The Rams have a 51.1 percent chance (ESPN.com) to beat the Beavers.

The San Jose State Spartans (4-8 last season) will be hosting the (coaches poll) No. 21 South Florida Bulls (11-2 last season), who through only one offseason with a new head coach are expected to be a New Year's bowl-game contender. The Spartans must be able to stop an offense that returns seven starters last season and was

ranked fourth in the nation in points per game (43.8) and fifth in rushing (285.3 yards per game). This is largely due to quarterback Quinton Flowers, who will

be a Heisman dark-horse candidate. Also, South Florida has a new coach in Charlie Strong (formerly from Texas) who will coach near his strongest recruiting spot in the Miami area.

Last year, the first game of the season was an early matchup between California over Hawaii (51-31) in Sydney, Australia. This season, the Sydney game will be between the No. 14 Stanford Cardinal (10-3 last season) and Rice Owls (3-9 last season). Cardinal quarterback Keller Chryst will start after recovering from an ACL tear in the bowl game last year. Stanford returns eight starters on a defense that was ranked 18 in the nation in points allowed per game (20.4) including Harrison Phillips, who had 10 tackles for loss and seven sacks last season. With little room to improve, the Rice Owls may not recover much and only have a 1.7 percent chance (ESPN.com) to beat Stanford.

ESPN's College GameDay will have their first show on Aug. 31 for a special kickoff between conference foes No. 2 Ohio State Buckeyes (11-2

last season) at the Indiana Hoosiers (6-7 last season). The Buckeyes are not only favorites to win the Big Ten conference but also favorites to go to the College Football Playoffs. Ohio State returns eight offensive starters from last year including long-time starter in quarterback J.T. Barrett. Former Hoosiers head coach Kevin Wilson joins the Buckeyes as co-offensive coordinator. Indiana is hoping to leap over the label of average with a win over the Buckeyes. Hoosiers linebacker Tegray Scales (team returning leader in tackles with 126 and sacks with seven) will lead a more efficient defense that returns nine starters.

The Arkansas Razorbacks (7-6 last season) will kick off their season earlier than most teams on Aug. 31 by hosting the Florida A&M Rattlers (4-7 last season). ESPN.com gives the Razorbacks a 99.6 percent chance to beat the Rattlers. Austin Allen (threw for 3,430 yards and 25 touchdowns), Rawleigh Williams (rushed for 1,360 yards), and pre-season All-American center Frank Ragnow will lead a potential and high-power offense. Though the Razorbacks are expecting to have a below average defense, they can fix their adjustments and problems early against Florida A&M. Visit ESPN.com for more schedule information.

Prior to joining the Academy, Ramsey spent four years as a lecturer at the University of North Georgia for the Department of Health and Physical Education and Recreation. He was also the CEO and a licensed massage therapist at Dynamic Therapeutics in Gainesville, Ga., where he provided medical massage, trigger point and myofascial release, and proprioceptive neuromuscular facilitation, as well as Swedish and cranio-sacral therapy.

Ramsey received his Ph.D. degree in physical education and sport studies/biomechanics from the University of Georgia in Athens, Ga., in 2002. He

received his Master of Science degree in exercise science/biomechanics in 1998 and his Bachelor of Science degree in physics/mathematics in 1996, both from Georgia State University in Atlanta.

Throughout his career and education, Ramsey has completed many funded research projects. The most recent was in 2013, the Veterans to Veterans Home Winterization Project. This project was funded by Home Depot Foundation and through collaboration with the Northwest Georgia Homeless Veterans Shelter in Winder, Ga., the group was able to enhance the living conditions of approximately 30 homeless veterans.

At the Academy, Ramsey has been involved in an extensive program to reduce the impact of concussion on high school football players through education and medical intervention.

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Follow guidelines for successful wildlife food plots

Now is the time to knock back the weeds and undesirable plants in wildlife openings by mowing or herbicide application. If the proper amount of lime wasn't applied in the spring, go ahead and try to get the soil to the proper pH as soon as possible. Hunters and landowners can determine how food plots are utilized by building a small enclosure in the middle of the field.

Early August means that kids and parents are frenetically preparing for the opening of the new school year, and we hunters are looking for every opportunity to remind us that the hunting seasons are not far away.

With attention focused on the future seasons and what will lead to successful outings, hunters could possibly be playing catch-up if their preparations didn't start earlier this year, according to Chris Cook, Deer Project Study Leader with the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources' Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries (WFF) Division.

"What you should have done back in spring is get soil samples and correct any problems with soil pH," Cook said. "If you haven't already done that, any lime application is not going to have time to be effective this fall. But go ahead and soil test and apply the proper lime, if needed, but don't expect to see the results by the time you plant your fall crops."

Whether the soil has been amended to attain the proper pH or not, Cook says it's time to tackle the undesirable plants that inevitably pop up in the wildlife openings.

"The best thing you can do right now is start working on weed control to help make sure you will be able to prepare a

really good seed bed to get the seed in contact with the soil," he said.

"This will allow the seeds to germinate and grow the best they can.

"A lot of people, instead of bushhogging the fields, will spray the fields with glyphosate (Roundup and equivalents), which makes it a whole lot easier to disc it up. When you spray a field, you don't have to deal with all that green vegetation after you mow it. And it will limit the weed and grass competition if you spray it before it forms seed heads."

For those who don't have the proper equipment to spray or large enough equipment to easily prepare the seed bed, Cook suggests multiple mowings, depending on the rainfall that occurs in the next several weeks, to get ready to prepare the seedbed. Cook also suggests proper maintenance of equipment.

"You also need to make sure you've got the equipment you need for planting and it's all functional," he said. "You've got people who don't get back to the hunting camp after turkey season closes until it gets close to the start of deer season. Sometimes those hunting-lease tractors are not the best, and you need to make sure they are functional. Some people won't have the proper equipment to plant those expensive seed blends, so they're wasting their money."

Traditionally, ryegrass has been the most prevalent winter forage planted in wildlife openings, but

plenty of options are available to landowners and leaseholders.

"If you go with your basic big buck mix that every feed and seed store has, it will likely have wheat, oats, clover, ryegrass and possibly some rape or some other brassica like that," Cook said. "If you go with that basic mix, you don't have to worry about ordering beforehand. But if you want to plant some of the different clovers or nontraditional seed mixes, you may need to get with your dealer or co-op and order to make sure you'll have it when you get ready to plant.

"If your primary concern is just to draw deer in during hunting season, it's hard to go wrong with the basic mix of wheat, oats, crimson clover and Austrian winter peas. That combo is hard to beat. It grows well during hunting season and for a little while after hunting season. It's basically attractive by the time that small grain starts germinating. The deer start using it. As the rest of the crop comes on, they'll use it as well."

If you just want to see something green while hunting, Cook said it's hard to beat ryegrass. But the deer may not be using it as much as a multi-species crop.

"Ryegrass will grow basically anywhere," he said. "If there's a little bit of sand in a parking lot, it will grow. And once you plant it, it produces a lot of seeds. So you'll see it in future food plots unless you mow it down before it produces a seed

head. It's great for cattle grazing during the winter, but better options are available for deer food plots."

Cook said those who plant just ryegrass or another single cereal grain are rolling the dice.

"Anytime you plant a single crop you have two issues," he said. "There's always the possibility of not getting a good stand. For some reason, those particular growing conditions don't suit that particular seed. By growing a single crop, you don't have the benefit of plants growing at different stages. Deer will change their preferences for plants, even wild plants, depending on what stage of growth they're in. Plants will be more palatable at different times.

"If you have a monoculture out there, you may not get the use you want on the food plots. If you have a lot of rain and a lot of acorns, the grass may get knee-high before the deer start using it. Then it may not be as attractive to the deer."

As farmers and those who maintain food plots know, timing can have a great effect on the success of the crop. That timing includes a weather component, but it doesn't appear Alabama will be stuck in drought conditions like last year as fall approaches.

"If the rain continues and the temperatures are fairly mild, you need to anticipate that the native plants will hang on a little longer and provide a food source for the deer that they wouldn't have in a year when it's re-



ally dry and really hot," Cook said. "If we have these conditions through August, people probably need to hold off on planting their food plots."

"To me, Labor Day is too early to be planting plots anywhere in Alabama. People are tempted to get the food plots finished in September, but if we keep having rain, those plants may get up pretty tall and not be as palatable. You can also run into issues with army worms, which can take the crop down to the ground. To play it safe, I don't recommend planting until October 1."

One of the most common mistakes Cook sees in wildlife plantings is a misappropriation of food-plot funds.

"I see people putting their resources into buying the most expensive seeds and then not getting the soil prepared like it should be," he said.

"People can waste a lot of money if they don't get the soil tested. And a lot of people will buy expensive seeds and go cheap on the fertilizer."

Cook said a ballpark figure for the recommended application rate of a balanced fertilizer like triple-13 is 300 to 400 pounds per acre.

"Most people don't do half that, and they double the seed rate," he said. "They're putting more plants out there and not giving them enough nutrients to grow. That and not taking the time to prepare the seedbed to where you have good seed-to-soil contact are the biggest mistakes I see."

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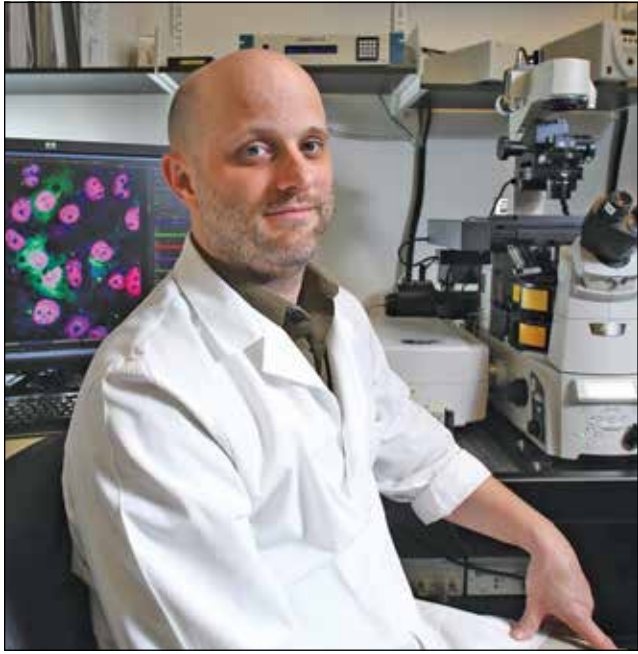

To properly, and fully, destroy something, you first have to understand it.

Joel Andrews, Ph.D., spends his days learning how cancer cells behave: how they are different from other cells, and how we can use those differences to eradicate them.

Andrews is a research assistant professor of oncologic sciences and manager of the Cellular and Biomolecular Imaging Facility

at USA Mitchell Cancer Institute. There he is part of a team that is developing cutting edge technology. In fact the institute is home to many instruments that are not found at any other research facility or hospital in Alabama.

Next week he is speaking in Baldwin County to give the general public a closer look at some of the exciting research happening right across the bay.

"I think it is a chance to show people what we actu-

ally do in the lab on a day to day basis and how that relates to the overall strategy to defeating cancer," he said.

In next week's gathering, Andrews will discuss how lasers are used to manipulate cells in experiments and examine how cells repair damage to their DNA. The differences in the ways cancer cells repair that damage, as opposed to regular cells, could be the key to developing new treatments, and eventually, finding a cure.

Live, Love, Run

George Freeman says there is indeed a secret to life and longevity: running.

It's also his best remedy for answering a tough question.

"When you've got a problem on your hands and you've got to find the solution or do some thinking, nine times out of ten you can figure it out after a run," says the 86-year-old athlete from Foley.

It doesn't hurt to win a few medals when you finish either.

Freeman has earned dozens of medals from races across the United States, including six turns at the Boston Marathon. This summer he returned from his 15th visit to the National Senior Games where Freeman was just one of eight athletes to have attended all of the bi-annual games.

"I've been to all of them, 30 years of my life," Freeman says. "The next one is in New Mexico in 2019. I've never been there but I sure plan on

going."

And in 2019, Freeman is returning to the games as a runner. In this summer's games, he opted to bowl. He left without a win.

"My feet were sticky. For some reason I picked up enough resistance that I couldn't slide. That's my alibi," he says with a laugh.

Freeman began running in college. He continued daily runs even while working as a high school guidance counselor and managing a beef farm in New York. Freeman often



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ran with the high school sports teams he coached.

He helped grow his school's cross country team from eight boys to 50 boys and girls. He coached girls' basketball before game rules allowed those players to cross the half court line. He is pleased to see girls' sports grow and prosper.

He raised his own daughter to become a marathon runner. She teaches in Michigan and encourages her students to be active. Every month she chooses a student of the month to receive one of the hundreds of medals her father has earned on the track. The students write him letters of thanks, and admiration.

"I love to run. That's

me," he says. "It keeps the weight down. I don't have any disease, diabetes or high blood pressure."

Freeman comes from a family of seven children. Four are still living, though he says two of his siblings are in bad shape with arthritis and other ailments. Freeman says his daily runs have kept him disease-free.

"Two years ago I had arthritis on my knee but I kept on running it and it got better," he says.

If the sun is up, and the weather is favorable, chances are Freeman is already out on the track or the golf course. He encourages everyone he meets to get out and exercise.

"Take it easy early

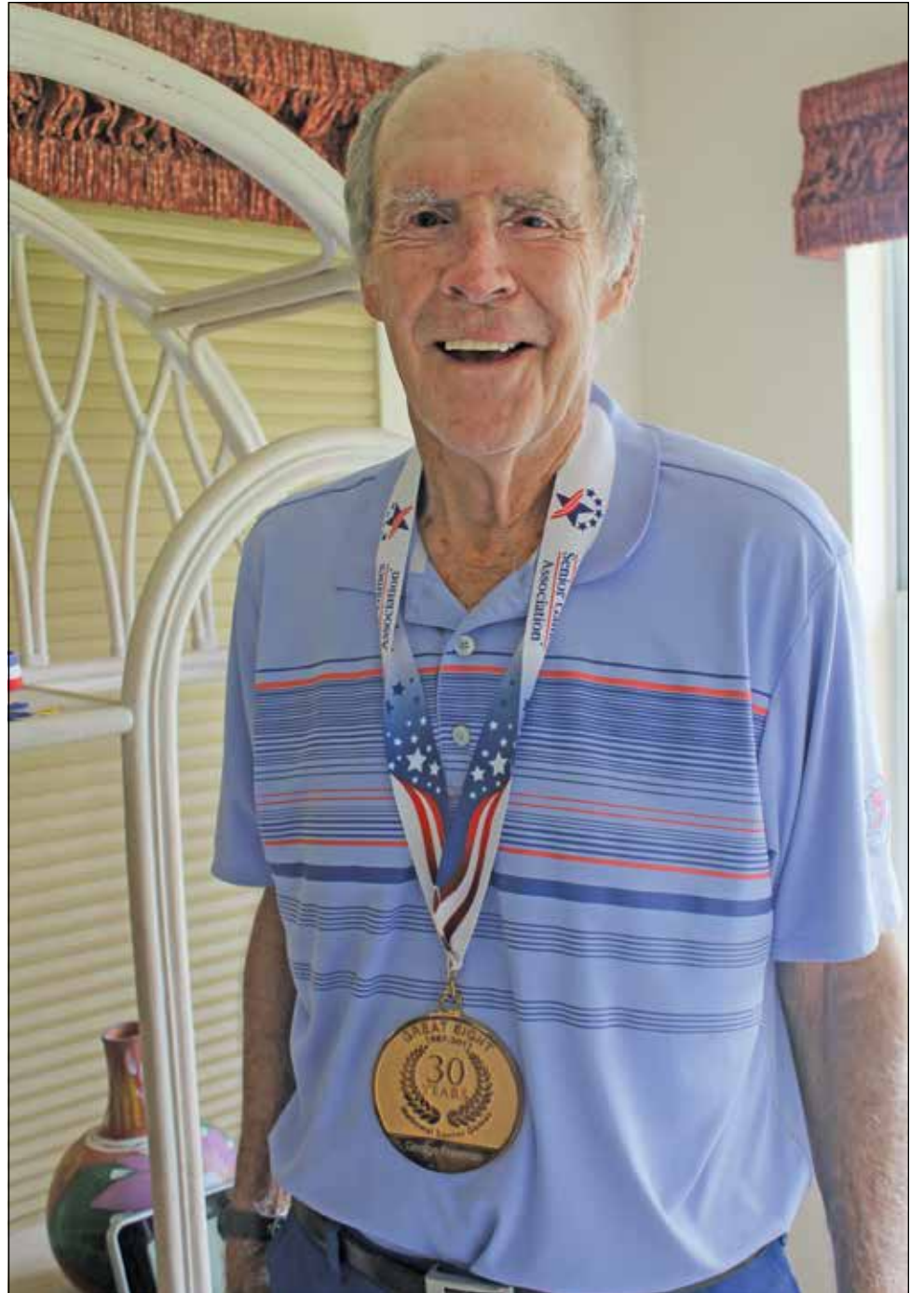
on, get into the habit," he says. "Fitness is a lifetime adventure. Once you get into it, you will enjoy the rest of your life."

And, you might win a few medals along the way too.

Freeman says as he ages, more and more baby boomers, including former Olympians, enter the National Senior Games. This year a 104-year-old man entered the races.

Some years, the competition is tough. Others, time catches up with the group of athletes.

"The older we get the easier it gets," he says with a mischievous smile. "The competition all start dying off."

Ordinance: 17-2031

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE TAXICABS AND VEHICLES FOR HIRE IN THE CITY OF FOLEY (NOT TO INCLUDE "TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES") AND TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 1018-07

WHEREAS, the City of Foley sees the need to update its requirements for taxicabs and vehicles for hire.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOLEY, ALABAMA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: DEFINITIONS

Unless the context clearly indicates a different meaning, the following words and phrases, wherever used in this article, shall have the meanings respectively described to them in this section:

Bus: Any vehicle designed, constructed or used for the transportation of 16 or more passengers, including the driver, or any vehicle required to obtain commercial licenses and permits pursuant to state and federal laws governing commercial vehicles.

Business License: The license required by Ordinance No. 1018-07 to operate a taxicab or limousine within the City.

City: The City of Foley and its police jurisdiction.

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Driver/Operator: Any person engaged in the business of operating a taxicab or limousine within the City or its police jurisdiction.

Limousine: A motor vehicle used in the business of transporting passengers for hire in the city or its police jurisdiction, not operated on a fixed route. Limousines are unmettered, unmarked, ground transportation vehicles regularly engaged in the business of transporting passengers on a pre-reserved basis only. Provided, however, the classification "limousine" shall not apply to a motor vehicle which is:
1. Classified as a taxicab as herein defined.
2. Used exclusively by or under a written agreement with a hotel, motel, airport, hospital, club or other such entity for the transportation of its members, guests, patients or clients; provided, that each vehicle under such agreement will have the same distinctive visible outside painted appearance as each other vehicle under the agreement to any such hotel, motel, airport, hospital, club or other such entity.

Owner: A person owning or controlling one or more taxicabs or limousines and driving or causing such vehicle to be driven within the city or its police jurisdiction.

Passenger: A person or persons other than the driver, who is an occupant of a taxicab or limousine, who for the purposes of this article, is presumed to be a passenger or passengers for hire.

Person: An individual partnership, firm, association, corporation or any other legal entity.

Taxicab: A metered general transportation vehicle regularly engaged in the business of transporting passengers. Any automobile or similar vehicle having a seating capacity limited to the number of passengers for which there is an operational, manufacturer-installed seatbelt for each individual passenger, engaged in carrying passengers for hire other than along a fixed route. Provided, however, the classification of "taxicab" shall not apply to any motor vehicle which is:
1. Classified as a limousine as herein defined.
2. Used exclusively by or under a written agreement with a hotel, motel, airport, hospital, club or other such entity for the transportation of its members, guests, patients or clients; provided, that each vehicle under such agreement will have the same distinctive outside painted appearance as each other vehicle under the agreement to any such hotel, motel, airport, hospital, club or other such entity.

Terminal: The fixed base of operations from which the applicant proposes to conduct the taxicab or limousine business.

SECTION 2: IDENTIFICATION OF VEHICLES

(a) All taxicabs shall have words "taxi" or "taxicab", in printed letters, permanently affixed, on at least one door on each side of the taxicab in letters not less than four inches in height and of corresponding width, in paint of a different color from that of the remainder of the door so as to be easily read.

(b) All taxicabs shall have a number displayed on both sides of the body of each taxicab on the front end and rear of each taxicab in numerals of at least three inches in height. Any person with more than one taxicab shall have a different number displayed on each taxicab.

(c) All taxicabs shall have the name of the corporation or person that is the owner or operator affixed on both sides of the taxicab in letters not less than four inches in height and corresponding width, in a different color from that of the remainder of the door so as to be easily read.

(d) All taxicabs and limousines shall have the appropriate decals provided by the City of Foley clearly visible and affixed to the vehicle. These decals will be issued upon successful completion of the vehicle inspection and issuance of the City of Foley business license.

SECTION 3: INSPECTION OF VEHICLES

The Chief of Police (or designee) shall inspect, or cause to be inspected, every taxicab or limousine operating in the city or its police jurisdiction, prior to approval of the vehicle for licensure and as often as such Chief (or designee) may deem necessary to determine whether such vehicle is in a safe condition to be operated as a taxicab or limousine. When the Chief of Police (or designee)

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notifies the person engaged in the business of operating a taxicab or limousine that an inspection is to be made, such person shall submit the vehicle for inspection at the time and place specified by such officer. Nothing herein shall prevent the Chief of Police (or designee) from inspecting any taxicab or limousine at any reasonable time that such officer sees fit and, if the vehicle is found to be in a defective condition, to order its use as a taxicab or limousine discontinued until it has been approved. A complete record shall be kept by the Chief of Police (or designee) of all inspections made. Each taxicab and limousine shall be equipped with the following, each of which must be kept in good working order:

- (1) Tires in good condition with acceptable tread depth;
- (2) Headlights;
- (3) Tail Lights;
- (4) Turn Indicator Lights;
- (5) Brake Lights;
- (6) Emergency/Parking Brake;
- (7) Unbroken Windshield;
- (8) Safety Belts for Driver & Passengers;
- (9) Unbroken Rear window and other glass;
- (10) Windshield Wipers;
- (11) Doors (Open/Close/Lock);
- (12) Horn;
- (13) Bumpers;
- (14) Muffler and Exhaust System;
- (15) Interior & Exterior rear/side view mirrors;
- (16) Interior in good, clean condition

(17) No vehicle should be a model year of more than ten years prior to the calendar year in which the inspection is performed, with an exception for "vintage" vehicles, as long as all of the above listed criteria is met.

If any vehicle fails to meet any of the above listed requirements, such vehicle shall be deemed to be an unserviceable vehicle and unfit for public use and may be removed from service until the vehicle is brought into compliance. No person shall operate any taxicab or limousine which has been wrecked or damaged until such vehicle has been repaired and brought into compliance with this article.

SECTION 4: PROOF OF INSURANCE

Applicant shall present a current insurance certificate for an amount not less than that required by the rules and regulations for motor carriers of the Alabama Public Service Commission.

SECTION 5: DRIVER QUALIFICATIONS

No person shall be approved to operate a taxicab or limousine who:

- (a) Has been convicted, within the past seven years of driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol, fraud, sexual offenses, use of a motor vehicle to commit a felony, a crime involving property damage and/or thefts, acts of violence or terrorism that constitutes a felony under the Anti-Terrorism Act of 2002, or a similar felony offense under the laws of another jurisdiction
- (b) Is a match in the National Sex Offender Public Website
- (c) Has accumulated more than three (3) moving violations or a major driving violation, including but not limited to attempting to evade the police, reckless driving or driving on a suspended or revoked license, during the three year period prior to the driving history check
- (d) Does not possess a valid driver's license, or who is under nineteen (19) years of age

SECTION 6: DRIVER IDENTIFICATION

All drivers of a taxicab or limousine shall, upon approval of the Police Chief (or designee) provide a passport-size photograph to the City. This photograph will be used to create a driver's identification card, which will be issued by the Revenue Division at no cost to the applicant, and is to be displayed in the vehicle in a conspicuous location.

SECTION 7: DRIVER APPEARANCE AND CONDUCT

- (a) All drivers of taxicabs or limousines shall be neat and clean in appearance.
- (b) No driver of a taxicab or limousine shall be discourteous or use vulgar or profane language while on duty.
- (c) No driver of a taxicab or limousine, while in charge of operating the same, shall be under the influence of, or have any alcoholic beverages in his possession.
- (d) No driver of any taxicab or limousine shall consume or be under the influence of any prescription or nonprescription drugs which impairs driving ability while on duty.
- (e) Every driver, upon request to do so, shall give to any person who

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has been a passenger in the vehicle, or who is about to become a passenger in the vehicle, or to any police officer, the license number and name of such driver and the license number of such vehicle.

SECTION 8: REFUSAL OF PASSENGERS

It shall be unlawful for any person engaged in the operation of a taxicab business in the city or its police jurisdiction, or the driver of any taxicab, to refuse, without sufficient cause, to carry any passenger, including handicapped persons with seeing-eye dogs, to any designation in the city or its police jurisdiction designated by the passenger; provided, however, that no person shall be required to carry any person who is intoxicated or disorderly or who is afflicted with a contagious or infectious disease, or who refuses to pay in advance when requested to do so, or who, for other reasons, deemed adequate by the court, shall be excluded.

SECTION 9: PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, for each offense, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$500.00, and may also be imprisoned in the City or County jail for a period of no more than six (6) months, either or both.

SECTION 10: AMENDS CITY OF FOLEY ORDINANCE NO. 1018-07

Section 25 (g) shall be amended to read as follows: Must meet all requirements of City of Foley Ordinance No. 17-2031 or any subsequent ordinance regulating taxicabs and limousines.

Ordinance: 17-2032

Amendments to Ordinance for Control, Collection and Disposal of Refuse

WHEREAS the City of Foley, Alabama adopted Ordinance No. 13-1034 on 1st day of July, 2013, providing for the Control, Collection, and Disposal of Refuse.

WHEREAS the City of Foley, Alabama repeals Ordinance 13-1034 to provide for the modification for refuse control, collection, and disposal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the aforementioned Ordinance be stricken and replaced to read as follows:

Section 1 Title and Purpose

This article shall be known and may be cited as the "Ordinance for Control, Collection and Disposal of Refuse." In order to serve the public health, safety and welfare, the declared purpose of this article is to prohibit and order the abatement of certain public nuisances within the city that are defined in this article.

Section 2 Definitions

The following words and terms when used in this ordinance shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by this section, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

- (a) "Bulk Waste" shall mean furniture, appliances (white goods), and other large items not of a typical household daily garbage.
- (b) "City" shall mean the City of Foley, an Alabama municipal corporation.
- (c) "City limits" shall mean the corporate boundaries of the city.
- (d) "Collector" shall mean the City or its collection contractor engaged in the transportation or collection of solid waste.
- (e) "Commercial premises" shall mean any lot or any building, or part thereof, used in connection with or for the carrying on or any business, trade, occupation or profession for which a license is required by the city.
- (f) "Construction, clearing and demolition debris" shall mean materials that are not water soluble and non hazardous in nature, including but not limited to steel, glass, brick, concrete, asphalt, roofing materials, pipe, gypsum wallboard, and lumber, from a construction or demolition project and including rocks, soils, trees and tree debris, and other vegetative matter which normally results

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from land clearing operations associated with construction.

(g) "Construction Debris Container" shall mean containers, bins, dumpsters, or enclosed areas by fencing used to store construction scrap and debris until removal.

(h) "Contractor" shall mean a business that is required to be licensed by the City of Foley and/or charges a fee for services.

(i) "Curbside" shall mean the area within five feet of the edge of the traveled portion of any public or private street affording reasonable access to waste collection vehicles, but only such portion thereof as lies on the roadway side of any drainage ditch.

(j) "Customer" shall mean any person, persons, firm or corporation who shall place garbage, rubbish, residential or commercial waste or yard waste for pickup and disposal by the collector and who pays fees accordingly.

(k) "Garbage" shall mean materials resulting from the preparation, cooking, and serving of food, market wastes, trimmings and other discarded matter from meat or produce, including packaging materials and containers and other refuse as defined as putrescible waste.

(l) "Garbage Container" shall mean a City issued container used for temporary storage of residential or commercial waste.

(m) "Hazardous Waste" shall mean solid waste, or a combination of solid wastes, which, because of its quantity, concentration, or physical, chemical or infectious characteristics, may cause or significantly contribute to, an increase in mortality or an increase in serious irreversible or incapacitating reversible illness or may pose a substantial present or potential hazard to human health or the environment when improperly transported, disposed of, stored, treated, or otherwise managed and including any materials specifically designated by state or federal agencies.

(n) "Household Hazardous Waste" shall mean hazardous waste generated solely by a residential household. This shall include but is not limited to tires, batteries, used oil, paints and paint thinners, anti-freeze, fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, and chemicals.

(o) "Household Waste" shall mean any combination of garbage and rubbish common to housekeeping and generated solely by residents in an ordinary course of residential occupancy of a premises, excluding major appliances furniture, automobile bodies and parts, tires, and any other bulky items not conducive to confinement in the garbage container.

(p) "Litter" shall mean all garbage, refuse, uncontainerized man-made solid waste, including but not limited to, paper, plastic, diapers, cigarette butts, bottles, cans, glass, scrap metal, construction materials, rubbish, disposal packages or containers.

(q) "Occupant," as applied to any house, building, store, shop, room, lot or premises; the owner, tenant or other person who for the time being is in possession or is in charge or control thereof, whether for such person's self or for another, or as agent, officer or employee of a corporation.

(r) "Premises" shall mean any residential, commercial, or industrial lot or parcel of land which is improved for occupancy.

(s) "Recyclable Materials" shall mean solid waste items that can be transformed into new products where the original products lose their identity. The City shall designate the materials to be recycled, separation procedures, and provide recyclable containers for this purpose.

(t) "Rubbish" shall mean waste materials which are not water soluble, not putrescent, non hazardous, not biological waste, and are likely to retain most physical and chemical properties under the conditions of disposal, and do not threaten ground or surface waters. Rubbish includes but is not limited to paper, glass, cardboard, cloth, and similar materials. Rubbish does not include yard waste.

(u) "Solid Waste" shall mean refuse such as garbage, rubbish, yard waste, bulk waste, construction and demolition waste or other discarded materials.

(v) "Yard Waste" shall mean material resulting from performing landscape maintenance on premises, including but not limited to grass clippings, leaves, twigs, small trees (six inch diameter or less) and other materials not resulting from lot or land clearing operations. Yard waste may only contain vegetative debris and may not include plastics or metals.

Section 3 Occupant's Responsibility

It shall be a violation of this ordinance for any occupant of

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property in the city limits who generates litter or solid waste to fail to insure that the litter or solid waste is managed, stored and handled in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 4 Required Service

A. Except as provided in Subsection C of Section 4 below, every person, household, business or industry generating solid waste in the corporate limits of the City of Foley, and every owner of rental or lease property whose occupants generate solid waste in the City of Foley shall subscribe to a garbage collection program offered by the city or its contractor and shall pay fees accordingly as set by the City.

B. All mobile home parks, as defined by the City of Foley Zoning Ordinance and apartment complexes over four dwelling units shall be required to obtain garbage collection by dumpster services through the City of Foley Revenue Department. Exceptions may be granted by the City Public Works Department when requested in writing based upon space limitations.

C. It shall be unlawful for any person to transport, haul or carry garbage or solid waste as herein defined, within the ways, streets or alleys within the corporate limits of the city, without first there being placed on file with the city clerk a copy of a valid permit issued by a county health department showing the right of the person to use a sanitary landfill provided in the county of that department, and if such permit is presented the vehicle or container in which the same is to be carried or hauled must not permit any leaking, spilling, or blowing of the waste and must be adequately secured and covered in a manner approved by the city and the county health department.

Section 5 Fees

Monthly charges for various types and frequency of waste collections shall be set by the City, and may be amended by the City as needed by resolution. Residential customer fees and shall be charged to the customer on the monthly utility bill. Nonpayment of fees is a violation of this Ordinance. City garbage containers will be removed for three months of nonpayment and service discontinued until payments are brought current. Fee exemptions exist for customers whose sole household income is social security benefits or total household income is less than fifty-five hundred dollars per year. Exemptions shall be verified through the Foley City Clerk. Commercial dumpster customers shall be charged a fee through a monthly invoice from Foley City Hall.

Section 6 Household Waste Containerization and Removal

Household waste shall be regulated under the following conditions:

(a) Household waste shall be placed in garbage containers provided by the City and shall be sufficient in number to containerize the waste generated by the premises between collections. The customer shall immediately retrieve and containerize any and all waste spilled from garbage containers.

(b) All garbage containers for household waste shall be placed on curbside no sooner than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the designated day for collection. Garbage containers shall be removed from curbside within 24 hours of pickup.

(c) Household waste shall be collected at least once a week as scheduled by the Sanitation Department.

(d) It shall be a violation of this article for any owner or occupant of private property to fail to keep their premises free and clear of litter, garbage, trash, junk, high grass and weeds that constitute a public nuisance.

(e) It shall be a violation of this article to blow, sweep or push litter, junk or trash, including yard clippings, leaves or grass, onto city streets, alleys, stormwater structures or ditches. All litter and trash shall be deposited into a garbage container that is tightly covered and secured to prevent scattering before pickup.

Section 7 Yard Waste

Yard waste shall be regulated under the following conditions:

(a) Yard waste generated by a contractor shall not be collected as it is the contractor's responsibility for disposal.

(b) Yard waste shall be kept separate and apart from household rubbish and garbage for City solid waste collection. Yard waste shall not be collected by the Sanitation Department if rubbish, garbage, plastics and/or metals are combined.

(c) Residential and commercial yard debris from lawn mainte-

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nance or landscaping that occurs on premises that are occupied and have City garbage service shall be collected by the City. Yard waste shall be limited to six (6) cubic yards per weekly pickup. Excessive yard waste will be charged one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per load (20 cubic yards) over the initial pickup.

(d) Yard waste shall be placed on curbside for collection. The yard waste shall be piled adjacent to the garbage container. Yard waste such as leaves or lawn clippings may be placed in biodegradable yard waste bags which should then be placed adjacent to the garbage container. Plastic bags will not be collected as yard waste.

(e) Yard waste may include grass clippings, leaves, trees or parts of trees not more than six inches in diameter and cut to less than six feet in length. Yard waste shall not include tree stumps.

Section 8 Recyclable Waste

Recyclable materials included in the City service are newspapers, tin and aluminum cans, plastic jugs such as milk and soda containers, broken down cardboard, and office paper. Recyclable materials shall be placed in the provided receptacle. Recyclables are collected once a week as scheduled by the Sanitation Department or its designee.

Section 9 Bulk Waste

Bulk waste generated by the customer shall be scheduled for pickup through the Sanitation Department prior to placement on curbside. Bulk waste shall include furniture, appliances, and other large items not of typical household garbage. No items shall be placed earlier than three days before the scheduled pickup. Multi family residential units and mobile home parks with City dumpster service may pay a monthly fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for bulk pickups on twice a month basis.

Section 10 Special Pick Up

All commercial, residential, rental and lease properties that require a special pick up of garbage or yard waste shall be charged a fee of sixty dollars (\$60.00) per hour plus associated landfill charges for the disposal.

Section 11 Construction and Demolition Debris

Premises under construction or demolition through a licensed contractor permitted by the City shall be required to obtain a licensed independent contractor permitted in the collection and transportation of construction and demolition debris. Minor home repair construction debris (under 4 cubic yards) produced by the homeowner may be collected by the Sanitation Department. The Building Official or his designee shall be allowed to enter and inspect the premises for compliance. The contractor shall be responsible for the following:

(a) Construction and demolition debris shall be contained in a construction debris container so as to prohibit the migration of the debris off of the premises.

(b) Dumpsters shall not be placed on City streets and must be located on property owned by the customer.

(c) Construction debris shall be regularly collected by the collector. Construction debris containers shall be safely accessible to facilitate removal. Construction debris containers that have been filled to capacity shall be removed within one week.

(d) Construction debris shall not accumulate in work areas, passageways, stairs in and around buildings, and drainage ways.

(e) Construction and demolition debris shall not be mixed with garbage. Separate garbage containers shall be used for the disposal of the garbage.

(f) Hazardous waste and materials contaminated by hazardous waste shall not be disposed in construction debris container. Contractor shall ensure proper disposal as required by state and federal regulations. Hazardous waste generated shall be stored in a covered container until disposal. Storage of these materials shall not be located in a drainage way.

(g) Disposal of construction and demolition debris, including clearing debris, by burning shall comply with local fire department, state, and federal regulations.

Section 12 Dead Animal Disposal

Dead animals located in the corporate limits of the City right-of-way, not in excess of fifty pounds in weight will be picked up by the Sanitation Department. The Sanitation Department shall not remove dead animals from places of business making a business of treating, handling, or disposing of animals. In no event shall any person having a dead animal on the

premises occupied or under control of such person allow it to remain indisposed of for a period of longer than twelve hours. In the event the dead animals must be disposed of on a day other than the regularly designated collection day, the Sanitation Department shall be notified promptly. All dead animals over fifty pounds in weight must be disposed of within twelve hours by the owner.

Section 13 Vehicle Littering

A. It shall be a violation of this article for any person in a vehicle to drop, deposit, discard or otherwise dispose of litter in or upon any public or private property within the city, including but not restricted to, any street, median, right-of way, sidewalk, park, vacant or occupied lot, body of water, except in litter receptacles, or in an area designated by the department of environmental management as a permitted disposal site. The owner of the motor vehicle shall be responsible in the event that any person commits the following unlawful acts while in a motor vehicle, whether it is moving or at rest.

B. It shall be an unlawful violation of this ordinance for any person, hauler, firm or business to haul garbage, paper, trash, sand, gravel, wet cement, construction materials, other loose materials or waste unless the truck or used vehicle is properly covered, secured or sealed to the extent that there will be nothing to prevent any loss or spillage during haulage, any littering of streets and highways or nuisances or hazards to the public health. The deposit of sand or other substance to increase traction, or of water or other substance applied on a street or roadway in the cleaning or maintenance of such street or roadway by the responsible government agency having such responsibilities, is excepted from the foregoing provision. Any person charged with a violation of this section shall be required to appear before a municipal judge.

C. Any person cleaning litter or junk from a private premises and operating a vehicle on a public right-of-way in the city limits from which any glass, nails or other sharp objects have fallen or escaped, which could cause an obstruction or damage a vehicle or otherwise endanger travelers on such public property, shall immediately cause the public property to be cleared of such objects and shall pay any costs thereof. It shall be a violation of this article to fail to comply with this subsection.

Section 14 Dumping of Litter

A. It shall be an unlawful violation of this article for any person to discard or dump any litter, garbage, trash or junk on any private or public property unless disposed of in receptacles provided for public use that comply with the requirement of this ordinance or in an area designated by the state department of environmental management as a permitted disposal site.

B. For the purposes of this section, items found in an accumulation of garbage, trash, or other discarded material, including but not limited to, bank statements, utility bills, bank card bills, and other financial documents, clearly bearing the name of a person shall constitute a rebuttable presumption that the person whose name appears thereon knowingly deposited the litter. Advertising, marketing, and campaign materials and campaign literature shall not be sufficient to constitute a rebuttable presumption under this section. No prosecution for violation of this section based on evidence that creates a rebuttable presumption shall be brought against a person unless he or she has been given written notice by a designee of the city that items found in an accumulation of garbage, trash, or other discarded materials contain his or her name, and that, under this section, there is a rebuttable presumption that he or she knowingly deposited the litter. The notice shall advise the person of the penalty for violating this section, and shall provide that, unless the person can present satisfactory information or evidence to rebut the presumption to the designee of the city within fifteen (15) days of the date of the notice, an action under this section may be filed against him or her in municipal court. If the person responds to the notice and presents information or evidence to the code enforcement officer of the city, the code enforcement officer shall review the information or evidence presented and make a determination as to whether or not an action should be brought against the person for violating this section.

C. For the purposes of this section, items found in an accumulation of garbage, trash, or other discarded materials contain his or her name, and that, under this section, there is a rebuttable presumption that he or she knowingly deposited the litter. The notice shall advise the person of the penalty for violating this section, and shall provide that, unless the person can present satisfactory information or evidence to rebut the presumption to the designee of the city within fifteen (15) days of the date of the notice, an action under this section may be filed against him or her in municipal court. If the person responds to the notice and presents information or evidence to the code enforcement officer of the city, the code enforcement officer shall review the information or evidence presented and make a determination as to whether or not an action should be brought against the person for violating this section.

(b) Dumpsters shall not be placed on City streets and must be located on property owned by the customer.

(c) Construction debris shall be regularly collected by the collector. Construction debris containers shall be safely accessible to facilitate removal. Construction debris containers that have been filled to capacity shall be removed within one week.

(d) Construction debris shall not accumulate in work areas, passageways, stairs in and around buildings, and drainage ways.

Section 15 Prohibited Acts and Practices

The following acts and practices

are expressly prohibited by this ordinance.

(a) It shall be unlawful to dispose of any hazardous material including household hazardous waste, into a garbage container. These items include but are not limited to batteries, paint, pesticides, oils, chemicals and fertilizers. Household hazardous waste may be taken to the Magnolia Landfill for disposal.

(b) It shall be unlawful to bury, burn, or dispose of solid waste except in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, or as permitted by the Alabama Department of Environmental Management and the Baldwin County Health Department.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person to remove waste from containers placed for removal, except the collector.

(d) It shall be unlawful to dispose of wastes resulting from industrial processes except as provided by local, state, and federal regulations.

(e) It shall be unlawful to dispose of any infectious biohazardous waste except as provided by local, state, and federal regulations.

(f) It shall be unlawful to dispose of tires in garbage containers, bulk waste, yard waste, or placed on curbside. Tires may be taken to the Magnolia Landfill for disposal by the resident.

(g) It shall be unlawful for any contractor to dispose of their business generated wastes in City collected containers.

Section 16 Applicability of Ordinance

Except where otherwise provided, the provisions of this article apply throughout the corporate limits of the city.

Section 17 Enforcement and Violations

A. The Sanitation Department Superintendent or their designee shall be authorized to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance as reasonably necessary. Any person, firm, or corporation that violates any provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment all as set forth in the Code of Alabama Section 11-45-9 (1975) and by Section 1-8 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Foley, Alabama. Each day such owner shall allow a violation to continue, after having received ten (10) days notice from the code enforcement officer to correct or abate same, shall constitute a separate offense.

B. Failure to pay garbage collection rates is a violation of this Ordinance. After 90 days of the account falling into the arrears, the City of Foley shall remove the garbage containers and discontinue services until accounts are current. Furthermore, the City may pursue collection through civil action in the court system.

Section 18 Saving Clause

In the event that any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance shall be declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall in no manner affect the other sections, sentences, clauses or phrases of this ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect, as if the section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part thereof.

Section 19 "The terms and provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part or portion of this ordinance is declared invalid, void, or unconstitutional, that portion shall be deemed severed, and the remaining portions of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect."

Section 20 All ordinances or parts of ordinances, in any manner conflicting herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 21 This ordinance shall become effective upon its publication as required by law.

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Alabama Oyster Shell Recycling Program awarded Fisheries Conservationist of the Year by the Alabama Wildlife Federation

Alabama Oyster Shell Recycling Program of Mobile was recently awarded the Fisheries Conservationist of the Year Award at the 2017 Alabama Wildlife Federation Governor's Conservation Achievement Awards banquet. The Alabama Wildlife Federation (AWF) held the banquet, co-sponsored by Alabama Power Company and PowerSouth Energy on Friday, Aug. 4 at The Marriott Legends at Capitol Hill in Prattville. Governor Kay Ivey provided opening remarks and assisted with presentation of the awards.

The AWF Governor's Conservation Achievement Awards (GCAA) are the most respected conservation honors in the state of Alabama. Over the past 40 years, AWF has presented these awards to individuals and organizations that make great contributions to the conservation of Alabama's wildlife and related natural re-

sources.

In its first year, the Alabama Oyster Shell Recycling Program recycled over 2 million oyster shells from Coastal Alabama restaurants. The collected oyster shells, totaling more than 30 dump truck loads; will allow growth of more oysters, provide habitat, limit erosion and improve water quality.

This project, led by the Alabama Coastal Foundation, uses an inclusive environmental stewardship approach to manage and enhance the oyster resources of Alabama. Last fall, Phase I included the Causeway Route, and Phase 2 is underway in the Gulf Shores and Orange Beach area. Currently, over 30 restaurants are participating in the program, while interests and involvement continue to rise.

When the shells are ready to go back into the water, they are deposited on designated sites in

the waters of Alabama; and become the building blocks of newly restored oyster beds. Not only will new oysters grow; they will provide habitats for Gulf fish and crabs; prevent shoreline erosion; and clean the waters by filtering out silt, sediment and excess nutrients. This pilot recycling program will greatly reduce the loss of this valuable and limited resource to local landfills, and provide a substantial benefit to our coastal marine fisheries and estuaries.



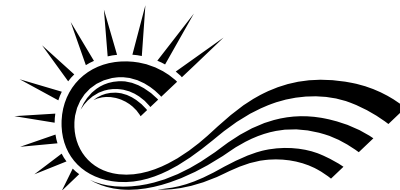

All proceeds from the event went directly to the medical fund of Georgia Byrd, a 13-year old girl fighting synovial sarcoma, an extremely rare soft tissue cancer. Georgia has undergone two major surgeries to remove cancerous masses, has had multiple rounds of chemo and is currently going through radiation.

The early sell-out event and the outpouring of generous donations were a testament to the customer service, longevity and tireless generosity of the Byrd family who owns Nall Printing in Fairhope. The event included a seafood banquet, a public silent auction with over 80 items including golf packages, artwork, casino and spa packages, wine baskets, gift baskets, restaurant gift certificates and a Wind Creek Package Raffle valued at \$330. Thirty volunteers collaborated on the Georgia on Our Mind Benefit. Led
