St. Augustine craft breweries team up for Nights of Pints

Locally brewed beer for a cause! The 5th annual Nights of Pints runs Friday, Nov. 19, through Jan. 31 at four St. Augustine breweries — Old Coast Ales, Bog Brewing Company, Dog Rose Brewing Company and Ancient City Brewing.

Coinciding with St. Augustine's Nights of Lights, the event was started in 2017 by the breweries as a way to give back to nonprofit organizations in the area.

"We love giving back to the community with this event," said Courtney Murr, co-owner with husband Doug Murr of Dog Rose Brewery Company. "Nights of Pints is a fun way for friends and families to enjoy time together over a couple of St. Augustine craft beers."

The 2021 shirts feature the iconic St. Augustine Lighthouse, designed by The Skinny Lizard T-Shirt Printers. Past shirts have featured the Bridge of Lions, the City Gate, historic ships and the Castillo de San Marcos — all symbols of the Nation's Oldest City. Shirts are \$30 and are available at any of the four

Democratic club plans holiday party





Big plans ahead

Joiner ponders Amelia, after winning Ponte Vedra Auto Show

Sam Joiner showed up to the 2021 Ponte Vedra Auto Show not knowing what to expect, and he left with his 1961 Mercedes-Benz 190SL being named the overall winner.

The Ponte Vedra Beach resident has owned the car for 40 years after buying it in 1981.

Much like the way this year's show turned out, he began his car search 40 years ago not quite sure how things would end up.

"I was actually looking for an early 1960s Corvette and didn't know this car at all, but I saw a picture of it in Autotrader Magazine, because we didn't have internet back then, and I was very intrigued," Joiner said.

He went to look at it, and it did not take long before he realized it was the car for him.

"As soon as I drove it on the lot, I knew I was going to buy that car," Joiner chuckled. "I forgot all about the Corvette."

One of the things that Joiner has continued to love about his car all these years later is the visual appeal that it offers.

"I think it's one of the more elegant cars ever built," Joiner said. "I don't really consider myself a 'car person,' but I like what I like, and I really like this car."

After driving it around for years, he recently had it go through a restoration process in May.

Although he may have expected to take home the top prize, he is also not surprised because he knows the passion it brings out of people when they see the car

"I got a lot of great reaction, and there were a lot of people that went gaga over it," Joiner said. "All the conversations I had with people were just very motivating."

Since the car was restored, Joiner has had several people tell him that he should consider taking the car to the Ameila Island Concours d'Elegance, which is considered one of the top automotive showcases in the world.

After winning this year's Ponte Vedra Auto Show, he is seriously considering doing just that. The next Concours d'Elegance is scheduled March 3 to 6, 2022.

"I've always thought that was so far above, but maybe next year, if the weather's good," Joiner said.

Joiner's Mercedes-Benz was chosen best in show among roughly 185 classic and modern vehicles that took part in the show.

"I didn't know what to expect, and I was pretty surprised at just how big it was," Joiner said. "It was so well done with the food trucks and how everything was run."

The show went smoother in year two of Justin Felker, with Art 'n Motion in St. Augustine, overseeing the event.

"We learned a lot from last year,"
Felker said. "The show field and food vendor situation were better organized.
The crowd was really good, and the weather was fantastic."



Judge Lauren P. Blocker of the 7th Judicial Circuit was one of nine judges appointed by Gov. Ron DeSantis to fill new vacancies created by the Florida Legislature. She recently joined the court in St. Johns County and took time to speak with The Recorder about her new role.



As told to Shaun Ryan

Tell me a little about your background, your education and the road to your current position as judge.

It's a little bit of a winding road. I went to the University of Florida for undergraduate, and I got a degree in environmental science, and I minored in Italian. Then, I went to Florida Coastal for law school. I was able to intern for a circuit court judge in Jacksonville and in the Florida Supreme Court with Justice Polston.

After law school, I worked for a couple of solo practitioners. They had a high volume of work. My goal was to find a judicial clerkship, which I was able to do with Judge (Marcia Morales) Howard in the Middle District. That was in October 2011.

Typically, clerkships are only two years, but I really enjoyed the complexity of the work and the variety of work. ... It's a great experience, so I stayed with Judge Howard for four years, and then was able to do a year with Judge (Patricia) Barksdale, who's a magistrate

Then, I went in-house, which was a great experience. I went in-house with Southeastern Grocers. They're the parent company of Winn-Dixie. I was able to do a variety of different things, compliance to contracts.

And then I was at FIS (Fidelity Information Services), which is a Fortune 500 company.

When this opening came up — this is the first new position we've had since, I believe, the 1970s — I decided to apply and was lucky enough to get the position. ...

I really just have a wide variety of legal experience, and I felt like that would actually translate well to the county court bench, because in county court you're doing different things every day. So, it just seemed like it would be a good fit.

What kinds of cases do you preside over?

I am doing both civil and criminal. There were two county court judges. Now there are three, so everything is being split three ways. On the criminal side, it's misdemeanors. And on the civil side it can be evictions, small claims, civil disputes ...

Which court are you associated with?

The circuit is the 7th Judicial Circuit. The way that it works is you have county courts and then circuit courts, and then above that are the appeals courts. The county and the circuit are the trial courts.

The 7th Circuit, you could have a judge that's sitting in St. Johns like Judge Maltz. He's a circuit civil judge. But he is basically representing the entire circuit, which is St. Johns, Volusia, Flagler and Putnam.

Each of the counties are broken down into different circuits. And then, every county has at least one county judge in addition to circuit judges. I'm a county court

What are some of the challenges to being a judge?

Having to reach decisions quickly, because of the volume. You just don't have as much time as you'd like,

I think that everybody here works very hard, and I'm excited to be a part of the team. Everybody has been very welcoming, and I just think we're blessed to have the



experienced judges that we do. I'm looking forward to learning from them and assisting them in bringing cases to resolution.

What do you find most rewarding about what you do?

I think it is when people are able to reach an agreement. They tend to be happier than if one side gets a ruling further down the line.

I think just being able to allow people to have their cases heard and get their day in court.

What do you like most about living here?

I actually live in Nocatee. I think we're technically Ponte Vedra. I think this area is fantastic. I think it's one of the best places to live. We have a great community. We have the beach. We have the historic St. Augustine, and places like the Alligator Farm. It's just a great place to raise a family.

How do you like to spend your free time?

When it's football season, going to college football games. We're big Gator fans. Otherwise, just kind of doing activities with our kids. Like I mentioned, the Alligator Farm, and they are playing sports now. So, that

BridgeHaven students beautify veterans' garden

The memorial garden at American Legion Post 233 in Palm Valley was a busy place Wednesday, Nov. 10, when the students from BridgeHaven Academy and Communication Clinic visited to beautify

The garden, originally dedicated on Aug. 9, 2012, had gotten somewhat unkempt and lost some of its initial beauty.

"It was supposed to be a space for

veterans to be able to come out here, have a little bit of quiet time and reflect," said post Commander Caroline Merillat. "As stuff gets a little overgrown, it doesn't feel very peaceful."

But the students have transformed the garden, first visiting in October to clean it up and then arriving the day before Veterans Day to perform some maintenance.

"We want this to be a place for veterans to come and have that moment to remember — remember those that have passed,

remember those that have fallen — and to be a place of peace, comfort and serenity," said Lynn Yeager, BridgeHaven Academy executive director.

The private, not-for-profit school is for students with autism. It arose out of a need to meet the academic needs of Yeager's son and officially opened its doors in January 2017. Today, it has eight students, who are taught in gradelevel classes. The school also works with families during its communication clinics to educate them on different methods of communicating with a child with autism.

The students, many of them nonverbal, enjoy meeting the veterans and learning about their lives and the programs the American Legion offers.

When they saw that the garden could benefit from their contribution, they selected it as a service project.

"Our students indicated that they wanted to be seen as individuals and not be defined by their autism," said Yeager. "They indicated that they wanted to be involved in service projects and giving back to the community."

The partnership between the American Legion post and BridgeHaven Academy has been mutually beneficial.

"As a lot of people know, the American Legion is about veterans, but what they don't know is that we're also about children, youth and community," said Merillat.

28th annual Nights of Lights begins with Light-Up! Night

The City of St. Augustine kicks-off the 28th annual Nights of Lights season on Saturday, Nov. 20, with a Showtime USA dance troupe performance followed by the All Star Orchestra.

The lighting of the city's holiday tree and canopy of live oak trees around the Plaza de la Constitución begins promptly at 6:30 p.m. The Nights of Lights continues through Jan. 30.

Turning the switch to light the city's tree will be Jennifer Wills, program coordinator for Care Connect+, the social health organization of Flagler Health+.

Dr. Javier Aduen, a critical care physician who leads the intensive care provider group at Flagler Hospital, will turn the big switch to light the city.

The City of St. Augustine is once again offering a free park-and-ride shuttle during Light-Up! Night and on peak Nights of Lights dates.

The shuttle service will continue Nov. 26 and 27 and then every Saturday in December — except Christmas Day — and the five days following Christmas. In consideration of the Christmas Parade on Dec. 4, shuttle operations will begin at 8 a.m.



Purchase art to place in your garden



Nocatee community honors local WWII veterans with presentation

Scott A. Grant's book, "The Merchant of Death is Dead: True Stories of the Progress of Humanity." On Nov. 10, Nocatee Crosswater Hall Director David Ray invited local historian Scott A. Grant to give a presentation for Veterans Day week. Almost 200 Nocatee residents attended to hear about an incident when German forces attacked a ship off the First Coast during World War II.

Grant detailed the German U-boat attack on the SS Gulfamerica, which killed 19 men four miles off the coast of Jacksonville Beach within view of thousands of beach and boardwalk visitors.

Grant then segued into the tale of Nazi spies who landed a few months later in Ponte Vedra Beach and their mishaps, which led them to the electric chair.

Ray and his Nocatee staff handed out three plaques to celebrate the lives of WWII veterans living in their community: Frederick Hoerl, U.S. Coast Guard second class petty officer 1942-1946; Jean Whitley, U.S. Navy PHOM2-C 1944-1946; Joseph D'Aoila, U.S. Navy.

"Nocatee hosts over 250 events and activities each year for our residents," said Ray. "However, this event was special as we were able to honor our WWII veterans living in the community while learning about the local impacts from an historic time. Scott Grant continues to deliver interesting and informative historical presenta-

tions that are always a resident favorite."

Don Prince, a veteran who fought in Korea, brought a footlocker full of original newspapers from World War II for guests to view.

"I thought it was very interesting," he said of the presentation. "I think he touched quite a few folks in there. A number of them had a few different versions of the stories that they got to match up to the facts Scott presented."

After the presentation, 12 guests reached under their seats to find out they had won door prizes. Grant gave away his latest book, "The Merchant of Death is Dead: True Stories of the Progress of Humanity," and signed the books for the winners.

Grant's book is available at amazon.com/Merchant-Death-Dead-Progress-Humanity/dp/1797730975/ref=sr. In the book, Grant shares some of his favorite col-

umns. Stories in the book include those of inventor Alfred Nobel, writer Zora Neale Hurston, football player Deacon Jones, surgeon John Snow, adventurer Annie Edson Taylor, visionary Benjamin Franklin, swimmer Gertrude Ederle, clothing designer Tommy Hilfiger, General James Doolittle, golfers Johnny Miller and Jack Nicklaus, athletes "Bullet" Bob Hayes and Mack Robinson and First Lady Frances Cleveland, plus events such as the discovery of the South Pole, Nazi spies landing on a North Florida beach and economic bubbles through the years.

Grant studied economics and history at Cornell University before working on Wall Street. He later earned a law degree from Rutgers University. Over the last 14 years, he has been a regular columnist for two newspapers and has perfected several history presentations.



Atrial Fibrillation: Don't dismiss this common heart condition

According to a study published in the Journal of the American Heart Association, people over age 40 have a 1-in-4 lifetime risk of developing atrial fibrillation

Often referred to as "AFib," this irregular heartbeat increases risk of stroke by five times and doubles the risk of heart-related deaths. Unfortunately, it's estimated that up to half of all patients don't realize they have this common heart condition. AFib is treatable and beatable, but awareness is key.

How AFib Affects the Heart

AFib is the most common sustained heart arrhythmia.

AFib may occur in brief and intermittent episodes, or it may be a persistent condition. It causes a rapid and chaotic heartbeat in which the atrial electrical signals can increase as high as 350 to 600 beats per minute.

In this case, the upper chambers of the heart, or atria, do not contract properly and blood pools in a cavity known as the left atrial appendage. The pooled blood can form a clot that travels to your brain's arteries, interrupting blood flow and leading to a stroke. Moving down to the lower chambers of the heart, or the ventricles, AFib can drive a fast and irregular ventricular contraction, which is reflected in an irregular and often rapid pulse. This irregularity in the pulse often results in symptoms of palpitations, fatigue, breathlessness and even reduced cardiac function (i.e., congestive heart failure).

Signs and Symptoms of AFib

AFib affects millions of Americans, but because many don't experience any symptoms, the condition often goes undiagnosed. These patients are only diagnosed through regular exams and screenings.

For those who do experience AFib symptoms, these can include irregular heartbeat or palpitations, lightheadedness or dizziness, shortness of breath, faintness or confusion, extreme fatigue and/or chest discomfort.

Many patients may dismiss these warning signs, especially if they seem to come and go or only last a short time. It's important to never take any risks with your heart. If you notice any of these symptoms, contact your physician immediately—and if you are in any sort of distress, such as severe respiratory difficulty or severe lightheadedness, call 911.

Causes and Risk Factors

AFib is most common in patients over age 65. Additional risk factors for developing atrial fibrillation include obesity, high blood pressure, sleep apnea, coronary artery disease, congestive heart failure, valvular heart disease, rheumatic heart disease, diabetes or metabolic syndrome, lung disease or kidney disease.

A family history of AFib can also be important, especially if it affects multiple family members at unusually young ages. However, AFib is so common that having a relative with AFib only slightly increases your chances.

Certain behaviors can also increase your risk for AFib. These include smoking and alcohol abuse. High stress levels and mental health conditions can also be a factor in atrial fibrillation.

Latest Treatment Options

Here in Northeast Florida, we're privileged to have access to cutting-edge treatments and technology, especially in the area of heart disease.

My team of cardiologists at Ascension St. Vincent's are highly experienced in catheter ablation for AFib. This is a nonsurgical procedure that blocks abnormal electrical impulses causing the irregular heartbeat. It has been proven to perform more effectively than medication for some patients.

However, every case of AFib is different, which is why a tailored treatment plan is essential.

As mentioned, it is important to reduce the risk of stroke for patients with AFib. While warfarin was the standard treatment, my team participated in all the major studies leading to approval of newer anticoagulants that do not have food interactions, do not require close monitoring and are now the standard of care.

Many patients can manage AFib with oral blood thinners to reduce the risk of stroke. Unfortunately, anticoagulants carry a small risk of unintended bleeding which can become problematic for certain individuals.

At Ascension St. Vincent's, we also perform procedures with the WATCH-MAN device that allow us to reduce the risk of stroke without putting patients at risk for increased bleeding.

Most recently, my team became the first in Florida and one of the first in the world to begin enrolling patients in the CHAMPION-AF Clinical Trial. We also did early trials of the second generation WATCHMAN, called the WATCHMAN FLX, and it is now in routine use at our center

Take some time to discuss AFib with your loved ones. By raising awareness for this common heart condition, more people can find treatment to reduce their stroke risk and improve their quality of life. If you or a loved one may have a heart rhythm disorder, speak to your primary care doctor or cardiologist today.

The average IRONMAN time is 12 hours and 49 minutes. Thirteen hours of being alone with your thoughts and pushing yourself to the limits of endurance. I have spent thousands of hours training for my first full 140.6-mile IRONMAN competition, and I've had ample time to reflect on what's most important in life.

As a busy ophthalmic surgeon in Jacksonville, I routinely treat Navy service members, veterans and their families. Regrettably, I am well aware of the somber statistics around veteran mental health. Roughly 20 veterans die by suicide every day. This figure has likely been exacerbated by the pandemic.

These statistics have generally stayed at an arm's length until recently when I lost a friend — a veteran and a member of our local eye care community — to suicide. I know his mental state was greatly affected by the stressors of the pandemic. And as I think about all the thousands of patients I've treated, I can't help but wonder: Might there have been more, had they received help?

These thoughts are often where I have

found my mind wandering while training. That is why I am partnering with K9s for Warriors in my first IRONMAN competition to raise awareness of veteran suicide.

Staying Fit for Change

Training for the IRONMAN started years ago as a personal bucket list goal of mine. Pushing myself to the limit of endurance was a critical outlet in achieving balance in a hectic life. But it's become much more than that. After witnessing my friend's struggle, I realize how important it is to raise awareness for our mental wellbeing. It is well known that physical activity has been found to improve mental health. We need to encourage each other to stay active, to check in with our loved ones regularly and to take time for ourselves.

K9s for Warriors and Veteran Mental Health

K9s for Warriors is an innovative program with a mission to end veteran suicide. Local to Northeast Florida, it provides highly trained service dogs to military veterans suffering from mental illness. Since it was established 10 years ago, the program has helped restore the

lives of veterans across the country. My late friend cared for his own dog and was a huge supporter of K9s for Warriors as well. There is no better cause to help honor his memory and support deserving veterans currently in need.

Tips for healthy dressing

You probably wouldn't connect getting ill with what you wear, but perhaps you should. When it comes to being healthy, you probably don't give your clothes or accessories a second thought. The reality is that what you wear or carry could play a crucial role in your health, even making you ill if you continually wear the wrong items, such as a heavy backpack or bag. Clothing fit is also an important consideration for health. Clothes or accessories that are too tight can constrict blood flow, reduce your range of motion and cause discomfort

From your head to your toes, what you put on your body on a daily basis needs to be considered for total wellness. Below

are some of our recommendations for back-saving wear.

A Back Saver Wallet

Most men carry a wallet in their back pockets and in many cases it can be over a half an inch thick. Sitting on a half-inch wedge for hours at a time over a period of years is one of the most overlooked causes of spinal misalignments and spinal pain, including back pain, neck pain and even headaches. Our recommendation is to clean out your wallet and carry only what is really necessary. Ideally, switch to as thin a wallet as you can find or find one you can carry in your front pocket rather than your back pocket to avoid compromising your spine while seated.

A Healthy Backpack

Another important wellness-essential product is an ergonomically designed backpack. It is amazing how we can put thousands of pages of data onto a microchip smaller than the eye can see, yet kids are carrying backpacks that are heavier than ever filled with text books. Many schools are taking away kids' lockers, making the problem even worse. Some kids carry backpacks with 40% of their body weight or more. You can see them walking to school leaning forward to offset the weight on their backs. Until schools figure out a way to make the loads lighter, we recommend that you get a backpack that is designed to help you stand up straighter. Look for one with shoulder straps and inflatable lumbar cushion, which when properly adjusted redistributes the weight from the shoulders and upper back into the hips, promoting a healthier upright-standing posture.

Buy Good Shoes

Most people spend close to two-thirds of their life in shoes, so wearing shoes that fit well is very important. Our feet endure tremendous pressures daily. For example, an average day of walking brings a force equal to several hundred tons on your feet. Feet are subject to more injury than any other part of the body, underscoring the need to protect them with proper shoes.

Here is a quick guide to selecting the right shoes for your feet:

- Always have your feet measured while standing
- Always try on both shoes, and walk around the store in them
- Don't buy shoes that need a "breakin" period; shoes should be comfortable immediately
- Don't rely on the size of your last pair of shoes, as your feet may grow
- Shop for shoes later in the day, as feet tend to swell during the day
- Select a shoe with a leather upper, stiff heel counter, good cushioning and flexibility at the ball of the foot
- Try on shoes while you're wearing the same type of socks or stockings you expect to wear with the shoes
- If you wear prescription orthotics, you should take them along to shoe fittings

Orthotics

Your feet are the base that your body stands on. If your feet are weak or have structural problems, this can lead to problems in your knees, hips and low back, and can even cause headaches.

Many people wear orthotics because they are good for their feet, but orthotics



are even more important for those who experience pain after extended walking or standing.

The best orthotics are ones that are custom made for your specific feet. The measurements are taken with digital scanners to ensure that your feet, and therefore your foundation, are more firmly supported.

Please note that the orthotics and insoles that you buy at your drug store are not the same as the high-quality orthotics that you can have custom made, even though they look similar. Insoles may effectively reduce pressure by increasing the padding under your feet, but orthotics are customized and provide a foot-bed that is molded specifically for each of your feet based on their unique shape and size. Customized orthotics are also a worthy investment. Consult your health care practitioner about whether or not you should consider custom orthotics.

"Flagler Health+ shares our commit-



Baptist Health first in region to use Synergy Megatron stent for high-risk heart procedure

Baptist Health cardiologist Salil Patel has performed the first procedure in Northeast Florida using Boston Scientific's Synergy Megatron stent during a recent coronary procedure to eliminate blockages in a patient's heart.

While stents are a common tool in this type of procedure, the Synergy Megatron stent is the first to be purpose-built for large, proximal vessels — those that are closest to the aorta. These arteries present challenges because they are often calcified, can vary in size in some places and

are more "stiff" than other arteries.

In the past, patients with blocked arteries might need bypass surgery, which is more invasive and requires more recovery time. Cardiologists are now able to use stents in some of these patients. This new advanced stent is ideal for procedures used to widen blocked or narrowed arteries. These procedures are less invasive and allow patients to leave the hospital sooner and heal faster.

The first patient in Northeast Florida to receive the Synergy Megatron stent

first came to Baptist Medical Center Beaches with shortness of breath and heart pain, where it was determined she'd had a small heart attack. Further diagnosis showed severe blockage in the main artery and the two major arteries branching from the main artery. This Y-shaped blockage is more challenging to treat. Her heart function was declining rapidly, and she reached a point where she was no longer a candidate for heart surgery.

Patel felt she could be treated with a complex stent procedure.

"She was declining fast," said Patel.
"We reviewed all the treatment options available and felt we could be successful [with this new stent]."

The procedure went well, and the patient has returned to her normal activities.



A lasting partnership

Underwood's teams with Pink Ribbon Jax, hosts annual trunk show

Pink Ribbon Jax has been raising money to help create cancer awareness and continue the grow the research associated with it for the past 15 years.

There are certain sponsors that have been with the nonprofit from the very beginning and one of those Underwood Jewelers.

"They've been with us since day one," Pink Ribbon Jax chairwoman Marica Pendjer said.

It is a partnership that both Underwood and Pink Ribbon Jax is proud of, and it has led to Underwood's hosting an annual three-day designer trunk show.

A kickoff to this year's event was held Nov. 11 at Underwood's Ponte Vedra and San Marco locations.

According to Pendjer, the organization chooses a focus for the money they raise based off of what is deemed would have the most impact at that time.

The pandemic and seeing what people had gone through over the past couple of years play a major role when deciding where to direct this year's fundraising.

"We looked around and realized that so many women had missed their mammograms," Pendjer said. "Whether it was due to losing their job or their insurance or just being hesitant to venture out during a pandemic and not making their appointments."

As a result, Pink Ribbon Jax has set a goal of raising enough money to pay for 1,500 mammograms for uninsured and underinsured women and men in the Northeast Florida area.

"Where you live should not determine whether you live," Pendjer said. "When you're going through something like that (breast cancer) you always want support."

However, she has found that so many people were not feeling that support because they felt isolated from so much of the world around them at the height of the pandemic.

Underwood's trunk show helped them get closer to their projected goal, as 10% of the proceeds during the showcase went toward helping the cause.

After the Underwood's trunk show, Pink Ribbon Jax is just \$100 shy of meeting their goal. It was estimated that it would take \$450,000 to fund 1,500 mammograms.

According to the American Cancer Society, many women with breast cancer have no symptoms, so a screening is considered the best way to find out if they have it.

"When breast cancer is caught early, there is a 98% survival rate," Pendjer said.

Pink Ribbon Jax is an all-volunteer operation, which allows their expenses to remain low so that roughly 98 cents of

Perseverance leads to Nease playoff victory

It has been a long journey, but the hard work and resilience the Nease football program has put in over the past couple of years is finally paying off, and in a big way.

The Panthers went on the road and defeated Port Orange Spruce Creek 24-21 in the first round of the Class 7A playoffs and appear to be hitting their stride at the most important time of the year.

It was the first playoff victory for the Panthers since 2008 and is a complete turnaround from the struggles they have endured in recent years.

With the win, the Panthers sit at a record of 8-3, which is two more victories than they had in the previous three seasons combined, which included a 1-9 campaign in Colin Drafts' first year as head coach in 2019.

However, that rough period seems far in the past as this year's squad has successfully breathed life back into the Nease football program and re-established a culture that reflects winning both on and off the field.

"It has been a crazy experience, because going 1-9 is not easy, but then to win our first playoff game in a lot of years," senior receiver Dom Henry said. "It feels good just proving everybody wrong, because we're not the same team from the past couple of years."

Henry had a huge game with 254 receiving and two touchdowns on nine catches while his partner in the passing game, Marcus Stokes surpassed 2,000 yards through the air on the season.
