Aqua Grill looks to 'wow' patrons with memorable moments at new restaurant

As Aqua Grill Owner Cary Hart prepares to welcome longtime patrons who come to his restaurant each year when they visit Ponte Vedra for THE PLAYERS Championship, he's looking forward to seeing their reaction to its new location.

If the response from local patrons is any indication, he said, it will be a positive one.

"The most common reaction we get is, 'Wow!'" Hart said. "It's so magnificently beautiful and has been so well received, I think people will really be blown away."

A Ponte Vedra Beach mainstay for 28 vears Aqua Grill relocated last fall to a new building constructed next door to its former Sawgrass Village home. The

multimillion-dollar project has created a sleek, cosmopolitan dining destination that offers total seating for 200, including the indoor dining room, bar area and the popular outdoor deck. Among the many patrons Hart expects to see Aqua Grill's new home for the first time this week are groups associated with THE PLAYERS Championship.

"This is my 29th TPC week - we've made so many different relationships over the years," he said. "NBC Sports, the Golf Channel, title sponsors - they all come here."

On the menu

The new Aqua Grill features expanded kitchen space, including a new back kitchen the previous location

"The new kitchen is more flexible for our chefs," Hart said. "It's going to allow them to be more creative and allow us to do more specialty dinners that we couldn't do before."

The added flexibility has also enabled Hart and his staff of 50 to offer some new, more upscale menu items.

"We always change it to try to keep up with the trends," he said. "We want to stay on top of what is happening now - the culinary world is very creative - and bring it to Jacksonville."

Unlike some restaurants, he added, Aqua Grill has a very eclectic menu that offers something for everyone.

"I was in California recently, and out there (restaurants) have five entrees,



Senior center marks Holocaust Remembrance Day

Local residents had an opportunity to hear from two community members whose lives were forever impacted by the Holocaust last week, when THE PLAYERS Community Senior Center hosted a special luncheon to mark Holocaust Remembrance Day.

Sponsored by the Council on Aging and Community Hospice of Northeast Florida, the May 4 luncheon featured guest speakers Beth El Rabbi Michael Matuson and Holocaust survivor Morris Bendit.

Rabbi Matuson spoke first about his struggle to understand the Holocaust and disclosed how it has shaped his entire life – from the time he was a child and spotted tattooed numbers on a neighbor's arm and wondered what the numbers meant to the present day.

"The Holocaust is very much in my mind then as it is now," said Matuson, adding that he still prays to try and understand. "It's influenced my life in virtually every way.

"I don't have any answers," he continued. "I know how important it is to never forget. I know how important it is to never allow it to happen again, that I understand."

Then it was Bendit's turn to speak and share his story. Born in 1941 in Chernovitz, a city in western Ukraine, Bendit was just two months old when the Russian army enlisted his father to fight the Nazis. He never got the chance: While in transport, his father was killed when German bombers attacked his train. Shortly thereafter, in October 1941, Bendit's family and thousands of other Jews were forced out of their homes and herded into a ghetto, taking with them only what they could carry. They were marched to Transnis-

tria, a territory in southwestern Ukraine that today is often referred to as "the giant forgotten cemetery."

During the day, they were forced to march from village to village, town to town, Bendit said, and when his mother was too exhausted to carry him, his grandmother took over. In the bitter cold, they would look for shelter in any form they could find in an attempt to protect themselves from the elements.

"Many died naked and barefoot in the cold – if you asked me how I survived, pure miracle," he said, listing just a few of the diseases he suffered from including typhus, malaria and scarlet fever. His mother, grandmother and aunt also survived, but they were the only survivors of his family by the time the concentration camp was liberated in 1944. Bendit was 4 years old.

After liberation, he immigrated to Romania and then Israel, where as an adult he served as a staff sergeant in the Israeli Navy. Shortly after finishing his military service, Bendit went to Montreal, Canada and stayed for three years. He immigrated to the United States in 1965 and has resided in Jacksonville for the past 31 years. He has three daughters and six grandchildren.

Bendit confided that no matter how many times he tells his story, it never gets any easier. He relives his painful past each time he tells his story. Hearing stories from actual survivors is a becoming a rarity, as an ever-growing number of people can only learn about the Holocaust in history books or from the remaining survivors.

"Twenty years ago – that's when my mother passed away – I realized that the WWII generation is disappearing fast," Bendit said. "Very soon there will not be any witness to the atrocity that

took place in Europe from 1939 to 1945. There will only be stories that will pass down to future generations."

So why share his story? It is a question he said he is often asked.

"I believe it should be told," he said. "The reason is, history always repeats itself – no matter if it's 70 years, 100 years or 1,000 years. Never again is not just a slogan. Never again means not to let your guards down, making sure that no other manmade human disaster ever happens again.

"We cannot fix the past, but we can improve the future," he said. "Living in the past is not healthy; remembering the past is essential."

five appetizers, four sides and that's it," Hart said. "At Aqua Grill, I could order a hamburger and you could get lobster. I could get fish and you could get chicken. And we print our menu in-house so we can change it as often as we need to."

There are some menu items, however, that patrons won't let him change. Among them: the Vidalia onion flounder, the whole fish Cantonese style and the ruby red shrimp.

"If we try to take them off the menu, people ask us to bring them back," he said, noting that Aqua Grill only uses the freshest local seafood, along with beef and poultry products that are free of hormones.

Making memories

While Ponte Vedra has seen many restaurants come and go over the decades, Hart takes pride in Aqua Grill's longevity.

"We've been part of the fabric of Ponte Vedra for 28 years now," he said, noting that many staff members have worked at Aqua Grill for decades. "We consider ourselves to be an icon in the community: Families have grown up here. People tell me, 'My son is 40, he's very successful – and he started working here for you as a busboy!"

That familial connection is important to Aqua Grill, because ultimately, Hart said, it's not about the food.

"You could go buy a sandwich at

Publix or eat anywhere," he said. "In this business, you want to create 'wow moments – the moments in people's lives they'll never forget."

Multiple generations of families have been coming to Aqua Grill to celebrate rehearsal dinners, school graduations, retirement parties and other special occasions. It's a responsibility the staff takes seriously.

"We are the stewards of special moments in people's lives," Hart said. "We want to be a place that people can feel proud to bring their family to celebrate those special moments. This business is all about relationships.

"For 28 years, we've been the community's restaurant," he continued, "and we want people to know we plan to be here for the next 28 years, for their grandchildren."



Ponte Vedra students named winners in Notre Dame art contest

Two students from Ponte Vedra have been named winners in the University of Notre Dame's first "Living Worlds Space Art Contest," which aims to foster creativity while building on a foundation of astrobiology.

Victoria Joseph, a third grade student at Palmer Catholic Academy, won first place in the Grade 2-3 category for her artwork titled "Blobstin." Lillian Massey, a Palmer kindergarten student, won second place for her drawing titled "The Butterfly Flower."

Open to students from kindergarten through fifth grade, the contest asked students to imagine and depict the unusual forms of life that might inhabit other planets. The entrants from around the country also included written descriptions of their creature, specifically describing how it had adapted to conditions on its planet.

Organizers said the goal of the contest was to allow students to explore evolution, adaptation and the discovery of planets around other stars. To guide their students, teachers had access to learning materials on animals, space, planets and stars, including a Living Worlds sample lesson from the iLocater program at Notre Dame. An ultra-precise spectrometer being developed at Notre Dame, the iLocater, will use infrared wavelengths to find new planets. It is expected to be operational in 2018.

Frst place contest winners received a \$250 teacher cash card, a \$75 student space swag bag and a classroom Skype session with Notre Dame iLocater scientists. Second place winners received a \$150 teacher cash card and a \$75 student space swag bag, while third place winners received a \$100 teacher cash card and a \$75 student space swag bag.



Freedom Boat Club, Big Brothers Big Sisters join forces for youth-mentoring group

Freedom Boat Club is partnering with Big Brothers Big Sisters of America to raise awareness and funds for the 111-year-old organization that pairs at-risk youths with mentors. It's the first time in the franchisor's 26-year history that the club's corporate ownership and franchise owners/operators are working together in a cause-marketing program and platform.

The campaign theme "Boating Big! All Aboard for the Littles," features a fundraising initiative for BBBS and a special event in cooperation with local BBBS affiliates. A nationwide "All on Deck" boating party will take place this month featuring feature boat rides for BBBS mentors, also known as "bigs," and their mentees, or "littles," that will include lunch and entertainment.

Locally, the Freedom Boat Club Jacksonville and St. Augustine will hold its "All on Deck" party on May 21. The group will launch boats from Julington Creek and be motored to Green Cove Springs, where they will dock at the springs and picnic, have a chance to explore the area and play on the playground. Participants will then re-board the boat for a short trip up Black Creek and return to the dock at Julington Creek.

Lisa Almeida, co-owner of Freedom Boat Club Jacksonville and St. Augustine, said that Freedom Boat Club chose BBBS as its corporate charity entity with the idea of wanting to get kids on a boat who might never have the chance. The local franchise previously has done charity boat rides on its own with organizations such as Community Hospice of Northeast Florida, the Daniel Kids Foundation and Father's Harbor Academy.

"We love giving people the opportunity, especially kids, to get out on the water when they may not have had the chance before," Almeida said.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northeast Florida CEO Warren Grymes echoed that sentiment.

"A lot of our kids have never been

out on the water and this gives them that opportunity to do something a little bit different, and that's kind of the way that it is for a lot of our children," he said. "We have kids living 12 miles from Jacksonville Beach and have never been there - never seen the ocean, so similarly, here we have this beautiful river running right through our city that many of these kids will have seen coming from the north side of town, and they've really never had the opportunity to go on a boat and experience what life is like on the water. It's something that many of us who are in a little bit better position just simply take for granted."

Grymes said he is thankful for the

boat club's willingness to be involved with the campaign, acknowledging that they have a number of volunteers who are helping to facilitate the event that are taking time out of their weekend.

"It's one more great testament to me of a giving community that we live in," he said. "These folks are willing to take time out of their weekend to do something for kids who have never experienced what these folks experience on a regular basis, so I think it's just tremendous."

Anyone who has ever volunteered at THE PLAYERS Championship has probably tasted the culinary talents of Darlene Riggs. For 30 years, Riggs has been the driving force behind what has become known as "Darlene's Diner" – the food tent that provides breakfast, lunch and afternoon snacks to the thousands of volunteers who make the tournament possible. — By Jennifer Logue

This is your 30th anniversary serving up food as a volunteer for THE PLAYERS. How did you come to be involved with the tournament as a volunteer?

Yes, this is my 30th year. I worked for SunTrust Bank and my boss, Robert Alexander, a tournament vice chairman in 1987, asked me to come out to help with the on-course concession deposits. After two years, I was asked to be an assistant on the food and beverage committee. Two years later, I was asked to be the chairman and I have had the privilege of serving in that capacity ever since.

Feeding thousands of volunteers is a pretty big

How many volunteers assist you in "Darlene's Diner" and what types of duties do they perform?

This year I have a staff of 86. We prepare a full breakfast and a broad menu lunch for our volunteers. They do everything from grilling our meats, to preparing our salads and sandwiches. Everything is prepared fresh every day, so they are quite a busy group.

Describe a typical day running Darlene's Diner.

I get to the diner every morning at 5 a.m. and I start by getting the water on for our grits. We serve a full breakfast made to order: hash browns, grits, bacon, sausage, eggs cooked to order, toast, pancakes, French toast, breakfast sandwiches and breakfast bowls. We start serving at 6 a.m. and people are already lined up when we open the door. At 10:30 a.m. we change over to lunch: We serve hamburgers, cheeseburgers, grilled chicken sandwiches, sausage dogs, hot dogs, chicken fingers, French fries, grilled cheese sandwiches, BLTs, our famous tuna and egg salad sandwiches. We also serve our popular bean and barley side salad, cole slaw, Marconi salad and snacks. All of our food is prepared fresh on site daily. We serve lunch until 4 p.m. Our meats and bread are delivered each afternoon. We marinate our chicken, store our breads and any other delivered product, clean up and get ready for the next day. We usually get out of the diner around 5:30 p.m.

How much food will you go through during the

During the course of the seven days, we will cook 832 dozen eggs for breakfast. Each day, we average between 70 to 120 dozen eggs cooked to order, 200 large sausages, 35 to 40 pounds of bacon and several hundred "Darlene's Specials" - a sandwich with two pieces of toast, two fried eggs, two slices of cheese, two slices of bacon and if requested we add a sliced sausage - "the ultimate." They love these sandwiches. For lunch, we will cook over the seven days 880 pounds of chicken breasts, 3,700 hamburgers, 12 five-gallon buckets of boiled eggs for our salads and several hundred grilled cheese sandwiches. Our volunteers love to eat, and my staff and I take a great deal of pride in making sure that we prepare our food quickly, so volunteers can get back out to their assignments and they go away saying, "That was really good!"

Annual 'A Night at Roy's' fundraiser raises awareness, funds for children's advocacy group

More than 400 attendees gathered for a Hawaiian-themed fundraiser to benefit the Monique Burr Foundation for Children at the annual "A Night at Roy's."

Held April 19 at Roy's Restaurant in Jacksonville Beach, this year's event was the biggest yet, event organizers said.

Tents and tables were set up outside of Roy's Restaurant, owned by James Beard Award-winning chef Roy Yamaguchi, who attended the event. Guests were presented with leis at the sign-in table. Inside the restaurant, attendees perused and bid on the silent auction items.

The night included live musical entertainment from Nashville artist Colleen Orender, Mack & Jack Hazel, Peyton Woods & Wesley Monzon, and Jack Rosa. Guests dined on Hawaiian influence gourmet cuisine and sipped on tropical cocktails. The live auction was conducted by MG Orender, who was assisted by event emcee Curtis Dvorak and Jacksonville Jaguar quarterback Blake Bortles, who helped to auction off one of his signed game jerseys.

Opening remarks were made by MBF Founder Ed Burr and retired teacher Karen Wolfson, who praised the foundation's Child Safety Matters Program, a prevention education program that provides information and strategies to prevent bullying, cyberbullying, digital abuse and other types of child abuse and exploitation.

"This program truly works and the children understand the safety rules and use them," Wolfson said. "I've seen it work in the classroom and as a volunteer at the Wolfson Children's Hospital, I have seen the tragic effect of child abuse."

The MBF Child Safety Matters curriculum is approved in 58 counties in Florida and its safety lessons have reached more than 1 million children. The foundation has trained more than 1,300 facilitators to implement the program, which is made possible through donations and fundraising events such as "A Night at Roy's." The foundation hopes to expand the program into other elementary schools nationwide following its recent launch in Dayton, Ohio.

REVIEW: Cast keeps spirits high in Alhambra's 'Blithe Spirit'

When Noël Coward's ghostly comedy "Blithe Spirit" first premiered in London's West End in 1941 during the dark days of the Blitz, some wondered whether a farce featuring loved ones back from the dead would play well with war-weary audiences dealing with death on a daily basis.

They needn't have worried.

Coward's "Blithe Spirit" went on to break West End records before moving to the Broadway stage and the silver screen in a 1945 film version starring Rex Harrison. And the Alhambra Theatre & Dining's new production does Coward's comedy justice, striking a deft balance between humorous hijinks and shrewd social commentary on the complexities of modern marriage.

The play begins as a seemingly straightforward British drawing room comedy, as novelist Charles Condomine and his second wife, Ruth, await the arrival of dinner guests, one of whom – the flamboyant psychic medium Madame Arcati – Charles hopes to

mine for material for his next novel. The guests good-naturedly take part in a séance and have a jolly time humor-

ing the medium – that is, until Charles discovers that the melodramatic mystic has somehow managed to summon the spirit of his late first wife, Elvira.

From there, Coward exploits all the comedic possibilities of Charles' predicament. As the only person who can see and hear Elvira at first, the suave and sophisticated Charles swiftly begins to unravel, becoming ever more frantic in his attempts to keep straitlaced Ruth from both learning about Elvira's presence and questioning his sanity. Eventually, Madame Arcati is summoned to send Elvira back where she came from – with about as much success and finesse as her previous séance.

It would be easy to dismiss "Blithe Spirit" as nothing more than a light theatrical confection were it not for the clever way Coward uses the play's supernatural love triangle to explore marriage and the human condition. And



the Alhambra's cast is more than equal to the task: As Charles, David Arrow is adept at conveying the confusion of a man torn between love for his current, more mature wife and lingering feelings for the irrepressible, coquettish Elvira. He is ably assisted in that effort by Laura Hodos as Ruth – the duo's timing is excellent and at times their marital sparring seems eerily authentic – and Jessica Booth, whose mischievous Elvira relishes the chance to throw a mystical monkey wrench into her husband's new marriage.

As Charles engages in heart to heart chats with first one spouse and then the other, it's fascinating to see how one man could have enjoyed happy marriages with such utterly different women. It's also easy to understand why Charles hesitates to banish the charming and devilish Elvira from his steady yet all-too-sedate union with

Patti Eyler and Drew Taylor strike the right note as the happily married country neighbors, the Bradmans, while the play's comic relief is entrusted to Lisa Valdini as the exuberant Madame Arcati and Lexi Langs as the high-strung parlor maid, Edith.

Together, the Alhambra cast succeeds in keeping the audience's spirits high for one of Coward's most enjoyable theatrical romps.

"Blithe Spirit" runs through June 5 at the Alhambra Theatre & Dining in Iacksonville.

Players by the Sea announces 2016-2017 season

"A Season of Bravery" will be the theme for the Players by the Sea's upcoming 2016-2017 theatre season

Associate Director Bradley Akers said the theme reflects the company's theatrical choices for its upcoming 51st season, which will feature nine shows, including a U.S. community theatre premiere and Southeastern U.S. premiere productions.

All of next season's productions have never before been performed by PBTS, Akers added. 



THE PLAYERS Championship: hole by hole

Whether you're a first-time visitor to THE PLAYERS or a seasoned spectator, this handy hole-by-hole rundown will help you navigate the Stadium Course like a pro:

Hole 1 –

Views:

- The large grandstands surrounding No. 1 tee are a popular place to watch players hit their tee shots, with mounds to the left and right of the green for optimal viewing.
- Limited foliage lets you see a player's approach and putt.
- This less-crowded location provides a great opportunity to get close to players as they walk from No. 1 green to No. 2 tee.

Views:

■ Elevated mounding behind the green provides a great place to watch players decide whether or not to go for the par 5 in two or lay-up, and then you can keep an eye on them as they head to No. 3 tee to take a shot at the par-3 green.

■ Refreshment stand at 1 tee and 2 green

Hole 3 -

Views:

- Left of the tee box is a great place to view golf, as you are just on the other side of the practice tee, which means you can move back and forth to watch the 3rd hole as well as see players warm-up. This elevated areas provide a great line of sight.
- Extended mounding to the left of the green allows for great views of balls approaching the green and players putting.

Food & Beverage:

■ Refreshment stand at 1 tee and 2 green

Hole 4 -

Views:

- Sit on the bulkhead around the water surrounding the green and dangle your feet (hold on to those flip-flops!).
- Lowered mounding for improved viewing on 4 tee.
- Expanded fan walkway.

Hole 5 -

Views:

- Find great views of this tough par 4 from the elevated left side of the fairway, where you can also catch a glimpse of players practicing on the back tee of the driving range.
- Elevated mounding behind the green provides superior viewing angles.

Hole 7 –

Views:

■ The elevated mounding behind the green allows you to see all the way back to the tee box.

- The fan bleacher on 8 green, featuring the Wine Lounge presented by William Hill Estate, offers fantastic views of the 8th hole.

- New mounding on 9 green was added so you now have a better view of players' approach shots and putts.



THE PLAYERS Donna 5K returns for its ninth year

More than 1,600 racers gathered for the annual THE PLAYERS Donna 5K Saturday May 7 at TPC Sawgrass, where participants were treated to a behind-thescenes look at the tournament preparations.

Runners and walkers were welcome to join the cause, starting near the island green of the Stadium Course's 17th hole and following a cart path through the nine back holes to raise funds for breast cancer research and treatment. Among the top finishers were male racers Cameron Klug, Wesley Twiggs and Jeff Provenzano, who finished first, second and third, respectively; and Carley Glasser, Erica Reinsel and Jennifer Leffew who finished first, second and third, respectively, among female racers.

As one of several events held on behalf of The Donna Foundation founded by Donna Deegan, the 5K run at THE PLAYERS is part of year-long efforts focused on the foundation's annual 26.2 with Donna national marathon. According to spokeswoman Lyndsay Rossman, the race serves as an extension of The Donna Foundation's ongoing fight to end breast cancer.

"It's really about driving awareness for breast cancer," she said, "and having a good time while doing it."

Now in its ninth year, THE PLAYERS Donna 5K's success can be measured by its history and the impact those funds and awareness have had on breast cancer research on the First Coast. It's Deegan's hope to continue to spread that effect.

"Since we started nine years ago, TPC has helped us raise more than \$300,000 that's helped thousands of families," Deegan said. "If you look at more than 10,000 people with critical needs, it speaks for itself. Hundreds of thousands of people have been helped by the foundation and we can continue to help them with events like this."

It's a cause that many were happy to join, whether they ran for fun, for awareness or for loved ones, both survivors and those who'd lost their battle with the disease. All came together with one goal in mind: to help end breast cancer.

"The atmosphere is fun, but the best part is seeing everyone united for one cause," said volunteer Rachel Gupton.

And for Deegan, that united front is worth more than the sum of its parts.

"I hope everyone has a great time," Deegan said, "but I also hope they feel like they're a part of something bigger than themselves."

DEP recognizes THE PLAYERS Championship for environmental stewardship

The state Department of Environmental Protection's Northeast District recognized THE PLAYERS Championship at TPC Sawgrass recently for its commitment to implementing environmental management policies, including using reclaimed water for irrigation and adopting a goal of achieving zero-percent waste at the tournament.

"By actively promoting environmentally responsible practices such as water conservation, resource management and recycling," Northeast District Director Greg Strong said, "TPC Sawgrass is helping to create a culture of sustainability and improve the environment in our community."

Through the education and implementation of sustainable practices, DEP said, THE PLAYERS Championship has committed to decreasing the amount of non-recyclable waste by 15 percent at this year's event. In addition to using single-stream technology and waste compactors that will allow for more recyclable materials to be mixed in a recycle bin, the tournament will use compostable materials at concessions as well as environmentally sustainable promotional items at future events.

The efforts build upon the tourna-

ment's new PLAYERS PRIDE initiative to create a culture of sustainability and responsibility among fans, staff, vendors and volunteers.

"We have taken our lead from the TPC Network in trying to be great stewards and a showcase for others," said Matt Rapp, executive director of THE PLAYERS Championship. "In working with Republic Services and a dedicated volunteer group, our staff has made significant progress in recycling over the past several years and we hope to do even better moving forward."


In addition to its waste reduction goal, THE PLAYERS Championship is also committed to water conservation, officials said. During the past two years, TPC Sawgrass has reduced the amount of water from the Floridan Aquifer used for irrigation. While the Stadium Course uses 50 percent reclaimed water for irrigation - with approximately 12 percent coming from the aquifer - the Valley Course uses 100 percent reclaimed water. TPC Sawgrass has also implemented landscape techniques, such as using native plants, to reduce turfgrass and water consumption.







PGA Tour caddie walks a 'A Mile in My Shoes' to raise funds for family foundation

If you've ever wondered what it's like to walk a mile in someone else's shoes, or have taken for granted the very act of being able to walk, then you may understand how Paul and Michelle Tesori came up with the idea for a fundraising campaign for their charitable organization, the Tesori Family Foundation (www.tesorifamilyfoundation.org).

The Ponte Vedra couple's 2-year-old son, Isaiah, who has Down syndrome, had just begun learning to walk, prompting them to wonder what it must be like for their son to tackle that challenge. The Tesoris then came up with the idea of using Paul Tesori's role as a PGA Tour caddie to raise money for their foundation.

Through "A Mile in My Shoes," Tesori will track the mileage he walks in the 2016 portion of the 2015-2016 PGA Tour wrap-around season. Donors can pledge to make a donation based on the number of miles Tesori ends up walking this year. At the end of April, Tesori had already logged 339.1 miles and still has about six months of the season to go. Anyone who pledges before June 1 can guess how many total miles they think he will walk, and the winner will receive a 2017 TPC Experience Package worth more than \$5,000. The package includes round-trip airfare for two anywhere JetBlue flies, two weekly passes to the 2017 PLAYERS Championship, gift certificates, pampering packages and more.

"We had set a goal of \$5,000, and I believe we've doubled that already," Michelle Tesori said. "Our hope now is to raise \$15,000 to \$20,000 for our special needs program through this mile in my shoes campaign."

Donors may make a pledge per mile walked, she said, or simply make a flat donation, with the funds raised going directly to special needs programs.

The Tesoris founded the Tesori Family Foundation in 2009 based on a mutual interest in charitable organizations and giving back to the community. The mission of the foundation is to achieve great things for God by lending a helping hand, providing hope and healing hearts for children.

In addition to supporting more than 20 local and national nonprofits, the foundation also partners with charities for events such as the Tim Tebow Foundation's Night to Shine, an annual prom held in more than 200 churches in 48 states and seven countries around the world; and Hope for the Holidays, which provides aid to the homeless at Christmastime in conjunction with the St. Johns County Emergency Services

Homeless Coalition.

Buddy Baskets

The foundation has also pioneered a way to welcome new families into the Down syndrome community through "Buddy Baskets." When a family receives a diagnosis that their child has Down syndrome, the foundation steps in and offers families a customized basket of goodies which includes a free professional newborn photography session - something Tesori noted can be easily overlooked when a family is caught up in a diagnosis and medical care for their newborn. The baskets also include massages for the parents, tailored gifts for the siblings, gift certificates to the families' favorite restaurants, and more.

It's a program, Tesori said, she is hoping will be picked up in a couple of major cities in the United States as the benchmark for the Down syndrome community as to how to welcome new families. Currently, the program is available to families in Northeast Florida and southern Georgia.

Holly and Chris Bishop of Jacksonville were the first recipients of a Buddy Basket after the program was launched a little over a year ago. Their son, Beckett, was born in February 2015 and has Down syndrome.

"One morning, after Michelle called me, I was able to enjoy about a two-hour conversation with her and she just basically, gently pulled me into the Down syndrome world," Holly Bishop said. "Mother to mother, she was able to really get on the same level with me and help me feel better, that I'm not alone.

"Really the baskets were not even the whole thing," she continued. "It was the support that came with it and to see all of the people that it took to create

the buddy baskets – all of the different people that donated and gave their money or spent time hand-crafting the things that went in the basket is really what was the most touching part about it all."

In addition to Buddy Baskets, families can also join a private Facebook page the foundation set up where families can support each other. The

foundation also organizes events for the families, such as an annual Christmas party and first birthday celebrations. Visitors to the website can also fill out a prayer request form to join its prayer network.

"We get requests from all over the world," Tesori said. "It's really amazing, and then if they give us permission to share, then we will share on our Facebook page, on our Twitter handle and just engage the world in prayer for someone's specific prayer request," Tesori said.





PLAYERS volunteer one of thousands

who make the tournament happen

When the gates open for THE PLAYERS Championship each spring, something of a magic show occurs behind the scenes.

Orchestrated golf carts route spectators everywhere from the 17th hole to the parking lot. Scores are recorded, equipment is inventoried and food is distributed.

Beneath the veneer of a world-renowned event are more than 2,000 volunteers – many returning from previous years – acting as the gears that keep the show running. The experience is not unlike a Disney movie, wherein the golfers, employees and volunteers all come together to make the event as seamless and enjoyable as possible.

Among those thousands of volunteers is Steve Nix, an IT worker from Convergys Corp., who is returning to THE PLAYERS for his 14th year as a volunteer. In his time there, Nix has seen, operated and assisted in just about every aspect of the event. From manual scoreboard duty to acting as a former chair for The Patriots' Outpost to his current post as assistant chair of on-site parking, his work as a volunteer is as expansive as his tenure. It's also, he says, an extremely rewarding experience.

"Every year, you see the tournament give back to hundreds of local charities, things that help the community," Nix said. "And just by us volunteering our time we're able to help put millions of dollars to Northeast Florida charities. So donating the time and energy for benefiting the people of our community is worth more than any financial reward."

Nix's volunteer experience spans several charitable organizations, including Jacksonville FC, The Donna Foundation and the Tom Coughlin Jay Fund Foundation. He first started as a volunteer with the PGA Tour at a friend's insistence that they participate together. While his friend never joined, Nix returned to the tournament every year because of the camaraderie of its volunteers and the benefits it brings to the community.

In particular, Nix remembers the time he spent at The Patriots' Outpost for allowing him to witness the service the tournament does for the community.

"To see the military folks who serve us all be able to come in and interact with the professional golfers and entertainers, and to see just how many people support that tent is one of my favorite parts," Nix said. "For a week, as a volunteer, I was able to help them. But for a lifetime they've helped me."

It's the spirit of giving back locally that Nix said keeps him and other volunteers coming back year after year for a "reunion" of sorts at THE PLAYERS Championship.

Volunteer Challenge

PGA TOUR Commissioner Tim Finchem announced last year that the 2015 tournament generated \$8.1 million for some 300 charities in Northeast Florida. This year, as per tradition, THE PLAYERS will hold a friendly competition between volunteers called The PGA Tour Volunteer Challenge (www.tourchallenge.com). Until 2 p.m. on May 14, fans, friends and family are encouraged to vote for the volunteer of their choice in order to give them a chance to present a \$10,000 check to the charity of his or her choice from a list provided by the tournament.

And though Nix joins the ranks among several other registered volunteers, his insistence on lending his time is a personal obligation.

"Between the dashes – between where your life starts and where your life ends – it's important to fill that time with doing good," he said. "So I always lean towards causes for people who might need help."





PGA TOUR winners Emiliano Grillo, Fabian Gomez, Jim Herman, Peter Malnati, Smylie Kaufman and Tony



Tee up a great read with golf books

"Marvin the Golf Caddy Dog" was the first in the series of books by Harold Mann. A stray golden retriever, kind of like Buddy in the "Air Bud" movies, and a boy named Ted meet on a golf course. Ted makes Marvin his golf caddy dog and their adventure begins. The book is filled with color illustrations of beginning rules of golf in a far easier format than the USGA Rules of Golf pamphlet.

After "Marvin the Golf Dog Caddy," Mann created sequels as coloring books designed to teach the basics of the game, including etiquette. First came "Marvin the Golf Caddy Dog ABCs of Golf," and then "Marvin the Golf Caddy Dog, 1 2 3s of Golf." Now there's "Marvin Qualifies for Junior Nationals." Available from www.thebookmann.com

"Joann Dost: The Ultimate Round Pebble Beach Golf Links, An Illustrated Guide to America's Majestic **Dream Course**"

The title says it all, really, if you know anything about Joann Dost. But if you don't, she is quite simply one of the very best golf photographers anywhere and has chosen to spend a great deal of her professional life photographing Pebble Beach. Dost has also been chosen by the USGA for a variety of photography assignments for their

tournament programs. Neal Hotelling and James Dodson provide the words to accompany her photos, giving background about the resort and detail on the course.

In addition to beautiful photography, there are tips for how to play the holes as well as some historic stories about things that have happened on them. For example, on the second hole, although the hole is 511 yards and a par five for most golfers, the USGA routinely makes it a par four for its championships. There's a note on the barranca in front of the green, with a suggestion that laying up in front of it is the way to go. That leaves a 75-yard pitch shot to the green.

History is a great part of Pebble Beach, and that information is included. For instance, on the second hole, Bobby Jones was short of the green after two shots in the 1929 U.S. Amateur played against Johnny Goodman. Jones conceded the hole to Goodman, giving him a two-up lead after two holes. Eventually Jones lost the match, and my opinion is that may be one reason Pebble Beach wasn't used for a U.S. Open for another gazillion years.

Most recently, the hole was where Dustin Johnson made his untimely triple in the U.S. Open and lost his third round lead. The tournament was won by Graeme McDowell.

Every hole has a story, including the sixth, which was a pasture for "National Velvet," starring Elizabeth Taylor. Together with stunning photos, it's a book that lovers of the game will enjoy. Available at amazon.com

"Golf: The Last Six Inches, **Change Your Brain, Change Your**

A paperback by Sue Wieger, M.Ed, and LPGA 2015 Teacher of The Year might be just what the doctor ordered for help with getting the most out of your game. Part of it is, as the chapter 3 introduction says in a quote from Gandhi, "Your beliefs become your thoughts."

She emphasizes the importance of keeping a journal to compare the golf shots you hit to what was happening mentally at that time. She talks about the emotions of the game of golf, the importance of selecting a target, and generally all those things good golfers know and do. 



Donald and Doral: How Trump restored resort to its former glory

The Doral Resort has evolved over six decades, enjoying some good times, and enduring some challenging times. Now, under the ownership of presidential candidate Donald Trump, the newly christened Trump National Doral has been restored to its status as a world class golf destination. But it was a convoluted process.

The story behind the transformation of the Doral Resort of the 1960s and 1970s into Trump Doral is intertwined with development, decline, renovation, bankruptcy and redevelopment. In addition, the last decade-and-a-half made profitable operation of the resort very difficult due to the aftermath of 9/11 and the financial and housing recession that began in 2008. Both 9/11 and 2008 caused a near collapse in business and discretionary travel – and a destination resort without travelers is a big monetary problem.

But let's start at the beginning, in 1959, when Alfred Kaskel bought 2,400 acres of what was considered swampland for about \$49,000. It's impossible to know what it looked like then. We can only imagine by looking to the west where I-75 meets the Sawgrass Expressway. After I-75 makes the turn west toward Naples, the Sawgrass Expressway cruises north until it makes the turn east at Coral Springs. Looking west, there's an endless sea of brown grass. That's the eastern edge of the Everglades. Things that slither and bite live out there in abundance, waiting

to be turned into shoes and belts and handbags. It's so nasty that the rest stop on I-75 going to Naples has signs warning about poisonous snakes. This is not a people-friendly area.

Nevertheless, whatever it looked like in 1959, Kaskel bought the land, because, as everyone in Florida knew then, you just drained the swamp and then built on the land. Without that philosophy, many places in Florida would not exist today, including TPC Sawgrass.

Kaskel was not a novice developer. He was quite the real estate tycoon in New York City and had built something close to 17,000 apartments, including Gracie Towers on East End Avenue and 360 East 72d St. in Manhattan, Roosevelt Terrace, Churchill Manor, Park City, Park City and Kennedy House in Queens, River Terrace and Skyview in the Bronx, and others. With the acquisition of the land in Florida, Kaskel turned his construction focus south.

Of the 2,400 acres, 800 acres would become the resort. The remainder would become Doral Estates and Doral Park, some of it built in conjunction with Lennar. If you are familiar with the area around Doral, Kaskel owned land on both sides of the current resort and to the north of it. The southern border was NW 36th Street. His holdings started where the turnpike is now on the west, and ran east almost to route 826, the road that connects I-75 with the Doral exit. That is a swath approximately four miles wide. He also

owned the land from NW 36th Street to NW 74th Street, a distance of about two miles. So basically he owned something about the size of Key West, without the ocean.

The name for the property, Doral, came from Kaskel's name and his wife's name: Doris for DOR and Alfred for AL.

1960s modern luxury

When Doral opened, it was luxurious and modern in a 1960s Jetson's kind of way, with sleek lines and interesting space-age design, including a round third floor level complete with floor to ceiling windows that overlooked the putting green and the golf courses. With multiple golf courses, it was designed to be a golf vacationers dream.

In 1962, professional golf debuted at the Blue course, which was subsequently named the Blue Monster for its lakes and difficulty. The first winner of the tournament, then called the Doral "500" Open, was Billy Casper. It was his 17th title, and he won the tournament again in 1964 on his way to 51 career victories.

Other early winners in the heyday of the Supremes, the Beatles and the Beach Boys included Doug Sanders, Phil Rodgers and Jack Nicklaus (a two-time winner).

Lee Trevino, Tom Weiskopf and Raymond Floyd would capture the title in subsequent years. Ponte Vedra's Mark McCumber won in 1979 – his first PGA Tour victory – and again in 1985.

With professional golf established,

Doral was on the map in a big way. It was a place where parents of baby boomers went for winter golf vacations and talked about what they shot on the Gold or the Red or the Blue. Eventually the Kaskels would build four courses.

Weeks became years, and years became decades. As with any set of buildings, there was wear and tear on the nearly 700 hotel rooms and the physical systems. By the mid-1980s, guests were likely to find rooms with air conditioning that didn't work or that cooled too much. Still, people came. It was Doral, after all, even though crumbling. The prime reason they came was because of the cache of the PGA Tour.

A period of decline

By the late 1980s, no one wanted to venture outside of the resort at night. The neighborhood had deteriorated. Businesses along the roads to Doral had bars on the windows and graffiti on the walls. It was not the kind of place anyone would want to drive through alone at night, at least not on purpose. If you were leaving after dark, you hoped for green lights.

Making things even more eerie, old warehouses surrounded the resort to the north and east. On the west boundary of the property, development stopped. Beyond that, the Everglades.

In the mid-1990s resort travel was upended for a time when a few tourists were car-jacked leaving Miami International Airport.

The resort and, truth be told, the

entire area needed a facelift, but the money to fix the resort it was more than the children of the Kaskels had or wanted to spend. Yet in all that time, the Blue Monster course was so good and Miami was such an important market that the PGA Tour continued to find ways to hold the tournament.

Fast forward to 1994. KSL Recreation made an offer for Doral that the descendants of Alfred and Doris Kaskel did not want to refuse. At the time, the sale was reported to be slightly over \$100 million. An extensive renovation was announced and begun. The rooms were improved significantly. The AC worked. Plumbing worked. A spa was added. Marriott took over the operation of the hotel and built timeshares across the street from the resort entrance.

A new golf course designed by Greg Norman also went up across the street. It was dubbed the Great White. Things looked up, and Doral began, once again, to look more like a luxury resort and less like a crumbling structure.

This first renovation effort had a domino effect on businesses outside the walls of the resort, as ugly stuff was bought, knocked down and replaced with new strip malls, drug stores and restaurants. A Publix sprouted up a couple blocks west

Then, seven years after KSL bought Doral came the horror of 9/11, which put the travel kibosh on the world, at least for a while. It was a difficult time financially for every golf destination, with the possible exception of Pebble Beach. Business travel, vacation travel, golf travel all came to a halt and only slowly returned. That caused problems for the Doral ownership, and they eventually sold to CNL, a real estate investment trust company in Orlando.

In the interim, other businesses continued to move in. Univision. The Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta – Miami Branch. The area around the resort, with more than 50,000 residents, voted to make themselves a separate city.

Also post 9/11, Flagler Development, the development company headquartered in Jacksonville, had begun acquiring land around Doral Resort. Eventually they would own at least 120 acres.

In 2006, Flagler announced what they called Downtown Doral, a 120acre mixed-use development which they said would become a city center for the new city of Doral.

"Downtown Doral will be vital to Doral because it is creating a true city center which will allow people to live near their work, an option that Doral has been longing for," said Armando Codina, then president and CEO of Flagler, now executive chairman of Codina Partners.

A year later, Doral, along with several other resorts, was sold to one of Morgan Stanley's real estate investment funds for a number close to \$500 million. KSL kept the Great White Course, as a future residential real estate play.

The deal for the resorts in the package was a bargain at the price.

Then the economy clawed back, only to be back-handed in the fall of 2008 with an economic double-whammy which again resulted in a decline in travel. It was bad timing, caused by worse people, and it happened to some large companies and many individuals.

All the resorts in the Morgan Stanley portfolio were in trouble. They tried to restructure their loans, and when that didn't work, the lenders foreclosed on them.

By 2011, Paulson & Co., Winthrop Realty Trust, and Capital Trust, all junior debt-holders, took over the properties at a foreclosure auction. Paulson & Co., Winthrop Realty Trust, and Capital Trust hoped to fix the debt issues, and to do that they put the properties into bankruptcy. They approached the Trump people to see if they wanted to buy anything. Trump wanted Doral. Ivanka Trump was involved in the deal.

So in February 2012, Donald Trump announced to the world that his organization would be buying Doral. He made an appearance during the WGC Cadillac Championship.

"We think that Doral has just tremendous opportunity, it's a tremendous location," he said then. "We look to make this one of the great places anywhere in the world for golf. It needs a lot of work. It's a little bit tired and that's okay, and we are going to do something special."

He said his daughter Ivanka and son Eric were going to spend a lot of time there working on the renovations.

In May, the bankruptcy court gave final approval for the sale of Doral assets to the Trump organization. Trump expected to take over the property by June of that year.

"When Doral first opened, it was considered the best resort in the world," Trump said in a statement announcing the acquisition.

He paid \$150 million, although it had earlier been reported that the sale price would be \$170 million.

"I will spend much more money on fixing Doral than somebody else, because somebody else is looking on return on investment. I'm not," he said. "I'm looking to make an amazing place, and the return will come. So I think it's a good thing for golf."

Let's not kid ourselves. It was a great price for the property, and it will return money to the Trump organization. But it has also cost a fortune to renovate it.

With a little more than six months between the closing on the real estate and the next WGC Cadillac Championship event, the Trump organization knew they could not remake the golf course before March 2013.

"We'll close it right after the 2013 tournament," Trump explained. "We won't skip a beat, and in the meantime we are going to be spending literally tens of millions of dollars on the rooms

and the ballrooms and all of the public space, and the clubhouse in particular is going to get a tremendous renovation."

"There really will be nothing like it and there really is nothing like it in a city that is as robust as this one," Ivanka Trump added. "Normally you have these large golf resorts, and they take five planes and three hours and a car to get to. So this really is something very special."

After the 2013 golf tournament, the Blue Monster golf course was torn up. Gil Hanse had been hired to renovate and modify it, making it harder for today's tour players. It was a huge amount of work to take on in a limited time frame. Fortunately, there were no hurricanes that year, and warm season grass grows all the time in Miami.

By the 2014 tournament, the Blue Monster had teeth, perhaps more teeth than the players wanted. The other courses, visible from the fairways of the Blue Monster, were in dirt. Changes were underway, but not completed, all around the property. The clubhouse, though, received a lot of attention.

The Trump touch

Anyone who has not been to Doral since the early 2000s will see the difference beginning at the entrance. Anyone

who has not been there since the early 1990s will be shocked at the transformation. For instance, hundreds of huge palm trees now frame the roadway from the guard gate all the way up to the resort front door.

One special addition is the helipad for you know who. It's located between the 9th and 10th holes. At the most recent WGC Cadillac Championship, however, when Trump visited the resort on Sunday the helipad was not used, no doubt for security reasons. He landed on an adjoining golf course, the better for secret service to provide protection.

On the registration level, enormous chandeliers shimmer and reflect off marble floors, and the same kinds of light fixtures are found in many other rooms. Walls are hung with historic photos of golfers. There are oil paintings. It isn't fake luxury. It is real luxury.

"All I want to do is take the existing buildings with Eric and Ivanka and make them absolutely beautiful," Trump said. "The bones of this place are phenomenal, the way it was originally designed.

What was a cocktail lounge area in the 1980s, then changed to a gift shop in the 1990s, is now back to a cocktail lounge. There's a second and quieter living room style lounge area that over-

Boselli inducted into Cotton Bowl Hall of Fame

Former Jaguars stand-out Tony Boselli was among the six individuals recently inducted into the Cotton Bowl Hall of Fame.

Boselli, a two-time All-American offensive tackle with the University of Southern California Trojans, was inducted in recognition of his role in the Trojans' record-setting 1995 Cotton Bowl 55-14 blowout over Texas Tech. During that game, USC set records for total offense, passing yards, total points,

points in one quarter and points in one half.

Also inducted in the April 22 ceremony at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas was former Texas head coach Fred Akers, SMU tailback Eric Dickerson, Notre Dame linebacker Bob Golic, Arkansas quarterback Fred Marshall and Cotton Bowl Athletic Association Team Selection Chairman Dan Petty, who was inducted posthumously.

"Those extraordinary individuals

whose unique talents formed the pageantry and prestige of one of college football's most historic post-season bowl games are showcased in the Cotton Bowl Hall of Fame," CBAA Chairman Jay McAuley said. A judging committee comprised of media representatives and athletic

In 1995, Boselli was the second NFL draft pick – and the first-ever draft pick for the new Jacksonville Jaguars franchise. He played seven seasons for the Jaguars, retiring in 2002.


While all of this is great for Donald Trump and his family, it is also a tremendous boost to the area.

The Great Panic of 2016

There is no of the jobs in the developed world! Yep. The talking heads were out in full force hyperventilating over the inevitable demise of the US stock market in early January What many people did not and do

What many people did not and do not understand is that these doomsters have been singing the same song since 2008, while the S&P 500 increased over 200 percent from its March 2009 lows. If we had listened to them at that time, we would have missed one of the greatest advances in the history of the S&P 500. Ah, it feels good to get that off my chest. Now we can take a more academic approach

When we are in the middle of so much anxiety and folks are stampeding to the exit door, it is hard to recognize that the theater is not on fire. Nevertheless, it was déjà vu all over again, as far too many folks hit the panic button, as their rational thinking went out the window. When selling stopped, and all the bears were exhausted, there appeared nothing else to do but buy! Friends, this is called capitulation! Regardless, many investors apparently believed this was going to be the first time in market history that the market goes down and stays down forever.

We must understand that periodic crises are inevitable, and though past performance is not indicative of future results, recovery has followed. Moreover, let us not lose focus with the fact that since 1950, the S&P 500 has experienced a decline of between 5 percent and 10 percent in 35.5 percent of all calendar years, which is another way of saying that this recent drawdown was entirely reasonable. Sip on that for a second. Swirl it around. Savor the essence. No, do not spit it out. Take a good long taste. Painful yes, but true nonetheless.

Folks, if we know that about 35 percent of the time that we will experience a stock market decline in the range of 5 to 10 percent, then why would we ever think of hitting the panic button? I know why. Because when panic fills the air again, I will hear, as I always do, the misinformed peeps uttering those four annoying words: This time is different. Of course, it is different. So what if this time is different? Who cares? The fact is that market declines are normal. We must get over it or do not play the investing game.

Perhaps the words from the "Forest Gump of Wall Street," Warren Buffet, will help you stay the course the next time the market enters its normal and frequent decline: "For 240 years it has been a terrible mistake to bet against America, and now is no time to start. America's golden goose of commerce and innovation will continue to lay more and larger eggs" (from Buffet's 2015-year end annual letter).

My final advice is to beware of futurists and carry some salt. In other words, just stay the course. I believe in stick ability. Do not do something, just stand there! Now take a deep breath and turn the page.
