





New Gate gas station raises tension in Ponte Vedra Beach

Controversy surrounds necessity, aesthetic appeal of construction

Controversy is bubbling due to the recently proposed Gate station construction at 330 A1A North, The Shoppes of Ponte Vedra. Critics are saying the Ponte Vedra Architectural Review Committee and Ponte Vedra Zoning and Adjustment Board meeting was not properly advertised. In addition, the gas station will not be keeping with the requirements of the Ponte Vedra Overlay regulations in signage size, "destroying the aesthetic of the area," according to a Change.org petition to reverse the decision granting a variance.

Almost 9,000 people have signed the website petition.

Cornelius Carroll, a Ponte Vedra Beach resident in opposition, said the PVARC meeting was "scheduled last minute" with "very little notice to the community for the week prior to Christmas." Carroll also noted "only three of the five members of the ARC were present."

Carroll added, "These variances will be used by nearby businesses and shopping centers to get bigger signs with more colors, bigger buildings, and less landscaping. Mark my words, if those decisions are not successfully opposed by the community, that stretch of A1A will look like Beach Boulevard five years ago and I believe property values will suffer as a result."

According to Change.org, many residents have concerns with traffic issues as well. A few questioned if Ponte Vedra Beach had a "need" for more gas stations, citing the regular availability of pumps at those already built.



Rep. Rutherford announces Naval Academy appointment

Mitchell V. Henshaw has accepted an appointment to the United States Naval Academy, U.S. Rep. John Rutherford announced. Henshaw will join the Class of 2024 in early summer.

Nominated by Rutherford, Henshaw competed first locally to obtain a nomination and then nationally to secure an appointment. The academy receives over 16,000 applications but only accepts about 1,200. Applicants are generally top students from every state in the country. The students serve as class leaders, are members of various honor societies, have impressive community service hours, play athletics and score between 1,230 and 1,520 on the SAT.

A student at The Bolles School, Henshaw boasts an academic career that includes 10 honor and seven advanced placement classes, and he has over a 4.0 GPA. He has been a member of the varsity crew team for four years.

In addition, he is a member of the National Honor Society and the National Spanish Honor Society. He received a gold medal for the 2019 National Spanish Exam, earned his Eagle Scout Award and is a member of the Order of the Arrow, the National Honor Society for the Boy Scouts of America. He is also president of the Environmental and Save Our Seas clubs and is on the Character Committee and a New Student Ambassador.

Henshaw has amassed over 250 hours of volunteer service with groups like Dreams Come True and the Jacksonville River Keener.

He is the son of Sarah and Jarrod Henshaw and lives in Ponte Vedra Beach.

Beach toll booths open



As told to Maggie FitzRoy

What does your job entail?

My main job is to help golfers stay healthy. And if they are struggling with mechanics then I make sure it's not a physical limitation. I do an assessment of 15 different moves in a golf swing.

If it is a physical limitation, then what?

Then we work on their mobility or stability. Also, I help players improve speed with the golf club.

Where do you work?

The PGA TOUR's Performance Center at TPC Sawgrass. It's located on the range right next to the practice tee.

What golfers do you work with?

I have people as young as 9 and as old as 72. Right now, I have 16 professionals: five on The PGA TOUR and three on the European Tour and the rest are on mini tours. I am the only fitness instructor located at The Performance Center. I work as part of a team with other golf instructors, swing instructors and a club fitter. There are six of us total.

What type of educational background do you have?

My college degree is actually in business, from Flagler College. And then I went back and trained with The National Academy of Sports Medicine as a professional fitness trainer. I also got my Corrective Exercise Science certification from them, too. I am also Level 3 Titleist Performance Institute certified.

How did you happen to choose your profession?

I played golf professionally after college and I broke my wrist two weeks before Q-School, which is the qualifying round of tournaments to get into The PGA TOUR. I had been already through a shoulder injury from golf, which was triggered by a history of playing ice hockey and basketball growing up. I definitely found my love for what I do now from the rehab process that I went through. Just learning all the functions of the body and how it can compensate for certain limitations. The trainer I was working with while training professionally was known as the Father of Golf Fitness, Randy Meyers, and he took me under his wing. He told me I should try doing this. He mentored me along. I went into training while I was still in the cast for my wrist.

About a year and a half. My parents were very supportive. My girlfriend at the time, who is my wife now, was very supportive.

Tell us about your family.

How long did the training take?

I grew up in Metro Detroit, Michigan. My father was in the auto industry. Mom was a stay-at-home mom who took me to all my sports. My wife, Kim, works in medical sales.

What do you do during the week of THE PLAYERS?

I will only work with my TOUR players who are in the tournament that week: Billy Horschel, Sam Ryder, Lanto Griffin and Doc Redman. I work with them pretty much before they tee off. It's a long week for me. It's fun, though; I enjoy it. But it's definitely busy.

What is most rewarding about your job?

As someone who has been through a bunch of injuries, helping people bounce back after injury is rewarding. And — teaching young kids proper body mechanics to prevent injuries in the first place.

Not your average lunch ladies

The 'lunch dudes' of Palm Valley Academy serve up cafeteria staples in style

"There's your headline," said Chris Parker, food service manager at Palm Valley Academy. "Not your average lunch ladies." He breaks out laughing. Then he says it again, in case it was missed.

It's clear the "lunch dudes" behind the counter at the Palm Valley Academy dish out more than mac and cheese, which happens to be that day's special. They are cracking jokes and slapping each other on the back. They make shoving large stainless-steel spillage pans full of green beans into the oven look like fun. And it is — to them.

Greg Cominski didn't take well to retiring after being a juvenile probation officer and subsequently found himself in the K-8 school's cafeteria not too long after. Cominski said he walked into the interview for the position stating, "I have no experience at all — so I got no bad habits." Surprisingly, that worked, and he has currently been with the school for the past year. Of the three, Cominski possesses the rawest enthusiasm for being a lunch dude. His excitement and energy rivals that of his customers, saying, "being positive and

saying hello to a kid that looks like they're struggling," is the highlight of his day.

Javier Torres spent most of his career serving in the military, working as a food service technician. After 15 years in the service, spending time touring Iraq and Afghanistan, Torres decided he wanted to do something less demanding, although he wanted to stay in food preparation. "After getting burned out from the service," Torres said, "I decided to do something 'light' that also entailed giving back to the community." Torres said one of the most important aspects he loves about his job is being able to provide excellent customer service for even the smallest of customers. "They appreciate it, they really do," Torres said. "You can see it on their little faces."

The leader of the pack, Parker, announces today's special (mac and cheese) saying they are making 130 pounds of macaroni and cheese that day and they expect all of it to get eaten. "It's a very popular special." he said.

Parker's background was in the restaurant industry, previously owning a restaurant and lounge in Savannah, Georgia. Tired of the late hours, he has found his niche in the cafeteria, where he started working in 1996. Parker said he has seen a lot of changes go through school lunch preparation since he first started. "Kids are starting to see stuff for the first time here," he said. "Fresh fruits and vegetables. It's

offered every day. Kids are more open to trying them or even just asking, 'what's that?""

Although Parker said the industry has somewhat stepped back from the "made from scratch" preparation style of his early days, he is seeing steps being taken toward reducing sodium and making vegetables a necessary element of what's offered since the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010.

"The mac and cheese we serve today is low sodium," Parker said. "Some people liked (the initiative) and some didn't. I look at it from the perspective of a food service manager and you're serving kids healthier stuff now, so maybe that will last a lifetime."

It's clear Parker, Torres and Cominski all are devoted to their jobs on something other than a superficial level: Torres, for serving his community. Cominski for brightening an overlooked kid's day and Parker for advocating healthy eating. They work well together.

"How we interact with each other, it's like my second family. " said Torres. "I love these guys."





"She talked us into coming and we're having a fun day," Richards said. "We love the band," she said of a student jazz





PVHS students take part in annual state Chinese Competition

Ponte Vedra High School students recently competed in the 15th annual Florida State Chinese Competition in Orlando, becoming one of the few public high schools in the state to do so.

High school students 'think global, act local'

Ponte Vedra High School senior Chase Magnano is one of 234 students recognized nationwide as Distinguished Finalists for their impressive community service activities by The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards, a nation-wide program honoring students in grades five through 12 for outstanding volunteer service. Magnano will receive an engraved bronze medallion.

The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards is conducted by Prudential Financial in partnership with the National Association of Secondary School Principals.

"In our 25th year of honoring young volunteers, we are as inspired as ever by the work students are doing to address the needs of a changing world," said Charles Lowrey, chairman and CEO of Prudential Financial Inc. "We hope that their resolve, their initiative and their perspectives on society's challenges move others to consider how they can make a difference, too."

Magnano cofounded Teens Helping Refugees Integrate Via Engagement, also known as JaxTHRIVE, a nonprofit organization that has provided more than 85 refugee students in the Jacksonville area with programming focused on English, STEAM and career and life skills. Magnano's efforts include raising more than \$50,000, recruiting volunteers, collaborating with other local community organizations and establishing JaxTHRIVE chapters in several schools.

The catalyst for the initiative was an experience Magnano had on a family vacation to Germany the summer before his sophomore year. They stopped in Hamburg and, through a family friend, were invited to share an Eid al-Fitr dinner with Syrian refugees. Eid al-Fitr marks the end of Ramadan, the Muslim holy month of fasting.

"I was pretty nervous going into it," Magnano said. But the family's son, about Magnano's age, was wearing a Star Wars t-shirt. Both were surprised at how much they had in common — Star Wars, TV shows and even the

same songs in their playlists. He said they ended up talking the rest of the night.

"He was from the other side of the world," Magnano said. "There were so many similarities. It doesn't matter where you're from. Everyone is so alike when you come down to it."

That was the most memorable part of the trip, Magnano

said, and it stuck with him after returning home. He wanted to find a way to get involved, to help the local refugee population and meet more interesting people like the Syrian refugee Star Wars fan he connected with in Hamburg. He said he wanted to "think global, act local."

Magnano had heard about World Relief, a government organization that partners with local churches and community-based organizations to provide support for immigrants and refugees who are seeking a place to call home. It's common for kids recently resettled in America to fall behind in academics because of language and culture barriers, as well as gaps in attending school. Magnano volunteered to help with English and get them caught up.

"I think education is one of the best pathways to a good future," said Magnano, who describes himself as a math nerd. "Being able to show someone else math is cool is exciting. It's kind of fun, really. They're smart, but there's a language barrier. Sometimes they can learn a month of math in four hours."

Magnano's longtime friend, Grace Freedman, also volunteered and the duo wanted to find a way to continue volunteering throughout the year – on Saturdays. They were able to organize volunteers to help, but World Relief suffered a budget cut and was no longer a viable partner. The possibility to continue tutoring student refugees seemed to be over. A local non-government organization, Kim's Open Door, stepped up to help. The privately funded nonprofit somewhat filled the gap World Relief budget cuts had left, but the program had to be scaled back.

Magnano and Freedman started JaxTHRIVE as a way to raise funds to have the impact they wanted. To date, more than 200 volunteers have donated 500 hours to help 85 refugee kids.

"In another bit of crazy perfect timing, I competed on Who Wants to Be a Millionaire," Magnano said. "I came back with prize money from that and wanted to do something better than going on a shopping spree. I used a portion of the winnings as seed money."

Volunteering with World Relief, Magnano and Freedman were able to establish a rapport with other like-minded people and gain their trust. They worked alongside Kim's Open Door, which resulted in support for infrastructure, transportation and access to kids. The Girl Scouts have volunteered through their gold and silver projects. They just started a GoFundMe page with a link from jaxthrive.net. The Ponte Vedra High School lacrosse team, meanwhile, held a camp to teach the sport, which was unfamiliar to most of the refugee students.

"It was great to see all the kids connect around the sport," Magnano said. "Barriers between anyone faded away as they bonded over common interest."

JaxTHRIVE has held two community galas that have not only raised money, but also brought awareness to the difference between refugees and immigrants. Magnano wants people to understand what these students are going through. In addition to being the new kid from across world, they're not at grade level. Tutoring helps them catch up.

"They've taught me more than I could have taught them," he said. "About resilience — coming from somewhere so different and experiencing extraordinary hardships. They come through with a good attitude, ready

To be eligible for public kindergarten in the SJCSD, children must be 5 years old on or before September 1 and must reside in St. Johns County.

Other requirements for registration include:

- Birth certificate/guardianship documents
- Documentation of a health examination performed within one year of enrollment
- Proof of completed required immunizations on Form DH680
- Proof of residence per the Residency and Guardianship Policy located at www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/student/residency/

to learn or to have fun. They have good energy, good light. Especially when you might think they may not have that good energy because of all they've been through.

"I realize the problems I'm dealing with are temporary; they're small. The kids remind me to bring that light and to remain positive," he said.

Cofounder Grace Freedman graduated last year and is attending Yale. Magnano graduates with the Class of 2020 and has been accepted to Princeton. When the pair began JaxTHRIVE, they committed to

being at every event to make sure it was running as smoothly as possible. As chapters in about 13 area schools formed, other students stepped up to lead and they are just as excited as Magnano and Freedman. This year, the push has been to get people thinking about how JaxTHRIVE runs day to day and finding leaders to continue the initiative. Working with them, there is a succession plan for next year.

"I never understood the value of teaching," Magnano said. "Until you start doing it, you never see how profound the impact will be. It's been really, really incredible to work with such a great group of kids."





PALM TREES

As we see all around us in Florida, palm trees are a popular staple for our landscaping. The very tall, thin palms you see everywhere are sabal palms (also known as cabbage palms) and are native to the state.

However, there are many other beautitypes of palms that can flourish in our zone. Here are a

ful types of palms that can flourish in our zone. Here are a few of our favorites at Kathy's Nursery:

Sylvester Palms (Phoenix Sylvestris): These are one of our most popular sellers. They come in a variety of heights to fit most landscapes and create a beautiful ambience. They have a neat diamond-cut trunk, but as they are large trees that need to be planted a distance from the home.

Queen Palms: These palms are stately, with bright glossy leaves that are gorgeous in the wind. Their fronds cascade over, which creates a tropical vibe. Bright orange dates hang in ornamental clusters. They are common around patios and pools and areas of relaxation.

Bismarck Palms: These silvery blue-green palms are show-stoppers, with their huge fronds and robust trunks. Their fronds can span up to 16 feet. They are fast growing and thrive in full sun, making them a focal point of your landscaping.

Robellini Palms (Pygmy Date Palms): This miniature palm is slow growing and allows you to have a palm closer to your home. Popular at the end of driveways or front



doors, robellinis are soft and feminine in look and feel.

Sago Palms: These wide trunk palms are dark green and lush. They will not grow to be too high, with large cones of seeds growing out of the middle. The seeds are poisonous to pets, so keep them away from fur-friendly homes.

European Fan Palms: These palms are very hardy and slow growing. They are not sensitive to cold weather and grow 8-15 feet tall. Their fronds are fine textured, which makes them stick out in landscaping, and they can range from dark green to silver in color.

Majestic Palms: This palm loves humidity, which is perfect for our Northeast Florida climate. Their fronds can be full, fanning out to 15 feet in height. They are also slow growers that don't mind some shade, but love water and naturally wet areas.

Women may need extra steps to reach financial security

International Women's Day 2020 is observed on March 8. This special day celebrates the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. Yet women still face gender barriers as they seek to achieve their financial goals.

How can you address these challenges?

To begin with, you need to be aware of what you're up against. The wage gap between men and women has closed somewhat, but it hasn't disappeared. Fulltime female employees earn about 82% of what men earn, according to the Census Bureau. Over a 40-year career, a woman who worked full time would lose, on average, more than \$400,000 because of this wage gap, according to the National Women's Law Center.

Furthermore, a woman turning age 65 today can expect to live, on average, until age 86.5; for a 65-year-old man, the comparable figure is 84. Those two and a half years can amount to a lot more living expenses.

Plus, by taking time off from the workplace to raise children and care for elderly family members, women often end up with lower balances in their 401(k)s and IRAs than men.

So, what can you do to help even the playing field, in terms of building adequate resources for retirement? Here are a few suggestions:

■ Contribute as much as possible to your retirement plans. During your working years, put in as much as you can afford to your 401(k) or similar employersponsored retirement plan. Most people don't come anywhere near the 401(k) contribution limit (which, in 2020, is \$19,500, or \$26,000 if you're 50 or older), and you might not be able to reach it, either, but

strive to do the best you can. And every time your salary increases, bump up your annual contribution. If you are able to "max out" on your 401(k), you may still be able to contribute to an IRA. If your income exceeds certain limits, you can't contribute to a Roth IRA, which offers tax-free withdrawals of earnings if you meet certain conditions. But you may still be able to fund a traditional IRA, although the tax deductibility may be reduced or

■ Use Social Security wisely. You can start taking Social Security as early as 62, but your checks can be larger if you wait until your full retirement age, which will likely be between 66 and 67. And if you're married, you may be able to choose between claiming your own benefits or receiving 50% of your spouse's benefits, which could help you if your spouse has considerably higher earnings. (Your spouse does not lose any benefits if you choose this route.)

■ Look for every opportunity to save and invest. As mentioned above, women often lose out on some retirement savings when they take time away from the workforce to raise families and eventually become caregivers for elderly parents. But even if you aren't working full time, it doesn't mean you have no chance to boost your retirement savings. If you can do any paid work, whether it's part time or as a consultant, you can contribute to an IRA and you should.

It's not easy to overcome the structural disadvantages women face when seeking to reach financial security. Taking advantage of the savings and investment possibilities available can help you make progress toward your goals.

All said they wanted to join.

And the female food alliance has been growing and going strong since then.

Serebin lost his fight with cancer and Cort sees it as a tribute to him, her beloved "foodie" and "eater."

It is also, "my legacy to hard working, creative, dynamic, caring women," she said. "It is my favorite project in my entire life, and I say that with love."

I am writing this narrative, on Monday March 2, at the close of trading with the Dow roaring back from the Coronavirus sell-off with its largest gain since 2009 advancing over just shy of 1,294 points or 5.1%!



"I've already had about three of these," she said, laughing, as she pointed to one of the veggie pies.

"The filling is salpicao," said Hangar One's chef Tiago Joaquim. Salpicao is a Brazilian dish with chicken and other herbs

Joaquim is from Brazil, as is Calebe Pereira, husband of Hangar One owner Rainer Pereira Da Silva.

Da Silva is a German-born pilot who runs the flight school at the airport, Florida Flyers, and is also the man behind the eatery. He was inspired to fuse the cuisines for a place where guests and students can relax and socialize.

"It was really lacking a restaurant for the customers and pilots that fly in," Da Silva said about the airport. "I thought it was a great opportunity. I initially turned in my concept in 2016, and we couldn't really decide on common ground. I came back in 2019 with a different concept. It was accepted and here we are."

Da Silva and his team remodeled the entire location, creating two indoor patios for the view and a full liquor bar, adding St. Augustine craft beers and liquor from the St. Augustine Distillery.

Da Silva is running a restaurant out of a regional airport, but he's doing it with a local mindset.

"We want to stay local," he said, "and support local businesses like us."

A brief history of influenza

1918, Cpl. Harry MacKerell and his comrades in the 314th Infantry Regiment crouched down in their trenches awaiting the order to attack the spike-helmeted troops of the Kai-

ser awaiting across no-man's land.

Each man said his prayers. They knew that they would encounter fierce resistance and that many of them would not return. What they did not know, what they could not know, was that World War I was less than a month from ending.

Up and down the line, other Americans made similar preparations. Col. Douglas MacArthur readied the men of the 42nd Rainbow Division, the first to set foot in France. Lt. Col. George S. Patton prepared to lead his tanks forward. He would literally lead them on foot into the battle where he would be wounded. Behind the lines, Capt.

Harry S. Truman prepared his battery of heavy artillery. That battery would drive back a German counterattack.

The battle of the Meuse-Argonne was the deadliest American campaign up to that time and the second deadliest in U.S. history. Twenty-thousand American soldiers would die before the battle ended and it would only end with the Armistice that would end the War on Nov. 11, 1918.

World War I was one of the bloodiest wars of all time and the combatants faced hardships beyond the imagination. Twenty million lost their lives.

But what they did not know and could not know as it drew to an end, was that a far deadlier menace was stalking them and every other person on Earth.

Sometime in 1917, what came to be called the Spanish flu began to ravage the World. This strain of Influenza was misnamed. It did not come from Spain. At the time, experts felt it originated in France or Boston or Haskell County, Kansas.

Today, most experts agree that it started in China and was initially transmitted from a bird to a pig. Sound familiar? The deadliest influenza pandemic of all time raged across the globe for three years, from 1917 into 1920.

Death tolls were difficult to calculate at the time and estimates range from 17 to 100 million people, with most of those estimates centered around 40 to 50 million.

In other words, the flu that soldiers carried home with them to every country in the world killed more people than the war itself.

This influenza outbreak was particularly harsh on indigenous populations, wiping out a quarter of the population of Samoa and entire Inuit villages in Canada and Alaska. So many died in the U.S. that life-expectancy was cut by 12 years. The death total in the United States was 675,000, about 6% of the total population. Globally, the Spanish Flu pandemic was the worst of all time and infected over half a billion people, or one-third of the world's population.

Since then there have been other influenza outbreaks — swine flu, avian flu, Asian flu, Hong Kong flu, and Russian flu. None of those were as brutal as the one that spawned in the trenches of Europe.

Today we are faced with a new flu threat, the coronavirus. I just read a poll that said over 39% of beer drinkers had stopped drinking Corona beer for fear of catching the virus, which is nuts! (You cannot get the coronavirus from drinking Corona or any other beer. Unless, of course, you are sharing that beer with someone already infected).

As I write this, the stock market has tumbled on fear of the virus.

My reading of history says that the fear is probably likely greater than the reality and I urge you not to allow yourself to be ruled by fear.
