

# New nonstop flights from St. Augustine to Chicago, Philadelphia to begin next week

Frontier Airlines will begin new, nonstop routes from St. Augustine's Northeast Florida Regional Airport to Chicago and Philadelphia next week, offering area residents an alternative to driving to Jacksonville International Airport to catch a flight to those cities.

Frontier will begin service to Chicago on April 14, with the nonstop route to Philadelphia beginning the following day. To inaugurate the new routes, the airline offered low introductory fares, with savings of as much as 64 percent off the industry average fare. Flights between St. Augustine and Chicago will operate on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays, while flights to Philadelphia will operate on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays.

"There has been a high level of

interest in both Philadelphia and Chicago for the new service to Northeast Florida/St. Augustine," Northeast Florida Regional Airport Executive Director Edward Wuellner said. "The airport has been working with the Visitors and Convention Bureau and with Frontier to advertise and promote the new service in the Philadelphia and Chicago areas."

When asked about the possibility of adding nonstop flights from St. Augustine to other major metropolitan cities, Wuellner said the success of the new Chicago and Philadelphia routes could play a role in making that happen.

"Local support will lead to the success of these new routes," he said. "A successful launch of the new markets will allow the airport to tell the story of Northeast Florida to airlines and continue to work to identify opportunities for future service additions."

# Flavor Palette brings international flair to sandwich shop

Homemade soups, salads and an eclectic blend of internationally inspired sandwiches are just a few of the items on the menu at Flavor Palette, which opened last week in the Ponte Vedra Pointe Shopping Center.

The sandwich shop and its diverse menu are the culinary creation of Chef Tommy McDonough, who recently moved from Philadelphia to the First Coast with his wife and two children.

"I got my start working in the iconic sandwich shops of Philly," said Mc-Donough, who went on to work for two decades in a variety of culinary and executive chef positions before opening his own business. "I was fortunate to work under culturally diverse chefs from places like Taiwan, India, Germany, Korea and Belgium. I picked up things from each of them, which has helped me develop my own style as a chef and become more dynamic."

All of the signature sandwiches are McDonough's original creations, unique combinations. The "Boss Hogg" sandwich, for example, features pastormarinated pork topped with cucumberavocado salsa, salsa verde, black bean

hummus and picked red onions on an Amoroso hoagie roll. The "Samurai," meanwhile, is a miso-marinated fish sandwich topped with grilled scallions, cucumber, cabbage slaw and a sesame pickled ginger aioli on a wrap.

Other internationally inspired offerings include Pountine, which the menu describes as a Canadian French fry dish topped with gravy, cheddar, bacon, caramelized onions and scallions. The menu also includes a "create your own masterpiece" option whereby customers can build their own custom sandwich from a

selection of breads, toppings and meats, chicken or fish.

"I like big, bold flavors," said Mc-Donough, noting that Flavor Palette also has a kids' menu with traditional items such burgers and a grilled cheese sandwich. "We have options for people who are a little adventurous, but our menu is really designed to appeal to a vast array of palates."

Hence the restaurant's name. "It's a play on words," said McDonough's wife, Jamie, taking a quick break from waiting on lunchtime customers. "It refers to an artist's palette and the palate of your mouth."

The shop's logo, in fact, features a sandwich in the shape of an artist's palette – a nod to the artistic flair Mc-Donough tries to bring to each creation, including the shop's salads, soups and desserts. On a recent visit, the soups of the day included chimichurri and ribolita – a hearty Tuscan vegetable – while the homemade gelatos available included mint lemonade sorbet, chocolate amaretto and strawberry balsamic swirl.

"Everything here is made from scratch," McDonough said. "Some gelato shops use bases or stabilizers, but we use only fresh, natural ingredients."

Open Tuesday through Sunday from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m., Flavor Palette has been doing brisk business since it opened March 29. "We opened our doors and within 10 minutes we had 30 people in line!" McDonough said.

Flavor Palette plans to have an official grand opening in the coming weeks. Also in the works are plans to offer wine and a selection of craft beers.

# **Accotink Academy to merge with Keystone Child Development Center**

New 'Keystone by the Sea' to open on Accotink campus in the fall

Accotink Academy By The Sea is merging with Keystone Child Development Center, adding Keystone staff and curriculum to the Ponte Vedra school.

Keystone By The Sea will officially open in the fall, as Keystone relocates its child development center and preschool to the Accotink campus located at 171 Canal Blvd. Keystone By The Sea will serve children ages 3 months to 8 years old.

"This is a child development and early learning center that focuses on preparing children for success in mainstream elementary school, "Keystone Marketing Coordinator Karen Rieley said. "The primary school will serve those students who will benefit from having some additional time to develop fundamental skills needed for success in a traditional school setting."

In addition to featuring small class sizes and a high staff-to-student ratio, Rieley said, the newly merged Keystone By The Sea will feature a variety of enrichment programs, including tutoring, yoga, health and wellness, dance, sports, art and music.

"I'm thrilled." Accotink Academy Head of School Rebecca Bowersox said. "I really believe we are now going to be the premier preschool in all of Jacksonville."

Bowersox said Accotink's current staff of 40 will continue with the school, with the addition of Keystone staff. Bowersox will continue in her role as head of school, under the overall direction of Keystone CEO and founder Katie Falwell, Ph.D.

We are very excited about the pending merger," Falwell said. "Our newest educational endeavor will be our third school in the past four

years to operate under the Keystone

"The new paradigm of education and pediatrics creates a marriage of the two under integrated care," Falwell continued. "Keystone By The Sea will offer all learning, health and wellness programs that a child could need under one roof."

Bowersox agreed.

"This is an amazing opportunity for us," she said. "We're going to take what's awesome about Accotink and enhance it through the addition of Keystone's incredibly professional staff and updated curriculum."

For Accotink's existing students, there will be no change or disruption to their schedule, Bowersox said. "We're already gearing up for our summer programs, which begin June 6." she said.

# Open enrollment

Currently, Accotink Academy By The Sea serves 275 children ranging from 1-year-olds to 8-year-olds. Open enrollment for the new fall program will be held from 8 a.m. to noon Sat. April 9 in the multipurpose room at Accotink Academy by the Sea, 171 Canal Blvd. Registration for existing students and alumni families will occur today (Thursday) and Friday from 8 a.m. to noon. Registration packets have already been sent home with current students.

A town hall meeting for both current and prospective parents to ask questions about the merger will also be held at 6 p.m. April 14 in the school's multipurpose room.

Bowersox noted that she believes school founder Elaine McConnell, who passed away in January, would have given the merger her blessing.

"This is exactly what she would have wanted," she said. "It's a match made in heaven."

# Malcolm Anthony to run for circuit judge

Ponte Vedra attorney Malcolm Anthony has announced his candidacy for circuit judge.

Anthony, 57, previously had announced his intention to run for U.S. Congress for the FL 6th congressional seat being vacated by Rep. Ron De-Santis, who is running for U.S. Senate. Following the recent congressional redistricting that split St. Johns County into two congressional districts, however, Anthony decided to withdraw from the congressional race and seek election as a circuit judge for the Seventh Circuit, which includes St. Johns,

Flagler, Volusia and Putnam counties.

"I believe the time has come for me to offer my years of experience to the people of St. Johns, Flagler, Volusia and Putnam counties as a circuit judge," Anthony said in announcing his candidacy. "I have enjoyed over 32 years practicing law in this circuit, both as a prosecutor and a private attorney, and I know the value of a wellseasoned judge on the bench who has been professionally involved in the challenges people face regarding the law and who understands the application of justice from all sides."

Ponte Vedra resident Robert "Bob" Rooks, 69, has a lot of love to give. A chance encounter at a foster parent booth at the state fair led Bob and his wife, Geri, on the path to their life's work. The couple became foster parents in 1969 and successfully fostered about 100 children. Upon moving to Florida, Geri became a neonatal nurse and Rooks took a job with Daniel, the oldest child-serving agency in Florida. The Jacksonville-based organization helps nearly 2,000 children and their families each day through a wide variety of programs. Rooks has worked for the organization since 1993 and currently serves as director of Florida's Adoption Information Center. In addition to being a foster parent, he and his wife are also adoptive parents. A youth-care services worker for more than 30 years, Rooks has served as a residential counselor and youth care administrator. —By Carrie Resch, The Recorder

# How long have you and your wife been foster parents?

My wife and I have been foster parents since 1969. We were active foster parents from then until we moved here to Florida, which was in 1993. If the children couldn't go back to their family, our goal was to keep them and raise them. A couple of the kids stayed with us well into their 20s. That's what you're supposed to do. We had a word for our program back then. We called it family and truly that's how we operated, we operated as a family.

## Tell me about your role at Daniel.

Daniel operates the state's adoption information center. We're the 1-800-96-ADOPT number, a statewide program. It handles all areas of adoption - whether it's working with people wanting to adopt or whether the child is an infant, an international child or the kids are in foster care. About 60 percent of our work is on behalf of the children in foster care that need to be adopted. But we also work with adults who were adopted and may be seeking their medical history. We can let them know how to go about doing that. If they're wanting to reconnect to their birth family, we can help them with that. Also, we get calls from pregnant woman who are considering placing their child for adoption. We let them know what services are available to them and then get them directed to those folks who would be most helpful to them. It might be adoption, but it might just be a good social service agency so they don't have to place their child for adoption. In this day and age, money is the last reason anybody should have to place their child for adoption.

## How many calls does the adoption information center receive?


We average over 10,000 calls a year in adoption. Our motto is "if adoption is in the sentence, we can help." I've been in the adoption information center for 22 years now. We pay close attention to what's going on in adoption and try to make sure that we're minimally able to get that person or family to that next step based on what their needs are.

# And you also like to clown around when you have the time?

I didn't set out into the world to be a clown, but I had these skills. One year for Father's Day, one of my kids got me this book to learn how to make balloon animals. Then, it was actually a little paragraph in the paper that said come learn how to juggle - just bring three oranges. So, I brought my teenagers and we all went to learn how to juggle. I went home and practiced and

later, I was teaching the juggling class. Geri, my wife, got me a unicycle for Christmas. So, I learned how to ride a unicycle. Now if you can do balloon animals, ride a unicycle and juggle,

got relatively decent at it. Two years what do you do with those skills? You become a clown, and so I did! I did it for a while quasi-professionally. When we moved here, I joined a group in town called Gator Clowns. There are about 75 of us.



# Despite downpours, Relay for Life exceeds last year's goal

Alyssa Sandler Sugg, 27, doesn't remember much about the first time she was diagnosed with leukemia at age 3. She remembers vividly, however, what it felt like when the cancer returned at age 9. So much so, that the Landrum Middle School special needs teacher credits her battle with cancer with inspiring her to become a teacher.

"I was in middle school when I was finishing my treatments and I was having difficulties in school because of some of the effects," she said. "It made me want to work with special needs children."

Today, the newly married Sugg says that having cancer was in some ways a blessing.

"You meet so many wonderful people and make so many special connections because of it," she said.

Those connections were evident Saturday, as more than 120 volunteers participated in the Ponte Vedra Relay for Life fundraiser for cancer research and treatment. Though thunderstorms delayed the start of this year's event, the downpours didn't dampen the spirits of the volunteers and cancer survivors who showed up and walked to fight cancer.

Held at Ponte Vedra High School, this year's Relay for Life opening ceremonies



began at 3 p.m. Before the first walkers began their paces, however, the event had already exceeded last year's fundraising goal. Lynn Nelson, the event's lead coordinator, said that \$13,000 had already been raised as the event was getting underway. That figure was expected to rise, she added, thanks to fundraising containers placed at local Gate gas stations and ongoing fundraisers that will occur through August. One such event, she noted, will occur May 18 at Bogey

"The restaurant is doing a special promotion called 'Stick a Fork in Cancer," Nelson said. "On that day, they'll donate 10 percent of all sales from 5 p.m. until

Saturday's Relay for Life featured a full slate of entertainment, including performances by local dance troupes and concerts by local singer/songwriters. The focus, however, remained squarely on fighting cancer, and following the opening ceremonies the official relay portion of the event began with a "Survivor's Lap," as Sugg and four other local cancer survivors took a victory lap around the high school's courtyard to the applause of volunteers. Survivor Richard Ulmer - a retired teacher who now substitutes regularly at Ponte Vedra High School smiled and jokingly told the cheering students, "If I see you smoking, you're swallowing it!"

"Events like this are special to me, because this is what's going to cure cancer," Ulmer said. "I volunteer for the American Cancer Society and the Mayo Clinic, and many of us believe that we will see a

cancer was one of the best things that ever happened to me."

Bob McKeefrey, a prostate cancer survivor and member of the event's leadership team, agreed.

"Having cancer gives you a whole new appreciation for life," said McKeefrey, whose company, Medcruiters, was a sponsor of this year's Relay for Life.

Martine Gelb, 16, has been participating in Relay for Life events for nearly her

"I've been doing this since I was 3 years old - and I've been a captain since I was 12," the Ponte Vedra High School sophomore said. "I participated with my family when we lived in New Hampshire, and then my dad got cancer so we said, 'Let's keep doing this."

For this year's event, Gelb was team captain of a group of students representing PVHS's Gay/Straight Alliance.

"I think events like these are important because they not only bring awareness of the need for cancer research, but also of the huge impact cancer has on the lives of all the people around that person," said team member Adam Snowden, 17. "When we come together and see all the support that's out there, I think it's very encouraging for people fighting cancer to know the monumental impact that they have on us."

# Seawalk Pavilion welcomes Springing the Blues bands, visitors for 26th year

For a brief moment on Saturday, the rain clouds dissipated over Jacksonville Beach's Seawalk Pavilion for the second day of the annual Springing the Blues festival, casting sunlight over a growing crowd as Kim Reteguiz and the Black Cats Bones took the main stage.

The 2015 Jax Idol winners performed songs from their yet to be released LP,

with frontwoman Reteguiz belting the band's signature brand of hybrid Latin fusion and soul to the applause of an early afternoon turnout.

Celebrating its 26th year on the Jax Beach calendar, Springing the Blues hosted yet another lineup of acclaimed blues musicians both local and national drawing an equally mixed crowd.

After kicking off Friday April 1, the festival presented a variety of acts over the course of three days, including The Lee Boys, Toots Lorraine & The Traffic and Red Dirt Revelators.

"I don't think there's anything else like it," said Nelson Osborn, an Alabama native with a band of his own who atteneded in support of Red Dirt Revelators. "I love it - it's by the beach and the sound production is always great. And I'm from Alabama – I'm a real blues man so it's really for me."

Springing the Blues, which reportedly attracts over 150,000 people to the Seawalk Pavilion each year, has come a long way since its first event in 1991 featuring just four artists. This year's festival featured 16 bands and soloists and more than 40 hours of music on two stages - the Main Stage and a Blues Lounge, for a more intimate performance experience.

A bevy of food trucks vendors, including MOJO Kitchen and several other local and national chains offered up an assortment of classic hot dogs and sausages, smoothies and snow cones. A ferris wheel, a cluster of apparel booths and a small attraction of inflatable slides and bouncy houses gave the festival the feel of a fair – a vibe festival organizers pride themselves on bringing to the First



# Nocatee launches 'NocaTour'





# Local boys' soccer team raises funds for fellow player diagnosed with rare bone cancer

"Nov. 5, 2015 our world fell apart." Those seven short words are how St. Augustine couple Lisa and Michael Branck described the shock and pain of learning their 13-year-old son, Ethan, had a rare form of bone cancer.

One day their son was a happy teenager and aspiring young soccer player

who moved to St. Augustine with his family last year, started attending Sebastian Middle School, and tried out for the school's soccer team. But his father noticed that something was off. Ethan was tiring easily and not playing with the same intensity as he once had, so his father decided to take him to the doctor. After many doctor's visits and tests, Ethan was diagnosed with

metastatic Ewing's sarcoma, and as a result of this rare type of bone cancer, had to have his right leg amputated.

Ponte Vedra Beach resident and soccer coach Stuart Impey heard about Ethan and together, he and the two teams of boys he coaches wanted to do something to help.

"I have a 13-year-old son and it really got me because all us parents who have kids who play soccer, it could have been any of our boys," Impey said.

The head soccer coach at Landrum Middle School, Impey also serves as assistant coach of his son's soccer team, the Ponte Vedra Storm U-14 Gold. Many of the boys from the Landrum team and some members of the Ponte Vedra Storm had already decided to run the Run 13.1 and 5K half marathon on April 3 at The Jacksonville Landing. After hearing about Ethan's story, the group decided to turn the run into a fundraising opportunity to help Ethan's family with the mounting cost of medical bills. They set up a Go Fund Me page and managed to raise almost \$12,000 in one month. They named their fundraising group "EB's Toon Army" in honor of their fellow soccer player.

"We were just amazed that we got this call out of the blue and this generosity and forethought to help Ethan out," Branck said. "It's just amazing what (Impey's) doing and the support and the overall attention that he's brought." Branck said.

The Brancks are especially touched by the outpouring of the community, considering the family is new to the area. The family also expressed appreciation for the local organizations that have stepped in to help, including The Tom Coughlin Jay Fund and the Tim Tebow Foundation. Ethan and his family were invited to attend the 2016 Tim Tebow Foundation Celebrity Gala and Golf Classic, where Ethan enjoyed a private meeting with Tebow, who signed and threw a football with him.

Ethan has also received good tidings from a number of other organizations. The Jacksonville Armada FC soccer team sent Ethan and his family tickets to a game and some Armada swag. He also received a letter from the personal assistant to the head coach of Ethan's favorite soccer team. Newcastle United. a letter from NBA star LeBron James, a visit from two of the Jacksonville Jaguars and a card signed by the Fruit Cover Middle School girls' varsity team.

"The community support," Branck said, "has been outstanding."







# Girl Scouts to make history come alive at Ximenez-Fatio House April 9

The daily tasks and struggles of mid-19th century Florida women will be brought to life April 9, when local girl scouts take part in Living History Day at the Ximenez-Fatio House Museum in historic downtown St. Augustine.

Gateway Council girl scouts in 7th through 9th grade will portray women of the period, living their lives amid Indian uprisings, Yellow Fever epidemics and the Civil War. Working closely with the Colonial Dames – which owns and preserves the Ximenez-Fatio House Museum – the girls have trained and rehearsed extensively in preparation for Living History Day, which will occur from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the house, located at 20 Aviles St. Admission for the event is \$8 per person.

Listed on the National Register of

Historic places, the Ximenez-Fatio House was purchased by the Colonial Dames in the State of Florida in 1939 to use as their state house museum. One of St. Augustine's best-preserved Spanish colonial dwellings, the museum is considered one of the first American museums to interpret 19th century women's history, depicting the boarding house lifestyle of Florida's territorial and early statehood periods.

The Ximenez-Fatio House Museum is open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. Tours of the buildings are available from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.; the museum is closed on Sunday and Monday.

Admission is \$10 for adults and \$8 for students, seniors and the military. Admission is free for St. Johns County residents.







# Ponte Vedra fencer wins double bronze

Fifteen year-old Ponte Vedra resident Lawrence "Lance" Tan recently won team bronze in Y14 Foil and individual bronze in Y14 Epee at the North American Cup (NAC) fencing competition.

Held March 11-14 in held in Salt Lake City, Utah, the event was the last U.S. national tournament prior to the Cadet and Junior World Championships (Les Championnats du Monde D'Escrime) to be held next month in Bourges, France. Tan will compete April 1-10 in four events: Cadet Foil,

Cadet Epee, Junior Foil, and Junior Epee.

Tan, a dual national, will represent the Philippines at the international event. He has previously represented the United States and medaled in many international competitions in the Pan-American region and in Europe for Team USA, but began fencing for the Philippines as a heritage athlete dual national this season.

Tan said deciding to represent the Philippines instead of the USA was "a difficult decision." After winning two gold medals at the National Youth Games held in the Philippines, Tan was invited to train with the country's senior national team, where he me the coaches. He also had an opportunity to meet other American youths who are currently on the national Philippines team.

"When I won the national youth championship in Foil and Epee, I realized that it would be very special to represent the country of my heritage in international competition," Tan said. "I talked it over with my coach and my parents, and we came to the conclusion that it would be not only great for my fencing, but also a wonderful thing to represent the Philippines as an American-trained, third generation American athlete. It's the best of both worlds."

Tan currently trains in Orange County, Calif. at Golubitsky Fencing Center under Olympic Silver Medalist and three-time World Champion Sergei Golubitsky. When he is in Florida, he trains at the Jacksonville Fencing Club in Riverside.

# Nease drama program to present 'The Crucible'

The year is 1692, the place is Salem, Massachusetts and witchcraft hysteria is sweeping through the town, tearing apart families and ruining reputations.

When playwright Arthur Miller wrote his Tony Award-winning play "The Crucible" in the early 1950s, however, the fear and mob mentality of a 17th-century witch hunt seemed all too relevant, as anti-communist fears swept the nation and the House **Un-American Activities Committee** was actively seeking out writers and artists with leftist sympathies.

These are among the themes and undercurrents that will be explored in Nease High School's production of "The Crucible," to be presented at 7 p.m. April 14-16 in the school's Performing Arts Center. Considered to be among the most significant American dramas of the 20th century, "The Crucible" is required reading for all local high school juniors, drama teacher Maria Laird noted. Nevertheless, the play's heightened emotions and serious subject matter present a challenge for student performers.

"I wanted to present a play that really pushed the students and challenged them," Laird said. "For the past few seasons, we've done really light plays and musicals like 'Cinderella.' This year, I wanted to give students the chance to portray something that was real."

The challenge for young thespians, Laird added, is to dig deep and draw on authentic emotions. "The Crucible gives them the chance to get up on stage and show true emotion instead of just pretending."

Junior Grant Burmeister, who portrays Rev. John Hale in the play, said the most challenging part of acting in "The Crucible" has been memorizing Miller's dialogue, which approximates the more formal, verbose speech patterns of colonial Salem.

"Memorizing all the dialogue has definitely been the hardest part," he


Laird agreed.

"The language is so important to this play," she said. "I'm working with the students to help them understand the importance of every single word and every phrase."


Sophomore Abby Watson - who portrays Susanna Walcott - said the play's dark subject matter is a departure from typical student theatrical productions.

"The play really has no hope and it's just really difficult to portray that hopeless feeling," she said. "It's been very challenging for everyone, but I've really connected with everything we're doing here."







life, which, however, we have borne, and come through.






