

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

# Ponte Vedra Beach Mid-Year Market Update

ow's the real estate market? Real estate agents are asked this question daily. The answer, of course, depends on who you're talking to! For homeowners who have no plans to move, the market is great. But, as all first-time home buyers are aware, buying a new home can be challenging in today's market. Overall, the market is, well, weird! Home prices are up, the number of pending and closed sales are down ... it's a little hard to predict what's coming

According to the Florida Association of Realtors (FAR) and the National Association of Realtors (NAR), the national market is experiencing record high home prices; however, the number of sales is very low and interest rates are still too high.

Here are some important statistics at the national level:

- Home prices are expected to rise 5.7% this year (up from 3.9% in 2023).
- Interest rates were predicted to drop in 2024 to just above 5%. Instead, home loan rates increased and are now just under 7%. The higher interest rates have a large impact on buyers' monthly costs. This had led to many buyers waiting to purchase their next home until rates fall below 6%.
  - New construction homes made up

30% of residential sales (up from 16% before the pandemic).

- Many of today's homeowners are "locked-in" to their current low mortgage rate and the high equity they have in their house. Financially, it doesn't make sense for them to sell their current home and finance a new home at the much higher rates.
- According to NAR, 42% of homeowners in the U.S. own their homes and have no mortgage. Many of those people who typically would be moving to a smaller or larger home have decided to stay put, further reducing the inventory of re-sale homes.
- Investors accounted for a staggering amount of home buyers, up to almost 30% of residential purchases (compared to 20% in 2019). This further reduces the number of homes available to traditional home buvers.

So, how does the Ponte Vedra Beach real estate market compare to the national market? According to the Northeast Florida Association of Realtors (NEFAR), at the mid-year mark our market (Ponte Vedra Beach, not including Nocatee) was in a state of flux:

- The median home sale price was down 9.8% when compared to June of
- Closed sales were down almost 21% when compared to last year.
  - The median price per square foot was

up 2.4% to \$399/foot.

- Pending sales were down 50%. Pending sales are considered a leading indicator, so we can anticipate closed sales to be down again next month.
- New listings and the active inventory are up substantially. Right now, we have almost six months of inventory available - suggesting we've made the shift to a more balanced market after the last several years of strong sellers' markets.

Does all this mean now is a bad time to sell? Not necessarily! Home values are still higher, much higher, than they've ever been. So, unless you purchased your home within the last year, you will likely make a profit. Now can be a good time to buy, too. The inventory of available listings is much more robust than in the recent past — you'll have more to choose from. If the current interest rate makes you nervous, remember you can always refinance the loan in the future when rates (eventually) come down. Or, you can structure your offer in a way that the seller helps buy-down your interest rate.

# **Normandy to Paris**

In 1993 I was having dinner with my late father-in-law Charles W. "Woody" Schmoe, when he said that he wanted to attend the 50th anniversary of the Normandy Invasion.

When I asked why, he said that "he had been a First Lieutenant on General Eisenhower's staff and carried the invasion plans from Eisenhower's headquarters in London to General Bradley's headquarters in Southampton where the invasion was launched.

He added that at the time he was sure of what he had but was not certain until he delivered the package and was ordered to stay for the briefing, which scared him because of what he knew.

On hearing this, my first thought was that I had been married to this man's oldest daughter for a dozen years and he never even mentioned that he had been involved in something so historic.

Later, I was to learn this was typical of the Greatest Generation that considered what they had done as just their duty, about which there was little to say as the real heroes were the ones who had sacrificed their lives for our freedom.

Pressing him for more information, I learned that he had also been ordered to land on the mats at Omaha Beach the first day of the Invasion with a plane load of maps, but they could not land because of the intense enemy fire and severe weather.

Consequently, they turned back and

landed in Scotland from where Woody took a train back to Southampton, gathered up 60 troops, a doctor and two boats with which he headed back to Omaha Beach. Landing in the dark, they spent the night outside a German bunker with five dead Germans inside while the battle raged just hundreds of yards away.

Eventually the Allies pushed the Germans off the beaches and out of Paris upon which Woody got orders to head for Paris to establish the American headquarters.

Being a practical man, on arrival he asked where the German headquarters were and was told that it was at the Hotel Wagram, just across from the Arc de Triumph on the Champs Elysee. Going in there he said was an eerie experience because it looked like the Germans had just run out as their maps were still on the walls and their phone systems and everything else was working.

Once inside he said he went up to the roof where he took down the last German flag over Paris and put up the American flag. At this point, I asked him "where the German flag was?" To which he calmly responded, 'in a drawer in the living room at home.'

This made me realize that while not claiming to be any kind of hero, my fatherin-law had been caught up in a special part of history from carrying the invasion plans to taking down the last German flag over Paris.

Woody saw the rest of the War from

Paris where he lived in the house of a French General's niece whose husband was a professor at the Sorbonne.

During that period, he got the opportunity to escort Vice President Alvin Barkley and a delegation of Senators around to the concentration camps at Dachau, Buchenwald and Bilsen along with other sites around the European Theater on the first official visit to those locations. He also accompanied the Chief of Chaplains on official trips to the concentration camps and other spots while meeting many other famous people of that time who shaped our history.

Having heard my father-in-law's story, I agreed that we should make the trip for the Anniversary and ended up joining a group of 82nd Airborne veterans that met in Leister, England, where the division had trained before the invasion.

While there, the English people were wonderful to us with several official events honoring those men who were extraordinary people just like the characters portrayed in the HBO series, "Band of Brothers."

Our next visit was to Sainte-Mere-Eglise, in France where an entire battalion of 82nd Airborne troopers staged a drop over our location. The event was exciting and well attended by military personnel, members of Congress and other government officials who readily engaged in conversations with those interested in

# Did they check all the boxes?

aguars General Manager Trent Baalke and Head Coach Doug Pederson huddled in the Miller Electric Center hours after their

team was eliminated by the Titans in Nashville in January.

They didn't have the time or the inclination to lament a season that ended with five losses in six weeks, none more gut-wrenching than the last, which ultimately left them on the outside of the playoffs looking in. Injuries aside, and there were key injuries down the stretch that helped disable their playoff hopes, there were too many flaws for a team that expected to build off their playoff win in 2022. The two men needed to take an honest assessment of where they were and commit to an aggressive strategy that would consume the next six months. They needed to get on the same page and that page was filled with an offseason to-do list for a team with too much talent, too much potential to fall short again.

On the cusp of another NFL season, the Jaguars 30th in franchise history, the two men have worked through that long list and can look one another in the eye after a busy and productive offseason. By my recount of their stated intentions, their list sits complete as training camp looms.

Getting bigger and stronger so they could overcome their lack of physical play at the line of scrimmage was at the top of the list. The Jaguars checked in at the bottom of the NFL on third down conversions of fewer than three yards and their inability to stay on the



field cost the offense any chance to find a rhythm that would let quarterback Trevor Lawrence play loose and free. Enter former Buffalo center Mitch Morse and a new contract for guard Ezra Cleveland who played hurt after arriving via trade in October. The addition of Morse should give them the push they need but they're still relying on Cam Robinson to stay on the field at left tackle and aging left guard Brandon Scherff to avoid injury. If the Jaguars can run the ball, it will unlock an offense that was too predictable and too passive a season ago.

On the other side of the line the addition of former San Francisco 49ers defensive end Arik Armstead and the news that defensive tackle DaVon Hamilton is finally healthy didn't stop the Jags brain trust from adding defensive lineman Maason Smith and Jordan Jefferson from LSU in the NFL Draft. The defensive front now has size and depth inside to go with pass rushers Josh Allen and Travon Walker.

The hole that remained when wide receiver Calvin Ridley left in free agency was quickly filled with former UCF Golden Knight Gabe Davis and first round draft pick Brian Thomas Jr. from LSU to give the quarterback

bigger targets with better speed down the field. Davis, who famously scored four touchdowns in a playoff loss to Kansas City while with Buffalo, brings a proven playmaker, while Thomas is the kind of receiver the Jaguars have long longed for, tall with great length, fast with an extra gear and fresh off a 17-touchdown season in Baton Rouge.

New defensive coordinator Ryan Nielsen needed help in the secondary to cover the opponents' receivers and who could handle his scheme. which requires defensive backs who can play in press coverage at the line of scrimmage. Ronald Darby signed on in free agency after a stint in Baltimore and a history with Pederson in Philadelphia where he claimed a Super Bowl ring and former Green Bay Packers first round draft pick Darnell Savage came south to play safety in the new scheme.

And that's just on the field. Off the field they had to massage the salary cap for a greater level of financial flexibility so that they could ink Allen to a \$150 million dollar contract, which registered as the biggest deal in franchise history, and then topped that with a \$275 million dollar contract for Lawrence. Check and check ... literally. Longterm planning is impossible without having the best player on both sides of the ball secured for the foreseeable future.

Mix in a new defensive coaching staff with men whose resumes met Pederson's criteria of championship experience and culture and you have a very busy off-season for Trent and Doug and by all accounts they checked every box mentioned above plus a few more.

But was their list complete? Did they do enough to take a team that won the AFC South in 2022 and gave it away in 2023 and re-focus, re-energize and re-shape it for 2024? We're about to find out!

# Fun in the Sun: **Summer Skincare Essentials**

s temperatures rise and sunny days become the norm, it is crucial to adapt your skincare routine to keep your skin healthy and radiant. With the summer season in full swing, we emphasize the importance of sun protection, cleansing, and regeneration to combat the effects of UV rays, heat, and humidity.

My favorite summer treatments include HydraFacial and Skin Pen. I personally recommend getting the HydraFacial more often in the summer months for deep exfoliation and cleansing.

HydraFacial is a no-downtime individualized treatment by one of our skin health care specialists to cleanse pores and remove dead skin cells and oils from your skin. It can be especially useful for those with oily skin or those prone to acne or breakouts in the summer. It is quick enough to do over a lunch break.

Skin pen is a minimally invasive no-downtime microneedling treatment where small needles puncture the skin to stimulate collagen and elastin production. It is a rejuvenating and calmer treatment to have in the summer when it is best to limit invasive skin treatments.

Following up summer in the fall with a Moxi laser by our educated

My favorite summer products include Sunscreen! One of the most crucial aspects of summer skincare is protecting your skin from harmful UV rays. These UV rays cause skin cancer and accelerate aging.

I recommend using a broad-spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher, even on cloudy days. I apply my sunscreen before leaving the house every morning and before any outdoor activity including even just daily dog walks. Don't forget your lips with lip balm with SPF! The lower lip is one of the most common areas to have skin cancer.

Applying sunscreen generously and reapplying every two hours, or immediately after swimming or sweating, is essential for effective protection. Lightweight, non-comedogenic formulas are ideal for summer, ensuring your skin stays protected without clogging pores.

I know this is hard for some of my sun worshippers to accept, as I am one myself, but it is worth it in the long run to prevent cancers and aging. You are still worshipping the sun, just now safely, with the protection of SPF.

There are options of chemical and mineral sunscreens. Chemical sunscreens absorb into your skin and then absorb UV rays and convert them to heat. Mineral sunscreens do not absorb but sit on top of the skin and reflect UV light. There are also hybrid sunscreens that have both.

Mineral sunscreens may be safer for those with sensitive skin or patients with melasma as the heat from chemical sunscreens can exacerbate pigmentation. My favorite sunscreens include the Alastin Hydratint Pro Mineral Sunscreen with SPF 36 in replacement of daily make up, and SkinMedica, EltaMD, or ZO sunscreen just to name a few.

I enjoy these products because they feel light on the skin, are not very opaque, and do not aggravate my sensitive skin. Additional protection with wide brimmed hats, sunglasses, and beach umbrellas are also recommended.

Other great summer products include Skinceuticals Vitamin C, which there are multiple formulations for different skin types and is best applied in the morning.

# **Protecting public health:**

## The vital mission of the Anastasia Mosquito Control District

osquito stands as a cornerstone of public health efforts in Florida, where the warm, humid climate fosters ideal conditions for disease-carrying mosquitoes. Within

St. Johns County, the Anastasia Mosquito Control District (AMCD) plays a pivotal role in combatting mosquito-borne diseases and managing mosquito populations to safeguard residents. This article delves into Florida's mosquito-control history, the diversity of mosquito species and disease

vectors statewide, the AMCD's initiatives against mosquito-borne illnesses and practical steps citizens can take to reduce mosquito numbers in their vicinity.


The roots of mosquito control in Florida trace back to the early 20th century, when efforts began to tackle diseases such as malaria and yellow fever. Establishment of mosquito control districts and the deployment of larvicides and insecticides were instrumental in reducing disease prevalence and protecting public health. Technological advances over time have further refined mosquito control strategies across Florida.

Florida hosts a diverse array of approximately 90 mosquito species, each varying in habitat, behavior and disease transmission potential, posing a multifaceted challenge for control efforts. While not all mosquitoes transmit disease, several species are known vectors of pathogens that can harm humans.

Recent years have witnessed a notable rise in disease-transmitting mosquito species in Florida, including Aedes aegypti and Aedes albopictus, responsible for diseases like Zika virus, dengue fever and chikungunya. This increase underscores the critical need for robust mosquito control measures to prevent disease outbreaks and protect public health.

The AMCD leads the charge in St. Johns County against mosquito-borne diseases. Through vigilant surveillance, larval control, adulticiding and public education campaigns, the district minimizes mosquito populations and mitigates disease risks. Employing science-based approaches and innovative technologies, the AMCD effec-







meeting them.

Among those people was Gen. Gordon Sullivan, the chief of staff of the U.S. Army. I approached him and told him about how Woody had obtained the last German flag over Paris that he said he would like to give to the Army on behalf of those who had sacrificed their lives for our freedom.

This interested Gen. Sullivan and ultimately, at his direction and that of General Brown, the Chief of Military History, a delegation of people from Fort Stewart in Georgia visited Woody's home, Blackwater Plantation, to receive the flag.

I must say, that when the flag was opened to be presented to the director of the Fort Stewart Museum, I was shocked to see a Nazi symbol the size of a bed sheet with a huge black Swastika in the center. Only then did I fully appreciate what that symbol must have done to the hearts and minds of our French allies who passed below it daily for five long years, but then through the sacrifices of our men



and by Woody's hands no more.

By way of background, in April of 1942 when he was 29 years old, Woody was drafted. Having been a 1935 graduate of Butler University, he was considered good officer material and found himself in Officer Candidate School.

Later in November 1943, he was shipped to London to join Eisenhower's headquarters in the Adjutant General Section where he was in charge of British Publications and updating air traffic maps. Then, after serving in Paris, he ran the personnel office in Marseille before taking a B-17 to Randolph Field in Texas and mustering out at Wright Field, in Dayton, Ohio, where he returned to Shelbyville,

Indiana and the life of a teacher.

Woody married a Georgia girl, the former Nancy Young of Berrien County, Georgia, whom he met at a USO Dance while he was in Officers Candidate School in Gainesville. They were married on Christmas Day in 1945 and lived in Indiana until 1949, when they moved to Georgia to continue teaching and eventually to go into farming and cattle.

This always reminds me of Cincinnatus, the Roman citizen soldier, who like Woody and others of our Greatest Generation, returned home from war to tend their land.

# Digital Health & Artificial Intelligence: The new frontier for health care

Digital health encompasses a wide range of technologies and practices aimed at improving health and well-being. These digital programs leverage technology to enhance health care delivery. They include apps, wearables and online platforms.

Digital health aims to make medicine more personalized and precise. Smart devices (like step trackers, blood pressure monitors and glucose meters) are useful measures for digital health. They provide real-time data, empowering users to take control of their health. Digital health bridges geographical gaps, making health care accessible to remote areas. Streamlined processes, reduced paperwork and faster communication benefit both patients and providers.

A more prominent component of digital health is artificial intelligence (AI).

AI describes computer models and programs that imitate human-level intelligence to perform cognitive functions, like complex problem solving and experience gathering.

Artificial Intelligence in health care is not a new



concept. In the 1970s, AI applications were first used to help with biomedical problems when research produced MYCIN, an AI program that helped identify blood infections. From there, AI-powered applications have expanded and adapted to transform the health care industry by reducing spending, improving patient outcomes and increasing efficiencies overall.

Within the last few years, AI has made significant strides in the diagnosis, treatment and management of patients. For instance, AI can identify patterns in mammograms to aid in breast cancer diagnoses. AI can suggest treatment recommendations based on individual patient data by considering factors

like genetics, medical history and lifestyle to optimize care.

AI accelerates drug discovery by analyzing vast datasets and predicting potential drug candidates. AI-powered surgical robots can assist surgeons during procedures and enhance surgical precision, reduce errors and provide real-time feedback.

AI automates administrative tasks and improves efficiency in appointment scheduling, billing and patient records management. AI enables remote consultations, monitoring chronic conditions and providing personalized health advice using telehealth.

At UNF this fall, we are conducting our annual health care symposium with the theme "Personalized Medicine Using Digital Health and AI." More than 30 experts in digital health and AI will be discussing potential applications of these new technologies in our community in various areas of health care delivery.

The symposium will be held Oct. 9-10, 2024, at the UNF Adam Herbert University Center on campus. You can find more details about the program at: www.healthcaresympsoium.unf.edu.

Digital health and AI in health care will continue to improve outcomes, lowers costs and enhance patient experiences. Using AI appropriately will allow allocation of work uniquely suited to automation and making time for humans to provide exceptional personalized care.

tively manages mosquito populations while safeguarding public health.

While malaria isn't endemic to the United States, cases can occur among travelers returning from affected regions. In 2024, the AMCD actively monitored and managed detected malaria cases in the area, underscoring the importance of timely surveillance and response measures to curb disease spread.

Residents can actively contribute to mosquito control efforts by eliminating standing water, using mosquito repellent, wearing protective clothing and installing window and door screens to reduce mosquito breeding sites and bites. These efforts, coupled with AMCD's strategies, bolster effective mosquito management countywide.

Environmental stewardship is paramount to the AMCD, which strives to minimize the ecological footprint of mosquito control operations. By employing environmentally responsible methods and safeguarding beneficial insect species like bees, the

district ensures that public health protection aligns with conservation efforts, promoting ecosystem health and sustainability.

A cornerstone of the Anastasia Mosquito Control District is its provision of free mosquito control services to county residents, made possible through independent taxing authority funding based on property values. 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

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


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# Ponte Vedra Beach Residents and the Sisters of Mary World Villages for Children




