Flagler Health+ Care Connect, BRAVE program hopes to curb student mental health stigma

St. Johns County has decided to combat mental health from the onset — by starting with the district's youth.

At a Sept. 30 press conference, Flagler Health+, in conjunction with the school district, announced the BRAVE program, which is established to encourage students toward early mental health treatment. THE PLAYERS presented a generous donation of \$1 million toward supporting the initiative.

The BRAVE program will help students get in touch with their mental health earlier in life by opening the conversation about receiving help and dispelling myths. By addressing social barriers associated with receiving treatment, BRAVE hopes to provide healthcare services at the right time and right place for students silently struggling.

Flagler Health+ Care Connect will serve as the hub for student behavioral health referrals for all 39 schools in the St. Johns County School District. Services will be provided by Epic Behavioral Healthcare, Children's Home Society and St. Augustine Youth Services. BRAVE includes care coordination and navigations services, access to virtual mental health counseling visits and a 24-hour



crisis text line. Additionally, there will be on-site telehealth booths that offer access to urgent-care and mental health services.

Ponte Vedra Woman's Club holds new member event


The Ponte Vedra Woman's Club held its new and prospective member event Aug. 22 at the home of Michelle Purdy to kick off the new year for the club.

Ponte Vedra Inn & Club undergoes \$8 million golf course renovation

The Ponte Vedra Inn & Club is giving its Ocean Course a much-anticipated makeover. The club hopes to improve many aspects of the course, from the practice facility to the back nine holes, with the 10th being fully redesigned.

"It was time to change," said Jim Howard, director of golf at Ponte Vedra Inn & Club. "It's the (standard) that we want to be for our property and for our members."

The renovation will address the greens, fairways, tees, bunkers, irrigation, drainage, grassing, bridges/bulkhead and landscaping, along with substantial improvements to the course's driving range and practice facilities. While the first nine holes will essentially be the same, changes to the back nine will occur as well as the elimination of the 10th hole. A new hole will be designed at the north end of the property. The renovation is currently underway and is slated for completion by August of 2020 with the hopes that the updates will address new issues with the sport.

"Trying to make an interesting golf course for golfers is number one," Howard said. "There is a challenge with golf

right now that golf balls, combined with the new equipment, fly farther than they ever have."

The Ponte Vedra Inn & Club welcomes back renowned course designer Bobby

Weed to head the design. Weed worked on the course's last renovations in 1998 and 2008. Weed, who is responsible for many of the TPC's best venues, got his start apprenticing under golf legend, Pete Dye. "We are very fortunate that he lives in the neighborhood and he is a club member," Howard said. "I think Bobby is really known to design some interesting green complexes. A lot of that is almost just like an artist.... It will be interesting to see what he comes up with."

Debuting in 1928, the Ocean Course has been a cornerstone amenity at Ponte Vedra Inn & Club for more than 90 years. First designed by renowned golf course architect Herbert Strong, the Inn's signature course has undergone two major renovations since its opening, first in 1940 and later in 1998. The \$8 million Ocean Course renovation project is part of a larger \$40 million commitment to upgrade and modernize the resort as it approaches its centennial anniversary. Over the last 18 months, enhancements have been made to several of the resort's amenities, including renovations to the Golf Club Dining Room and Golf Pro Shop, expansion of the club's locker rooms and a remodeling of the resort's family pool. By summer 2020, Ponte Vedra Inn & Club will reintroduce the historic Ocean House, offering 41 new guest rooms and suites.

Campbell and First Lady of Florida, Casey DeSantis.

Additionally, Nease High School senior, Anna Hampton, spoke on behalf of students struggling with academic pressures and social expectations in an evolving world.

"I've witnessed firsthand the effects that students are being impacted regarding wellbeing and mental health," Hampton said. "Although the purpose of social media is to increase communication, we see many studies that link using the application to feelings of social isolation. Teenagers who already struggle with feelings of insecurity and inadequacy are stuck scrolling through images that reinforce and worsen those feelings."

First lady DeSantis spoke about how essential addressing mental health is for the bettering the future of the state.

"Just as we make physical health a priority, we need to start making mental health a priority," DeSantis said. "Especially for our young students. After all, 50% of all lifetime mental illness begins by age 14. Our children getting help early on is quintessentially essential to their success in the future going forward."

National data shows that mental illness is on the rise among the youth population. St. Johns County itself is first in th state in overall deaths by suicide for young people, ages 18 to 24. The B.R.A.V.E initiative

stands for "Be Resilient And Voice Emotions." By helping improve access through public school systems, the program hopes to provide a hand for students and families who might not know where to look for help. According to county statistics, last year only 36% of students in St. Johns County who were identified with a mental health need followed through to access care. BRAVE's goal for 2021 is to bring that percentage to 90%.

Mike Platt

What can you share about your background?

I was born in New York and raised in New Jersey. I graduated from Christian Brothers Academy. During my years at CBA, I was on the varsity wrestling team.

I am an Eagle Scout (Double Bronze Palm) and a member of the Order of the Arrow, receiving the Vigil Honor — the highest honor the Order of the Arrow can bestow upon its members for service to lodge, council and scouting.

I then attended Jacksonville University, where I served as the student disciplinary chairman as well as a resident assistant. I was inducted into the Green Key Society, which recognizes campus leaders. I earned my Bachelor of Science in sociology with a minor in psychology.

Before coming to Daniel, I was an assistant field sports director (teaching archery, personal fitness and fishing merit badges) and an assistant aquatic director for the Boy Scouts of America (teaching the BSA Lifeguard program, lifesaving, swimming, rowing, canoeing and small boat sailing merit badges).

Briefly describe what Daniel is.

Daniel is the oldest childcare agency in Florida, established in 1884 with the mission of improving the lives of children and families.

Daniel began as an orphanage, but over the past 135 years, we've grown into so much more. We currently offer a diverse range of programs that serve around 3,500 children and families each day. I work for the residential treatment program, which provides children exhibiting the most severe symptoms of mental and emotional distress with intensive residential treatment over four- to six-month periods.

How did you come to work at Daniel?

I heard about Daniel through the classified section of the newspaper 30 years ago. The organization had placed an ad looking for child care workers. In 1989, I attended a group interview and was selected for the position.

Tell us about your current role at Daniel.

My current role at Daniel is staff trainer and recreation specialist – also known as the director of fun! I work with a multidisciplinary team, assisting youth and families with meeting their treatment goals. I help clients come to know their self worth by improving their self esteem and building character while teaching them ego enhancing therapeutic activities, self control, coping and social skills. I also work with volunteers and partners across our community that provide special events, play days and service projects for the agency.

Additionally, I instruct Daniel staff for certification in adult and pediatric first aid/CPR, Physical Crisis Intervention under Crisis Prevention Institute guidelines. I guide therapeutic recreation and pool training for staff and youth, and also work to certify others as Ukeru instructors, which offers a safe, comforting and restraintfree approach to crisis management.

I was recently inducted as a Meritorious Instructor in the CPI Hall of Merit for demonstrating training excellence and commitment to the training process, as well as advancing the philosophy of care, welfare, safety and security.



Where did you meet your wife?

I met my wife, Lisa, at Daniel in 1993. She also was a child care worker and worked as a case manager and an adoption information specialist as well.

What do you enjoy most about living in St. Johns County?

I love the great outdoors, the beaches and the fact that there is plenty of room for my two dogs to run around. I also enjoy the kind people and my neighborhood.

What do you like to do in your free time?

In my free time I enjoy jogging (5K-15K runs), swimming, kayaking and playing with my fur babies (two dogs and two cats). I also like to spend time helping others in the community, and hearing and sharing jokes.

What is the last bucket list item you crossed off?

The last bucket list item I crossed off was going on a cruise to Labadie, Haiti, Cozumel, Mexico and Jamaica. *Edited by Christine Rodenbaugh*

So, the rolling out of ideas on the beautification process began.

The PTO did not have any specific fundraisers for this project nor was it funded



by any general fund. However, the PTO had planned a meeting with Kevin and Karyn Caroll, owners of Coastal Luxury Outdoors, about becoming a community partner of Landrum. The Carrolls took it a step further and let the school know that they graciously wanted to donate something to the school.

The makeover idea was generated from the PTO and what they thought would be a better car drop-off and pick- up visual experience. The tiling of the wall behind the Landrum Lion mascot, "ABL" (Alice B. Landrum) was the first idea. The pavers, landscaping and everything else came in to play once the PTO and Principal Player sat down with Coastal Luxury Outdoors. The team at CLO started mocking up designs.

The other great piece to this makeover is that the pavers that surround ABL are made up of personalized bricks that were sold in a fall fundraiser last year at Landrum, called the "Landrum Lion Challenge." Families could either purchase a personalized brick, a paw print (located outside of the gymnasium entrance) with their family's name on it, or a "Landrum Lion Lives Here" yard sign to place front of their homes. So, the vision was to "build" ABL's Den with Landrum families' personalized bricks for years to come. The building of his den has begun. In the future, all of those bricks will have families' names on them with more added each year.

The installation of this project began just a few weeks before school started, and it took about a week. The installation included plank tiling on the wall behind the mascot, brick pavers surrounding the mascot, landscaping, new lettering and two planters to enhance ABL. Now he really "pops."

The PTO looking forward to the launch of its fall fundraiser, which is slated for mid to late October. The "Landrum Lion Challenge" will encompass selling personalized bricks, new yard signs and paw prints. However, this year the PTO is going to add one more piece to the challenge. They have a few tricks up their sleeves that might enhance the new entrance even more, and perhaps some other areas on campus.

Brazilian Jiu Jitsu school opens in Ponte Vedra Beach

Self-defense instructor, John Manis Jr., recently opened a martial arts school for Brazilian Jiu Jitsu in Ponte Vedra. The St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce Ponte Vedra Beach Division hosted a ribbon cutting Aug. 5, the first day of classes.

"I think it's the most effective form of self defense," he said. "I knew Ponte Vedra didn't have jiu jitsu, I think we did a good job in finding the right area where there's enough traffic."

Manis started training in martial arts at the age of 4, when his mother enrolled him in classes for being so shy.

"That's what sparked the passion and I haven't stopped ever since," he recalled.

Manis hopes to spark that same passion with his younger students and build their confidence, especially his two daughters, who he wants to prepare for the real world.

"As a father of two girls and as someone

who's done martial arts his whole life, it was a goal of mine to give them that life skill of self defense, knowing how to protect themselves," he explained.

Manis wants to build confidence, not only for his daughters, but for the youth in the Ponte Vedra community, who may just need time away from all the screens and technology or who might be insecure or bullied at school.

"I know a lot of kids need to get away from their computers and get a 'digital detox,' as I like to call it," he joked. "But also, it's a lot about making people better people. For example, if there's someone new in school and they're quiet or alone, as someone who does jiu jitsu, just go up to them, smile at them and ask them how they're doing."

Chamber meeting focuses on energy

St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Isabelle Renault welcomed members and guests to the Aug. 16 Economic Development Council quarterly breakfast in Shell Hall at the World Golf Village.

The keynote speaker was Eric Silagy, president and CEO of Florida Power & Light. Silagy cited Florida's \$1 trillion economy and lack of state income tax as two driving forces that attract an average of 1,000 new residents to the state daily. Increased population increases the demand for energy.

To meet that demand, FPL has experienced a paradigm shift and is no longer the power company of yesteryear. "We are a technology company that delivers energy," Silagy said.

FPL's dependence on oil to produce energy is almost nil. Instead, FPL continues to develop clean energy sources including solar, natural gas and nuclear energy products. Silagy said one option in the works is to install 40 acres of batteries to provide power, which removes emissions and requires no water, is efficient and enhances reliability.

"When it comes down to energy, it's a national security issue," Silagy said. He said FPL's focus is to help make the country energy independent.

FPL has invested \$4 billion in storm hardening.

"After Irma, power was back on to 50% of customers in 24 hours," he said. "This is about being predictive instead of reactive."



Financial Focus: Can'Al'help you become a better investor?



For the past several years, artificial intelligence - or AI - has increasingly found a place in many walks of life. Almost certainly, you use some form of AI, whether it's time on social media, use of mobile banking, the naviga-

tion system you rely on for directions, or any of the many other AI-driven applications relevant to daily life. But AI has also become a significant part of the financial services industry. So, you might wonder if AI can help you become a better investor.

To begin with, what is AI? Essentially, it's the ability of a computer program or machine to think or learn. Using complex algorithms (a set of rules, or steps), computers and machines can mimic many of the thought processes of human beings.

But how can you use AI to invest? And should you?

In the financial services world, many companies use AI to select investments for specific funds. On an individual level. you can work with an AI-powered "roboadvisor" to build an investment portfolio. These robo-advisors are typically quite affordable, and they generally follow proven investment principles, such as

diversification, in making recommendations.

Yet, you are more than just the sum of your answers to a robo-advisor's online questionnaire. Investing is a highly personal matter, which means that, in the following areas, you may well benefit from some human intelligence – and empathy:

Understanding of your risk tolerance: A robo-advisor will ask you to identify your tolerance for risk - low, medium, high - and will plug in your answers when constructing a portfolio. If I change jobs, should I leave my

The program will be Tuesday, Oct. 15, at 6:30 p.m. at the Ponte Vedra Beach Branch Library, The program is free and open to the public.




