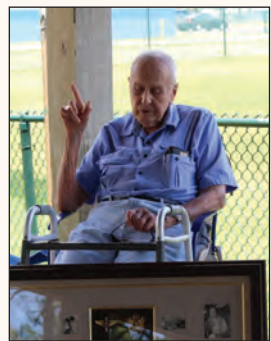

City HR Director files assault claims against Fairhope mayor

A claim has been filed by Fairhope Human Resources

Director Pandora Heathcoe against the city of Fairhope after an alleged assault against Heathcoe by Fairhope Mayor Karin Wilson.

The claim was filed Friday, May 19 with the city clerk's office, according to a confidential source within the city.

Two sources have told Gulf Coast Media the full report contains Heathcoe's narrative about what happened when the alleged assault by Wilson took place and that former Fairhope Public Works Director Jennifer Fidler was present when that incident took place.

Gulf Coast Media has viewed a copy of the claim filed with the city, including a page that contains some of Heathcoe's narrative of what led to the alleged assault.

According to the claim, the incident occurred on Dec. 29, 2016. Heathcoe met with Wilson and Fidler in a meeting where Wilson wanted to create a part-time position and fill it with her campaign volunteer, Lynn Mazer.

Heathcoe wrote she advised the mayor that they needed to create a job description for that position before it could be filled, and said Wilson replied she "didn't care."

Heathcoe wrote she reiterated the position must be a budgeted line item because city rules do not allow for the hiring of new employees in non-budgeted positions.

"Wilson started screaming 'We don't have a f----- budget,'" Heathcoe alleged

in the claim. "While she did so, she shook me violently leaving me dazed. While shaking me, the Mayor yelled 'How many f----- times do I have to tell you to do something?'"

Heathcoe wrote "the mayor's assault and battery" left her injured and emotionally shaken. She added she was unable to carry out her work at top form and it continues to leave her emotionally distressed.

Heathcoe wrote in the claim she had filed a police report with the Fairhope police, but has not proceeded to swear out a warrant against Wilson.

Attached to the claim was a uniform incident/offense report filed earlier this year with the Fairhope Police Department.

The document is dated Dec 29, 2016, and reports a harassment (simple assault) occurred at 1:33 p.m.

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Daphne holds public hearing on 914-lot subdivision

Daphne's city council held a public hearing May 15 on several developments that could be coming soon to the city, including the 914-lot Jubilee Farms development that has garnered some controversy.

According to the developer, the Jubilee Farms project, located on Highway 181 and Austin Road, would take 15 to 20 years to be built out to its full capacity and said plans include 25 percent (or 88.17 acres) of the

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p.m. involving a 59-year-old female victim.

Sgt. Craig Sawyer with the Fairhope Police Department said he could not reveal the name of the victim or the potential suspect due to a departmental policy.

“Our policy prohibits us from naming a victim of an offense if that victim might be called to testify in any judicial proceedings,” Sawyer said.

Sawyer said there was an investigation into that incident by the Fairhope Police Department.

“Because of the obvious conflict of interest between us investigating someone in a potential criminal matter who is in our chain of command, the victim was referred to the county’s magistrates,” Sawyer said. “They can investigate this because it is also within the county jurisdiction as well as the Fairhope jurisdiction. We documented it and referred the victim to the magistrates for the county.”

Sawyer said as of right now, no warrants have been signed and no arrests have been made.

“As with any misdemeanor offense, the victim has one year from the date of the offense to go see a magistrate to sign a warrant,” Sawyer said. “Since this allegedly occurred in December of last year, the victim still has until December to sign a warrant.”

Heathcoe wrote in the claim she is receiving medica-

tion for “her nerves” and the alleged assault continues to affect her ability to work.

She is seeking damages in the amount of \$100,000 against the city.

The claim filed with the city is not a civil claim, but one that procedurally has to be filed with the city before the matter could be taken to a civil court.

While Wilson did not return phone calls from Gulf Coast Media, she did post the following on her official Facebook page Saturday afternoon:

“I remember when I contemplated running for Mayor how worried my husband was for me,” Wilson wrote. “I kept asking him what he thought could happen that would warrant such stress?”

“He’d give me hypothetical situations and I always responded, ‘but that’s not the truth.’ If we allow worry and doubt to control our decisions based on an unknown future, there would never be positive progress.

“I’m surrounded by opportunists, people who believe I’m naive and those who try to demoralize me. But no one can or will take away the truth.”

Shortly after this article was posted on gulfcoastnewstoday.com mid-day Monday, Wilson took to her Facebook page again to release another statement on the claim

“Many people are reaching out for additional information about a claim that was filed on Friday,” Wilson wrote. “I am confident that the facts will demonstrate that no assault occurred. Responses to the claim will be

handled internally by legal counsel.”

During an interview with Lori DuBose on WABF 1480 AM Monday morning, Council President Jack Burrell and Councilman Jay Robinson confirmed the claim had been filed Friday and said city staff was looking into the matter.

Burrell said he had heard about the alleged assault some time ago, but said he had only heard rumors.

“I had been hearing of this for quite some time, but only as rumors,” Burrell said. “Rumors hurt, and so you don’t act on rumors. What we have concrete is that a claim has been filed.”

Robinson, who is an attorney, said he wasn’t certain what the next step would be for the city.

“I assume our city attorneys are working on it behind the scenes and figuring out how to move forward,” Robinson said. “I don’t know what the next step is from the city’s perspective.”

Both said everything involving the incident is preliminary at this point.

“We have to proceed with caution,” Burrell said.

“While it’s a very serious matter, we have to let the system work. As council members, we take care of what we can take care of and we let the legal system take of what it’s supposed to take care of.”

When called for a comment by Gulf Coast Media, City Attorney Marion “Tut” Wynne said he and his staff had reviewed the claim and had turned it over to the city’s insurer for further investigation.

include 25 percent (or 88.17 acres) of the total site being left as open space, nine acres of which is wetlands.

The project is designed to include several amenities for residents, including parks and a large network of trails.

The developer said their plans will also include conducting a traffic study to see what road improvements and amenities might be needed in that area for their potential residents.

Councilman Pat Rudicell questioned whether the developer could limit the number of smaller lots on the project.

“Can we keep the density down?” Rudicell asked. “It’s a big concern when you factor all of this out.”

The project is seeking pre-zoning from the city

of Daphne and would then likely annex into the city, which the city could approve or deny. If denied annexation into the city, the developer would then likely go to the county for approval.

Mayor Dane Haygood said he has been aware of the project for some time and wanted the project to come into the city so that Daphne could have a great say over how the development there moved forward.

“I made a request that if they were going to pursue it, they would pursue it in the city so we could have input on this project,” Haygood said. And, should the development occur, the side effects that might impact quality of life that it could have, annexation would help us develop a funding base in the southeast part of Daphne that would enhance our services there.”

Michael Raider, a county

resident in a nearby subdivision, told the council a number of area residents spoke up against the project, but said Council President Ron Scott made them feel as though their issues were of “no consequence” since they did not vote in city elections.

“Our concerns appear to have fallen on deaf ears,” Raider said.

Scott said his comments were taken out of context and were meant as a plea to get those residents to annex into the city of Daphne.

“We would love to have you guys annex in to let you have a more direct say,” Scott said. “It was not intended to mean we were not concerned about anyone outside the area.”

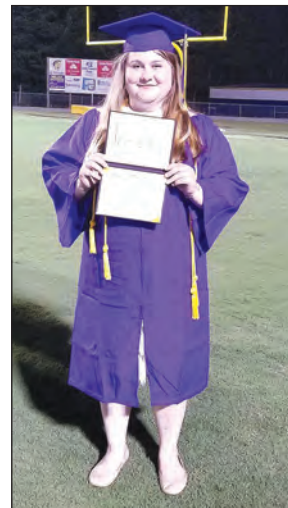
Haygood said one of the perks of the development being done within the city is the development standards the city imposes.

“We have probably the most stringent standards in the county,” Haygood said. “Daphne is a leader in that regard. You would not have the same protections with the county.”

Vote on the potential pre-zoning will take place at the council’s June 5 meeting.

Smoke billowing into the air. A strong smell of sulfur permeating the nearby field. Small finned tubes screeching into the air, then popping a parachute for a soft landing. Daphne's AL-935 AFJROTC has a tradition of launching rockets that has gone on for several years, and is still going strong.

Lydia's Closet is a non-profit organization that provides brand name clothing for children in foster care. Owner, Sarah McIntosh, began her business last February after she began caring for two teenagers in the foster care system.

"They came in with not very many clothes and most of the clothes were raggedy and didn't fit them," McIntosh said. "It perpetuated their mood and attitude. I had a vision of why can't we provide these kids with good clothing? DHR does provide a shopping trip to Walmart, however for teenagers, they don't necessarily want their clothes to be from Walmart."

McIntosh went around to local businesses, explained her situation and asked for discounts to provide clothes for her foster kids. Most businesses were willing to give a discount, and she wanted to do it on a wider scale.

"The desire to provide clothing to our kids in foster care and make them feel more value so they can fit in with their



peers," McIntosh said. "They're put into a situation they didn't ask to be in and this is just some way to have something they can call their own. It wasn't a hand me down and something to let them know their worth. It's something they can take from place to place with them."

Currently, Lydia's Closet has 20 kids signed up to receive a box full of seasonal clothes for summer. Each box provides anywhere from \$150 to \$200 worth of brand new clothing, shoes and other essential items. The boxes are sent out to children of all ages, four times a year at the beginning of every season.

Lydia's Closet is strictly online for now. Eventually she would like to open a location for the kids to visit.

nated through Pay Pal and every bit counts. To receive a box for your foster children, go to the website and click the sign up button.

"Most older kids have an idea of the stores they want clothing from, but for the younger kids it's more general," McIntosh said.

Donating is very quick and easy. Visit their website at www.lydiascloset.co and your donation is tax-deductible. If you would like a paper donation receipt, you can email McIntosh with an address and she will send or email you a copy.

Lydia's Closet urges the community to rally behind this business to help impact foster children's lives in the community.

Currently, there are 170 children in foster care.

"Providing for foster kids is a lot, providing clothing is one way to help a foster parent and one less thing for them to worry about," McIntosh said. "It's a way to get our community involved. It's our responsibility as a community to take care of our own."

On Faith

One of the most controversial topics in Christian theology is the doctrine of election. As a bit of anecdotal proof of the continuing interest in this issue, I'll be delivering lectures on election at two different theology conferences this year. Although there is a dizzying array of nuances, the basic point of contention boils down to this: does the Bible teach that election is God's choice of some individuals for salvation and not others? My simple answer (after hundreds of hours of study) is no.

When the idea of election appears in Scripture, the dynamic is never between God's choice of some and His rejection of everyone else. God does not choose Abraham and reject every other person. God does not choose Israel and reject the nations. God chooses Abraham so that "in him, all the families of the earth will be blessed (Gen 12:3). God chooses Israel to be "a light to the nations" (Is 49:6). God does not choose Jesus and reject the rest of us. In the thesis statement to his letter to the Romans, Paul, in vv.16-17, says that the gospel is for everyone, "the Jew first and also the Greek." This is the biblical

picture of election: a selection through which God brings salvation to the whole world. Several years ago, I came across this thought from C.S. Lewis that gave me the push in the proper direction on the correct understanding of election: "When we look into the selectiveness which the Christians attribute to God we find in it none of that "favouritism" which we were afraid of. The 'chosen' people are chosen not for their own sake (certainly not for their own honour or pleasure) but for the sake of the unchosen." The chosen are chosen for the sake of the unchosen. That's the point of biblical election.

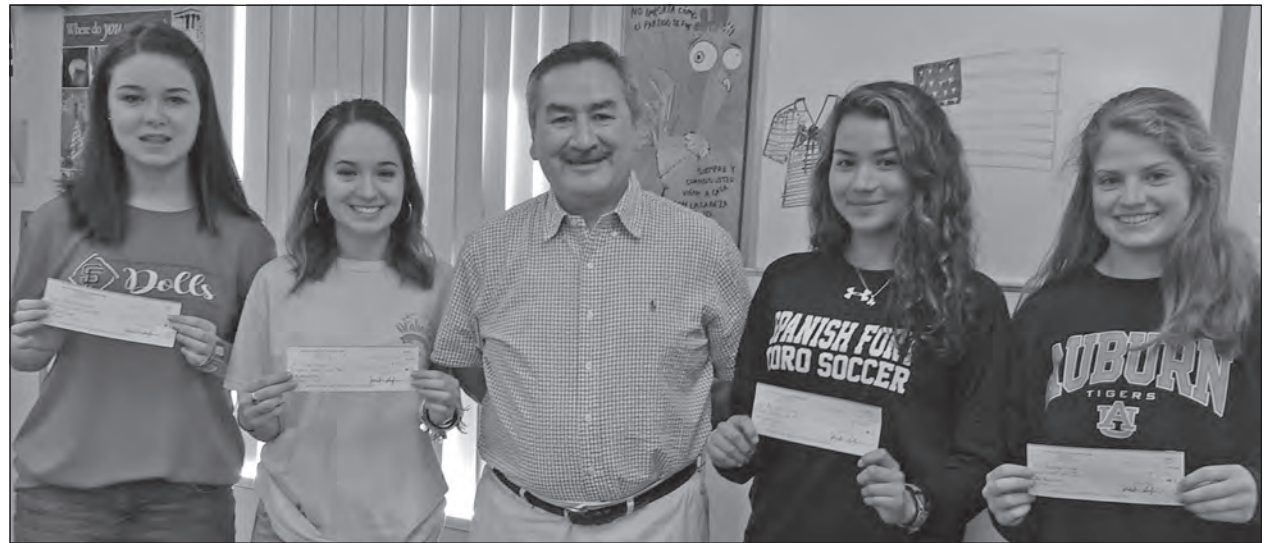

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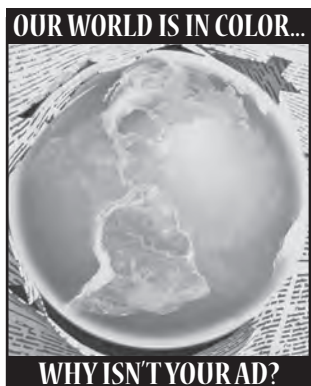

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
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The Smells that Move You

Winner of GOP runoff will likely be Alabama's next senator

Well folks the field is set for the sprint to fill the open U.S. Senate seat of Jeff Sessions. The primary is less than three months away on August 15. There will probably be a run-off on September 26 and the winner of that GOP run-off will be our Junior Senator from Alabama. In the Heart of Dixie, winning the Republican nomination is tantamount to election. The December 12 General Election will be a coronation for the winner of the September 26 Republican primary.

That bold soul who had to be hit by John Hannah like a tackling dummy can truthfully say to their grandson, "I played football at Alabama for Bear Bryant."

Actually, Alabama's Sixth Congressional Jefferson/Shelby U.S. Representative, Gary Palmer, was elected to Congress by his doing the above thing while in college at Alabama. Some people suspect that his saying he played for Bear Bryant helped propel him to victory when he was elected a few years ago.

Despite our offers to provide a monetary reward for his efforts, Officer Stringer refused to take anything from us. All that he desired was simply knowing that my uncle was now safely back home with his loved ones. However, I managed to take a photo of Officer Stringer smiling while shaking the hand of my Uncle Clifton. Although there is so much publicity that often illuminates the less than favorable sides of law enforcement, I am especially thankful for Officer Stringer's altruism and his selflessness in serving and protecting his fellowman with dignity, respect, and compassion.

Goat Island and Battleship Pete

I well remember riding across the Causeway before the Interstate 10 Bay Way was built. I could see the huts out on the little patch of land my Daddy called Goat Island. Sometimes I was lucky enough to catch a glimpse of Battleship Pete, the man who called the island home. I felt important because my father had been to that island and knew the legendary character personally.

One Thursday night my Daddy told Mother that he would not be home the next night. He said he and a buddy were going to spend Friday night out at the "Camp" with Battleship Pete so they could get an early start fishing on Saturday. I could hardly wait to hear all about his adventure. I loved imagining what it must be like to live all alone on that island we could see from the Causeway every time we crossed Mobile Bay. We could see it best just as we crossed the narrow Admiral Semmes Bridge draw-bridge, and I often envied the man that lived there.

As Daddy cleaned his catch that Saturday night, he told me they had slept in bunk beds in a cabin Battleship Pete had built for guests. There was a jukebox in the middle of that hut, run by a generator. They used jugs of fresh water they had brought with them and cooked their food in the cooking shed. Pete had a separate sleeping hut and there was an outhouse. (Daddy had to explain what an outhouse was...) "Yes," Daddy said, "There were goats all over the little island. Pete keeps them there to clear the underbrush that used to cover the island. He also has chickens and rabbits."

Legends may call Battleship Pete a hermit, but he was certainly not one! He had many friends and came to town at least once a week. Peter Felix Bernard was born up north in 1869 and started working in the shipbuilding industry at age 16. He

worked in several shipyards in Canada and the U.S. as a boiler-maker. In 1902 he helped build the New Jersey, one of the BB-16s used in the North Atlantic when Teddy Roosevelt was determined to circumnavigate the earth as part of his Big Stick plan. That was about the time his friends started calling him Battleship Pete.

He married a Canadian girl and they had a son. He left them in Washington to find work, but when he returned, he could not find them. Pete continued to bounce around, and eventually settling in Mobile working at Mobile Shipyard and Shipbuilding Company and later at Todd Shipyards. He retired from shipbuilding when he turned 62 in 1931, but his life was hardly over!

He boarded in various places in the area of Mobile around St. Emanuel, Eslava and South Royal Streets, and he began keeping a boat at the foot of Eslava Street, according to Lawrence Stauter of the famous Stauter Boat family. He spent days in his old boat, mostly catching crabs which he sold to Southern Fish and Oyster Company. At age 76 he thought he would take a stab at running a restaurant, so he opened one at 220 South Royal Street. He closed it four years later in 1949. All this time he was active at the Union Hall of the CIO and had lots of friends.

I guess Pete lived the life of leisure as long as he could stand it, because just a few

years later he opened an oyster bar at 270 South Royal street. A sign painted by Fasco Beverage Company hung over the door: Pete's Place Cold Drinks. During the years Pete ran the bar, "The Shipbuilder" magazine ran a story about Pete. As fate would have it, a man who knew Pete's son showed Pete, Jr. the article. When Pete, Jr. came from Detroit to visit his father, the local newspaper ran a story about the reunion. Pete, Jr. had followed his father's footsteps in the industry, and he brought the old man news that he had a 25-year-old grandson living in Florida.

Their visit was short, but it did connect Pete with his relatives. His older sister living in California also visited Pete in Mobile when she was 87 in 1953. He learned that his son had died in 1958, and he began to spend more and more time on his boat and would often sleep over on the little patch of land about a mile from shore. So by age 88 he decided to end his city life routine and move to the island.

The island was actually created during the Civil War as a defense battery protecting the city of Mobile. Battery McIntosh was built with pilings driven into the bottom and filled in with soil barged in from miles away. It rose 24 feet above the water, had a magazine, seven cannons, and the troops who manned them. The walkway built surrounding the battery was constantly walked by sentinels on guard duty. After the war, it was left to nature's will, and visited rarely by boat-

ers, until Pete decided to make it his home.

Pete had already been keeping his boat at Autrey's on the Causeway and the owners Billy and Queenie Rice became his best friends. When Pete started staying full time on the island it was only about 12 feet high and had quite a nice stand of pine and gum cypress. It was covered with debris, which he used as building materials for a crude shack. His friends at Autrey's kept an eye out for him and collected his mail. Friends helped him build a bunkhouse, a cooking shed and a chicken coop. He survived the terrible flood of 1959 by quickly throwing together a tree house where he stayed for two days, but he lost his chickens and rabbits. He replaced them with this next pension check and made the decision that added to his reputation. He brought goats to the island and Pete himself started calling his home Goat Island. He had a pier built on the Spanish River side of the island. It was 10 feet wide and 32 feet long.

More people can tell you about his death than about his life. He continued religiously attending mass at St. Vincent's in his old neighborhood. He also bought his supplies in Mobile, usually tying his boat at the Eslava Street dock. On April 3, 1966, as the 96-year old Pete was crossing St. Emmanuel Street, he stepped off the curb into the path of an oncoming taxi. He was taken to Mobile General Hospital and friends contacted Queenie, who came right away. He remained in a coma all day and was pronounced dead at 9:00 that night.



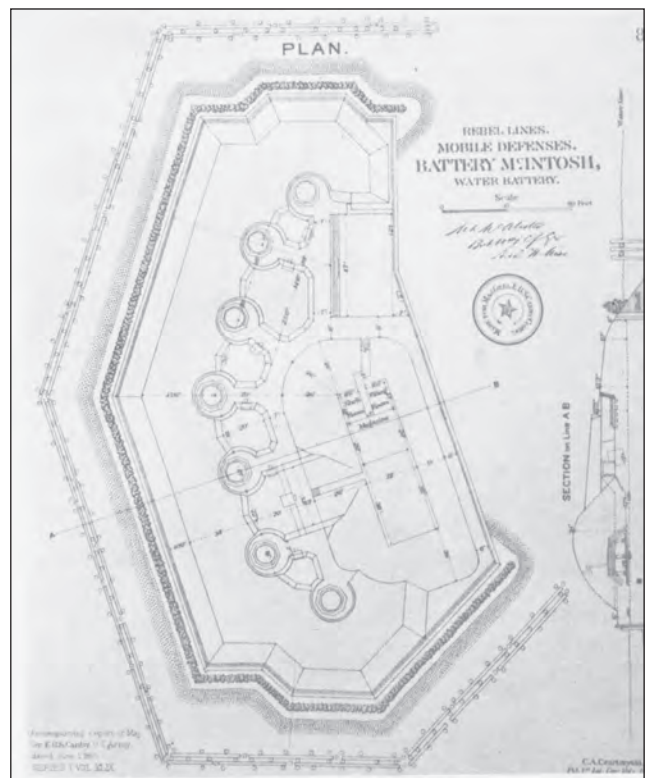
To grant Pete's wish, his friends organized the longest funeral procession ever held in Mobile. Cars came from miles and miles to process to the Catholic Cemetery where he was laid to rest in Potter's Field section. He had left enough money for the funeral, but not enough for a headstone, so his grave is unmarked to this day.

Never has the quote, "Gone, but not forgotten" been truer. For Battleship Pete's story has been told and enhanced throughout the years. This larger than life character has become a folk legend. You may not be able to find his grave, but you can certainly see Goat Island. The best view is from the deck of the USS Alabama or from a boat. It is about half the size it was when Pete lived there, and who knows how long it will be before it is completely gone.

My goodness, how few years can pass before we have lost information about people who lived and walked among us. If not for the newspa-

per articles about Pete, we would have only the myths that sprang up around his life on Goat Island. In my mind, he had lived there for at least fifty years, but in reality he spent only the last eight years of his life there. For example, even though I knew Pete lived on Goat Island before the USS Alabama was brought home to berth at Battleship Park, I connected the two and assumed his name came from the fact that he lived right next to the grand old Number 60. So now we all know the rest of the story, and I hope you talk about it every time you see Goat Island.

The South holds a 30-25-2 edge in the

North-South series which began in 1948. The North won 14-0 last year in a game called due to inclement weather in the second quarter.

Braves face battle with Freeman injured

The term “next man up” in sports is where you try to replace an injured player without any negative consequences. That may be easier said than done when you are dealing with the loss of a star player. Last week the Atlanta Braves’ first baseman Freddie Freeman was hit by a pitch from Toronto Blue Jays pitcher Aaron Loup. Scans showed that Freeman suffered a fractured left wrist and he will be out for at least 10 weeks. This with the Braves (18-23) within a few games

of the Washington Nationals in the NL East only to lose a potential league MVP for a few months. At the time of his injury, Freeman was tied for first in the major leagues in home runs (14) with rookie sensation New York Yankee Aaron Judge. Freeman was also second in the league in on-base percentage (.461) and slugging (.748). Freeman had played in 37 games, accounted for 135 at bats, 35 runs, 46 hits and 11 double bases so far. Before his injury, Free-

man was in heavy consideration for MVP due to his batting performance and his consistent fielding output for the Braves. Freeman is a two-time MLB All-Star (2013-14) and was on pace this season. Time will only tell how his wrist will be, in the meanwhile, the Braves are in a series of battles. As of Sunday night, they are seven games behind the Nationals. Atlanta is half a game ahead of the New York Mets (18-24), three ahead of the Philadelphia Phillies (15-26) and four ahead of the Miami Marlins (15-28). The Braves finished last in the NL East last season.

Three days after Freeman’s injury, the Braves traded away minor leaguer Juan Ypez to the St. Louis Cardinals for Matt Adams. Adams will contribute to the Braves fielding sufficiently while Freeman is out. Adams had 14 hits, seven RBIs and a home run in 52 at bats this season for St. Louis. Atlanta is currently ninth in batting (.261) and eight in OBP (.333). The Braves are significantly better this year in batting but will now need the reliance of Matt Kemp, Nick Markakis, Ender Inciarte and now newly acquired Adams to keep the Braves winning.

Anglers heading to Pickwick Lake for 34th BFL All-American

FLORENCE – The T-H Marine Bass Fishing League (BFL) is heading to Florence, June 1-3 for the 34th annual BFL All-American on Pickwick Lake, when 98 of the best boaters and co-anglers from across the 24-division BFL circuit will cast for a cash prize of up to \$120,000 in the Boater Division and \$60,000 in the Co-angler Division. In addition to the six-figure payday, the top boater will receive an invitation to compete for bass fishing’s most coveted prize – the Forrest Wood Cup – held Aug. 11-13 on Lake Murray in Columbia, South Carolina. “It’s going to be really good tournament – Pickwick Lake is one of the best fisheries in the Tennessee River system,” said Quaker State pro Scott Canterbury of Odenville, Alabama, an eight-time

Forrest Wood Cup qualifier. “The fish are going to be just getting out on the ledges so they haven’t been pressured and will be easy to catch. Those schools will be really big – some of the guys will likely be able to catch 50 bass off of one spot. “There also a lot of smaller areas where you only catch five or six fish from, but they weigh a bit more,” continued Canterbury. “This tournament could be won in the upriver current near the dam, down in the mid-lake eelgrass, or out on the ledges. It’s going to come down to who can get that 6- or 7-pounder to bite.” Canterbury said swim baits will be favored in this event, as well as big crankbaits and spoons on the ledges. “When we competed there on Tour in 2016, Buddy Gross won it using a hair jig in eelgrass, so look for that,”

said Canterbury. “Everyone was on the lower end on the ledges, while he hit areas mid-lake. Spinnerbaits may also be a player in the eelgrass, but it’s the tail-end of the shad spawn so we’ll see.” The Alabama veteran said a three-day cumulative catch of 73 pounds should be enough to win it all. “A 10-pounder could be caught any day,” said Canterbury. “I wouldn’t be surprised to see some 25- to 30-pound limits come in – the lake has been fishing that well that past couple of years.” Competitors will take off from McFarland Park located at 200 Jim Spain Drive in Florence at 7 a.m. CDT each morning. Weigh-ins each day will be held at McFarland Park, and will begin at 3:30 p.m. Takeoffs and weigh-ins are free and open to the public. The 2017 BFL All-American on Pickwick Lake is being hosted by

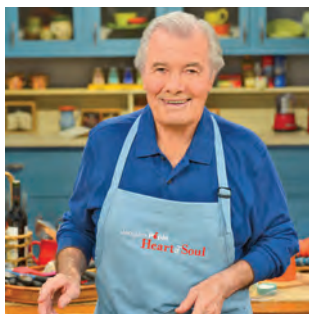

Study affirms Forever Wild's impact

When it comes to return on investment, very few programs can match the success of Alabama's Forever Wild Land Trust.

Forever Wild was established in 1992 as a vehicle to preserve and protect important ecological and recreational tracts of land in the state. Voters approved the constitutional amendment that established Forever Wild with an overwhelming 84 percent approval.

Two years later, Forever Wild closed on its first parcel of land, and now the program owns 195,000 acres and has an additional 60,000 acres under long-term lease agreements. Forever Wild funding comes from interest earnings generated by oil and gas production royalties paid to the state and is capped at \$15 million annually. Doug Deaton of the Alabama State Lands Division, which administers the program for the Forever Wild Land Trust Board, said funding to date for the current fiscal year is about \$14 million.

When Forever Wild came up for renewal for another 20 years in 2012, the program maintained widespread support and passed with 75 percent of the vote.

Despite the public support, there have been attempts to divert some of the Forever Wild funding, and concerned conservation groups decided to sponsor a return-on-investment study to show how Forever Wild benefits the state in ways more than the intrinsic values of preserving sensitive habitat or providing public recreation opportunities.

At last week's Forever Wild Land Trust Board meeting in Spanish Fort, Tammy Herrington, Executive Director of Conservation Alabama, took her turn during the public comment portion of the meeting to remind those in attendance of the enormous impact of Forever Wild and outdoor recreation on Alabama's economy.

"We partnered with The Trust for Public Land, The Nature Conservancy and others to do an economic impact study to show the economic value of the program so we would have the information when we were talking with legislators and voters about the actual benefits the program does bring to the state," Herrington said. "There have been attacks in recent years on public lands. So

we had an idea there would be continued threats to Forever Wild, and we wanted to bring the numbers into the conversation."

Herrington said the economic study showed that for every \$1 invested in public land through the Forever Wild Land Trust, \$5 is returned in goods and services to the state.

The economic analysis, a return-on-investment study, focused on fee simple purchases made by Forever Wild using state dollars. Public lands purchased through partnerships with federal grant programs, conservation organizations or private landowners were not included to purposely highlight the benefits of Alabama's direct investment in land conservation through Forever Wild.

Herrington said the economic study verified what the study sponsors expected from setting aside land for public access and recreational use.

"We feel it's a conservative estimate to what public lands bring to the state," she said. "We focused just on Forever Wild land. When you look at some of the ways the program is able to leverage funds from fed-

eral, private and nonprofit sources, it adds to the value.

"So we think it brings more economic benefits than can even be quantified through this economic report."

The report showed that tourists and residents spend \$7.5 billion annually on outdoor recreation, which generates \$494 million in tax revenues and supports 86,000 jobs and \$2 billion in wages in Alabama.

One of the most geographically and ecologically diverse states in the nation, Alabama's habitat includes mountains, coastal beaches, grassland plains, forests, farmland and abundant water resources in the drainages of the Tombigbee, Tennessee and Alabama river systems.

"In addition to those concrete numbers about the economy, you have stories in local communities about how they were able to take Forever Wild lands and were able to market them to bring in people for recreational opportunities, like hunting and other outdoor activities, to their areas," Herrington said. "Those stories are all very interesting to me.

"Not only are you look-



ing at what happens in economic impact, you're able to look at places like Anniston, which took their Forever Wild land and built a biking community around it. You've got bicyclers from all over going to Anniston for their great mountain biking."

The area near Anniston that Herrington referred to is the Doug Ghee Nature Preserve and Recreation Area, which is comprised of four Forever Wild acquisitions on Coldwater Mountain. Named for the former Alabama legislator and Forever Wild board member, the 4,180-acre tract of mountainous forest is a combination of hardwoods and pines.

A total of 35 miles of bike trails, ranging from beginner level to expert, have been constructed on Coldwater Mountain. The trail system attracts riders from all over the U.S. and has become a mecca for mountain bikers in the Southeast. Forever Wild's Coldwater Mountain tract has been recognized by the International Mountain Biking Association as a Bronze-Level Ride Center, one of only 37 in the world.

Forever Wild has been used to purchase land in the Mobile-Tensaw Delta, Little River Canyon, Sipsey River Complex, Cathedral Caverns, Ruffner Mountain, Weeks Bay Reserve, Splinter Hill Bog and the Turkey Creek Nature Preserve, to name only a few. Additions to numerous Wildlife Management Areas were created through Forever Wild purchases, as well as additions to the Alabama State Parks System.

"I think that's what people don't understand," Herrington said. "Our organization, Conservation Alabama Foundation, is focused on nature but also how people interact with nature. It's not just to protect the wildlife for nature's sake, it's really about how citizens of this state interact with the land and what intrinsic value that brings to us as people. That's why we do this work. Looking at public lands and these communities that benefit from Forever Wild lands, local leaders and citizens want to take advantage of them personally but also bring tourism opportunities into their community."

Fixing broken hearts through tissue engineering

The third annual Cardiovascular Tissue Engineering Symposium met at the University of Alabama at Birmingham last month, a gathering of noted physicians and scientists who share the goal of creating new tissues and new knowledge that can prevent or repair heart disease and heart attacks.

Talks ranged from the cutting-edge translational work of Phillippe Menasche, M.D., Ph.D., professor of thoracic and cardiovascular surgery, Paris Descartes University, to the basic biology research of Sean Wu, M.D., Ph.D., an associate professor of medicine, Stanford University School of Medicine. Menasche’s work pioneers human treatment with engineered heart tissue. Wu’s work opens the door to generating heart chamber-specific cardiomyocytes from human induced pluripotent stem cells, which act similarly to embryonic stem cells, having the potential to differentiate into any type of cell.

Menasche has placed engineered heart tissue derived from embryonic stem cell-derived cardiac cells onto the hearts of six heart attack patients in France in an initial safety study for this engineered tissue approach. Wu has used single-cell RNA sequencing to show 18 categories of cardiomyocytes in the heart, differing by cell type and

anatomical location, even though they all derived from the same lineage.

“We are creating a new community of engineers,” said Jay Zhang, M.D., Ph.D., chair and professor of the UAB Department of Biomedical Engineering. In their welcoming remarks, both Selwyn Vickers, M.D., dean of the UAB School of Medicine, and Victor Dzau, M.D., professor of medicine at Duke University School of Medicine and president of the National Academy of Medicine, spoke of the growing convergence between scientists and physicians that is leading to tremendous possibilities to improve patient care.

The tissue engineering field is moving fast.

Cardiac progenitor cells that can contribute to growth or repair injury in the heart were only discovered in 2003, says symposium presenter Michael Davis, Ph.D., associ-

ate professor of Medicine, Department of Biomedical Engineering, Georgia Tech College of Engineering and Emory University School of Medicine. In 2006, the Japanese scientist Shinya Yamanaka first showed how to transform adult cells into induced pluripotent stem cells. This potentially provides feedstock for tissue engineering using either pluripotent cells or specific progenitor cells for certain tissue lineages.

One example of the pace of change was given by Bjorn Knollman, M.D., Ph.D., professor of medicine and pharmacology at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. Knollman noted an “ugly truth” that everyone recognized in 2013 — that cardiomyocytes derived from induced pluripotent stem cells were nothing like normal adult cardiomyocytes in shape, size and function.

He described the improved steps like culturing the derived cardiomyocytes in a Matrigel mattress and giving them a 14-day hormone treatment that have led to derived cardiomyocytes with greatly improved cell volume, morphology and function. His take-home message: In just four years, from 2013 to 2017, researchers were able to remove the differences between induced pluripotent stem cell-derived cardiomyocytes and normal adult cardiomyocytes.

In other highlights of the symposium, João Soares,

Ph.D., a research scientist for the Center for Cardiovascular Simulation, University of Texas at Austin, explained how subjecting engineered heart valve tissue to cyclic flexure as it is grown in a bioreactor leads to improved quantity, quality and distribution of collagen, as opposed to tissue that is not mechanically stressed.

Sumanth Prabhu, M.D., professor and chair of the Division of Cardiovascular Disease, UAB School of Medicine, talked about the role of immune cells in cardiac remodeling and heart failure. He noted the distinct phases after a heart attack — acute inflammation and dead tissue degradation, zero to four days; the healing phase of resolution and repair, four to 14 days; and the chronic ischemic heart failure that can occur weeks to months later. Prabhu described experiments to show how specialized spleen macrophages — specifically marginal-zone metallophilic macrophages — migrate to the heart after a heart attack and are required for heart repair to commence.

Nenad Bursac, Ph.D., professor of Biomedical Engineering, Duke University School of Medicine, described his advances in engineering vascularized heart tissue for repair after a heart attack. Bursac said a better understanding of how to grow the tissue from heart tissue progenitor cells has allowed formation of mature “giga”

patches up to 4 centimeters square that have good propagation of heartbeat contractions and spontaneous formation of capillaries from derived-vascular endothelial and smooth muscle cells. These patches are being tested in pigs.

Duke University’s Victor Dzau gave a perspective of the paracrine hypothesis over the past 15 years. In 2003, researchers had seen that applying mesenchymal stem cells to a heart attack area led to improved heart function, with beneficial effects seen as early as 72 hours. However, there was little engraftment and survival of the stem cells. Thus was born the hypothesis, which has been worked out in detail since then — that stem cells do their work by release of biologically active factors that act on other cells, similar to the way that paracrine hormones have their effect only in the vicinity of the gland secreting it.

Joseph Wu, M.D., Ph.D., professor of radiology, Stanford University School of Medicine, showed how heart cells derived from induced pluripotent stem cells could be used to develop personalized medicine approaches for cancer patients. The problem, he explained, is that some cancer patients are susceptible to a deadly cardiotoxicity when treated with the potent drug doxorubicin. Hence, the drug has a black box warning, the strictest warning mandated by the Food and Drug Administration. Wu

was able to use a library of induced pluripotent stem cell-derived cardiomyocytes to associate certain genotypes and phenotypes with doxorubicin sensitivity, in what he called a “clinical trial in a dish.” From this knowledge, it will be possible to look at the transcriptome profile in patient-specific cardiomyocytes derived from induced pluripotent stem cells to predict patient-specific drug safety and efficacy, thus fulfilling the definition of precision medicine — the right treatment at the right time to the right person.

In all, UAB’s Cardiovascular Tissue Engineering Symposium included more than 30 presentations. The entire symposium will be summarized in a paper for the journal *Circulation Research*, expected to be published shortly, Zhang says.

Presentations of the 2015 Cardiovascular Tissue Engineering Symposium were published in the journal *Science Translational Medicine*, and the presentations of the 2016 Cardiovascular Tissue Engineering Symposium were published in the journal *Circulation Research*.

At UAB, Zhang holds the T. Michael and Gillian Godrich Endowed Chair of Engineering Leadership, Vickers holds the James C. Lee Jr. Endowed Chair for the Dean of the School of Medicine, and Prabhu holds the Mary Gertrude Waters Chair of Cardiovascular Medicine.

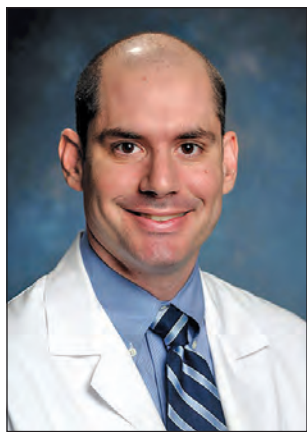
UAB clinical trials pave way to new cystic fibrosis drug

Imagine breathing through only a tiny straw. That is what life is like for people with cystic fibrosis, which includes about 30,000 people in the United States, making cystic fibrosis the most common lethal genetic disease in the country.

Though the CFTR gene responsible for the disease was discovered in 1989, it has taken researchers nearly 25 years to develop the first causative treatment for one type of cystic fibrosis. For many cystic fibrosis patients, specific treatment for their individual gene is still not available.

A step forward came in March as Vertex Pharmaceuticals announced successful Phase III trials that were conducted partly at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. Steven Rowe, M.D., a professor in the Division of Pulmonary, Allergy and Critical Care Medicine, UAB School of Medicine,

was part of the international leadership team. This newly developed drug — a “corrector-potentiator” combination therapy using the Vertex drugs Tezacaftor and Ivacaftor — may lead to a better future for cystic fibrosis patients, a future in which they may not need to struggle with every breath.

According to Rowe, the new Tezacaftor/Ivacaftor combination drug is an extremely exciting development in cystic fibrosis therapy for two reasons. First, this new combination drug did not have any

of the adverse pulmonary effects associated with another Vertex drug, Orkambi (Lumacaftor/Ivacaftor), aimed at treating the same group of patients. Rowe also thinks this new “corrector” combination will be better tolerated in patients in the long run because of the less frequent pulmonary side effects.

Cystic fibrosis is caused by genetic errors in the CFTR gene that, among other problems, leads to persistent lung infections. Recurring pulmonary infections result in the progressive destruction of normal lung tissue and, eventually, the need for a double lung transplant, often in young, 20- to 25-year-old individuals with cystic fibrosis.

Details of the study In these recent Phase III trials, Vertex Pharmaceuticals examined the efficacy of this new combo drug in 24-week and eight-week studies using two patient groups: one that received the drug and one that received a placebo.

In both trials, the drug-treated group showed greater lung function improvement compared to the placebo-treated group. Additionally, patients in the drug-treated group did not report more serious side effects than the placebo-treated patients.

The first, 24-week EVOLVE study assessed the combination treatment of Tezacaftor/Ivacaftor in patients with two deltaF508 mutations, and it showed a 4.0 percentage point baseline improvement of forced expiratory volume in the treatment group compared to the placebo group. The second, eight-week study, EXPAND, evaluated the treatment efficacy of the same combination drug and the monotherapy of Ivacaftor in patients with one deltaF508 mutation and one residual CFTR ion channel function mutation. This shorter study showed a 6.8 percentage point improvement in the Tezacaftor/Ivacaftor combination therapy group and a 4.7 percentage point

improvement in the Ivacaftor monotherapy group compared to the placebo-treated group.

While a 4.7 percentage point improvement might not sound like much, Rowe emphasized that EVOLVE study patients with the residual function mutations showed this significant lung function improvement even after the relatively short, eight-week treatment. He believes the Tezacaftor/Ivacaftor combination will also be a great candidate for the next generation of cystic fibrosis drugs, mostly because this combination showed mild pulmonary side effects similar to the placebo’s side effects in these trials.

Additionally, these trials are important since the EVOLVE study was the first Phase III clinical trial that involved cystic fibrosis patients with residual function mutations. This means the new drug could be available to another important population of CF patients.

The exact mechanism

of how Tezacaftor works is not known yet. Patient recruitment for new clinical trials investigating the mechanisms of action of Tezacaftor is underway, and a handful of cystic fibrosis patients have already been enrolled in these studies at UAB.

UAB, as part of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation Therapeutics Development Network, plays a key role in these new developments in cystic fibrosis therapy. At UAB, Rowe holds the Nancy R. and Eugene C. Gwaltney Family Endowed Chair in Medical Research, and Rowe is director of the Gregory Fleming James Cystic Fibrosis Research Center.

The study was funded by Vertex Pharmaceuticals and supported by infrastructure awards by the National Institutes of Health and the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. The foundation helped develop cystic fibrosis drugs with Vertex through a collaborative agreement.

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Circadian fluctuations in glaucoma

Brian Samuels, M.D., Ph.D., assistant professor in the University of Alabama at Birmingham Department of Ophthalmology, has received a five-year, \$1.5 million grant from the National Eye Institute to explore the links between circadian fluctuations and glaucoma. This is Samuels' first R01 grant.

People more than 60 years of age are six times more likely to develop glaucoma, which can result in irreversible blindness when left untreated. As the U.S. population ages, the number of glaucoma cases will also increase,

and it is projected that more than 5.5 million Americans will suffer from glaucoma by 2050. It is estimated that 3 million Americans have glaucoma, but only half of those are aware they have the condition.

"The scientific community knows there is an increase of eye pressure throughout the morning, and the pressure typically comes down throughout the day, known as circadian fluctuation," Samuels said. "This circadian fluctuation is now known as a risk factor for the progression of glaucoma. What we need to now answer is 'why is this circadian fluctuation happening?' Once we understand why circadian rhythm is a risk factor, we can begin to develop targeted treatments."

Circadian rhythm is driven by a master time-clock, known as the suprachiasmatic nucleus. The suprachiasmatic nucleus communicates directly with the dorsomedial hypothalamus, which then regulates circadian rhythm. When a person wakes up in the morning, heart rate, res-

piration and blood pressure rise so the person does not lose consciousness when they get out of bed. As a byproduct, people can have an increase in eye pressure.

"We conducted a series of studies and stimulated the dorso-medial hypothalamus, and then observed eye pressure after heart rate and blood pressure increased," he said. "What we saw for the first time is that, when blood pressure and heart rate increase, so does intracranial and intraocular pressure."

Samuels says the next step is to uncover how this relates to glaucoma because it may not be solely the increase in pressure itself, but there is also likely a needed balance between intra-ocular and intracranial pressure.

"We think the damage might be occurring when the balance of pressures is unstable," he said.

In addition to the pressure balance, there are specific types of neurons in the dorsomedial hypothalamus called orexin neurons. These neurons are responsible for driv-



ing a lot of our circadian rhythm. Samuels is also studying the orexin neurons to see if they could be regulating the changes in intracranial pressure and intraocular pressure.

"If we can identify the connection between orexin neurons and circadian rhythm, we could potentially develop a therapeutic treatment to target the progression of glaucoma," Samuels said. "We know if we

stimulate this area there is an increase in intra-ocular and intracranial pressure, but we don't know the pathway for that. This R01 grant will help us discover this pathway."

This R01 NIH grant is in addition to a grant Samuels recently received from NASA, along with his fellow collaborators from the Georgia Institute of Technology and Emory University, to study computational

modeling as a method of determining why astronauts who are in space for extended periods of time are experiencing eye pathologies. Samuels is collaborating with scientists at NASA Glenn Research Center, and others, to help identify the causes of these pathologies, and determine whether there is a way to intervene and prevent these types of vision complications in the future.

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OB/GYN publishes children's book to help working moms explain where they are

Both books, "Mommy, Where Are You?" and "Mommy, What's That?" are available on Amazon and at Barnes and Noble.



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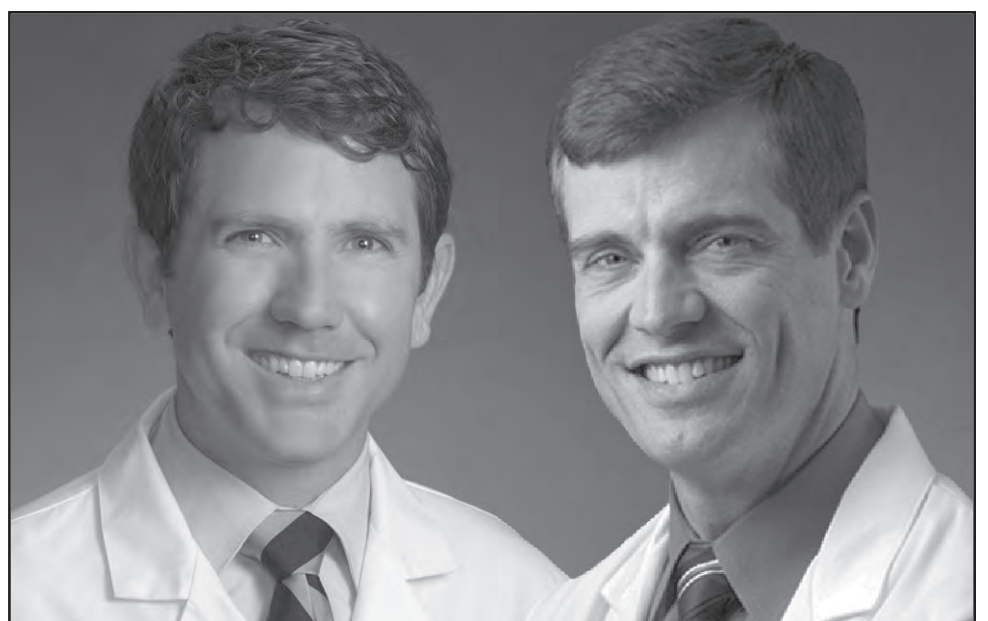

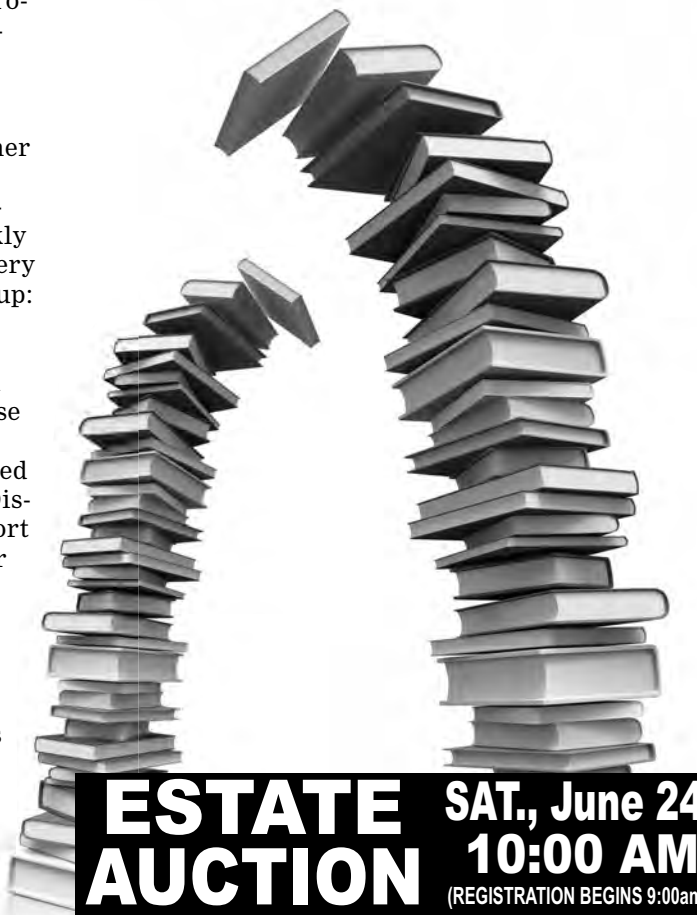

A march in memory of soldiers' past

April 9, 1942. A three-month battle for the defense of the Philippines is over. Tens of thousands of defeated US and Filipino soldiers on the Bataan Peninsula make the long 60-mile trek to the prisoner of war camps many will spend their last days in. Along the way, many are shot, stabbed, beaten, and humiliated by their Japanese captors. Food and water are scarce, and what little was there was rotten and spoiled. Life was a nightmare for those who survived, and everyone who lived past it would be changed for the rest of their lives. 75 years later, the memory of the fallen still lives on.

In memory of those who died on the Bataan Death March and shortly after, as well as those who lived on, a walk was created with the same name. On Saturday, May 13th, cadets from Daphne/Spanish Fort and Foley AF JROTC units participated in a 14-mile walk for the 75th year since the march. Turnout was strong with 21 Daphne/Spanish Fort cadets and over 30 cadets from the host school, Foley. The Corps marched on with good numbers. One cadet reports that everyone that participated completed the walk, even through 80-degree weather and sore feet from the amount of walking. The event was a success, with the people of Baldwin County remembering lost soldiers with a march in their memory. Thanks to host unit at Foley who provided hot dogs and hamburgers and drinks at the conclusion of the walk. The march was conducted in Gulf State Park and WW II veteran John Elliott provided an inspiring talk at the conclusion of the event to the cadets who had completed the march.

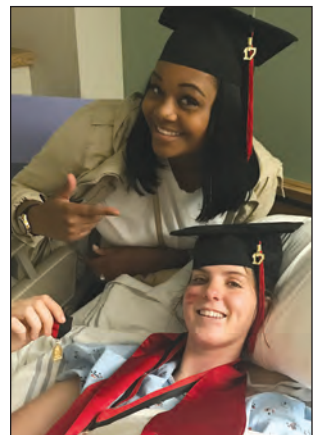

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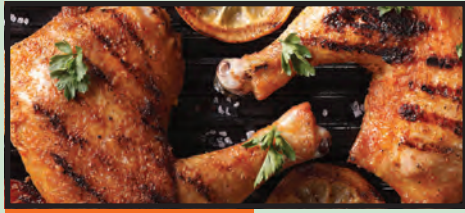


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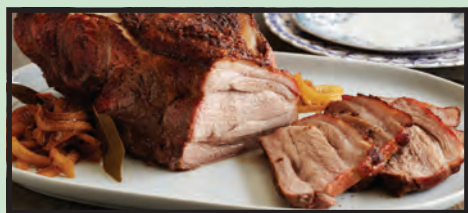
