#### More Than a Million FFA Members celebrate National FFA Week

People across the country are celebrating National FFA Week from Saturday, February 15, through Saturday, February 22. This event gives the organization's more than one million members, as well as alumni and supporters, the opportunity to come together with the common goal of sharing FFA's value and impact from their own hometown.

The National FFA Organization works to develop young leaders through classroom instruction in agricultural education, leadership opportunities, and hands-on learning (known as SAEs or Supervised Agricultural Experiences). This is the first time National FFA Week has been celebrated since the record-breaking announcement of the organization's milestone of reaching more than one million mem-

"National FFA Week serves as a powerful reminder of the vital role that agricultural education and leadership development play in shaping our future," said National FFA Advisor Dr. Travis Park. "It's a time of celebration and reflection as FFA members, advisors, and supporters come together to honor the impact of this extraordinary organization. National FFA Week strengthens the bond between members and their communities, ensuring the legacy of agriculture and education thrives for generations to come."

The six National FFA Officers will connect with chapters throughout the week by leading workshops, delivering keynotes and interacting with students on a more personal level. President Thad Bergschneider will be traveling to South Dakota. Secretary Luke Jennings will be traveling to Washington. Central Region Vice President Mary Schrieber will be traveling to South Carolina. Eastern Region Vice President Caroline Groth will be traveling to North Dakota. Western Region Vice President Abigale Jacobsen will be traveling to Missouri. Southern Region Vice President Jack Lingenfelter will be traveling to Pennsylvania. "FFA Week is a celebration of what makes our or-

ganization impactful... and what is it? What turns shy, reserved middle schoolers and freshmen into confident communicators? What learning could possibly result in hours of bus rides after school, working when it is not required, and serving when it is not asked for?" said Thaddeus Bergschneider, 2024-25 National FFA President. "For me, it's answered with three gavel taps and a room full of united voices saying, 'to practice brotherhood, honor agricultural opportunities and responsibilities, and develop those qualities of leadership which an FFA member should possess.' That statement is the way we start every meeting, and I find it pretty fitting to kick off our 2025 FFA Week with the same reminder. Let's enjoy the brotherhood and community of our organization, honor the industry that challenges us to change the world, and let's dedicate ourselves to exemplifying the character of our organization." agricultural education on local, state, and national levels Friday, February 21 is Wear Blue Day – people

are encouraged to show FFA pride by wearing blue, the color of the iconic FFA jacket

Saturday, February 22 is the last day of FFA

Several chapters across the country will be participating in their own special events to commemorate the occasion.

The Norfolk FFA Chapter in Massachusetts will create quilts to donate to local care centers that serve expecting mothers and foster children as part of a fiber and agricultural education service project.

The Bergman FFA Chapter in Arkansas is setting up a petting zoo at its elementary school and kicking off a "Hunger Games"-style event where students compete to collect the most food for students in

need. The Odessa FFA Chapter in Delaware will continue its "Read to Lead" tradition, bringing FFA members into kindergarten through fifth-grade classes to

read agriculture-related books to young students.

This year's National FFA Week will also include the 10th Annual Give FFA Day on Thursday, February 20. During the 24 hours of giving, the National FFA Organization has the goal of raising \$1.5 million. The money raised supports special programs and events, provides iconic FFA blue jackets to students, supplements travel costs for career and leadership opportunities, and pays for teacher support and resources. ## **FUN FFA FACTS**

- 1. The organization's official colors – national blue and corn gold – were adopted in 1929. The blue pays tribute to our nation's flag, while the gold gives a respectful nod to agriculture, symbolizing golden fields of ripened corn.
- 2. The signature blue-and-gold FFA jacket was adopted as the organization's Official Dress all the way back in 1933, and it remains an FFA tradition 85 years later! More than 50,000 FFA jackets are manufactured every year.
- 3. Ever wonder which states have the most FFA members? The top five membership states are Texas, California, Georgia, Oklahoma and Missouri. FFA operates in all 50 states, as well as Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.
- 4. The national FFA emblem consists of five meaningful symbols. The emblem's foundation is the cross-section of an ear of corn, a symbol of unity because corn grows in every state. The red rising sun symbolizes progress and opportunity. The blue plow signifies labor, the backbone of

- agriculture. The eagle serves as a reminder of our freedom, and the owl represents the wisdom and knowledge required for success in agriculture.
- 5. Did you know females were not allowed to be FFA members until 1969? Today, nearly half of all FFA members are girls. To be exact, females make up 45 percent of FFA's total membership and hold about half of all state leadership positions. Talk about girl power!
- 6. With 669,989 members, the National FFA Organization is the largest youth organization in the country. There are 8,630 local FFA chapters operating in all 50 states, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. FFA continues to grow every year!
- 7. Over the years, several celebrities and politicians have been involved in FFA. Former FFA members include 39th president Jimmy Carter, athlete Bo Jackson, actor Matthew Fox, and musicians Tim McGraw, Taylor Swift and Easton Corbin.






