Nov. 18 that will protect Floridians from losing their jobs due to COVID-19 vaccine mandates and protect parents' rights to make health care decisions for students. The bills were passed through a special session of the state legislature.

Where employers wish to require COV-ID-19 vaccinations, employees may make use of numerous exemptions and may opt instead for testing, the cost of which employers would have to cover. Employers in violation will be fined.

In addition, government entities may

not require COVID-19 vaccinations of anyone, including employees; educational institutions may not require students to be COVID-19 vaccinated; and school districts may not require face masks in school and may not quarantine healthy students.

Students and parents may sue violating school districts and recover costs and attorney's fees.

Also, state Attorney General Ashley Moody announced that Florida has filed a lawsuit challenging a mandate by the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services requiring health care workers at facilities accepting Medicare or Medicaid funds to be vaccinated.

Community Hospice invites area residents to remember their loved ones at the celebration.





# Can you please tell us a little bit about your background and how you got to where you are?

I knew I wanted to work in health care and after graduate school, I had the opportunity to work for a real estate investment trust that invested in senior housing properties.

As the due diligence manager, I was able to visit wonderful communities all over the country and see the great work they were doing.

That piqued my interest in operations, so I left to become licensed as a nursing home administrator. After running a nursing home in Gainesville, I was invited to run the health care at Vicar's Landing and fell in love with the community.

After my predecessor left in late 2012, I was asked to take over as CEO and have enjoyed the challenge and the opportunity to be a part of the growth of Vicar's Landing.

# What are the most rewarding parts of being CEO at Vicar's Landing?

There are so many rewarding parts of this career. I get to be a part of providing exceptional care and services to a community of fascinating people, I work alongside a dedicated and compassionate staff, and now we have the excitement of growing at Vicar's Landing at Oak Bridge to meet the huge demand for our product.

I love what we offer, too, as we provide peace of mind for the future and a vibrant quality of life for today!

# What are some of the projects and future plans you are working on?

Our most obvious project at the moment is the new construction at Vicar's Landing at Oak Bridge.

Once built out, we are planning on having 175 additional homes for independent living and 60 high-quality assisted-living homes, some of which will be purposebuilt to care for those residents with dementia.

We are proud to have been a Great Place to Work, to have the Governor's Gold Seal Award of Excellent in Long Term Care, and to be accredited by the Commission for the Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities and have a lot to offer as an employer, but there are not enough workers available to meet the demand for open positions.

Another challenge is that we fall under regulations from several federal and state agencies, so keeping up with changes due to the pandemic has been interesting.

What I love about being a bit further north is that we have seasons up here! I enjoy the friends I have made, and the amenities offered in greater Jacksonville.


It's been a great place to live and raise my kids.



# Fire station donated by Ponte Vedra couple saving lives in Israel

A fire station in Israel donated by a Ponte Vedra Beach couple proved its worth as fires raged in the country's north in November.

The station was the donation of Penny and Stephen Rosen, previously of Brooklyn Heights, New York. It is located in the northern Jewish-Arab city of Ma'alot

Twenty-six fire crews recently responded to a large-scale brushfire in the Hacienda Forest while more than 100 houses were evacuated.

The Rosens donated the state-of-theart fire station through Jewish National Fund-USA (JNF-USA) in memory of their late son, Adam, as part of their ongoing philanthropic support for the land and people of Israel. They were on hand in 2019 for the station's dedication.

"We are saddened to hear of another fire in the Hacienda Forest," said Penny Rosen, who is a JNF-USA Fire and Rescue Task Force co-chair. "However, we are also proud that the fire and rescue station that my husband, Stephen, and I built in our beloved son Adam's memory was in place to respond. These devastating

fires are a stark reminder as to why we need to keep building and helping equip as many areas in Israel as possible with modern firefighting equipment."

Alon Mazar, spokesperson for Israel's Fire and Rescue Authority, added that despite popular belief, summer is not necessarily the peak time for fires in his

"Spring and fall are in fact the most dangerous times of year for the rapid spread of fires," Mazar said. "For example, in 2010 we had the Carmel disaster, and again in 2016, the Carmel region had another major fire. Then, in 2019 we had large fires in Mevo Modiin. All three events that were not in the summer - May, November and December, In our case, they are the most dangerous seasons that are characterized by winds coming in from the east - strong winds that do not come from the sea. They are eastern winds from the interior of the country and are characterized as dry and strong. It is enough to turn a small fire into a major catastrophic event."





Israel's Fire and Rescue Authority along with volunteer firefighters are already getting ready for the summer months.

# Kathy's Gardening Guide

"The palm tree that sways in the breeze stays standing the longest"

As we see all around us in Florida, palm trees are a popular staple for our landscaping. The very tall, thin palms you see everywhere are sabal palms (also known as cabbage palms) and are native to Florida.

However, there are many other beautiful types of palms that can flourish in our zone. Here are a few of our favorites at Kathy's Nursery:

 Sylvester Palms (Phoenix Sylvestris) – These come in a variety of heights to fit most landscapes and create a beautiful ambience. They have a neat diamond-cut trunk but are large trees that need to be a distance from the home. • Oueen Palms - These


palms are stately with bright glossy leaves that are gorgeous in the wind. Their fronds cascade over, which creates a tropical vibe. Bright

orange dates hang in ornamental clusters. They are common around patios and pool areas of relaxation.

• **Bismarck Palms** – These silvery blue-green palms are a show stopper with their huge fronds and robust trunks. Their fronds can span up to 16 feet. They are fast growers and thrive in full sun. Certainly a focal point of

your landscaping.

• Robellini Palms (Pygmy Date Palms) – This miniature palm is slow growing and allows you to have a palm closer to your home. Popular at the end of driveways or front doors, robellinis are soft and feminine



- Sago Palms These wide-trunk palms are dark green and lush. They will not grow to be too high with their large cone of seeds growing out of the middle. The seeds are poisonous to pets, so we tend to keep them out of our fur-friendly homes.
- European Fan Palms These palms are very hardy and slow growing. They are not sensitive to cold weather and grow 8 to 15 feet tall. Their fronds are fine textured, which makes them stick out in landscaping, and the color can range from dark green to silver.
- Majestic Palms This palm loves humidity, which is perfect for our Floridian climate. The fronds' fullness can fan out to 15 feet in height. They are also slow



Mignerey's sister Logan already attends FAU as a sophomore and is studying biology and looking into the marine aspects of it. She also plays beach volleyball for the


Mignerey has been playing indoor volleyball as long as she can remember, but I probably got serious about playing on a team in second or third grade.


