COVID-19 testing site at St. Augustine Visitor Information Center offers free tests

The COVID testing site that opened earlier last week at the St. Augustine Visitor Information Center, operated by Flagler Health+ in partnership with the City of St. Augustine and Ivy Medical, is now be a free testing site.

"We are grateful to have found a solution with support from the State of Florida to begin offering COVID tests at no charge to those who need them," stated Flagler Health+ President & CEO Jason Barrett. "The ability to access COVID-19 testing is an important component to stopping the spread of the virus."

Anyone who has already been through the testing site will receive a refund and anyone who currently has an appointment scheduled will not be charged.

The COVID-19 testing site is located at the bus loop on the north side of the Historic Downtown Parking Facility on West Castillo Drive and is open 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Mon-

day through Friday. Expanded hours are being discussed, based on demand.

Patients must schedule an appointment for their test by downloading the Flagler Health+ Anywhere app or going to the Flagler Health Anywhere, app.flaglerhealthanywhere.com.

Testing is available for all ages, but a parent or guardian must be present for children under 18 to be tested.

Rutherford hosts sheriffs, members of Congress for law enforcement discussion

U.S. Rep. John Rutherford recently hosted a roundtable discussion with Duval County Sheriff Mike Williams, Nassau County Sheriff Bill Leeper, St. Johns County Sheriff Robert Hardwick, Clay County Sheriff Michelle Cook, Bradford County Sheriff Gordon Smith and Fraternal Order of Police Vice President Sgt. Randy Reeves. U.S. Reps. John Katko (N.Y.-24) and Greg Pence (Ind.-06) also attended virtually.

"Throughout the country, we are witnessing attempts to delegitimize, demoralize and defund law enforcement," said Rutherford. "Congress has a responsibility to support the men and women in blue who risk their lives every day to keep our communities safe. I greatly appreciate hearing from Northeast Florida law enforcement leaders today about how we in Congress can help make their jobs easier and safer."

Key takeaways from the roundtable

discussion include:

- Cuts to police funding lead to increased crime and longer response times.
- Ending qualified immunity would prevent good police officers from confidently carrying out their duties and would lead to police shortages.
- Accreditation remains an important tool in building strong relationships between agencies and communities.
 - Policing improves by building commu-

nity trust and allowing agencies flexibility to make changes based on the situation on the ground, not through federal mandates.

Rutherford is a member of the American Security Task Force led by Katko, who is also the top Republican on the House Homeland Security Committee. Rutherford leads the law enforcement pillar of the task force, which also includes U.S. Reps. Nicole Malliotakis (N.Y.-11), Troy Nehls (Texas-22) and Pence.

Tell me a little bit about Signature+ Concierge Care and how it works. What makes this form of care different than a traditional Primary Care/Physician experience?

This type of practice is substantially different than the traditional primary care model in several ways. Not only do we offer a patient-centered approach to care, it's different because I spend as much time with my patients as their needs dictate. It's not unusual for me to spend an hour or more with a patient – and I enjoy that opportunity to get to really know my patients and their health. And, my patients can reach me anytime. They have my personal cell phone number and I'm essentially on-call 365 days a year. Our amazing Signature+ staff help to coordinate appointments, including with other specialists. If a patient's needs would be more fully met by me attending appointments with other sub-specialists, I can go with them in a supportive and collaborative way. I would like to think this is the highest quality medical practice in the Northeast Florida region.

My background has been primarily in concierge and executive medicine over the majority of my 21 years practicing internal medicine. I was Chair of Executive Health at Mayo Clinic before joining Flagler Health+ to help develop and run this high-quality and innovative practice. While ample time spent with patients has been replaced with a model of care marked by rushed visits, fragmented care and increasing depersonalization in most practices today, Signature+ Concierge Care in many ways harkens back to how Marcus Welby MD treated patients in the television show from the early '70s.

I was instilled with the understanding of how much time spent with patients and performing a thorough history and physical resulted in markedly improved medical outcomes during my training and work experience at Mayo Clinic. I have brought this experience and philosophy to Flagler Health+ to continue a tradition of superior care with a holistic approach to health. I feel very fortunate to have the opportunity to continue this tradition at Signature+.

Patients have praised you for your accessibility, kindness, skill and integrity. Many physicians are talented and professional, but not all have had the kind of personal connection with their patients that you have. What is your secret?

I love what I do on several levels. As a Mayo Clinic and Cleveland Clinic trained internist, I learned how to become an expert diagnostician. Moreover, I adopted a philosophy of service, never rushing exams or discussions with patients and always understanding that patients should, and will always, come first. I view all of my patient interactions and subsequent recommendations in the prism of a holistic approach. I enjoy the rapport and friendship which develops with patients over time as well.

What do you like best about what you do?

I would say what I like most is evenly split between my enjoyment of delving into complicated cases given my internal medicine background, and also exploring the psycho-social aspects which are additional determinants of health. I hold a Master of Health Care Delivery Science from Dartmouth College, and I enjoy working on projects intended to improve the delivery of health care.



Can you tell me about your background? How did you get to where you are today? Did you always know you wanted to be a physician, or did you discover medicine at some point?

I became interested in medicine late in my college career. I initially thought I would follow in my father's footsteps as he was a practicing chiropractor for many years. However, while I was completing my pre-medical course in college I had the good fortune of working as an ICU unit secretary at night and an autopsy assistant on weekends at our local coroner's office. A forensic pathologist who became a mentor encouraged me to apply to medical school and so my life's path was set. It was the very best and most rewarding decision I ever made.

I am originally from Ohio. I graduated from medical school in my hometown of Dayton, Ohio, and subsequently trained and worked at both the Cleveland Clinic and Mayo Clinic. I also completed a fellowship in Integrative Medicine with world-renown integrative medicine specialist Andrew Weill MD at the University of Arizona in Tucson. While the profession of medicine has declined in terms of patient satisfaction, poorer quality outcomes due to rushed visits with physicians who are overworked, and high physician burnout rates, Signature+ has allowed me to practice medicine as many of us remember and miss dearly. I very am fortunate in that regard.

What do you like best about making your home in the Ponte Vedra area, and what do you like to do with your free time?

I enjoy spending time with my wife and enjoy reading medical literature. I also enjoy sports cars and auto racing. Ponte Vedra is an idyllic place to live with great amenities and very nice neighbors.

CITRUS TREES

Kathy Esfahani Columnist Ever wonder what type of citrus trees thrive in Northeast Florida? Growing citrus is not only great for fresh fruit, but they are beautiful ornate trees

with a wonderful scent. All citrus trees in 9A require a minimum of six hours of sunlight or more. They also require more water than most trees no matter if the weather is hot or cold. Dwarf trees are suited for smaller yards/spaces, whereas a big yard may have many large citrus trees. Fertilizing with specific citrus fertilizer quarterly is key to the success of these trees growing in our zone.

Here are some of the most popular in our area:

Meyer lemon, Persian lime, tangerine, Valencia orange, Ponderosa lemon, key lime, Ruby Red grapefruit, calamondin, Mandarin orange and cocktail citrus tree. A cocktail citrus tree is grafted with 3-5 fruits, including orange, grapefruit, lemons and limes. It's a great option if you only need one citrus tree in your landscaping but want to have multiple fruits! Fun fact: Each year, the cocktail citrus tree can bear different fruit that the year before!

Now that the weather is warming up, it's a perfect time to purchase citrus! Stop by the Nursery to see our inventory of citrus trees for the upcoming spring!



Veteran culture in place as Panthers begin new season

The Nease football program is entering year three under head coach Collin Drafts and as a result there is a certain degree of cohesion that has not been there the past couple of years.

In his third year, Drafts is finally starting to see the team reflect his philosophies as a head coach.

"The energy is great, and the competition level is very good every day, which is the most important thing for us," Drafts said.

The Panthers are the definition of a veteran-laden team with 36 seniors on this year's squad.

"We've got a good player-led team with a great group of seniors taking the lead," Drafts said. "A lot of those guys played varsity since they were sophomores, which was also my first year."

The relationships the coaching staff and the players have developed over the past three years is something that should not be underestimated heading into the new season

It is often said that the third year under a coach is when the coach's imprint can really start to be seen. That has taken place within the Panther football program.

"The foundation has been laid and we feel good that our culture has been set," Drafts said. "The players know the expectations and they know what the deal is and now we just have to go out and execute and produce."

Because the team was so young last year, the juniors were thrown into situations that forced them to become leaders, which Drafts believes has made it easier to continue and embrace those leadership roles as seniors.

Although Drafts is about to begin his third season, he just wrapped up his first full offseason with spring football and summer workouts.

He was hired late in June 2019 and had to plan around COVID-19 regulations in place in 2020.

After a full offseason, something that has stood out to Drafts is the consistent play of his defense.

"I feel really good about the way our defense is responding right now," Drafts said. "We've got a good group of core guys coming back. They've been challenged and are definitely stepping up right now."

He expects the receiving corps to be a strength this season with the ability to present both speed and size out wide.

Tight end and UCF commit Grant Stevens and wide receiver Donovan Wilson provide matchup problems for defenses with their size, while Dom Henry's speed gives the Panthers the ability to hit a big

play through the air at any moment.

"We have four starters back up front along the offensive line, anchored by Sam Dec," Drafts said.

Dec plays offensive tackle and has committed to Army. He and the rest of the line will be tasked with helping create a clean pocket for quarterbacks Marcus Stokes and Gabe Ohlson to work with.

As a former quarterback himself, including playing in the Arena Football League, Drafts understands how well an offensive line must play for a team to have success.

"At the first team meeting every year,

I tell the team that the most important position group on the field is the offensive line, because they have to be the most selfless and play together," Drafts said. "We're going to go behind those guys."

The Panthers drop down in classification to 7A, which means the regular season opener against rival Ponte Vedra will now be a district matchup. The rest of the district includes Fleming Island, Atlantic Coast, Fletcher and First Coast

"It is one of the tougher 7A districts out there," Drafts said. "Week in and week out, it's going to be a battle."



"I love our kids;t they have just been fantastic," Price said. "It's just been a joy to coach and come out here every single day. They like to work and get better, and they just love the sport of football."

Having that energy and love for the game is something that is often ingrained in a person, which Price enjoyed seeing because it is definitely a building block that can be built upon moving forward.

Price brings plenty of pedigree as he spent the past five seasons as head coach at Tallahassee North Florida Christian, where he led them to a Class 2A state title in 2018.



Chris Howard has had one heck of a journey as a member of the University of Florida football program, and although he has been there for four years, it seems like his path is just now beginning.

The Ponte Vedra High alum and redshirt senior kicker graduated in early August with a bachelor's degree in sport management and a minor in business. He has now shifted his focus to pursuing a master's degree, although he is still figuring out the career path that best suits him.

"I just know that I want to go into the business side of sports when my playing days are over," Howard said.

Walking across the stage to receive his diploma was an emotional moment for Howard and his family, especially knowing all the hard work that went into getting to that point.

"It was pretty surreal," Howard said.
"School was pretty tough, so it was a big accomplish to achieve in front of all your family and friends."

Howard was named to the SEC academic honor roll in 2018 and 2020.

Since walking on to the Gators' squad in

2017, he has been fighting to be the starting kicker, and this year, he will have the best opportunity he has had to earn the top job.

It is also the first season he will enter as a scholarship player after being granted a scholarship in January.

Hearing the news that he earned a schol-

arship after four years as a walk-on has been arguably the greatest moment of his college career and is something that will stick with him forever.

"It was one of the best feelings I've had in a long time," Howard said. "Coach Mullen said he would find me a scholarship

after Evan (McPherson) left. He kept true to his word."

According to Howard, he felt such a sense of accomplishment, as if he reached the end goal, but then he quickly realized that there are much bigger goals still up for grabs on the horizon.

"I have a real opportunity this year to see the field," Howard said. "I've been working the last couple of years for this moment."

He has been competing during fall practice with Jace Christmann, who is new to the team as a graduate transfer from Mississippi State.

One of the things Howard is leaning on is the experience he gained playing in reserve duty in five games during the past two seasons.

Last year, he showed the coaching staff exactly what he could do by making a pair of field goals and all five of his extra-point attempts in contests against Missouri and Arkansas.

"I definitely think that experience is pretty valuable," Howard said.

"Don't make it a bigger kick than it is," Howard said. "You just try to go out there and execute."

The mental side of the game has been something Howard has worked on since he first started experimenting with kicking in eighth grade.

"I always played soccer, so I knew I had the tools to do it," Howard said.

He began his career at Ponte Vedra High School as a wide receiver, but eventually made the full commitment to being the team's kicker as a sophomore.

"I really haven't looked back," Howard

Howard credited former PVHS special teams coach Kris Kramer for helping with the mental side of the game while in high school, but when it came to his technique, he was able to hone that himself over the years.

"The height on my ball and ball striking have really improved the most," Howard said. I'm still always working to improve kickoffs."

Several small schools recruited him out of high school, but he had high expectations that he continued to shoot for.

"I always told my parents that if I was going to play in college, I wanted to do it on the big stage," Howard said.

It may have taken a little longer than he initially wanted, but that big stage came calling when Florida's coaches called and told him they thought he had what it took

to compete for a spot on the team.

The call came just in time, as he was about to start classes at Florida State.

Four years later, he has a degree, is under scholarship, and is in the hunt to be the Gators' starting kicker in the season opener at home against Florida Atlantic at 7:30 p.m. on Sept. 4.

"It's definitely been a crazy journey, but I just always kept believing and working toward what I knew was possible," Howard said. "No matter what situation you find yourself in, at the end of the day it comes down to you to make the most of it."

Tronti rediscovering Mr. Football magic as FAU quarterback

Nick Tronti reminded people why he was named Mr. Football in Florida following his senior season at Ponte Vedra High School in 2016 with his play as Florida Atlantic's signal-caller last

After winning the starting quarterback job, he ended up helping lead the Owls to a record of 5-4 and an appearance in the Montgomery Bowl.

However, he believes he and his team have the potential for much more as he heads into his redshirt senior season.

"Our goal is always to win the conference, and that's no different this year," Tronti said.

His mindset heading into what could be his final college season, if he does not choose to enact the NCAA's pandemicrelated eligibility rules, is a simple one.

"Just soak it all in," Tronti said.

He, as most players are looking forward to the opportunity to play a full and "normal" season.

"It was tough last year bringing in a new offense with no spring ball," Tronti said. "It was tough on everyone."

Already, Tronti can feel and see a difference in the rhythm of the team as the combination of Willie Taggert entering his second season as head coach and having had an actual spring to practice is beginning to take hold.

All the pieces started coming together for Tronti last season under Willie Taggert, his third different head coach in five years. He has also had four offensive coordinators during that time.

"He's got a really good record of coaching at some known programs," Tronti said.

Although Tronti would have loved to have some consistency calling the shots in his career, he is also grateful in a way, because it has allowed him to learn about the different approaches that exist.

"It's wild how much more football is out there," Tronti said. "I've grown a ton (as a player) over the years."

According to Tronti, he feels comfortable operating Taggert's offensive philos-

ophy and is happy to play for a returning coach for the first time in college.

Despite having earned the job last year, Tronti has made sure that he approaches this preseason the same as he did last fall.

"Every year is a competition," Tronti said.

The advantage of being a redshirt senior is Tronti's experience compared to the majority of the Owls' quarterback room, which includes freshman Willie Taggert Jr., and redshirt freshmen Justin McKithen, Javion Posey and Michael Johnson Jr.

Miami transfer and graduate senior N'Kosi Perry is the only other quarter-back on the roster that can equate to the level of experience Tronti offers.

"I've been around for a while and seen a lot of defenses in my career," Tronti said. "I've probably experienced every high and low you can in college football."

He began his college career at Indiana after graduating from PVHS, but transferred to the Owls after just one year, which he redshirted.

From there he joined FAU and has spent the last four years preparing to earn the position and prove potential.

Since his high school days playing at the "Shark Tank," he has been known as an excellent athlete and someone who presents dual-threat capabilities from behind center.

In last year's shortened season, he completed 89 of 167 pass attempts for 905 yards, six touchdowns, and three interceptions. He also ran for 139 yards and two scores on 70 carries.

"Really, I just ultimately see myself as a football player," Tronti said. "I'm willing to do whatever I have to to help my team win."

The Owls open against the Florida Gators on the road on Sept. 4 at 7:30 p.m., followed by a pair of home non-conference games against Georgia Southern and Fordham and a road date with Air Force, before beginning the Conference USA slate of their schedule as they host Florida International in the Shula Bowl on Oct. 2 at 3:30 p.m.



QB Joey Gatewood transfers to Knights from Kentucky

The University of Central Florida football team continues to increase its footprint in the Sunshine State by getting a commitment from Nease tight end Grant Stevens and luring former Bartram Trail quarterback to transfer from Kentucky.

Eight of the Knights' 11 commitments are from Florida.

Grant attended UCF's high school camp this summer, and he quickly became a target for tight ends coach Brian Blackmon. Grant, a 6-foot-4, 230-pound senior, narrowed his list of likely destinations to UCF, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech, Coastal Carolina, FIU, Liberty and Arkansas State. Grant originally picked Coastal Carolina, but he recently changed his mind

"It's pretty close to my home," Stevens said. It's like a

family-feel there. There's a great opportunity to go there and play and have a great career. I know they're just about to build the program with [head coach Gus] Malzahn and the whole staff there."

Grant caught 40 passes for 502 yards and five touchdowns last year for the Panthers. Nease opens its new season with its Battle of the Bridge rivalry at Ponte Vedra on Friday night.

"[It's] just a place where it would be like family going there," Stevens said. "Somewhere I could see myself going, playing, and living there for the next three to four years."

The Knights also got a commitment from quarterback Joey Gatewood. The Bartram Trail graduate spent two years at Auburn with Malzahn before transferring to Kentucky last year. Gatewood entered the transfer portal after Malzahn was hired as UCF's new coach.

Gatewood, 6-5, 221, was rated as the No. 1 athlete in the country when he left high school. He was a four-star recruit who was selected to play in the Under Armour All-America game.

3 ways to eat healthy at game day events

The sports landscape changed dramatically in 2020. Professional sports leagues were forced to interrupt or delay their seasons, while many amateur athletes, including college and scholastic players, were told their seasons would not take place in 2020.

3. Make your own foods.

When you make your own food for game day, you control what you're putting into your body. Homemade snacks that are low in calories and don't contain much sugar can help you stay the dietary course more effectively than brownies, chips and nachos.



Savory sandwiches for tailgate fun

Fall marks the start of football season. Game day experiences are made even more enjoyable by hosting or attending a tailgate in the parking lot of the

Tailgate supplies must be brought to the tailgate the day of the game. That includes food, which is often prepared at home and then cooked on-site. This recipe for "Ultimate Steak & Mushroom Sandwiches" from Laurie McNamara's "Simply Scratch" (Avery) can be prepared at home and then put together at the stadium lot. These delicious sandwiches can be easily cut into small pieces and served as slidertype appetizers.

Ultimate Steak & Mushroom Sandwiches

Makes 46-inch sandwiches

- ■11/4 to 11/2 pounds rib-eye steak
- ■1 cup Balsamic Herb Dressinade (see below)
- ■1 tablespoon unsalted butter
- ■1 tablespoon olive oil
- ■1 large sweet onion, halved and thinly sliced
- ■1 pint cremini mushrooms, cleaned and sliced
- ■Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper (optional)
- ■1/2 cup crumbled blue cheese
- ■11/2 cups grated provolone cheese
- ■4 6-inch hoagie bungs, split
- ■Mayonnaise
- ■Balsamic Herb Dressinade
- ■2 cloves garlic, minced
- ■1 tablespoon chopped fresh basil or 1 teaspoon dried
- ■2 teaspoons chopped fresh rosemary, or 1 teaspoon dried
- ■1 teaspoon chopped fresh thyme, or 1/2 teaspoon dried
- ■3/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- ■1/4 teaspoon coarsely ground black pepper

- ■6 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- ■2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- ■1 cup grape-seed or olive oil

In a 1-pint glass jar, combine all the ingredients. Secure the lid and shake until combined. Let stand for 30 minutes before using. Refrigerate any unused dressing.

Place the steak on a small rimmed baking sheet and freeze for 20 minutes so it's firm and partially frozen. Holding a sharp knife on a slight angle, going against the grain of the meat, slice into very thin strips.

In a large resealable bag or a medium bowl, marinate the steak in the dressinade for 30 minutes.

On a griddle or in a 12-inch cast-iron skillet, melt the butter with the olive oil over medium-high heat. Add the onion, toss and spread out in an even layer. Once the onion starts to soften, add the mushrooms. Cook until soft and slightly caramelized.

Using tongs, remove the steak from the marinade (allow excess to drip back into the bag or bowl) and place on the griddle, toss with the onions and mushrooms, then spread in an even layer. Allow the steak to sear, forming a crust, for 4 to 6 minutes, then flip and cook for 4 to 6 minutes more.

Season with a pinch of salt and pepper, if desired, and sprinkle with the blue cheese and provolone. Turn off the heat on the griddle or remove the skillet from the heat and cover with a domed lid or tented foil to allow the cheese to melt quickly.

Toss one last time so the cheese is mixed throughout. Divide the steak mixture among the crusty hoagie buns. Serve immediately.

Despite preseason losses, Jaguars display positive developments

The Jacksonville Jaguars conclude the preseason on Sunday, Aug. 29, at 1 p.m. against the Dallas Cowboys at AT&T Stadium.

Through two games this preseason, the Jaguars defense has allowed the NFL's fewest rushing yards (104 rushing yards allowed, 52.0 yards per contest), including limiting the Saints to 63 rushing yards on 21 carries on Monday night. New Orleans won the game 23-21. The Jaguars also lost their preseason opener against the Cleveland Browns 23-13.

"We're trying to still feel the chemistry with each other out. I feel our run stop is phenomenal right now," Jaguars safety Rayshawn Jenkins said following Monday's game. "The back end just has to trust the ball more, but it will all come. It takes patience and time, but we will clean up some things and [the process] will go smooth."

Quarterback Trevor Lawrence has started both preseason games and completed 20-of-32 passes for 184 yards, while QB Gardner Minshew II has thrown for 196 yards on 17-of-29 passing. C.J. Beathard has totaled 223 yards and three TDs on 22-of-30 passing in two preseason contests. Beathard's 127.5 passer rating is the highest among all NFL QBs this preseason.

Jaguars head coach Urban Meyer has coached at AT&T Stadium twice as a college coach with Ohio State. In 2015, the Buckeyes defeated Oregon, 42-20, in the College Football Playoff National Championship for Meyer's third NCAA title. The Buckeyes again impressed at the venue in 2017 when they trounced Southern Cal 24-7, in the Cotton Bowl Classic on Dec. 29, 2017.

After going 1-15 last season, the Jaguars are looking to rebuild this year with Meyer as the new coach and by selecting Lawrence as the No. 1 pick in the NFL Draft.

The Jaguars open the regular season at 1p.m. Sunday, Sept. 12, at the Houston Texans.

Notes: The Jaguars waived OL Derwin Gray, CB Jameson Houston and DT Kenny Randall on Tuesday, and placed RB Travis Etienne Jr. on injured reserve. ... On Monday, the Jaguars placed DE/OLB Josh Allen on the Reserve/CO-VID-19 list.



teen acres of coquina screenings replaced rough grasses, resulting in a reduction in maintained turf and considerable savings on water, chemical inputs and labor.

A full-service practice facility was created by tripling teeing space. A second tee was added on the north end for private instruction and corporate outings, along with a new short game practice area.

The first tee was strategically transformed into a multi-use space. And 20,000 square feet of tightly mown bermudagrass now serves as both a teeing ground and outdoor event venue.

As the former par-4 10th hole was absorbed into the practice facility, a new par-3, 13th hole was created. This provides a break between former back-to-back par 5's and now offers a more formidable par-5, 14th hole.

Greens were also redesigned to USGA specs. Each was lowered 15-24 inches to become receptive to the ground game, a necessity on windy seaside tracks.



It's no secret why many regard Theo Peoples as one of the most authentic voices in the music industry, and all agree he has raised the bar high because of his soulful vocal style. Glass Animals to perform Sept. 7 at The Amp

Genre-mashing hit makers Glass Animals will bring their "Dreamland Tour" to The St. Augustine Amphitheatre on Sept. 7 for a full-capacity concert.

The band has been selected as a 2021 Billboard Music Awards finalist for Top Rock Song – "Heat Waves" – and Top Rock Album - "Dreamland." This is the first time the band has been recognized by the Billboard Music Awards.

strikingly diverse audiences.

"Heat Waves" is taken from Glass Animals' critically acclaimed third album, "Dreamland," which was released last summer and this week was certified

platinum in the United States.

Nearly a year since its release, the song continues to grow globally across streaming platforms and on radio charts. Amassing over 450 million global

streams to date, "Heat Waves" peaked at No. 1 on the Alternative Radio Chart for three consecutive weeks, a first for Glass Animals in their career.

The track currently sits in the Top 20 on the Top 40 Radio Chart and is making similar moves at Hot AC and AAA.





More than golf

Match play championship seeks more opportunities for golfers, women

By Anthony Richards

Inaugural events do not often have the ability to create an instant impact, but that is exactly what the PXG Women's Match Play Championship is hoping to accomplish.

That was the message presented during the media day for the two-week event scheduled to be played at World Golf Village Oct. 26 to Nov. 4.

"This is a women's initiative in a golf wrapper," said Mark Berman, managing partner with MediaShare Consulting Group. "Hopefully this will launch a whole new movement."

Berman stated that he is a "girl dad," which is one of the reasons the initiative seems so much to him and why he wanted to do his part to make it happen.

He saw the limited number of avenues for female golfers to take to reach the LPGA Tour after their college careers end and wanted to do something to change that.

"This has been a two to three year project for me," Berman said.

Currently, female golfers have the option to play on four developmental tours en route to one day becoming a member of the LPGA Tour.

The four tours include the Women's All Pro Tour, the Symetra Tour, Ladies National Golf Association in Florida, the Cactus Tour based out of Arizona.

However, the number of tours available for women are far less than the men's side, which has about 30 "mini" tours for golfers to explore on their path to the PGA Tour.

"It has to start somewhere," Berman said. "We want to use this as a platform for women moving forward. It's all about creating opportunities."

The tournament is collaborating with non-profit Generation W to help showcase some of the best up-and-coming female golfers in the world.

One thing's for certain: Uncertainty will reign at Daytona race

The playoff scenario has never been clearer this year heading into Saturday's Coke Zero Sugar 400 at the Daytona International Speedway. And yet, the battle for the 16th and final spot in the Cup Series Playoffs has created an enormous sense of uncertainty.

Fifteen spots are locked in. Tyler Reddick has a comfortable lead in the point standings for the final cutoff position. But there's nothing comfortable about racing on Daytona's high banks — especially in the summer.

If Reddick survives the 160-lap race under the lights, he has a great chance to advance to the first round of the playoffs. But that's a big if.

No less than 14 other drivers can make the cut by winning the race. As Greg Sack reminded us in 1985,

then David Ragan in 2011, Erik Jones in 2018 and Justin Haley in 2019, longshot winners can be a good bet

Moreover, the chances of finishing on a wrecker's hook are as likely as driving to the checkered flag. A year ago, 23 of 40 cars were involved in crashes. In 2019, 28 of 40 wrecked, including 18 on the final lap of a rain-shortened finish.

All drivers agree on one thing ahead of Saturday's 7 p.m.: hold on, it's going to be a wild ride.

"I think you'll expect to see drivers that were as desperate as I was in that race to try and get up front and get control of the race and win for their team and all their partners," Reddick said. "It's just going to be a matter of trying to have an understanding in the

Dozens gather at Vilano Beach for Florida Skimboarding Pro/Am

Dozens of athletes from around the state, the nation and the world gathered at Vilano Beach on Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 12-22, to demonstrate their skimboarding proficiency.

The Florida Skimboarding Pro/Am is the third longest running professional and amateur skimboarding tournament in the world. The annual competition is important not just for participants but also for the community and local tourism industry.

"The Visitors and Convention Bureau has been supportive of this terrific event for years," said Richard Goldman, CEO and president, St. Augustine, Ponte Vedra & The Beaches Visitors and Convention Bureau. "Not only does it bring participants and their families who might not have known about us, it also raises awareness of our sports-friendly destination. We have ample beaches and waterways that can support so many outdoor sporting events which don't require the construction of expensive facilities that many other sports demand."

The local tournament welcomes competitors representing more than 75 different beaches. The age range starts at 15 and goes all the way up, with the most senior category being 40 and over.

The enthusiasm of this year's participants was evident even before the competition began. Contestants began gathering at the beach early Saturday morning, charging into the surf and catching waves as high tide approached.

Experienced skimboarders knew that this was an optimal opportunity to practice their pastime. The incoming tide was expected to reach 5.4 feet, peaking at 8:30 a.m.

To the uninitiated, skimboarding may resemble surfing, but there are important differences.

Skimboards tend to be thinner, narrower and shorter than traditional surfboards and do not have fins. That means they are not as easily controlled on the water.

In addition, skimboarding is practiced in shallow water, which is why it is done closer to shore than surfing. And, unlike surfing, skimboarding can be done even on flat water, which means such elements as wind and the direction of currents and swell are not as critical.

According to the Run Drop Slide website, rundropslide.com, the local tournament was launched by Steve Pullara in October 1990, a year after he moved to

Vilano Beach. Its roots go back to Pullara's youth in Tampa when he discovered the fun of skimming the waves on round disks.

Pullara's business, Run Drop Slide, has been an apparel brand for the skimboarding sport since 1998 and the main sponsor of the local event.

The United Skim Tour is the sanctioning body for skimboarding events on both coasts of the United States and abroad. Its 2021 schedule lists five men's professional tournaments and three women's professional tournaments, with the Florida Pro-Am in both categories.

The summit will feature an array of esteemed female speakers who have found success in multiple avenues.

"It will be energizing, informative and inspirational," Orender said.

PXG is the title sponsor of the event and Vice President of Brand Communications and Engagement Leela Brennan was on hand to make sure the message is clear.

"The idea of inclusivity is part of the core value at PXG and this is a wonderful opportunity to articulate that," Brennan said. "We don't make golf clubs for men, and we don't make golf clubs for women we make golf clubs for golfers."

back of your head or have a point that you kind of have within yourself. Like OK, this is my fun meter. If we can stay within, we're good. If we go over here, etc.

"We're trying to make the Playoffs, right? But we're also trying to get 10th and get that extra [bonus] point if we can, too. So, there are a lot of things around. We're going to try and control what we can. Someone going in and winning that race in Daytona is something that we can't really control unless we win that race. But it's a tough spot to be in."

The 14 other drivers, including Reddick's Richard Childress Racing teammate Austin Dillon, know they need a victory to move up the list, including Florida watermelon farmer-turned-racer Ross Chastain.

"I don't want to cause a big wreck. I've done that. I'm trying to learn from it," Chastain said. "I used to get really freaked out and worried and stressed about superspeedway races, but I've just realized over my 10 years in the sport, and really — I learned it from [truck racer] Johnny Sauter — he said one day something that resonated with me like we're all going to crash. We're all going to get backward in the grass at 200 mph

at some point. You make it. Go home. So, yeah. No desperation. I just want to win and compete in this series. So, whatever happens there, happens."

That's what concerns playoff drivers who are focusing on not crashing and gaining momentum for the Playoffs.

"No, it's going to be balls to the wall for anybody that's top-30 in points," Kyle Busch said. "Anybody that's top-30 in points that can win that race, we've seen Front Row Motorsports win. We've seen Spire win. We've seen teams that don't normally win races be able to score victories in the restrictor-plate races so that just leads to the anxiety level of everybody."

Busch is safely in the Playoffs. But like others, he's wary of the circling storm from others who are desperate to win at all costs.

After racing at the Richmond International Raceway in the past, NASCAR moved the regular-season finale to Daytona this year. It was done to create a greater level of excitement — and angst.

"There are a lot of people who are really worried. You always have bubble drivers," Denny Hamlin said. "You used to go into Richmond and you were kind of afraid of a different winner there, but you usually had the same cast of characters who ran upfront. But at Daytona, you just never know. That race, in particular, always gets a lot more wild. It's very

unpredictable. There's a lot of nervous guys out there.

"Ultimately [it's] a great opportunity for someone to sneak into the playoffs who's had a rough year behind them. You just never know. It's good for our schedule to have it where it's at [as the regularseason finale]. It's a good place."

Hamlin is trying to clinch the regularseason championship — and the extra bonus points that come with it. Oddly enough, he's also trying to his first race in 2021. With a spot already assured in the playoffs, Hamlin said he's likely to be more aggressive and take more risks to

catch Kyle Larson for the top-seed.

"The way I see it, we don't have anything to lose," Hamlin said. "Now we need to go back on offense on the regularseason championship. From my standpoint, I will be going as aggressively as I can to try and get a win there. It depends where our points position is and if we can gain anything on the 5 [Larson]. That will distinguish how I'm going to strategize, how I'm going to run. I just think it's fluid. It's a moving target to see how I'm going to approach that race."

Which certainly adds a level of uncertainty to the race.




