



Deaths of 2 Ponte Vedra residents ruled murder-suicide

SJSO says woman killed by stalker ex-boyfriend

According to the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office (SJSO), the Medical Examiner's Office has concluded that the deaths of the two individuals found in a home in Ponte Vedra on Saturday have been ruled a murdersuicide.

Per an email from SJSO spokesman Chuck Mulligan on Monday, the two deceased individuals have been identified as Lynn Michele Bender, 53, of Ponte Vedra, and Simon Patrick Hanley, 60, of Ponte Vedra. According to Mulligan, the cause of death of Bender was ruled a homicide, and the manner of death was by gunshot wound. SJSO said Hanley died from a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Bender and Hanley were found dead on Saturday in a house off Southern Oak Drive in Nocatee's Twenty Mile neighborhood. A Facebook post from SJSO stated that two individuals came to the residence around noon on Saturday to check on the residents because they had been unable to contact them. When they arrived at the home, they discovered two people deceased inside.

Mulligan told the Recorder in a subsequent interview that Bender had contacted SJSO in November 2018

about her ex-boyfriend's stalking behavior. Hanley was issued a trespass warning at that time. A month later, Bender sought a restraining order, at which point SJSO learned he had continued the behavior, allegedly buying her unwanted gifts including a golf cart. On Dec. 7, he was arrested and issued a GPS ankle monitor.

On March 5, a court hearing addressed the case, but the charges were

dropped, and Hanley's GPS ankle monitor was removed, Mulligan said.

Bender was a real estate agent who recently moved to the area from Ohio. The Cavanaugh Team Real Es-

tate at RE/MAX Unlimited in Nocatee where she worked released a statement on Monday via Facebook.

"It is with great sadness that we must share the tragic loss of our dear friend and listing agent, Lynn Bender," the post read. "Our hearts are broken, and our prayers are surrounding her family in this most difficult time. Lynn joined our Cavanaugh Team 14 months ago as an experienced RE/ MAX agent from Ohio. We have gleaned on her experience, but mostly her laughter, joy and fun spirit. We became very close as we talked and/ or met almost every single day for the past year. Over the next few days, we will be giving her family our full support to ensure her honor and dignity are held high while they are accepting the loss of their mother, sister, daughter and aunt. Her death was not related to real estate interactions, but with a past relationship that had turned into a horrific scenario."

Actor Kevin Rahm to host inaugural celebrity golf tournament, music event in St. Augustine supporting St. Jude

Known for his roles in "Mad Men," "Desperate Housewives," "Lethal Weapon" and "Madame Secretary," actor Kevin Rahm is hosting a celebrity golf tournament and music event in St. Augustine May 30 to June 2 benefiting St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

To be held at the World Golf Village Renaissance Resort, the inaugural event is modeled after the West Coast version, The Warburton, hosted by actor Patrick Warburton. More than 45 celebrities, songwriters and rock legends are anticipated to attend The Rahm.

"Give us one night, and I'll promise you'll want to come back," Rahm told the Recorder. "It's a top-notch event, and it's going to be a lot of fun."

Celebrities will begin arriving on Thursday, May 30, for Songwriters Night at the Renaissance World Golf Village ballroom. The show includes renowned Nashville songwriters who will tell the stories behind their biggest hits and perform them.

Songwriters scheduled to perform include Tim Nichols, who wrote Tim McGraw's No. 1 hit, "Live Like You Were Dying" and Jo Dee Messina's "Heads Carolina, Tails California;" and Kelley Lovelace, writer of the hit "All-American Girl" performed by Carrie Underwood as well as Brad Paisley hits such as "Ticks," "I'm Still a Guy" and "Camouflage." Other writers include Jamie O'Neal and Billy Dean, both of whom have several country hits and multiple awards. Tickets are \$100 and include open bar.

"This is one of my favorite events, because you really get to hear those stories,

especially from the person who's not necessarily the famous person," said Rahm, who lives in Sacramento, California.

Friday night, May 31, begins with the Pairings Party for golfers and their guests followed by the St. Jude JAM. This event will feature entertainment by Sixwire, a unique lineup of Rock-and-Roll Hall of Famers and other famous rock legends who will perform some of their hits in what will be a two-and-a-half to three-hour rock-and-roll variety show. Tickets are \$100.

Performers scheduled to appear include Steve Augeri, the former lead singer of Journey; Steve Cropper of Booker T & the MGs and a member of the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame; Jason Scheff, the longtime lead singer of Chicago; Wally Palmer, lead singer of The Romantics; John Elefante, former lead singer of Kansas; Mike Mills of R.E.M. and a member of the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame; Jay Demarcus of Rascal Flatts; Drew Copeland and Ken Block of Sister Hazel; David Cook, the season seven winner of "American Idol;" Chris Daughtry, Grammy Award nominee and fourth-place contestant on the fifth season of "American Idol;" and Robin Meade, Headline News anchor of "Morning Express with Robin Meade." There will also be two unannounced surprise guests.

"It's a concert like you're never going to see anywhere else," Rahm said. "You're never going to see all those guys in one room."

On June 1, the Saturday Soiree will

feature evening red carpet appearances by many of the celebrities involved with the golf tournament, live and silent auctions, a patient family, dinner and entertainment by Sixwire. Tickets for the Saturday Soiree are \$250.

The golf tournament will be played Saturday and Sunday, June 1-2, at the World Golf Village utilizing both the King & Bear and Slammer & Squire courses. Each foursome will be paired with a celebrity for both rounds, and that celebrity will be seated with the team at the Saturday Soiree. The cost per player is \$2,000 and includes two tickets to each of the evening activities. Foursomes are \$8,000. There are a limited number of openings for golf.

According to the event website, other celebrities confirmed to attend the weekend's festivities include actor and comedian Rob Riggle, actor Jeffrey Nordling, actor Galen Gering, actor Ben Reed, former NFL allpro player Sterling Sharpe and former NFL player Harold Green, among others.

The lemonade stand ultimately raised \$2861.44. In addition to the help of their friends, the fundraising effort included the support of Publix store manager Brian Sanders and the Ponte Vedra Beach UPS store, which donated the flyers for the event.

Dogs

I adopted Porthos in July 2005 from the Humane Society of South Mississippi in Gulfport. Less than two months later, the region was devastated by Hurricane Katrina, and the facility suffered a number of canine casualties. I knew it was fate that Porthos and I had found each other.

Since then, we were pretty much inseparable. We relocated to Jacksonville in the summer of 2006 and he was my constant companion. He would join me at Bark at the Park for Jacksonville Suns/ Jumbo Shrimp games and \$2 hot dogs. I would join him at Dogwood Park to watch him swim in the lake and sniff his friends'

He was also able to win over my entire family, something none of my ex-boyfriends had been able to do. The first time we visited my mom in Tennessee, Porthos had to sleep on a dog bed in the laundry room. Fast forward a few years and he was laying on HER bed, enjoying some treats while watching a "Twilight" marathon (don't ask).

He was also a great road-trip buddy, even making the trek from South Carolina to upstate New York with me and my

mom. And he was the only one of us on the trip that was able to maintain composure as my mom took the mountain curves of West Virginia at 70 miles per hour, yelling at anyone who cut her off, which means they eventually pulled in front of her with less than 2.5 miles in between.

Porthos was seriously the sweetest. calmest, cutest dog I had ever known, and charmed everyone he ever met. He would often go to work with me on weekends and keep my coworkers calm during college football Saturdays (not an easy feat). One time while visiting my mom in Tennessee, he did wander off after being let outside while I was gone, sending my mom into an immediate panic. I rushed back to her condo and began an immense search, which ended pretty quickly after a picture of a "missing" smiling Porthos was emailed to everyone in the condo community. He'd been quickly found by the first person he saw after he approached the boyfriend of a HOA board member to shake hands. When I called the number from the email, I was informed he had joined the couple for dinner at grandma's house and would be back soon. And my mom was relieved to know we would be speaking again.

That's just the kind of dog he was. He never met a stranger, and he sincerely loved everyone, especially me.

When he passed in January 2018, a few weeks shy of his 14th birthday, I thought I might never recover. It was weird going home and not being greeted at the door. Not having someone to care for and who would listen to me without complaint or interruption, which I know couldn't have been easy.

A couple of months after his passing, the Recorder ran a story about the Pet Pals program at S.A.F.E. Pet Rescue. People could "borrow" one of the nonprofit's long-term residents for a few hours, a weekend, a week, or however long you wanted. I thought this seemed like a great solution to getting some canine companionship without having to make a commitment I wasn't ready for.

Through this program, I met Chocho, a senior chow chow-mix, with a bad hip and a beautiful white face. Chocho was different from Porthos. She didn't always love everyone she met. She wasn't too fond of men, and she really, really didn't like cats, especially Midnight, a feral cat that came with my house. In fairness, though, no one really likes Midnight, because he's mean, and I'm 98 percent sure he's some kind of demon that was transformed into a cat and cursed to roam the Earth for all eternity. I feed him daily anyway for fear of what might happen to me if I don't, but that's a

story for another time.

Anyway, Chocho, who had been at the shelter for four years, would spend most weekends with me as part of the program. At first, she seemed unsure about the arrangement, or about me even reaching down to pet her. As time went on, though, she started rubbing her head on my hand, she would hang out in the kitchen as I cooked, and she would look at me with sad, brown eyes when I returned her to the shelter on Monday mornings. After working on a story about local residents who took in senior dogs, I was inspired to foster Chocho fulltime. That was a couple of months ago, and Chocho and I have come a long way.

I still miss Porthos every day, but Chocho has made things easier. Taking in an older dog has been a simpler transition for me, and, as my aunt once told me regarding her and her senior dog, "We're just a couple of old ladies who like to hang out." I don't compare her to Porthos anymore and I appreciate the individual qualities she has. I would encourage anyone looking to foster or adopt to consider a senior or overlooked pet like Chocho, because they still have a lot of love to give — and

And I know, when the time comes, she'll eventually warm up to Peyton.

When it comes to golf, Laura Baugh is continually learning — and teaching

Former LPGA Tour player and Ponte Vedra resident competing in 2nd U.S. Senior Women's Open

Laura Baugh knows golf.

She grew up playing golf with her dad, played more than 25 years on the professional circuit, worked as an announcer on the Golf Channel and currently serves as a golf instructor at Sawgrass Country Club. Laura Baugh has golf in her blood.

"You learn something every time you play," Baugh said.

Baugh won the U.S. Women's Amateur in 1971 at the age of 16, the youngest ever at the time, and was named Rookie of the Year after going pro in 1973. She had 71 top-10 finishes on the LPGA Tour, including 10 runner-up finishes.

During that time, she also married and divorced pro golfer Bobby Cole (twice), raised seven children, starred in several TV commercials and wrote a book "Out of the Rough." And, at age 63, competition is still a driving force for Baugh.

"For me, I love competition," she said. "Golf is a game where you develop lifetime friends. The women I play tournaments with, I've known for 40 or 50 years. Arnold Palmer used to say golf 'doesn't develop character, it reveals character.' Most (golfers) have so much character and so many great attributes, and so many people know them as great golfers, but I know them as great people."

Baugh will be one of 120 seniors competing in the U.S. Senior Women's Open, which runs Thursday, May 16 through Sunday, May 19, at Pine Needles in North Carolina. The tournament is only in its second year, and Baugh was part of the process to make the event a reality.

"I worked really hard with a few other women to try and get the U.S. Women's Senior Open," Baugh said. "About five years ago, several of us played qualifying tournaments for the men's U.S. Senior Open, and they said it was great to have us there but why aren't you in the Women's Senior Open? Our response was, 'There isn't one.' Within six months we had one in the making, so I feel a big part of the Senior Women's U.S. Open being around because we tried for years to get it, and finally we got it."

Baugh said she didn't score as low as she wanted in last year's inaugural event at the Chicago Golf Club, but feels more prepared this year, and has been focusing on her short game.

"I work on my putting because putting is really important," Baugh said. "It may not be as exciting as hitting the long drives but putting is where it's all at."

Baugh also said she thinks continuing to participate in tournaments hasn't just helped her overall game but has benefitted her in her current job at Sawgrass Country Club.

"I found I was a better teacher if I stayed relevant in the playing capacity because I could relate more," she said. "It was a refresher of what it's like to play under that level of competition."

Baugh enjoys the opportunity to share the game she loves with people of all different abilities across all different age groups.

"It's a very high-level process," she said. "I can teach whatever level you come to me at. Although the language may change and questions you have as you move along your journey may change, the process is still the same. I enjoy it because I know my stuff, and I know that it works and I'm able to help my students love their game of golf."

Baugh moved to Ponte Vedra about three years ago from another golf hotspot, Augusta, Georgia, where she relocated to in 2013 after around 25 years living in Orlando. After raising her kids, she was looking for something new, and visited a friend who lived in Atlantic Beach, and realized Ponte Vedra would be a good fit for her.

"It's such a charming area," Baugh said. "It's nice that everyone plays golf. I think that makes me valuable. I always call Ponte Vedra a hidden gem. Not that many people may know about it, but the people who live here really treasure it, and the golf is just so wonderful here."

And golf is something Baugh appreciates more and more, especially as she gets older.





John Lobb defends JAGA Senior Amateur, wins 3rd title in 4 years

John Lobb got up and down for par from 40 feet on the 54th hole to capture a one-shot victory and his third JAGA Senior Amateur Championship title in four years.

The former Naval Station Mayport executive officer sealed the win April 30 at St. Johns Golf & Country Club with a two-footer moments after Scott Ray of Central City, Kentucky, missed from 6 feet for par.

Lobb shot rounds of 73-70-75-218 – 218 (3-over par) for his three trips around the 6,495-yard, par-72 golf course. The runner-up Ray recorded 76-71-72 – 219 (3-over par). Another shot back in third place was Jim Loftin, a JAGA director representing The Palencia Club in St. Augustine. The former Columbus (Georgia) State University teammate of Jim "Bones" Mackay posted 72-76-72 – 220 (4-over par).

The champion got off to a slow start bogeying the first two holes, then birdied Nos. 3 and 4. Beginning the final round up by four shots, Lobb's lead at the turn was only two over Ray, who went out in 35. Loftin also shot 35 and was two back.

Lobb's four bogeys on the back nine were offset by birdies on Nos. 15 and 16. Ray and Loftin both shot 37 on the back nine and could not overtake the 55-year-old Lobb.

Lobb won his first Senior Amateur at Windsor Park Golf Club in 2016 and his second in April 2018 at Eagle Harbor Golf Club. The Frank Rogers Trophy will once again return and be on display for the next 12 months at his home club, Jacksonville Golf & Country Club.

years old, are still in great shape and competitive. The image of a mature woman now is so much different than what we used to think."



Loften times hear conversations about our current aging population. Many people say that the 'Age Wave" is on its way. Wrong! The "Age Wave" is already here, and we

have not come close to high tide yet.

Over the next several months, I will be sharing some articles with you that will hopefully help you and your family members navigate many of the trials and tribulations when caring for a loved one.

I tell families all of the time that we did not go to school or take any courses on how to care for our aging parents, so it's essential to educate yourselves on the variety of options available.

For today's article, I will share some eye-opening statistics regarding the world of aging.

Caregiving population

According to research from the National Alliance for Caregiving and Evercare in 2009, the value of the services family caregivers provide for "free," when caring for older adults, is estimated to be \$375 billion a year. That is almost twice as much as is actually spent on homecare and nursing home services combined (\$158 billion). In addition, 47 percent of working caregivers indicated an increase in caregiving expenses has caused them to use up all or most of their savings.

Also, here are a few statistics to consider from the National Alliance for Caregiving in collaboration with AARP in 2009 regarding the caregiving popula-

- More than 65 million people, or 29 percent of the U.S. population, provide care for a chronically ill, disabled or aged family member or friend during any given year and spend an average of 20 hours per week providing care for their loved one.
- The typical family caregiver is a 49-year-old woman caring for her widowed 69-year-old mother who does not live with her. She is married and employed. Approximately 66 percent of family caregivers are women. More than 37 percent have children or grandchildren under 18 years old living with them.
- Thirteen percent of family caregivers are providing 40 hours of care a week or more.

■ Fifty-one percent of care recipients live in their own home, 29 percent live with their family caregiver and 4 percent live in nursing homes and assisted living.

Impact on family caregiver's health

The research on the impact of caregiving on one's health is significant.

Again according to the National Alliance for Caregiv-

ing in collaboration with AARP in 2009, 23 percent of family caregivers caring for loved ones for five years or more reported their health is fair or poor.

In addition, research from the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences in 2003 concluded that stress of family caregiving for people with dementia has been shown to impact a person's immune system for up to three years after the caregiving ends, thus increasing their chances of developing a chronic illness themselves.

Lastly, the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences also found in 2004 that family caregivers experiencing extreme stress have been shown to age prematurely. This level of stress, said the organization, can take as much as 10 years off a family caregiver's life.

All of this information reinforces that the "Age Wave" is already here. We also need to be aware of the needs of our aging parents and loved ones as we want to care and support them the best that we can.





Fleet Landing Investment Club beats best minds on Wall Street

Champagne flowed at a recent meeting of the Fleet Landing Investment Club (FLIC). The club beat the S&P 500 average in 2018, not by a little, but by a significant amount. According to the club, the S&P was down by 4.5 percent. The club was up 2.5 percent, or 700 basis points better. In an average year, the S&P would have been up 10 percent. FLIC would have been up 17 percent.

FLIC realized that unexpected events often happen in the markets and was ready to handle them. According to the club, one unexpected event was the crash of Apple Inc. The club realized that after the death of co-founder Steve Jobs, Apple had failed to replace its source of creativity and innovation.

FLIC had huge profits in Apple. They carefully watched Apple's performance as it coasted upwards on Jobs' ideas. When the company finally faltered, they sold it before it plummeted and lost one-third of its value.

Market analysis also helped FLIC sell Home Depot and other stocks. According to the club, it is relatively easy to buy stocks that do well for a time. The difficult skill, said the club, is to sell them near the point of maximum profit. Fleet Landing Investment Club has done considerable study and research in this area. As a result, it has been

doing well at this task.


Much of this improvement has been due to the leader-ship of Bob Dinda, who was elected president of FLIC about two years ago. His first 25 years were spent as an aerospace engineer. He rose to be an engineering director at Computer Sciences Corp., reporting directly to the president. He was then hired by Wall Street, where he spent the next 30 years. While there, he pledged to himself that he would spend maximum time in the research departments and learn from the brightest, most experienced analysts.

When elected president of FLIC, Dinda pledged to help the club beat the S&P. On the masthead of reports was the new motto: "BEAT THE S&P." In January when Bob

saw the performance figures for the past year, he couldn't believe them. He was pretty sure the club had beaten the S&P, but he questioned if it was really by that amount. He considered it impossible. He spent much of January checking and rechecking the figures.

Dinda said this performance would not have been possible without the help of the eager and knowledgeable members: Howard Burdick, treasurer; Walt Trevaskis, secretary; Tom Steinke, keeper of the SSG; Joe Ruthenberg, master of electronics; and Ron Jacobstein, assistant to the president. New members are Dick Footh and John Lones.







Fixed annuity could help extend lifespan of retirement accounts

It's almost impossible to save too much for retirement. After all, you could spend two, or even three, decades as a retiree. And retirement is not cheap. Even if you maintain a relatively modest lifestyle, some of your expenses, especially those involving health care, may continue to rise over the years. Consequently, you will need

several sources of reliable income — one of which might be a fixed annuity.

Fixed annuities are essentially contracts between investors and insurance companies. When you purchase a fixed annuity, the insurer will guarantee the principal and a minimum rate of interest. This means the money you invest in a fixed annuity is designed never to drop in value. (This guarantee, however, is based on the claims-paying ability of the insurer that issues the annuity.)

You can structure a fixed annuity to pay you for a certain number of years or for your entire lifetime, which

is the route many people choose. This is advantageous not only because of what it provides you - income for life — but because it also may allow you to take out less money each year from your other retirement accounts.

Here's some background: Once you turn 70½, you are required to begin taking withdrawals from your traditional IRA and your 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored retirement plan. (This requirement does not apply to Roth IRAs.) You must take out a minimum amount, based on your age and account balance, but you are free to exceed that amount each year. But the more you withdraw from these accounts, the faster they are likely to be depleted.

So, when you reach retirement, it's a good idea to establish an appropriate annual withdrawal rate, based on your retirement plan balances, Social Security, lifestyle, longevity expectations and other factors. You may want to work with a financial professional to determine a withdrawal rate that's suitable for your needs.

If you can count on the income from a fixed annuity, you might be able to take out less each year from your traditional IRA and 401(k), giving these accounts more tax-deferred growth opportunities. Plus, if you don't withdraw all the money from these accounts during your lifetime, you can include the remainder in your estate

A fixed annuity's potential to help you extend the lifespan of your IRA and 401(k) can clearly be of value to you. Still, a fixed annuity does carry some issues about which you should be aware, such as surrender charges for early withdrawals, along with other fees. Also, if you take withdrawals before you reach 591/2, you likely will face a 10 percent penalty. And annuities can have tax implications, so before you start taking withdrawals, you will want to consult your tax advisor.

Is a fixed annuity appropriate for you?

There's really no one correct answer because everyone's situation is different. If you consistently max out your IRA and 401(k) contributions, however, and you still have money left to invest for retirement, you might want to think about an annuity. An income stream you can't outlive — and that may help you protect your other retirement accounts — is worth considering.

to understand, however, is how the investments held in these accounts can be dangerous to their future retirement. Let me discuss two problems to consider.

First, most 401(k) plan administrators (the folks who manage the plan) are investment firms, many of whom have their own proprietary mutual funds. So, it shouldn't be surprising that the fund choices offered to plan participants include these funds and, in some cases, are the only fund choices offered. Fidelity is a huge 401(k) plan administrator and, in every Fidelity plan I've seen, their funds are in the majority of the fund choices offered or are the only funds offered. That would be fine if every Fidelity fund was the best performer when compared with other similar funds, but that is often not the case.

of internationally ranked paddlers. One of them was Eri Tenorio from Brazil, who is the 21st fastest paddler in the world.

"At least three paddlers were in the top 100 of the world, and Eri was the best by far," said Jim Ingalls, Paddlefest organizer and Gail Ingalls' husband. "He had to go back because he flies to Europe for the European tour tomorrow.

Jaime Smyth, an Atlantic Beach paddleboarder who participated in the 8-mile race, said that competing in flat water was much more difficult than meets the eye, or in his case, the paddle.



One of the reasons why plan sponsors (employers) pick Fidelity is because their administrative fees — paid by the employer — are so low. If the investment selections they provide to you, the plan participant, are not broad enough to give you the latitude to select better choices, however, then you are potentially harmed from a return-over-time perspective. Fidelity isn't the only firm doing this.

Franklin Templeton, another large mutual fund firm, was recently ordered to pay restitution to their current and former employees for mismanaging their employee 401(k) plan by limiting investment choices principally to Franklin Templeton funds as well as charging excessive fees for such funds. Taking advantage of their own employees!

A second area of concern is the infamous target date retirement fund option found in many 401(k) plans. These funds are typically created and managed by the plan administrator (investment firm) and offered either as an alternative or, in some cases, as the only choices in the plan. As before, there are two concerns here. One is that these target date funds are often packed with proprietary mutual funds of the plan administrator, which may or may not be the best performers in their class of funds. Another concern is investment fees — who keeps an eye on the fund fees subtracted from participant account balances? Since the employer is not paying these mutual fund fees, they have little incentive to police them and they are not disclosed on any participant account statements, so the individual participant rarely knows the fees he/she are paying.

To be clear, I am not suggesting that you avoid participating in your employer's plan, just do so wisely. Make whatever contribution is needed to receive the full employer match — failing to do that is passing up free money. Next, consider funding a traditional or Roth IRA, assuming your income does not exceed the limits for such plans. Third, consider funding an after-tax investment account; you will pay the tax now, but the money comes to you in the future income tax free. Fourth, consider funding an indexed life insurance plan. Assuming proper and regular attention by a life insurance professional, these plans allow you to accumulate substantial amounts on a tax-deferred basis and, depending on how you withdraw the accumulations, could produce a tax-free income in retirement and a tax-free death benefit to the ones you love the most. Speak with a Certified Financial Fiduciary (CFF) about your individual circumstances and goals. A CFF has a legal, moral and ethical obligation to always act in your best



Local resident rocks KISS impersonation with authentic Peter Criss ensemble

Chris Heighton takes fandom to new level as Catman for Farewell Tour

There was a time in the not-so-recent past when the biggest band in the world captivated its audience in monochromatic makeup, leather pants and pyrotechnics. This band stomped to the center of the nation's attention in platforms that were bigger than their actual record sales. To the world, however, the music didn't matter. They weren't the Rolling Stones and they didn't want to be. Instead, they were Coca Cola, Ford Motor Company, Nike and McDonalds. They were KISS.

When KISS toured the U.S during the last half of the 1970s, they went state to state recruiting teenage boys until the nation's mothers pulled their hair out. Today, KISS doesn't have fans —they have an army. And as it stands, the KISS Army is almost as notorious as the band itself.

Ponte Vedra local Chris Heighton first saw KISS live when he was 17 in 1978. Today, as a proud member of the KISS Army, Heighton could be said to be "decorated."

Heighton recently purchased a \$2,250 custom-made, not-including-makeup, all-leather, stud-bedazzled and precisely tailored stage costume of Catman, also known by most as KISS band member Peter Criss.

Heighton currently takes his impersonation to the next level, locally touring small venues and private parties for a two-of-a-kind performance of "Beth." For those uninitiated, "Beth" is the warm glass of milk your grandmother hands you after you rocked and rolled all night (and partied every day).

Surprisingly, Heighton said that Catman is actually the crowd favorite for KISS fans.

"He seems to get more of the applause," Heighton said, adding, "You know, every woman loves a drummer."

Perhaps it's also Peter Criss' perceived "sensitive nature" that turns a more matured fan's head. The character does seem to evoke something special in not only the crowd, but in Heighton as well. Something more than 7-inch platforms can conjure.

On April 12, at the Veterans Memorial Arena Farewell Tour, Heighton actually got to attend a KISS concert, his first as a full-fledged Catman-man. This was something he had fantasized about since rocking at his first KISS show.

"It was my moment to shine and I had been waiting for this day for $42 \frac{1}{2}$ years," he said. "It was a dream come true."

Stepping out of the limousine, Heighton took his first wobbly steps as Peter Criss.

"I was immediately greeted by fans," Heighton said. "I

think (they thought I was Peter Criss) or close to it. From the time I got there to the time I got to my seat, I must have taken about a hundred pictures — and then some. Not just adults but children, too. It was amazing. ... They thanked me so much."

One fan in particular Heighton remembers.

"This one girl, bless her heart, she came running up to me saying, 'Peter Criss! Peter Criss! You're my favorite, I love you!"

Heighton said he politely explained he wasn't actually Criss, but she just didn't care. In her mind he WAS the Catman.

"My heart just melted," he said.

It turns out, being a celebrity is as easy as having the right digs, and most importantly, owning it in a way that other fans can love. This way not only can Heighton be Peter Criss (if only for a moment), but other fans can feel like they met Peter Criss and was he actually a really nice guy. A real hero who stopped to take pictures with every one of them, listened, and truly enjoyed them.

Maybe the real Peter Criss is actually as nice as a kitten. Only, chances are, there are more fans than moments in the day and many will never have the opportunity to meet him. But, honestly, who is KISS anyway? Criss, whose nine lives can almost be attributed to how many times he's quit the band, was at one point replaced by Eric Singer (who played Catman since 2001). It's no secret to their fans or otherwise that the band operates fiscally above all else. What other band will sell you bizarre merchandise such as an "official" Gene Simmons demon tongue pacifier, a leather-clad Mr. Potato Head or, even, a flame-decaled casket? Does it matter? Probably not. Because in a world according to KISS, if it looks like it, sounds like it and acts like it — who really cares?





PVHS lacrosse wins first state championship

The Ponte Vedra Sharks are the 2019 FHSAA boys lacrosse state champions after defeating St. Thomas Aquinas 19-7 on Saturday in Boca Raton.

Winning its first state championship in program history, Ponte Vedra scored in the first 15 seconds of the game and never looked back. Up 7-3 at half, the Sharks blew the lead open in the third quarter with nine goals.

"That third quarter is one of the best third quarters I've ever seen in high school lacrosse," Ponte Vedra head coach Tom West said. "We could have beat a college team."

Due to the Sharks' dominance, the game clock was set to a running clock, which West said has never happened before in the state championship game. Junior midfielder Dylan Hess, who is committed to Georgetown, led the Sharks with five goals and four assists. Senior attack Patrick Dotsikas, a Merchant Marine Academy commit, scored three goals. Committed to play at Notre Dame, junior midfielder Carter Parlette finished with three goals and two assists. Senior attack Jack Dowd, a Furman commit, and sophomore midfielder Freddie DiMarzo each had two goals. Junior long-stick midfielder Tommy Zitiello led the team with seven groundballs and also had a goal.

Ponte Vedra defeated Jupiter 10-8 on Friday in Boca Raton to advance to the state championship. After jumping out to a 4-0 first-quarter lead and a 7-3 halftime lead, Jupiter mounted a comeback, coming within one goal of the Sharks twice in the second half. In



The Ponte Vedra softball team lost 4-2 to Ridgeview on Tuesday in what proved to be a suspenseful regional semifinal game.

With the game held at Ridgeview, the Panthers scored early with four base hits and three runs in the first. Ponte Vedra answered in the second with four on, as Bailey Wagoner walked, Tara McGee hit, Michelle Holder reached first on an error

and Olivia Zitiello bunted into a fielder's choice. But the Lady Sharks scored only one in the process.

Ridgeview (21-8) gained another run in the second on a double by Raven Little, driving in Hannah Foster. The fourth saw the middle of Ponte Vedra's lineup striking again, as Wagoner walked, Tara McGee advanced her with a grounder and Holder pummeled a fly ball to left that drove Wagoner home.

McGee wielded a mighty club versus Brittany Michael, going two for three at the plate. Stranding two in scoring position in both the second and fourth innings, however, proved fateful, as PVHS' top and bottom of the lineup could not perform. Save for a lone hit by Scotty David in the fifth, there were no additional chances to score.

Pitcher Michelle Holder and a solid defense held Ridgeview in the remaining four innings with five plays each by Wagoner at third, Catherine Beaton at second and Scotland David in center. The result was a 4-2 win that sends Ridgeview to the finals in regional play. Ponte Vedra finishes the season 14-13.

that game, Carter Parlette led the Sharks with three goals and two assists, while Dowd, Hess and sophomore midfielder Joe Taraboletti each scored two goals.

West said the Sharks didn't get to play some of their offensive players in the game versus Jupiter, which resulted in them being fresh against St. Thomas Aquinas. West believes that depth was a crucial factor in Ponte Vedra ultimately winning the championship. The Sharks' head coach also said the team had a good game plan for the final and that everyone believed in each other.

Ponte Vedra has reached the state championship final four seven times in the program's 10-year history. Just once did the Sharks reach the championship in 2016, when they matched up with St. Thomas Aquinas for a first time. Ponte Vedra lost that year 13-11. The win on Saturday, therefore, was redemption for the Sharks.

West said losing in the final four in 2018 with a young team also proved to be the difference in 2019.

"Everyone just was committed to being the best that we could and to really play Ponte Vedra lacrosse the way we wanted to play it," West said.

The Ponte Vedra coach also noted that the team hosted a Navy SEAL for a day during the preseason, and his message also proved to make a significant difference

"We just talked about how you fight for each other and when things don't go your way, you have to be successful and fight through it," West said. "That happened six or seven times this season, where we came back to that training. In the past, maybe we would have folded or not played our best. This year, whenever we came to a situation whether there's a roadblock, a rainstorm, or things aren't going our way or the refs aren't making calls, we just said 'good' and put a smile on our face and kept on playing. That was the difference this year."

Ponte Vedra (24-1) finishes the season atop the state rankings and is currently ranked No. 1 in the country, according to MaxPreps. Nine players on the team are committed to play lacrosse in the collegiate ranks, including junior attack Cam-

eron Welch (Mercer); junior attack Freddie Amato (Lehigh); senior attack Patrick Dotsikas (Merchant Marine Academy); senior attack Jack Dowd (Furman); junior midfielder Dylan Hess (Georgetown); junior midfielder Carter Parlette (Notre Dame); senior FOGO (Face Off Get Off) Jimmy Burns (University of Massachusetts Lowell); senior midfielder Matayo Trumble (Merchant Marine Academy); and senior defender Max Schalit (Notre Dame). According to West, a group of three additional juniors and sophomores are planning to make their respective commitments in the coming weeks.

With only six players graduating from the team, expectations for the Sharks will be high in 2020.

"We want to get our own for that class," West said. "We want to get another one. We want to play our best and play Ponte Vedra lacrosse. Every game. Which is very fun to watch."
