Maria Radoslovich Cox, age 86, of Ponte Vedra Beach, FL passed away Sunday October 24, 2021 at her home in Ponte Vedra Beach. The cause of her death was progressive pulmonary disease.

Maria's career as an interior designer spanned two decades and included collaborations with such design firms as Harrison & Abramovitz; Skidmore, Owings & Merrill and ISD Inc. in New York, San Francisco and Boston. A Cornell University Fine Arts graduate, Maria was an Associate member of the American Institute of Architects, an Affiliate of the American Federation

of the Arts, and she actively served on multiple boards and committees throughout her life including serving as a Trustee Emeritus at the Museum of Contemporary Art (MOCA) Jacksonville. Her passion for design and the arts led her outdoors to the landscape. In 1995 she earned two degrees from the New York Botanical Garden in Commercial Horticulture and Landscape design. Her gardens were a great source of joy and inspiration to Maria and to all who experienced them.

Maria and her late husband Don resided in New York City and on Hilton Head Island before residing in Ponte Vedra Beach. She was preceded in death by her parents, the late architects Kate (nee Hall) Radoslovich and Mike Radoslovich, FAIA and her sister, Claire Clark. K9s For Warriors receives Back the Blue Award from Attorney General Moody

Nonprofit provides station dog to Jacksonville Sheriff's Office

K9s For Warriors, the nation's largest provider of trained service dogs to military veterans, received Florida Attorney General Ashley Moody's Back the Blue Award on Thursday, Oct. 7, for its dedication to the state's first responders.

In celebration, K9s For Warriors donated a station dog to the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO) to mitigate the stress and anxiety commonly found in dispatch operators, first responders and police officers.

The Back the Blue Award honors law enforcement officers, citizens and organizations that have taken extraordinary steps to forge positive relationships between law enforcement and the communities they serve.

The campaign recognized K9s For Warriors for its station dog program, which reallocates trained service dogs that either completed their time paired with a veteran or are identified as having a temperament better suited for a station dog environment.

"The brave men and women of Florida law enforcement often find themselves in extremely stressful and dangerous situations," said Moody. "I am so thankful for the work being done by K9s For Warriors to help connect law enforcement heroes with K9s to help them heal and cope with some of the invisible wounds inflicted while protecting Floridians. I look forward to watching the station dog program grow and help even more members of our law enforcement community."

Founded in 2011, K9s For Warriors has rescued more than 1,300 dogs across the country and paired nearly 700 veterans with trained service dogs to mitigate symptoms of post-traumatic stress, traumatic brain injuries and military sexual trauma. The nonprofit's station dog program provides homes for trained dogs that will no longer be paired with veterans by placing them with police and fire departments.

JSO's adoption of Buster, a yellow Labrador retriever, marks the eighth station dog donated by K9s For Warriors and the seventh in Florida.

"We are dedicated to supporting our nation's heroes, and while our focus is on helping military veterans overcome mental trauma, we started the station dog program to extend that support to the heroes who continue to serve our communities," said Rory Diamond, CEO of K9s For Warriors. "We are honored to be recognized by Attorney General Moody, and we are excited to partner with JSO in bringing Buster to their department as a way to help relieve the pressure our first responders face every day."

After completing the K9s For Warriors puppy raiser training program, K9 trainers designated Buster as better suited for station dog duty. The nonprofit worked directly with JSO to evaluate the station environment and identify personnel who would be responsible for Buster's care. The station dog received preliminary training to recognize signs of anxiety, and he will spend time in JSO's dispatch center to recognize signals of stress and intervene.

"We are continually looking for innovative resources to support our members who help others every day," said Jacksonville Sheriff Mike Williams. "While dogs and their special bond with humans are not new to any of us, bringing them into our workplace to help our employees is a positive and exciting new approach. I am looking forward to expanding our team through this partnership with K9s For Warriors that will be life changing for every member of the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office."

In addition to JSO, K9s For Warriors has partnered with first responder departments across Florida to provide station dogs, including the Atlantic Beach Police Department, Jacksonville Beach Police Department, Neptune Beach Police Department, Clay County Sheriff's Office, Daytona Beach Shores Public Safety Department and the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office.



Beaches Coalition discusses dune project prior to Nov. 1 start

St. Johns County Coastal Manager Damon Douglas was the guest speaker at the Oct. 25 Beaches Coalition meeting and talked about the dune enhancement project scheduled to begin Nov. 1.

"Whether you're a beach goer or not, this is going to effect all of us in some way, whether that be with traffic or beach closures," said Vicki Corlazzoli, with the Coalition.

The FEMA dune project includes 8.9 miles of coastline in Ponte Vedra, 1.7 miles in South Ponte Vedra and 0.7 of a mile in Crescent Beach.

Although the sand, hauled from a mine in Keystone Heights, is different than that from the ocean, Douglas expressed that it is still quality sand approved by DOT.

According to Douglas, the contractor will spread out the trucks hauling sand to limit the amount of increased traffic.

"We're cognizant of people's views," Douglas said.

Part of the route will include trucks travelling over Palm Valley Bridge and staging at Cornerstone Park prior to being sent to the beach.

Ponte Vedra Boulevard and Mickler Road will be used to transfer the sand to the beach.

Sand will be placed between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday with about 30 trucks attempting four trips a day.

"We do not take it lightly, having to close Mickler's," Douglas said. "Work areas will consist of about 1,000 to 2,000 feet of beach at a time, which will be closed to the public during the project."

He reiterated that Mickler's Landing will be partially opened Saturdays and Sundays with limited parking available.

Separate from the FEMA dune project is a Ponte Vedra Beach renourishment project, which will extend from the Duval County line to Guana River State Park.

"We've got the permits and are moving forward with the process of finding funding," Douglas said.

One of the next steps is also to have the Army Corps of Engineers conduct a feasibility study, which Douglas said could recommend a five-year beach restoration project.



Performers may require COVID tests at local venues

Local concertgoers might want to check venue COVID restrictions a few days before setting out to hear their favorite artists. This is especially important for fans who have chosen not to be vaccinated against the coronavirus.

Some performers are requiring proof of a negative COVID test within 72 hours or proof of vaccination before ticket holders are admitted to their shows.

Neither the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall nor the St. Augustine Amphitheater are requiring masks, negative tests nor vaccinations for entry, though they are following health and safety guidelines required by individual artists for specific shows.

Thus far, few artists are setting conditions related to COVID. There are, however, three exceptions so far at the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall:

- "An Evening with Bruce Hornsby" on Nov. 17
- "An Evening with John Pizzarelli Trio" on Feb. 22
- "Graham Nash: An Intimate Evening of Songs and Stories" on March 9 and 13. In addition, the performer asks that all patrons wear a mask.

Because there is typically a 24- to 48-hour turnaround for results from a PCR test, concertgoers won't want to wait too close to show dates to get tested. Fortunately, however, many sites offer rapid testing

One such site is run by Telescope Health at 540 Atlantic Blvd. in Neptune Beach. However, the site is only open weekdays, so it's still important to plan ahead for weekend concerts.

According to Dr. Matthew Thompson, who founded Telescope Health as a telemedicine company three years ago along with Dr. Matthew Rill, the test site sees people not only from Jacksonville, but also St. Johns, Ponte Vedra and elsewhere.

He said the volume of people seeking tests has declined from about 500 per day to about 70 currently. Greater numbers getting vaccinated may account for the drop, but mutations remain a cause for concern.

"There are certainly new variants that are coming out, and that can still put those who are vaccinated at risk," Thompson said. "Thankfully, the majority of people that I'm treating now are vaccinated and have much less severe symptoms."

He said Telescope Health, which opened its first testing site at the Prime F. Osborn III Convention Center in March 2020, has seen an increase in positive cases following concerts.

"We do see spikes in cases after large events where people are huddled together," he said.

To check the status of testing restrictions at local venues, concertgoers can go to pvconcerthall.com or theamp.com and look up show details.

County OKs rezoning of A1A property

By a vote of 4-0, the St. Johns County Commission on Oct. 19 approved a request to rezone 4.3 acres of land in Ponte Vedra Beach, allowing a mixed-use development that would include a 120-room hotel and commercial or office uses.

Commissioner Paul Waldron was absent.

Sleiman Enterprises requested the change from single family residential to planned unit development. Plans call for two buildings to be constructed onsite. The land sits west of State Road A1A about 200 feet south of the Duval County line.

Sleiman also requested nine waivers, later reduced to seven, where its plans did not meet the county's restrictions.

Objections raised by the public involved an expected increase in traffic and noise from the site.

At its Sept. 13 meeting, the Ponte Vedra Zoning and Adjustment Board had recommended the commission deny the rezoning request.

Waivers requested by Sleiman included construction of more than 10,000 square feet of building per acre, construction of a building longer than 120 feet (the hotel is expected to be 270 feet long), a reduction of the rear setback, addition of fill to the property, installation of an 80-square-foot sign, construction of a three-story building and installation of a flat roof.

Michael Herzberg, vice president of development for Sleiman Enterprises, predicted that the project would generate \$614,660 in impact fees and \$514,699 in tax revenue for the county. It would generate \$209,007 for the school district.

The charity run/walk will be 3.1 miles and will start at the 16th Street public beach access point, and the goal of the event is to raise \$10,000.

Blanton was born with a congenital heart defect known as tricuspid atresia, which has led to her having to live with Eisenmenger Syndrome, which according to the Mayo Clinic, can cause blood to circulate abnormally in a person's heart and lungs.

She moved to the United States 34 years ago but has continued to stay in touch with what is going on in Venezuela.

Although Blanton understood the struggles she has endured in her life due to being born with a congenital heart defect, she was not aware of the magnitude of the situation in her native land until she spoke with Dr. Ivan Machado Hernandez, who is a doctor and professor of cardiology at a university in

According to Blanton, Venezuela has more than 4,000 children born annually that suffer from congenital heart defects. Eighty percent of them end up requiring surgery prior to their first birthday.


However, about 2,000 children are on a waiting list for surgery, but many die while awaiting the care they need.

"I now dedicate my life to fight for the children with congenital heart defects in my country of Venezuela," Blanton said. "Our foundation provides the resources to aid families through appointment scheduling, medical supplies and nutritional supplements."



October mortgage market update

By David Johnson

In this Sand Castles mortgage market update, I discuss four topics: second and investment home mortgage availability improvement, rising interest rates and their causes, increased conforming loan limits and the general state of the Ponte Vedra Beach housing market.

Second and investment home mortgage restrictions eased: It has been confirmed by the two government sponsored entities (GSE), Freddie Mac and Fannie Mae, that second home and investment property lender restrictions have temporarily been lifted. Previously, lenders such as Ameris Bank were restricted to 7% of their portfolio consisting of second home and investment properties. You can imagine the negative impact this had on interest rates and guidelines. Earlier this year, when the new administration instituted the restrictions, it became more expensive and challenging for buyers to qualify for a second home or investment property. Although the lift is temporary, it offers respite for sellers and buyers.

Rumblings of rising rates: Recently, fears of Fed tapering along with Federal Reserve Board sentiment leaning towards increasing rates sooner than 2023 caused mortgage interest rates to rise. Subsequently, Freddie Mac reports the 30-year fixed rate mortgage surpassed 3% on October 14. This is the highest we have seen since April of this year.

Freddie Mac went on to report the causes of the increase, unlike in April, is due to inflationary pressure building due to the ongoing pandemic and tightening monetary policy, stating, "we expect rates to continue a modest upswing. Historically speaking, rates are still low, but many

potential homebuyers are staying on the sidelines due to high home price growth. Rising mortgage rates combined with growing home prices make affordability more challenging for potential buyers."*

As a reminder, your particular interest rate is based on your situation. Credit score, loan to value, loan type (purchase, refinance), residence (primary, second or investment home) and loan amount can have an impact on the interest rate.

Conforming mortgage limit increase:

Each November, the Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA), an entity of the federal government, issues conforming mortgage limit increases. The FHFA ensures that Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac and the Federal Home Loan Banks operate in a safe and sound manner so that they serve as a reliable source of liquidity and funding for housing finance and community investment.** Industry experts expect the FHFA to increase the conforming mortgage limit from \$548,250 to \$625,000.

Once implemented, this is a very encouraging development for the Ponte Vedra Beach market because home prices are relatively high compared to the rest of Northeast Florida. More homes in Ponte Vedra Beach will soon qualify for conforming mortgages compared to portfolio jumbo mortgages. Conforming mortgages offer competitive interest rates and lower down payments compared to jumbo mortgages. Local Realtor Katie Johnson of RE/MAX Specialists Ponte Vedra offers this assessment of conforming mortgage limit increases: "Affordability is a hot topic, and anything that helps our market become more affordable without reducing seller sales prices is a plus. It benefits buyers and sellers."

Ponte Vedra Beach housing forecast:

Two additional components continue to benefit the Ponte Vedra Beach housing market: local population growth and continued migration from the Midwest and Northeast. I mentioned the Northeast and Rustbelt mass migration in a previous Sand Castles article and can report it continues well into 2021. These two factors, along with local and state business-friendly political leadership, the absence



of a state income tax, beautiful weather, beaches, great schools and relatively affordable housing continue to offer beacons of hope to people throughout the nation. They also serve as a reminder of how blessed we are to call Ponte Vedra Beach home, and how excited we are to continue welcoming fellow citizens into our community.

What's Right with the Jaguars?

"What's right with the Jaguars?" Guessing you haven't asked or been asked that this fall. More likely it's the opposite: "What's wrong with the Jaguars?"

The list is longer than you'd like, but much shorter than it was last spring. Don't let the record fool you; they're not good enough to challenge yet, but they're better than they were.

Let's be honest, this edition of the Jaguars was going to struggle this season. A rookie head coach and a rookie quarterback have a lot to learn, and with a roster that won only a single game last season, that learning curve was going to be steep. Urban Meyer's credentials and Trevor Lawrence's track record fooled even these eyes, which have seen nearly 600 NFL games in almost 30 seasons. I forgot how hard it is for guys who have coached and played on Sundays for years to win – let alone two men new to the professional game.

That said, there is real progress being made and all you have to look at is the line of scrimmage. You don't win in professional football – you can't win in the NFL – if your offense can't control the line of scrimmage with the running game. And if your defense can't shut it down,

you're in a world of trouble.

The Jaguars didn't get off to a good start running the ball against the Texans and Broncos. They either fell too far behind or simply lost patience, which happens to the most veteran of coaches.

But James Robinson is so patient and has great vision, which you saw against the Cardinals and in Cincinnati – the kind of awareness of what's going on around him that allows him to find the soft spot in the defense and make a big play. When he gets going, he's a hammer that just keeps loosening the other team up. Carlos Hyde, then, is an excellent second punch of power to Robinson's patience. When the Jaguars were trying to get past the Cardinals, his 18-yard run into the teeth of the defense was a great blend of power to get through the line and then speed to set up a game-tying touchdown.

The Jaguars' 4.9 yard per carry average, which is the best measure of a team's ability to run the football, was fifth best in the NFL after Week Four. They're running the ball and that keeps a defense honest, which gives Lawrence time in the pocket when he drops back to throw.

That's a good sign – a very good sign of what's possible.

Dramatic improvement on the other side of the ball is a much bigger story for this team. From the mid-point of the 2019 season in Cincinnati when All Pro defensive tackle Marcell Dareus was injured, until the end of 2020, a span of 24 games, the Jaguars couldn't stop the run. They allowed their opponents run for an average of 157 yards per game, by far the worst in the NFL.

Worse than that was their yard-percarry average of 4.7 yards every time they touched it! You don't need to be a math major to figure out teams won't risk throwing when they don't have to. Seven teams ran for more than 200 yards in that stretch, while the Jaguars held only three to fewer than 100. It was a desperate situation for a defense that was literally powerless.

Enter new defensive coordinator Joe Cullen, who brought with him from Balti-





more a three-man defensive front featuring four linebackers, which is widely considered a good scheme to stop the run.

Through four games that 157 yards allowed had been winnowed down to only 106 and that yards per carry average stat that means so much to an offense... down to just 3.5, which puts this defense squarely in the top five among in football. They're getting teams off the field and giving it back to the offense. Already, that has resulted in closer games in the fourth quarter, which is helpful when you have a franchise quarterback waiting on the sidelines.

Lawrence is a generational talent who should, in time, lift the Jaguars like Patrick Mahomes has the Chiefs, Joe Burrow the Bengals and Justin Herbert the Chargers. But you won't see this team transform from pretender to contender until it can establish the run and keep the other team from running.

They're not winning games yet. But they're winning a few key battles that should set them up for a few wins before this season is through.





Fall in love with simple food

It's finally fall and time for apple cider donuts, cooler weather and of course the notorious PSL (pumpkin spice latte, in case you didn't know). For this season, I am going to share a few delicious – I mean seriously delicious – fall comfort recipes that have nothing to do with pumpkin. I figure there are enough pumpkin products and drinks out there to satisfy the pumpkin lovers, so I'm changing directions and featuring a fun recipe with a savory twist using apple cider and another that features a less recognized seasonal fruit that many never think of as a fall fruit, and that is grapes; yes, grapes!

Did you know that grapes are at their peak in early fall?

Better yet, have you ever cooked with grapes? It sounds crazy, but it's actually a delicious game changer! Trust me. Obviously, you can buy grapes any time of the year; and in case you're wondering where all those grapes go, wine is the most popular form of grape consumption, according to the USDA and my own unscientific observations of friends and family.


This first recipe is where heaven meets healthy – chicken with roasted grapes, garlic and rosemary; finished off with a simple sage butter.

Sounds fancy, and it is — but so easy! The smell of this chicken roasting with all of this deliciousness will have your whole house smelling like a restaurant. Don't be surprised if your neighbors come knocking because they can probably smell it, too! The other thing to love about this recipe is that it's super simple to make with minimal ingredients, and the presentation when it's done is as pleasing to the eye as it is to your palette.



CHICKEN WITH ROASTED GRAPES, GARLIC AND ROSEMARY WITH BROWN SAGE BUTTER

(Serves 4

- 1 4-lb whole chicken, cut into 8 pieces
- 4 tsp kosher or sea salt
- 1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1 medium bunch red seedless grapes (about 2 cups), divided into small clusters
- 1 large garlic head, separated and cloves peeled (15-20 cloves)
- 1 (½-oz.) bunch fresh rosemary
- 1 bunch fresh sage (about 5-7 leaves)
- ½ stick kerrygold butter
- ½ tsp fresh ground black pepper

DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Season chicken pieces with salt. Use more salt if 4 tsp is not enough to evenly coat chicken. Heat 2 Tbsp oil in a large ovenproof or cast-iron skillet over high. Add chicken pieces, skin side down and cook, undisturbed, until skin is browned and crisp, about 7-10 min. Remove from heat and transfer chicken to a plate.

Add grape clusters, garlic cloves and rosemary to skillet, stirring and scraping up any brown bits. Return chicken to skillet, skin sides up, nestling between grape clusters.

2. Roast in preheated oven, uncovered, until a meat thermometer inserted in chicken breast registers 155 degrees F, 22 to 25 minutes. Let chicken rest for 10 minutes. Just before serving, drizzle with sage butter.

Brown Sage Butter:

3. While the chicken is roasting, gently melt butter in a small saucepan on the stove. Tear sage leaves into about three pieces each. When butter is fully melted, turn up the heat until it starts to bubble and watch it closely until it begins to slightly brown. This is what you want. Be careful to turn off heat as soon as butter browns. Drop the sage leaves into the sizzling butter. They will frizzle up and create the most delicious sage butter to finish the chicken.



- 1 cup shredded Swiss or Fontina cheese (fontina is milder and nuttier)
- 1 Tbsp cornstarch
- Cubed French bread chunks, apple and pear slices, tri-color bell pepper strips

DIRECTIONS:

1. In large saucepan, bring cider to a boil. Reduce heat to medium-low. Toss the shredded cheeses with cornstarch and pepper, stir into cider. Cook and stir until cheese is melted, 2-3 minutes.

2. Transfer to a small fondue pot or 1 ½-qt slow cooker; keep warm. Serve with bread cubes, apple and pear slices, tri-color bell pepper strips.

eight Southern-inspired dining options. While we tooled around this beautiful setting on the preferred method of transportation – bicycling – nothing was more than a short walk away and the friendly staff was always on hand for a quick cart ride to your desired destination.

My Saturday afternoon was spent lounging by the pool, followed by a visit to the spa where facials, body treatments and massage therapies are all designed to heal and revive using the rejuvenating properties of the Lowcountry nature. That evening, we had a breathtaking sunset cruise where dolphins surfaced and swam next to our boat as we watched the sky light up with all the magnificent colors as the sun set across the seagrass waters. A historic day in St. Augustine

The Canonical Coronation of Our Lady of La Leche

In the early 1600s, Spanish settlers brought with them to the New World a special devotion to Our Lady of La Leche. Four hundred years later, the National Shrine of Our Lady of La Leche in St. Augustine has kept this devotion alive through countless people of faith. And Pope Francis recently recognized the importance and sanctity of this devotion by granting a Canonical Coronation for Our Lady of La Leche, which took place on Sunday, Oct. 10 at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine.

The historical site of the first parish Mass in the New World, Nombre de Dios (affectionately known as "the Sacred Acre") traces its origins to the founding of the city of St. Augustine, America's oldest continuously occupied city of European origin. This event is commemorated today by a 250-foot cross that stands on the original landing site in St. Augustine.

On Sept. 8, 1565, on the Feast Day of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Pedro Menendez came ashore and proclaimed the site for Spain and the church. The first Spanish settlers and soldiers brought a great love and devotion to Our Lady and in 1577, they established on the mission grounds the first sanctuary in her name. They built a chapel and dedicated it to Nuestra Senora de La Leche y Buen Parto – Our Lady of the Milk and Happy Delivery. They placed a statue of the nursing mother in the chapel. This devotion spread rapidly among the converted indigenous Indian tribes. The concept that God sent His Son to be born of a

Virgin and live among them was a powerful image in helping newly converted souls to understand God's love and the Incarnation.

So, for more than 400 years, the Shrine's mission has been the evangelization through the Blessed Virgin Mary. Pilgrims have come to the Sacred Acre year after year, as they seek her intercession to bless their marriages, to receive the gift of children, for safe and healthy deliveries, etc. Many return, bringing their "La Leche babies" back to offer thanksgiving to God and His Blessed Mother. And the site becomes increasingly popular each year, with thousands coming from all over the United States and even abroad.

As the first Marian Shrine in the nation, it is perhaps no surprise that Our Lady of La Leche is making history yet again.

However, this beautiful event on Oct. 10 did offer an opportunity for modernday Catholics and people of Faith to become part of the celebrations. Cardinal Carlos Osoro Sierra, a cardinal and archbishop of Madrid, traveled from Spain as the representative (Papal Legate) of Pope Francis to place the crown on

the infant Jesus and His Mother during the ceremony. The visible crowning of Our Lady helps Catholics and pilgrims to understand the vital and nurturing role she played in bringing Christ, the Redeemer, into the world. Bishop Estevez, the Bishop of the Diocese in St. Augustine, gave the cardinal a warm welcome. Bishop Estevez ascribes this great devotion with the care and gentleness of Mary's maternal appeal: "Since Mary is so tender, parents wanting a child are very attracted to Our Lady of La Leche..."

As the Thanksgiving holiday approaches, there is another interesting fact about the Sacred Acre. When Pedro Menendez arrived in 1565 with the 800 Spanish settlers, after they had their Mass of Thanksgiving, Menéndez laid out a meal to which he invited as guests the native Seloy tribe, who occupied the site. From

our knowledge of what the Spaniards had on board their five ships, we can surmise that it was cocido, a stew made from salted pork and garbanzo beans, laced with garlic seasoning and accompanied by hard sea biscuits and red wine. If the Seloy contributed to the meal from their own food stores, then the menu could have included turkey, venison, gopher tortoise, mullet, drum, sea catfish, maize (corn), beans and squash.

This was the first community act of religion and Thanksgiving in the first permanent European settlement in North America. The Thanksgiving at St. Augustine was celebrated more than half a century (56 years) before the Puritan Pilgrim Thanksgiving at Plymouth Plantation (Massachusetts), but ironically, this first Thanksgiving is largely unknown by Americans and it did not become the origin of a national annual tradition.

The reason is clear. During the 18th century, British forces won out over those of Spain and France for mastery over the continent. Thus, British observances, such as the annual reenactment of the Pilgrims' harvest festival in 1621, became a national practice.

ing holding up, lifting and throwing in the air their own body weight in the form of their four flyers. Always keeping their eyes on those four girls, they are also adjusting hand grips, feet placement and body stance. At the same time, the flyers are perfecting staying tight and balancing on one foot (or sometimes no feet) in the air while twisting, spinning and flipping, only to have the faith and trust of being caught over and over by their bases

The PV Cheer program competes in two different but equally intense competitions: States through FHSAA – Florida High School Athletic Association – and UCA Nationals in Orlando. A typical competitive cheer routine is 3 minutes long, packed with non-stop movement consisting of jumps, stunts, pyramids, tumbling, a cheer and dance. It's meticulously scored on every movement, stability and landing, as well as the athletes' performance of maintaining a high-energy and peppy personality. Whatever happens in those 3 minutes, that's it. There is no redo.

The athletes on average spend 10-plus hours a week in training sessions, tumble classes, workouts and sideline cheer just to get the opportunity to perform in that 3-minute routine in the spring with the hopes of moving on and being crowned the champion.

The PVHS cheer program has won 2nd & 3rd place in the state in their division for three years, received a bid





to UCA Nationals the first year the program became a competitive team and placed 17th in the nation at UCA.

Leading the way to their success is the cheer program head coach Melanie Hardin. Coach Mel is a former level 10 gymnast, all-star competitive cheerleader and East Carolina College cheerleader. She has more than 22 years' experience coaching tumbling, all-star teams and high school cheer.

"The decision to venture into the PVHS Cheer world had a lot to do with the commitment from the athletes and families, the drive of the athletes to push themselves, and support from the parents, the school, and the community," she said. "Over the past four years, together we have worked so hard to bring PV Cheer to what it is today. I have the absolute best cheer parents, who truly share the vision of the program and love seeing their athletes having a great time."

The award-winning PVHS cheer program consists of dedicated and hardworking student athletes who give it their all on and off the mat/sidelines. They give back to their community, thrive on being role models for their younger cheer sisters and carry on the high standards of

the program their peers left behind. Their friendships, hard work, and days competing will forever be a cheerful memory of that time when they were once a Shark athlete.

Visitors will see new exhibits, renovated garden

Lightner Museum invites St. Augustine residents and museum members to a community open house for a first look at two new exhibitions, "Picturing a Nation: American Art from the Lightner Museum" and "Tom Schifanella: Faces of the Alcazar." "Tom Schifanella: Faces of the Alcazar" presents a compelling insight into


the lives of working-class employees at Henry Flagler's Alcazar Hotel.

The Ambassadors are the volunteer arm of the Chamber. Its members often serve as the public face of the Chamber at community events such as ribbon-cuttings, Chamber events and networking groups.

Each year at least four local Chamber nonprofits are targeted for help by the Ambassadors. The most recent beneficiary is Fostering Connections. Simpson-Gotham conceived of the nonprofit when she was training in the education field.

Making a big splash

Girls swim team re-writes Ponte Vedra record books

Records have been re-written this season by the Ponte Vedra High girls swim team, and the playoffs have yet to begun.

Eight of the 11 school records that stood on the girls' side heading into the year have since been broken.

It is by far the most records head coach Junior Temotio has witnessed in his three years at the helm.

Junior Annie Wohlgemuth has set four new school records individually in the 100-yard backstroke and 100 butterfly, as well as part a team in the 200 medley relay and 200 free relay.

She wound up breaking her own record that she set earlier in the season in both those individual categories, including bettering her time by almost four seconds from 58.16 to 54.85 in the 100 backstroke.

According to Temotio, Wohlgemuth is a verbal commit to Florida State University.

Many of the records have been overtaken by underclassmen that have made a name for themselves immediately despite their young age.

The difference this year compared to previously is that Temotio has seen an increased dedication and discipline in the way the team is training.

That dedication includes starting practice every day at 6:30 a.m. at Planet Swim, located just down from Ponte Vedra High School on Davis Park Road.

"When you go to the meets and see your results, that's when you understand why you're getting up early all the time,"

sophomore Annabelle MacAdams said. "It makes it all worth it."

MacAdams is part of that talented group of youngsters and is the new record holder in the 100-yard breaststroke, 200 individual medley and 200 medley relay.

It is her first year swimming with the Sharks, but she has been swimming competitively for years prior to joining the team.

The breaststroke is one of her best events, but she can't really explain why other than it has always been a natural fit.

"It just feels different for me than other strokes," MacAdams said. "Since I've been swimming, I've just always really enjoyed it."

Others who are just beginning to discover their talent are freshmen Penny Zarczynski and

Mary Agnes Smith, who did not take long to leave their mark on the program as record holders in the 50-yard free and 200 free, respectively.

"They have really stood out," Temotio said. "On the girls' side we have two or three freshmen that we are going to be taking to state this year. I believe we're going to be among the top five in the relays at state."

According to MacAdams, qualifying for states was a goal she was aiming for at the start of the season.

"I don't really know how it's going to feel, but I know it's going to be a lot of fun," MacAdams said.

The only records that remain heading into the postseason for the girls' squad is Holly Cox's 100 free set last year, Haley Harris' 500 free from 2017 and the 400 free relay also set that year.

Of the two record-breaking relay teams, Wohlgemuth, MacAdams and Cox won the 200 medley relay and Wohlgemuth, Zarczynski, Cox and Liv Copland set a new mark in the 200 free.

Cox is a leader on the team and a captain alongside Hannah Outcalt. Cox is one of the few on the team that have success competing at state's which is experience Temotio will look to rely on.

If the offense once again taps into their potential, the sky is the limit for the Panthers come the postseason.


This week will be big for the Panthers in setting the tone and reestablishing their




