

THE PLAYERS Championship honored both active military members and veterans on Tuesday night with a Military Appreciation Day program that featured a special concert by country music artist Jon Pardi.

The ceremony kicked off at 5 p.m. on the Island Green 17th hole at TPC Sawgrass. In addition to hosting the music icon, THE PLAYERS donated two check donations to Veterans Legal Aid and the Five Star Veterans Center for \$25,000 and \$50,000, respectively. The checks were presented by PGA TOUR golfer Rickie Fowler, who won THE PLAYERS in 2015.

The Military Appreciation Day program also included pageantry by military personnel, a flyover by the 125th Fighter Wing of the Florida Air National Guard and a national anthem performance by the Jacksonville Children's Chorus. In addition to Pardi and Fowler, special guests at the ceremony included Jay Monahan, PGA TOUR commissioner; Gen. Joseph Lengyel, chief of the National Guard Bureau and member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; and Chris Dempsey, representing Five Star Veteran Center.

According to the PGA tour website, Jon Pardi joins a long list of notable country music stars to appear at the Military Appreciation Day Ceremony, including Tim McGraw (2010), Darius Rucker (2011), Luke Bryan (2012), Dierks Bentley (2013), Jake Owen (2014), Big & Rich (2015), Toby Keith (2016), Sam Hunt (2017) and Luke Combs (2018).

Billy Horschel is a golfer on the PGA TOUR with five career victories. He's won at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans (2013 and 2018), BMW Championship (2014), TOUR Championship (2014) and AT&T Byron Nelson (2017). A University of Florida graduate, Horschel was the FedEx Cup champion in 2014. He lives in Ponte Vedra Beach with his wife and three children.

What are you most looking forward to with **THE PLAYERS in March?**

Growing up and watching the tournament, I think the course is better in March. I think it's designed to be played in March with the wind coming out of the north/ northeast and dealing with the conditions. Also, I think we're going to have more fans than we've had in May. When you look at the reality of it, people up north are still dealing with winter, and they're going to want to come down to a great event like THE PLAYERS, where the weather is going to pretty good. We may have a couple cool, windy days. But for the most part, it's going to be really good weather. So, you're going to have those people coming down to play some golf early in the week and come watch THE PLAYERS. Not to mention, it's spring break in many places. I just think the tournament itself is going to grow exponentially in March compared to May.

What would it mean to you to win this tournament with your ties to Ponte Vedra?

This would mean a lot to me. It's something I've thought long and hard about. It's something that I really want to win. It's like a major to me. It really is. THE PLAYERS is obviously considered a fifth major, but to me it is a major. Having my family here, having my kids run out on the green, my parents and everyone else, there would be a big party going on for a couple of days.

What's your involvement with Feeding Northeast Florida, and what's the story behind Drive Out

My wife and I have been involved with Feeding Northeast Florida for about five years now. Almost half a million people in our Northeast Florida community are food insecure. We're not just talking about homeless people. We're talking about people who have jobs and unfortunately with the money they have, they're not able to meet all the means necessary. That means paying the bills is going to come first, and food comes last. We're helping them where they're falling short. We felt like we could play a vital part in raising awareness. We've donated our money, spent our time and volunteered. The Drive Out Hunger campaign has been unbelievable. For the fourth year in a row, I'm going to donate \$1,000 for every birdie and \$5,000 for every eagle I make during THE PLAYERS Championship. So, hopefully there a lot of birdies and eagles. With that, people can donate as well. When you look at the numbers, \$1 equals six meals for people. So, if you can donate a dollar, you're giving six meals. Donating any amount you can just goes a long way to meeting our goal at the end of day, and that is making our community food secure.

When you reflect on your career and life, is there a moment you're most proud of?

A few moments come to mind. Graduating from the University of Florida was a big moment. Neither of my parents at the time had a college degree. So, it was really important to my parents and also myself to get a degree from the University of Florida. Another big moment was getting my TOUR card. Obviously, that was something I wanted since I was a kid. I wanted to be a professional athlete, and I didn't know what I was going to be. But

when golf was the path that was chosen, I wanted to do everything I could to get to the PGA TOUR. So, getting to the PGA TOUR, getting a PGA TOUR card in 2009 meant a lot. And then winning my first event — the Zurich Classic in 2013 — accumulated everything I had worked hard for, my parents had worked hard for and my family had worked hard for. So, it was a special moment.

What do you attribute to your success in life, and what advice do you have for kids in the community who may want to follow your path?

I think something that helped with my success, and I

learned it from my parents, is hard work. You've gotta work hard to achieve anything. You're not just going to be handed everything in life. It seems like people and kids nowadays, they just want to be handed a TOUR card, they just want to be handed the job. You gotta work hard, you gotta put in the time and you gotta take advantage of the opportunities that come your way and be aware of the people who are trying to help you. So, work hard and be open to taking advice from people and understand it is advice. They're not trying to criticize you. They're trying to make you better.

Nocatee hosts grand opening of Spray Water Park

Nocatee unveiled its Spray Water Park to community residents and the general public on Saturday, March 9.

The newest attraction features more than 100,000 square feet encompassing a 42-foot water slide tower, five slides and interactive spray features. The amenity centers around Whale Harbor, a four-story water slide tower that is the tallest of its kind in Northeast Florida. The Spray Water Park also features Serenity Bay, a resort-style beach environment with beach volleyball; Scuttle Cove, a smaller spray park for younger children; Paradise Park playground; and Blue Water Bar & Grill, a restaurant serving both food and drinks.

The neighboring event field, which will be more than twice the size of the current event area, will be the new home for community events and concerts, including the monthly Nocatee Farmers Market, the Roscolusa country music festival, drive-in movie nights, concerts and more.

Before the Spray Water Park was unveiled, event attendees enjoyed various attractions in this field, including food trucks, a petting zoo and booths manned by local businesses. The Austin Park Band and Nease Drumline also performed.

The opening of the attraction was made official with a ribbon-cutting ceremony with representatives of Nocatee's master developer, the PARC Group, and representatives of the Tolomato Community Development District. Subsequently, Nocatee hosted tours of the Spray Water Park for residents and the public. The festivities concluded with the amenity being open to residents for the rest of the afternoon.


Featuring Wounded Warrior Project

ED WALLER

In this edition of Why I Serve, featuring Wounded Warrior Project, the Recorder sat down with Ed Waller, a retired captain who spent 25 years in the Navy. Waller was a P-3 Orion pilot who, among several other experiences and responsibilities, tracked Soviet submarines during the Cold War.

When you reflect on your service, is there a moment or experience that sticks out?

In my last deployment, when I was CO of the squadron, we went to Rota, Spain, and were there for six months. We came home in December 1991, and I'll never forget when that was, because that was the same month the Soviet Union dissolved. Our purpose up until that time was anti-submarine warfare, always knowing where the ballistic missile submarines were, because their missiles could hit the United States, and where the attack submarines were. It was very, very important. A lot of that stopped in December 1991. So, the entire time that I was deploying and flying P-3s, it was what we called the "glory days." We really had a phenomenal mission, we worked real hard, we really knew what we were doing and it was just a lot of fun.





Local Scouts BSA all-girl troop, local Girl Scouts robotics team make history

Both groups show community there is more than one way to teach a girl leadership

It's an unseasonably warm day at the Echockotee Boy Scouts camp in Orange Park. About an hour before noon, the sun peeks out of the clouds and lights up the five large archery targets located outside the pavilion, located a quarter mile distance from the camps.

Mike Mazur, a district representative for the North Florida Shooting Sports Committee, paces back and forth with a longbow, carefully explaining the myriad of accidents and injuries that could result from improper archery techniques.

A hand shoots up in a sea of brown uniforms lined up along the picnic tables. It waves around a little when Mazur glances its way. When he finishes his piece, he acknowledges it.

"Make sure you talk about the nock indicator!"

The hand belongs to Rose Gottschalk. She is one of 14 members of the recently-formed all-girl Scouts BSA (Boy Scouts of America) Troop 291, based in Ponte Vedra Beach. The Troop is one of 11 new all-girl troops in the North Florida area. Although the troop technically consists of inductees to scouting, many of the girls are already well-versed with many of the ins and outs of the program.

That's because well before the Boy Scouts program rebranded as Scouts BSA on Feb. 1 and invited girls to join, they were attending "family camping" with their brothers, who were already in the program. They did all the same activities and learned all the same skills on these trips. They just weren't getting the merit badges or belt loops. The integration of girls into Scouts BSA was the last scouting division within the Boy Scouts of America to allow both girls and boys. According to Patrick Linfors, director of field service/ COO for the Boy Scouts of America North Florida Council, in August 2018, the Cub Scouts opened for girls in grades K through 5. Other divisions such as Venturing have been open to women since 1998, and Sea Scouts and Exploring have been co-ed since 1971.

Recently, Troop 291 acquired two Cub Scouts who crossed over from Pack 277, also of Ponte Vedra, on Feb. 25 at the Christ Episcopal Church. They earned their Arrow of Light awards, the highest award in Cub Scouts. The girls were the first in history to achieve the award.

THE CONTROVERSY

Dick Basye has spent the past 13 years as a Boy Scouts leader, is currently serving at the district level and is the committee chair for the Ponte Vedra all-girls troop. Basye was also a scout in his youth and has seen the organization evolve throughout the years.

"The Scouts is leadership training for life," Basye says. "So, it's a great program. It prepares the kids for the future and it is making tomorrow's leaders. I was a scout leader for boys for years and these girls are phenomenal at what they can do. ... You know, I believe in the program. I knew (allowing girls in) was going to come. I mean, we (were) one of the only four countries in the world that (didn't) have co-ed scouting."

Basye says the program the BSA originally based itself on was the scouting movement in England, which was founded in 1907. According to The Daily Telegraph, the organization has allowed girls in as early as the 1970s. Basye says that much of the controversy surrounding the policy change has been due to a lack of information, from the media and other-

wise. He went on to say that once he tells people that the troops and camps are not co-ed and that the BSA and Girl Scouts organizations are unaffiliated, the outrage typically recedes.

"It takes two seconds to actually read an article and then figure out what most people don't bother to look up," Basye said.

The controversy isn't just limited to the opinions of the community. The Girl Scouts organization has been in litigation surrounding the change of membership policy with the Boy Scouts of America since November 2018. According to the complaint, the Girl Scouts claim the decision is an infringement on their trademark and can potentially cause confusion. Mary Anne Jacobs, CEO of the Girl Scouts of Gateway Council, released a statement to the Ponte Vedra Recorder regarding the litigation.

"Competitors come and go — but Girl Scouts focuses on moving forward at the pace of girls," Jacobs says. "We remain as committed and focused as ever before when it comes to serving today's girls in new, exciting and future-focused ways, because the need for female leadership has

never been greater."

While there aren't stark differences between the BSA and the Girl Scouts missions, the girls in Troop 291 say they like how much outdoor time is involved in the program and also want to learn skills like archery and rifle shooting. A few of the girls in Troop 291 that have participated in both organizations say they also enjoy how the Scouts BSA program is structured for the members to work as independently as possible.

"You can do a lot of the same things in Girl Scouts, but you can do more for yourself," says Nishita Ramesh, the patrol leader. "See, like today we get to make our own lunch and dinner. We get to decide what we want to do and what we want to eat. Like we just had cupcakes. We have coke. We are (drinking) coke right now."

LOCAL GIRL SCOUTS EMBARK ON MOON MISSION WITH ROBOTICS

About 10 minutes away from where Troop 291 meets at the United Methodist Church in Ponte Vedra, five third-grade Brownies are coding their first robot.

Aubrey O'Reilly, a volunteer leader for Troop 2112 in Ponte Vedra, led the girls on the first junior Girl Scouts robotics team in Jacksonville to present at the Shiva Robotics Academy FIRST LEGO League Junior STEM challenge. She became interested in nurturing her daughter's interest in robotics and engineering but found the landscape of after-school STEM programs to be expensive and limiting. After attending an event hosted through the Girl Scouts, which featured Shiva Robotics and Renaissance Jax, she became "hyped" to try the Academy and enter the Florida FIRST LEGO (FLL) Jr. Expo.

After recruiting some other girls in the troop, the team, named the "Mighty Emus," met every Wednesday to work on designing their moon mission.

"They were very interested in learning about the moon and about possibly living on the moon," O'Reilly says. "It was fun to see their imaginations run wild as they were building our moon base, designing our T-shirts and especially building and coding the different robots that we built each session in the program."

O'Reilly saw the potential of not only nurturing her daughter's interest but creating a safe space for her and the other girls to try new things.

"I also think that it's important to get girls involved in areas like robotics because we need to build and encourage their confidence from the very beginning," O'Reilly says. "They need to know that robots aren't just for boys and coding can be fun.



"They will do more in a group of just girls," O'Reilly went on to say. "A lot of these teams are like four boys and one girl, you know, and so sometimes the boys sort of take over and (girls feel like they) can't express themselves."

The girls got together and designed, coded and built their moon base every day for nine weeks. When the Mighty Emus presented at the Prime Osborn Convention Center on Feb. 23, they were only one of a few all-girl groups. They used their imaginations and learned team skills. They were proud of themselves.

"Our robot worked perfectly and I'm so happy," Girl Scout Emily Hightower says. "When you're practicing it, it sometimes doesn't work. During the presentation, I talked about problem solving. We came to some problems during the mission moon, like how the green house was too close to the water source."

Girl Scout Mackenzie O'Reilly described herself as a de facto team leader.

"I like how robots look and how they do things," she says. "(The presentation) was amazing and I loved doing it with friends. I'm good at getting the team together."

Back at the Boy Scouts Echockotee camp, the troop is cleaning up after lunch. Second-in-command, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader Marina Mitchell is directing the troop on proper washing techniques while the adults lounge in a pavilion a distance away.

Rose Gottschalk from the younger division of the "Winged Tigers" patrol, plays with her trumpet. She knows "Taps" and says her favorite part of being the official

Gottschalk becomes exasperated when continually asked about why some other girls choose to be in the Girl Scouts.

"Some girls just choose to," she says. "If they want to, they can! Just choose! We need both!"

Amid the controversy, the Girl Scouts

junior robotics team is giggling and helping each other with their Lego designs while eating cupcakes. Miles apart, two younger members of Scouts BSA Troop 291 are looking intently at a worm they found by the campsite. Neither group seems to notice the world around them at the moment, but they do seem at ease in their surroundings.


Ponte Vedra High School student achieves top ACT score


Joseph DePorre, son of Susan and Vince DePorre and a junior at Ponte Vedra High School, scored a perfect 36 on every section of his ACT exam, earning the highest possible ACT composite score of 36.

The ACT consists of tests in English, mathematics, reading and science, each scored on a scale of one to 36. A student's composite score is the average of the four test scores. According to ACT, only around two-tenths of 1 percent of students who take the ACT earn a top score. In the U.S. high school graduating class of 2018, only 2,760 out of more than 2 million graduates earned a top composite score of 36.

This is DePorre's first and only take of the ACT.

UNF poll shows majority approve of Gov. DeSantis' job performance

The Public Opinion Research Lab at the University of North Florida has a new poll of Florida registered voters that reveals a majority approve of the job Ron DeSantis is doing as governor. The survey also shows job approval for Sen. Marco Rubio is higher than job approval for newly elected Sen. Rick Scott.

The poll, comprised of registered voters in the state of Florida, shows approval for Gov. DeSantis at 60 percent overall, with a net positive of 41 points. Not surprisingly, the strongest support comes from registered Republicans at 81 percent approval and only 45 percent approval among registered Democrats. Overall, 21 percent don't know.

Additionally, 51 percent of respondents approve either strongly or somewhat of how Rubio is handling his job, a net positive of 21 points. Seventy-one percent of Republicans approve and 36 percent of Democrats approve of the job that he's doing. These figures are lower for Scott, with 43 percent overall approving, but only a net positive of 10 points.

Republican voters have 64 percent approval for Scott, and Democratic voters have 23 percent. Concerning Nikki Fried, Florida commissioner of agriculture, 32 percent approve strongly or somewhat of the job she's doing, with a net positive of 21 points. Among Democrats, Fried has 33 percent approval, and among Republicans she has 29 percent approval. Fifty-eight percent don't know how she's performing.

According to the UNF lab, Gov. DeSantis is enjoying the honeymoon period of recently being elected. The question that will play out over the next two months is whether he can translate his popularity into policy during the legislative session in Tallahassee, said Dr. Michael Binder, faculty director of the Public Opinion Research Lab at UNF.

"Having unified Republican government should make things easier for the governor, but as we have seen in the past, personal relationships can make or break the budgeting process," Binder said.

When asked what they believe is the most important problem facing Florida, education topped the list with 19 percent, followed closely by the environment and health care with 18 and 17 percent, respectively. Immigration leads the way for Republican voters with 22 percent, and Democrats believe health care is the most important problem, also at 22 percent.

Regarding the United States Space Command, 76 percent of registered voters support the Space Command being headquartered in Florida, 9 percent oppose and 15 percent don't know. Among Democrats, support is at 67 percent, while Republicans



UNF engineering professor and Ponte Vedra resident recognized for lifetime achievement in marine meteorology

Dr. Don Resio, a University of North Florida professor of ocean engineering and director of the Taylor Engineering Research Institute in UNF's College of Computing, Engineering and Construction, has been recognized for his lifetime achievements in marine meteorology.

Resio, a Nocatee/Ponte Vedra resident, accepted the Vincent Cardone Memorial Prize for Marine Meteorology, administered by the Society for Underwater Technology, at a Feb. 26 ceremony during the Catch The Next Wave conference as part of the Oceanology International Americas Exhibition and Conference at the San Diego Convention Center.

The award is named after marine meteorologist Vincent J. Cardone, who was co-founder and president of Oceanweather Inc. Shortly after Cardone's death, a few of his friends including Ralph Rayner, Society for Underwater Technology president, developed the memorial prize in his name.

"I was honored to receive an award named after the single marine meteorologist in the world that I most respected both for his work and as a person," Resio said.

The award comprises a Campbell Stokes Sunshine Recorder engraved with the prize winner's name. Selection of the award winner is made by a committee, which includes previous prize winners. Resio

is the second recipient and first U.S. citizen to receive the honor.

Resio's recent research has focused on solutions for coastal vulnerabilities within the U.S., including generating economically significant power from waves and tides; the development of improved rapid causeway/bridging replacement technologies for disaster relief; methods for sealing large breaches in levees; and improved risk estimation methods, in addition to his continued research in oceanography and marine meteorology.

Before joining UNF, Resio served as senior technologist for the Army Corps of Engineers and directed the Army's Program for Coastal Disaster Response/Mitigation. He has been a leader in meteorological and oceanographic research for over 40 years, spearheading many efforts that have contributed significantly to improving predictions for winds, waves, currents, surges and coastal evolution due to storms and to better understand coastal hazards.

He was co-leader of the post-Katrina Interagency Performance Evaluation Taskforce and led the risk analysis team for the South Louisiana Hurricane Protection Project, looking into the effects of climatic variability on hurricane characteristics in the Gulf of Mexico. This team developed a new technical approach for hurricane risk assessment, which serves as part of the foundation for much of the approach to risk along U.S. coastlines today.

Under the sponsorship of the Department of Homeland Security, Resio led a team of researchers in the development of innovative methods for the rapid repair of levee breaches. This work offered new options for improved flood mitigation in many areas of the U.S. and is now being implemented in a full-scale deployment in Lake

Okeechobee, Florida.

Resio has published numerous articles in leading international journals and has been the keynote speaker at many national and international conferences on ocean/atmospheric physics and statistics. He served as a U.S. delegate to the United Nations' Joint WMO-IOC Technical Commission for Oceanography and Marine Meteorology in the area of climate effects and the ocean. He also serves as a reviewer for many national and international efforts to quantify coastal hazards and risks, including a recent week-long review of the Indian Institute of Technology's (New Delhi) program on cyclone flooding in the north Indian Ocean.

Additionally, Resio served as the cochair of the U.N. World Meteorological Organization Coastal Inundation and Flooding Demonstration Project until 2017, helping to direct an international group of scientists and engineers to mitigate current and future global flooding risks. His expertise has played a critical role in helping countries around the world understand, quantify and mitigate coastal inundation risks.

UNF health administration professor named 2019 Emerging Scholar

Dr. Hanadi Hamadi, a University of North Florida (UNF) associate professor of health administration in the Brooks College of Health, was named a 2019 Emerging Scholar by Diverse: Issues in Higher Education, a magazine focusing on matters of access and opportunity for all in higher education.

Diverse: Issues in Higher Education first published its Emerging Scholars edition in 2002, which recognizes 15 minority scholars from around the country who are making their mark through teaching, research and service.

"Dr. Hamadi is extremely passionate about educating the next generation of health care leaders," said Dr. Mei Zhao, chair of the UNF Department of Health Administration. "She continuously integrates health administration students with her scholarly and community-based activities to diversify their learning experience. Her efforts have and will continue to re-shape the health care delivery system."

The scholars were selected on several criteria, including research, educational background, publishing and teaching record, field of study competitiveness and broad impact on the academy.

Hamadi, a Southside resident, joined the UNF faculty in 2014. Some of her current research projects include the impact of smoking policy on patient outcomes and hospital performance; development of an adolescent opioid-specific screening tool; examining the impact of community diversity and hospital factors on opioid-adverse events in Florida; examining the relationships between minority health and trauma center recognition; and identifying system-level intervention to improve

birth trauma rates among minority populations.

Hamadi has mentored graduate and undergraduate students who have actively participated with her in several research projects.

"I truly believe that this integration has broken down the silos students perceive themselves in," she said.

"They see their academic life as part of the UNF community and their personal life as part of the broader Jacksonville community. My research, and their involvement and contribution, focuses on helping them merge those two aspects."

Hamadi has won several awards, including the 2019 UNF Outstanding Undergraduate Teaching Award and the UNF Scholars Transforming Academic Research Symposium Award. Hamadi also has numerous peer-reviewed publications that represent her dedication to health care research and education.

Hamadi earned her doctorate from the University of South Carolina in health services policy and management with a concentration in health policy. She received her master's degree in health system management from George Mason University, as well as a bachelor's degree in biology.

Outside of teaching and conducting research, Hamadi is involved in academic, international, community and other forms of civic engagement, such as serving as a volunteer at a local women's domestic violence shelter.

have 85 percent support. When asked about allowing concealed carry on college campuses, 38 percent of registered voters support it, with 58 percent opposing. Democrats report 20 percent support of concealed carry on college campuses, while Republicans report 57 percent support. On a different note, only 46 percent of voters support allowing teachers and school officials to conceal carry in K-12 schools, with 27 percent of Democrats and 68 percent of Republicans supporting it.

Concerning smokable medical marijuana, 87 percent support legalization in Florida, while 12 percent oppose. Democratic voters have 89 percent support, while Republicans have 83 percent support. Similarly, when asked about recreational marijuana use, 62 percent of voters support legalizing it (65 percent of Democrats, 51 percent of Republicans).



Influential business leaders from the Jacksonville area convened on Friday, March 8 for Partner Connect at THE PLAYERS presented by Mayo Clinic.



Eyes on the green

With THE PLAYERS Championship starting Thursday, let's visit one of the most visually-intense sports: golf!

Though you may debate that every sport depends on vision, it is golf that heavily depends not only on sight but also vision.

And now that I have completely confused you, lets understand more.

So, sight is how small of a target you can see at a particular distance. If you are 20/20, then you can identify a letter that is 8.87 millimeters high at 20 feet. Vision is deciphering the cues from sight and interpreting that to our advantage for the task at hand, at that moment. The symbiosis of these two then allows golfers to not only see but also align their bodies, balance their stance and visualize their shot before impact itself. Herein lies the key to a successful drive or a meaningful putt.

After I completed Deane Beman's eye surgery, he taught me that I must start with becoming a great putter first and then the drive will eventually come. (Don't tell him, but I have yet to find time to start golfing.)

The vision demands and environmental exposure related to golf-associated eye concerns can be classified into the following categories for ease of understanding and future surgical correction:

- 1. Quantity of vision, such as 20/40, 20/20, etc.
- 2. Quality of vision such as:
- a.) Contrast sensitivity to decipher different levels of visual inputs in different lighting conditions
- b.) Stereopsis as depth perception to best apply learned techniques in three-dimensional space
- c.) Spatial resolution to plan and direct putting and long drives effectively
- d.) Convergence to align our target at a particular distance
- e.) Peripheral visual field to look at the big picture for cues or neglect
- 3. Red appearance of the eyes from pterygium and dry eyes

Having operated on numerous profes-

sional golfers over nearly three decades, I can project that when all of the above-mentioned faculties are in synch and normalcy along with eye-hand coordination, we can expect perfect execution for what the mind has planned in this mentally intuitive sport. This is true for novice as well as professional golfers alike.

Below is a brief look at some of the procedures that can be done for golfers' eyes to improve their game.

Bevond 20/20 vision

Recently introduced Bladeless, Flapless, No-Cut NextGen Lasik techniques can help most golfers safely see even beyond 20/20 in most cases.

Golfers who may wear contact lenses or glasses may have nearsightedness (myopia), farsightedness (hyperopia) or astigmatism (football-shaped cornea). With technology today, we can diagnose and measure to the minutest level of vision involvement and then correct these using computer-driven, micron-precision lasers.

Presbyopia in golfers as they advance in age (beyond 40 years) requires reading glasses because the natural lens inside the eye stops zooming (no more "tele" and "wide" zooming like a camera does) and hence they need to keep their score cards at further distance with their arms outstretched to read or record. This condition called Presbyopia can be addressed with new generation lens and laser techniques.

For those golfers in their early and late 60s, the vision gets cloudy and dim due to cataracts. A cataract is a cloudy transformation of our crystal clear, natural lens.

This cataract can be removed using modern laser techniques and be replaced by an artificial lens implant that can in most allow them to see without glasses at distance and near. Such lens implants can be monofocal; multifocal like ReStor, Symfony or Tecnis; or accommodative like Crystalens.

Additionally, cataract surgery can now be planned as two stages. Following cataract surgery, patients can undergo NextGen Lasik surgery to correct any residual astigmatism to thus completely fix the optics of the eyes for a glasses-free vision experience for life.

Even patients who have undergone previous cataract surgery and did not have a choice of these advanced, multifocal/progressive lens implants at that time can now avail of New Generation Lasik surgery to help them get rid of glasses altogether.

Red 'golfer's eyes

Pterygium is a red, unsightly lesion on the white of the eyes that is rampant among golfers. Pterygium — a yellow-red lesion on the white of the eye (pinguecula) that can start as a cosmetic blemish and become an unsightly wedge-shaped growth that, if left untreated, may eventually cover the comea of the eye and adversely affect vision — are usually the result of exposure to sun, a professional hazard for golfers.

A lot of golfers have pterygiums, and we usually counsel them to wear sunglasses with ultraviolet protection to prevent further damage, but when they are advanced, they require surgery.

Using a "No-Stitch" human placenta technique (SPARKLE TM) with glue allows us to strive for cosmetic (bright sparkling, white eye) elegance along with visual perfection.

These surgeries can further be raised by using 3D technology that uses a 3D IMAX-like screen. This technology is used instead of the smaller microscope traditionally used for eye surgery to deliver and execute for a golfer's armamentarium of vision and appearance, so much of which aligns with fashionable outfits we see on the golf course.

Dry eyes

Out in the sun with continuous exposure to allergens, tear evaporation and repeated challenges to their ocular surface induces dry eyes in golfers that can be corrected with today's technological advances.

MOISTTM Ocular Surface Therapy using a full range of dry-eye techniques and technologies including LipiFlow and MGP and Lacrimal Plugs can now help numerous golfers suffering from dry eyes.

With technology today, most golfers can enjoy their sport and yet maintain or attain vision without glasses or contact lenses and in many cases beyond 20/20 giving them an obvious advantage. Additionally, unsightly and red eyes can now be corrected using No-Stitch techniques to sparkling white eyes.

Protection and prevention are still key, but golfers are encouraged to visit with their eye doctors to evaluate for any of the above-mentioned conditions, as chances are, there is a successful option.

Handicaps in golf may be seasonal, but vision should not be. To have excellent vision and sight overcomes many handicaps to level the par on the greens.

Each year, patients from around the world travel to Jacksonville's Gulani Vision Institute to have their vision corrected by ophthalmologist Arun Gulani, MD. A Ponte Vedra Beach resident, Dr. Gulani has been a leader in LASIK, cataract and astigmatism surgery, has invented Lasik complication corrective techniques and is often called upon to train other surgeons in the latest groundbreaking technologies.



Ponte Vedra baseball kicks off season with optimism

Following the departure of three graduating seniors currently playing baseball at the Division 1 level, including Florida Gators starter Jacob Young, one would believe that expectations would be lowered for the 2019 Ponte Vedra Sharks.

The Sharks were also dealt a bitter blow when last year's leading hitter, Sebastian Rothman, sustained an offseason knee injury that will sideline the South Georgia JC commit for the season.

There is plenty of optimism, however, for the current Sharks squad, which returns several veterans who played major roles for last year's district champions. The returning veterans, coupled with the emergence of some promising newcomers, have propelled the Sharks to a nice start for the current season.

After a perfect preseason sweep over St. Joseph Academy (9-3) and Atlantic Coast (10-3), the Sharks have begun the season with a pair of victories and two defeats.

The Sharks began their regular season with a 2-0 road win over Valdosta's Lowndes behind the shutout pitching of returning ace Tony Roca and sophomore newcomer Scott Griesemer. With the victory over Lowndes, Roca won his 12th career victory and has climbed into fifth place in all-time wins for a Shark hurler.

Roca combined with current Jackson-

ville University pitcher Kevin Faulkner to form an effective one-two combination the past couple of seasons. Projected to replace Faulkner in this year's rotation is senior Brody Maynard. The 6-foot-4-inch, 215-pound Maynard sat out virtually the entire 2018 season with a shoulder injury before returning very late in the season. Maynard came on in relief to post a save in the Sharks' district championship win over Clay. A healthier Maynard is poised to take on a much more meaningful role

After a somewhat shaky start to this season in the Sharks' come-from-behind 9-8 victory over Mandarin, Maynard has shown some great potential by striking out nine opposition batters in less than six innings of work thus far.

Neither Roca nor Griesemer saw action on the mound in the second week of play in the current year's schedule. Entering his 11th year as the head coach of the Sharks, veteran head coach Tom Stanton has traditionally mixed up his lineups early in the season as he points towards his Sharks playing their best ball come tournament time.

In the Sharks' first loss of the season to Bartram Trail, the Sharks' opening pitcher gave up six runs to the Bears, a deficit that would prove too difficult to overcome as the Sharks fell 14-4 to Bartram Trail. Four other pitchers used in the contest also proved ineffective against the host squad.

Playing in the spacious confines of the

Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville, the Sharks dropped their second contest to Fletcher in a final score that was in no way indicative to what was a very tight game up until the final inning.

Trailing by a 1-0 score entering their half of the sixth inning, the Sharks, playing without some of their best hitters, loaded the bases with one out but failed to produce a run against the Senators. A deflated Sharks team then saw Fletcher tally seven runs in the bottom half of the inning to cement the victory.

Ponte Vedra beat Nease 2-1 on Tuesday

With more than 20 games remaining in the very young season, coach Stanton will welcome back a number of veterans that return from their district championship team from 2018.

A big reason for Stanton's optimism is the return to the infield of a now healthy Matt Barnhorst. The Cornell commit was relegated to just a hitting role in 2018, as an arm injury kept him out of the defensive lineup. Beginning his junior season, Barnhorst captured a starting role in his first year as the Sharks' second baseman. Now fully healed from his arm ailment, Barnhorst will be the starting shortstop for the Sharks and is currently hitting a hefty

Ponte Vedra should be very solid up the middle defensively as slick fielding junior infielder Alex Oritiz will move from shortstop to second base. Junior Porter Jordheim saw considerable action at third base last year, while the Sharks should expect to be very solid once again at first base with the return of the 2018 starter Tony Roca. When Roca is pitching, coach Stanton will have a very capable replacement at first base in Brody Maynard.

Stanton, a former minor league catcher, will return his entire three-man catching staff from 2018. With another year of experience behind them, the trio of seniors Mason McLeod, Michael Soncrant and sophomore Trey Powers, the Sharks should be much improved behind the

Stanton also welcomes some valuable regular returnees in the outfield. Carter Page, a three-year starter with a career .319 batting average, returns in left field, while sophomore Cody Nelson will again patrol the outfield in centerfield. As a freshman, Nelson hit at a .300 clip offensively and led the Sharks with an on-base percentage of .540. The Sharks expect more productivity out in right field this season with sophomore Dillon Haines slotted as a replacement for last year's right fielders who hit well south of .200.

After Tuesday's with Nease, the Sharks will conclude their limited two-game schedule this week by traveling Thursday to Orange Park to take on Oakleaf. The Sharks will then spend their spring break with a three-game tournament at nearby Providence High School, where they will first face Tarvares on Monday at 4 p.m.

The 18th hole, he mentioned, plays completely different this time of year compared to May. It was interesting that he mentioned 18 because so few people

"There's nothing easy about that hole," Woods said. "Anything starts left, it's not coming back and you're going to have to be dropping up on the next tee or playing from there again. The bail-out, that first tree, I think was 280 to that first tree, and that's dead. So, I've tried to play more in the conservative side to try and put it in play, even though I'm a little further back."

On the 18th hole last year, in May, Woods hit 3-iron, 9-iron. Tuesday in his practice round, he used 3-wood, 3-iron.

After the tee shot, there's the problem of landing on the green, he said.

"You can't bail right," Woods said. "You can't bail short. You got to hit two really good golf shots to finish it off. And if you can play that hole in 16 for the week, you're going to be picking up a lot of shots on the field."

When asked about the "better than most" putt that Woods hit in 2001, he said he actually got a read from Fred Funk's putt. Funk was playing in the group ahead, and




hit my spot, and I was just hoping that it would take the break because I saw Fred's, how much it went to the right at the end, and my putt was not going right. I'm like, would you start breaking. And as soon as it started to break, I'm like, stop breaking. And then it caught the low side of the hole and went in."

In addition to the difficulty of executing the shots required at TPC Sawgrass, Woods noted that Pete Dye is also a master of creating intimidating visuals.

"You have to overcome that part of it," Woods insisted.





FOOD POLICY

THE PLAYERS allows fans to bring in their own food in a 1-gallon clear, plastic bag, where food items are also wrapped in clear wrap. Fans can refill up their empty water bottles at the filtered water stations. This policy does not allow fans to bring in outside water bottles and/or beverages.

THE STADIUM COURSE: HOLE-BY-HOLE OVERVIEW

HOLE 1

- No. 1 tee is a popular spot to watch players hit their tee shots with mounds to the left and right of the green for optimal viewing.
- Limited foliage lets you see a player's approach and putt.
- This less-crowded location provides an opportunity to get close to players as they walk from No. 1 green to No. 2 tee.

HOLE 2

■ Elevated mounding behind the green provides a great place to watch players decide whether or not to go for the par 5 in two or lay up, and then you can keep an eye on them as they head to No. 3 tee to take a shot at the par-3 green.

HOLE 3

- Left of the tee box is a great place to view golf, as you are just on the other side of the practice tee, which means you can move back and forth to watch the third hole, as well as see players warm up. This elevated area provides a great line of sight.
- Extended mounding to the left of the green allows for great views of balls approaching the green and players putting.

HOLE 4

- Sit on the bulkhead around the water surrounding the green and dangle your feet (hold on to those flip-flops!).
- Lowered mounding for improved viewing on 4 tee.
- Expanded fan walkway.

HOLE 5

- Find great views of this tough par 4 from the elevated left side of the fairway, where you can also catch a glimpse of players practicing on the back tee of the upgraded driving range.
- Elevated mounding behind the green provides superior viewing angles.

HOLE 6

- This green isn't very crowded and offers a great place to catch the action up close.
- It's the perfect spot to be near players as they walk from the green to the No. 7 tee.

HOLE 7

■ The elevated mounding behind the green allows you to see all the way back to the tee box.

HOLE 8

- Always a fan favorite, you can get close to the action when players hit their tee shots thanks to elevated mounding behind the green (and in the shade of nearby trees).
- The elevated mounds also allow fans to see shots land and players putt on this undulating green.
- The Fan Bleacher presented by ULTRA offers views of the eighth hole.

HOLE 9

- A great par 5 to watch players hit their tee shots and decide whether or not to go for the green in two.
- Significant amounts of foliage to the left of the green have been removed, and bleachers were added
- Mounding on 9 green allows you to have a better view of players' approach shots and putts.

HOLE 10

■ The elevated mounding behind the tee provides great views of players' tee shots, and you're just steps away from a permanent restroom.

HOLE 11

■ A fan favorite par 5 where players often go for the green in two, the green is surrounded by sand and water, which provides non-stop drama and excitement.

HOLE 12

- Elevated mounds around the tee provide excellent views of players hitting their tee shots. Will they go for the green or lay up?
- The mound near the green allows you to look back at the tee and approach shots, as well as over the green for up-close views.
- \blacksquare Additional mounding for improved viewing on 12 tee.

HOLE 13

- Fans directly behind the green may even see a ball or two roll through the green and end up in collection area just on the other side of the ropes from where they're sitting.
- The top of the mounding behind the green also provides a nice view of players teeing off on No. 14.

HOIF 14

■ A tough par 4 with great, elevated views behind the tee and the right side of the fairway. Errant tee shots to the right often end up right near fans.

HOLE 15

- \blacksquare This par 4 has elevated mounding on the left side of the green, providing good views of approach shots and putting.
- \blacksquare Additional mounding for improved viewing on 15 green.

HOLE 16

- The elevated mounding on the left side of the green provides an ideal vantage point for approach shots and putts, as well as a view of the 17th hole.
- This is one of the most iconic par 5s in all of golf, offering opportunities for eagles and birdies with accurate approach shots, but also bogeys and double bogeys with water looming down the right-hand side.

HOLE 17

- There is not a bad view of this legendary, Island Green par 3.
- This is a perfect spot to watch golf and then see players walk off the green and through the tunnel as they head to the 18th tee.

HOLE 18

- This finishing hole is one of the most difficult on the PGA TOUR, with water down the left side and an extremely narrow fairway.
- You'll find great views behind the tee and down the right side of the hole.
- The elevated area around the green is known as The Bluff, where courtesy folding chairs are provided at no charge, and if you're in your chair when the last putt drops at the end of the day, you can take it home for free!




