## 2024 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

### Several questions on April municipal election ballot

On the April 2 municipal election ballot, residents will be asked to vote on several tax questions and propositions.

In addition to numerous contested races for city councils and school boards, voters across the county will also be asked to consider some questions. The Star-Journal is listing all ballot questions that were filed with the Johnson County Clerk's Office for the 2024 municipal election, but only voters within each particular voting district will see the question on their ballot.

#### City of Warrensburg

##### Question 1

Shall the City of Warrensburg, Missouri, be authorized to continue a sales tax of one-half of one percent (0.5%) for the purpose of funding capital improvements which may include the retirement of debt under previously authorized bonded indebtedness? This tax would be collected for a term of 20 years after its effective date, would be an extension of the current tax set to expire on Dec. 31, 2025, and would expire on Dec. 31, 2045.

#### City of Holden

##### Question 1

Shall the City of Holden, Missouri, issue its general obligation bonds in the amount of \$900,000 for the purpose of acquiring a fire truck and other equipment, and acquiring, renovating, and improving municipal buildings, for public safety and emergency preparedness purposes?

#### Holden School District

##### Proposition K.I.T.S.

Shall the Board of Education of the Holden R-III School District, Missouri, be authorized to increase the operating tax levy by \$0.2204 to \$3.7500 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation for the purposes of attracting and retaining quality certified teachers and support staff and meeting additional operating expenses?

Highlights of 2023 for Warrensburg Main Street included:

  - Vacancy rate declined to 11%.

...ant in shaping the community," DeBacker said. "Their unwavering commitment to Warrensburg Main Street is evident through their generous donations, both in kind and financially, over the years."

Standing in the Gap, a local men's addiction recovery center, won the 2023 Community Partner of the Year Award, but was unable to attend. It was nominated for its

## Parson's final State of State touts abortion ban, infrastructure spending

In his final address to a joint session of the Missouri General Assembly, Gov. Mike Parson on Wednesday pointed to outlawing abortion, increasing infrastructure spending and appointing five statewide office holders as the legacy of his six years in office.

"I'll be leaving here with my head held high," Parson told lawmakers during his annual State of the State address.

Parson can't seek re-election because of term limits. After years in the legislature, and 18 months as lieutenant governor, he was elevated to the state's highest office in 2018 after then-Gov. Eric Greitens was forced to resign in disgrace.

He was elected to a full four-year term in 2020.

When he took over, Parson said, Missourians were "tired of the turmoil, political infighting and self involved personalities. They were tired of quitters."

"We declared a fresh start and the return of stability," he said. "We committed to ensuring the next generations have their opportunity at the American Dream. We promised the return of integrity. Above all, we promised to return a people first mentality to state government, and that's our final commitment to Missourians. Until our final day, we'll continue putting people first."

Twice during his speech he noted that abortion is illegal in Missouri, thanks to a bill he signed in 2019 that included a trigger that outlawed the procedure if the U.S. Supreme Court ever struck down Roe v. Wade.

That Supreme Court ruling eventually came in 2022. Abor-

tion-rights advocates have now launched an initiative petition campaign seeking to overturn the ban.

"We fought the fight for life," Parson said in his speech.

Infrastructure spending has been the main thrust of Parson's agenda during his time in office. He told lawmakers Wednesday that over the last six years Missouri has rebuilt more than 1,000 bridges and repaired 50% of its entire highway system.

But the infrastructure project that could be his biggest legacy is Interstate 70.

Parson had hoped to rebuild portions of the interstate as part of his budget proposal last year. Legislative leaders decided the governor's plan didn't go far enough, boosting funding to \$1.4 billion in general revenue and \$1.4 billion in borrowed funds to widen the interstate across the state.

"The expansion of I-70 has been talked about in this build-

ing for decades. Decades of hot air. Decades of passing the buck," he said. "Under our administration, this General Assembly and the leadership of (Senate Appropriations Chairman Lincoln) Hough, decades of inaction turned to action. This summer, construction on I-70 is set to begin in Columbia."

Parson also noted the fact that he's filled vacancies in three statewide offices, appointing Vivek Malek as treasurer, Mike Kehoe as lieutenant governor and Andrew Bailey as attorney general. He previously appointed Eric Schmitt attorney general and Scott Fitzpatrick as treasurer.

And he said his administration has "reshaped our Supreme Court and judiciary as a whole. We've protected Second Amendment rights, focused on law and order and safeguarded Missouri's landmark castle doctrine."

Jamie Platt knew she wanted to pursue a career in art at the age of 5.

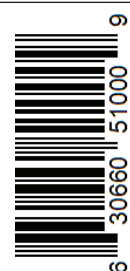

### David 'DG' George Johnson

When people met David "DG" George Johnson and asked what the DG stood for, he would always tell them, "Darn Good." At the age of 79, on Friday, Jan. 19, 2024, at Lee's Summit Medical Center in Lee's Summit, Missouri, DG passed away peacefully, surrounded by his family.



DG was born on Nov. 6, 1944, in Harrisonville, Missouri, the son of George Girdner Johnson and Hazel Louise (Bradley) Johnson. DG married his wife of 36 years, Virginia "Ginger" Sue (Schalue) Johnson, at Cedar Grove Christian Church in Johnson County, Missouri, on July 11, 1987.

Reflecting on his 79 years, I believe "Darn Good" was more than just an opening joke. His journey began with his early years dedicated to hard work on the Johnson farms near Latour, Missouri. After graduating from Harrisonville High School in 1962 and completing two years at CMSU, his playful and teasing nature continued to evolve. Even throughout his career, there are countless hilarious and infamous stories about DG's hard work and playfulness at the old Kansas City Stockyards and book binderies. He dedicated two decades to Anchor Labs; later, transforming into Model Farm Service, an animal supply store where he started in the early 1960s, before transitioning to Interstate Book Bindery and Harmony Printing, where he eventually retired in 2009.

Friends were many, and DG was most widely revered for his BBQ. DG and best friend Craig Kidwell formed the team that later became the Boys of BBQ and Patty, which competed, and oftentimes won, contests all across the Midwest, including the annual American Royal BBQ contest for more than 30 years. DG loved his friends and community, displaying his faith through his church at Cedar Grove, where he served as a deacon for many years. He showed his compassion and love for others through the Kansas City-based Kookers Kare BBQ charity that his teammates founded and grew along with other BBQ teams and friends from the

Kansas City BBQ society.

When DG wasn't tending to a smoker full of meat, you'd catch him tinkering with his old tractor, indulging in the restoration of classic hot rods, pursuing woodworking, or simply out mowing. Yet, his most cherished moments unfolded in the backyard, alongside his wife and family, watching the kids and his granddaughter play and grow. Especially on the Fourth of July, he had a knack for surprising everyone with the loudest firecracker, often tossed when you least expected it. And, of course, there was always BBQ at every family gathering.

DG is survived by his wife, Ginger Johnson of Holden, MO; two daughters, Deborah Johnson of Harrisonville and Susan Hagerman of Lee's Summit; one son, Luke Johnson (Janelle) of Warsaw; one granddaughter, Katie Hagerman of Lee's Summit; one brother, Charles "Hunky" Johnson (Nita) of Garden City, and his dog Buddy. DG is preceded in death by his parents, George G. Johnson and Hazel "Louise" Johnson; sister Marie (Johnson) Kimberlin and her husband Tom Kimberlin; and nephew, Casey Johnson.

In remembrance of DG, we can almost see him shake his head and hear him saying, "Good Grief" if he saw us making a fuss today. Until the day we reunite, let us carry forward his joking spirit with the words he often shared: "Talk at ya later" and "Glad you got to see me." May his wit and warmth continue to echo in our hearts as we cherish the memories of a life well-lived.

hours of service and community dedication. DeBacker expressed gratitude for the group, and said she's excited to keep working with them.

2023 Volunteer of the Year was won by Christina Kerns, who serves on the Main Street design committee. Other nominees included Airman Garrett Deschazo, Heather Harrison, and Wade Meyer.

"Christina often comes early or stays late to volunteer at numerous events over the last year. (She) is one of those volunteers we hope every organization has," DeBacker said.

Quarry City Properties won the 2023 Downtown Rehabilitation Project award for its project at 109 and 111 W. Culton St. Runner-up for the award was the Warrensburg Convention and Visitors Bureau with its rehabilitation project of the new Visitors Center in downtown Warrensburg.

# Parson proposes record \$52.7 billion state budget

Spending from large federal grants and a shrinking but substantial state surplus will propel Missouri to record spending in the coming year if lawmakers adopt the \$52.7 billion budget proposal from Gov. Mike Parson.

Unlike last year's budget proposal, which included nearly \$900 million from general revenue to improve Interstate 70, Parson has no large proposals for using the surplus that was nearly \$6.4 billion at the end of December.

Instead, increases in ongoing spending, including raises for teachers, more for higher education and childcare and funding to study improvements on Interstate 44 are among the more notable items in the fiscal 2025 budget.

Last year, lawmakers boosted Parson's plan for I-70 to \$1.4 billion in general revenue and \$1.4 billion in borrowed funds for widening the highway from Wentzville to Blue Springs. Interest from that money, about \$14 million, will pay for studies to do the same for all or portions

of I-44. In an advance copy of his annual State of the State address, Parson said he's proud of the investments his administration has made in roads and bridges. "While road and bridge repair might not be the most exciting topic...it is one that impacts all Missourians the most," Parson was expected to tell a joint session of the legislature on Wednesday. Overall, the budget anti-

pates spending \$15 billion from general revenue, which will reduce the surplus in that fund to about \$1.5 billion by June 30, 2025. Parson will leave office in January and that is the biggest surplus any governor has left the state, Aaron Willard, Parson's chief of staff, told reporters shortly before Parson's speech. "We really believe that we have overseen transformational changes in the state of Missouri,

and I did not say that lightly," Willard said.

Highlights of the budget proposal include:

- A \$120.6 million increase to fully fund the education foundation formula at \$3.7 billion, plus \$14 million to fully fund school transportation and \$4 million to boost base teacher pay to \$40,000 a year.
  - A 3% increase for higher education operating budgets plus \$314.7 million to fund new construction on all two- and four-year institutions.
  - A 3.2% pay raise for all state workers, plus an increase for longevity - 1% for every two years on the job up to 10% - for employees who work in residential facilities such as youth incarceration centers, state schools and mental health facilities.
  - \$1.5 billion in federal funds to expand broadband access statewide.
  - \$51.7 million to increase state subsidies for child care.
- When Parson signed the current year's budget - after vetoing 201 spending items, totaling \$555 million - the surplus of all state funds stood at about \$8 billion. After transferring

money for the I-70 project, plus setting aside \$300 million for expansion of the Missouri Capitol Building, the surplus in all funds is about \$6.4 billion, including \$4.3 billion of general revenue.

Budget officials anticipate that the general revenue surplus will be reduced to about \$3 billion by the end of June, when the fiscal year concludes.

Revenues are stable at about \$13.1 billion annually but growth will be negligible. As a result, income tax cuts based on revenue growth will be delayed, officials said.

Through Tuesday, revenues during the current fiscal year have grown by 0.7% and if that trend continues, the treasury will take in \$142 million more than estimated. That won't, however, be enough to trigger the next step in a series of tax cuts passed during a fall 2022 special session.

The current top rate on income taxes is 4.8% and will fall to 4.7% in the year after revenues grow by at least \$200 million. Two additional tax cuts, also predicated on \$200 million in revenue growth, are also in state law.

# 'Freedom Caucus' leaders ousted from Senate chairmanships over stall tactics

The Republican civil war in the Missouri Senate reached a new crescendo of strife Tuesday, when Senate President Pro Tem Caleb Rowden stripped four members of their committee chairs and declared he was acting against "a small group of swamp creatures."

The action toward members of the newly formed Freedom Caucus took away traditional prerogatives of senior legislators and even relegated the targeted four to parking spots as far from the Missouri Capitol building as possible.

Rowden said he was forced to act after caucus members tied up the Senate for 11 hours on Thursday in an unsuccessful attempt to force action on bills making it harder to pass an initiative petition.

"The beginning of the 2024 legislative session in the Missouri Senate has been nothing short of an embarrassment," Rowden said at a news conference. "A chamber designed to be occupied by civil, principled statesmen and women, has been overtaken by a small group of swamp creatures who all too often remind me more of my children than my colleagues."

Members of the Freedom Caucus responded in a news conference of their own, then took their complaints to the Senate floor. For almost four hours, they filibustered approval of the journal and complained about Rowden's punitive measures.

Rowden, said Sen. Rick Brattn of Harrisonville, is "somebody that wants to go out and say that we're bringing peace, yet wants to bring nothing but war."

Both sides accused the other of using public attention on the fight to win votes in statewide primaries later this year. Three of the members who were stripped of chairmanships - Sens. Bill Eigel, Denny Hoskins and Andrew Koenig - are seeking statewide office, as is Rowden.

Rowden and Hoskins, a Warrensburg Republican, are both running for secretary of state.

"The chaos caucus has chosen to use the Missouri Senate as a place to try and salvage their languishing statewide cam-

paigns and intentionally destroy the institution in an effort to claim that the game is rigged against them," Rowden said.

Hoskins, however, saw the action as a desperate attempt by Rowden to revive his campaign.

"Senator Rowden is using the same playbook that Joe Biden is using on President Trump on me to try and silence me and win and beat me in a statewide race by using his position of power to be punitive," Hoskins said.

When the afternoon floor session ended, it did not silence either side.

Rowden held a second news conference of the day outside his office, but not before Eigel approached reporters to get his version told.

"It's never been about policy for them," Eigel said. "It's been about individuals trying to preserve power at the expense of what we believe are the issues that Republicans sent us to Jefferson City for."

Rowden suggested every rule to propel debate forward could be invoked, including a rarely used motion to cut off filibusters.

"Everything is on the table," Rowden said. "We are going to get this place working again."

The committee changes Rowden announced are:

Hoskins lost a seat on the Senate Appropriations Committee and chairmanship of the Economic Development and Tax Policy Committee.

Eigel, a candidate for governor, was removed

as chairman of the Veterans, Military Affairs and Pensions Committee.

Brattn was removed as chair of the Select Committee on the Protection of Missouri Assets from Foreign Adversaries and vice chairmanships of Veterans, Military Affairs and Pensions Committee and Education and Workforce Development.

Koenig, a candidate for state treasurer, was removed as chairman of the Education and Workforce Development Committee.

The Freedom Caucus includes six Republican senators - most of whom were part of the disbanded conservative caucus that tied up floor action in 2021 and 2022. The other two - Sens. Jill Carter of Joplin and Nick Schroer of Defiance - did not lose

any committee seats or their parking spots.

After the news conferences, Eigel held the Senate floor for much of the next four hours, questioning several of the members who appeared in support of Rowden.

When Eigel asked if it was policy differences that led to the new schism, Rowden said it was the Freedom Caucus tactics.

"What you did last week was aimed at undercutting the floor leader," Rowden said.

The filibuster on Thursday was intended to force a committee referral of a bill making it harder to pass a constitutional amendment by initiative petition. When that failed, members of the Freedom Caucus filibus-

Tuesday to take that issue off the table by referring every bill introduced so far in the session to a committee.

"I'm willing to take the bullet out of my gun, which is me having the power to say I'm going to refer or not refer," Rowden said.

Eigel said it was too late for peacemaking, since the gun was already empty.

"You fired it when you fired four members from the chairmanship of their committees," Eigel said. "You just fired the biggest bullet you had in your gun."

Eigel asked state Sen. Rusty Black of Chillicothe about Rowden's decision to strip chairmanships and whether it will benefit the Senate.

"Short term, you go through hell," Black said. "In the end, you have to decide whether it was worth it or not."

A privilege for senior members of the Senate is a parking spot in the Capitol basement. Eigel chuckled when he realized his parking spot had been reassigned.

"Oh no, they've done it now," he said. "The swamp is going to win. They've taken our parking spots."

While the 24 Republicans fought, the 10 Democrats in the chamber stayed mainly quiet. Senate Minority Leader John Rizzo of Independence said the GOP fight created headlines that expose their weakness.

"The Republicans' fighting is masking their failures, as they are failing to address the issues Missourians truly care about," Rizzo said.

The state needs action on healthcare funding, education and childcare, Rizzo said.

"Or," he said, "they can keep stumbling down the dead-end-road of personal attacks and partisan pandering."

## GARDEN CORNER

### Pick a theme, any theme

The desire for change often seems to accompany a new year. It comes with the desire to be better and to do better, and gardeners often want it to be the year of the best garden ever. If you are thinking of starting a new garden, a new planting area, or just revamping a current garden, then consider picking a gardening theme.

Picking a theme for a garden comes with advantages for new and current gardeners. One important advantage is keeping the gardener focused in a world where there are hundreds of plants and thousands of seeds to choose from. Another advantage is that it brings cohesiveness to a design. A third advantage is that it encourages gardeners to research and learn more about a variety of plants and expand their gardening knowledge.

A good garden starts with good soil, and a soil test through your county extension office will get you off to a great start. Observe your site and the amount of sun it gets. Also, observe the site on rainy days to see if drainage is an issue and also on freezing days to see if it is in a frost pocket or an area where frost settles first or stays longer.

Consider some of the following themes: Limited color palette, medicinal or tea garden, cottage garden, wildlife or butterfly garden, fragrant garden, moon garden, or a miniature railroad or fairy garden. Possibilities are really open to your imagination. Once you delve into a theme, you will have more than enough plants to choose from. Just be sure to consider that the growing conditions of a particular plant match the conditions you have to offer.

While the internet is a great source of information, don't forget to visit the library, as books tend to delve deeper into specifics. Your county extension office website, extension.missouri.edu, also has information on several of the themes mentioned. The Master Gardeners of Johnson County occasionally has programs on themes such as wildlife and butterfly gardens and they meet at 6 p.m. on the fourth Thursday of each month at the Grover Park Baptist Church Family Life Center. Check the group's Facebook page for more information.

In order for your garden to express your chosen theme, you need to keep your focus on that theme and put blinders on in the garden center and when seed shopping. If choosing a color palette, remember that you will always have at least a second color as the foliage is always present. The famous Sissinghurst Castle's white garden is really a white and green garden. If designing for a fairy or railroad garden, then leaf size and mature height are important, as the plants need to be in scale with the ornamentation.

A tropical-themed garden will have plants with big lush leaves, need regular water, and the hardiness of plants will need to be considered carefully. A shrubbery may be a good choice in a large area and can require less weekly maintenance after it is established. A rockery is an option if you desire plants that need sharp drainage and a stump is a good consideration for a woodland or shady area. Is your mind reeling with possibilities yet?

If you are revamping a current garden, then take it slow. It will take a bit longer to relocate current plants and move things around than it will to start on a piece of fresh ground. If you are starting fresh, cover your chosen area to smother weeds/grass now (after the snow melts), and this will save work on site preparation later.

Pick a theme, research appropriate plants, and go slow so you can have a themed garden (or two) that you can live with for a long time. Gardening with a theme in mind can breathe new life into the garden and into the New Year.

## BEN ON WINE

### Giving the Oregon versions of pinot noir a try

Let us take a look at a can of peas. When you pick up a can of peas at the supermarket, do you look at the label to see where the peas were grown or the farm where they came from? Are the peas foreign or domestic? What section of the country and what year were they grown? Or even the name of the variety of peas that are in that tiny little can? Of course, you don't.

With wine, each and every one of those questions must, by law, appear on the label, be easy to read and could result in whether you buy the wine or not. Another fact that must be considered is that the grapes grown in one part of a country can be totally different from the same variety of grapes grown in other places in the same country.

But it gets worse. There can be major differences between grapes from one vineyard to another. I have often used the fact that two of the finest vineyards in Burgundy, France, that make wines that sell for the equivalent of a king's ransom are separated by a vineyard growing the same pinot noir grape variety but whose grapes make a lesser wine. It is proof positive of the well-used adage, location, location, location.

This dissertation on location is to bring to the reader's attention a fine winemaking district right here in the USA that has been producing excellent wines for many years and, in my opinion, has never received the accolades and publicity that it most positively deserves: the wines of the Willamette Valley in the State of Oregon.

The popular Burgundian grape

varieties, pinot noir and chardonnay, have found a very friendly home in the Willamette Valley, which rewards the farmers, winemakers and wine lovers with wines that can easily compete in style and quality with the best of the same varieties from anywhere in the world.

I was privileged to have an opportunity to sample some of Oregon's wines and I offer my experience with them to you.

I must admit to being a pinot noir curmudgeon who has, in recent years, tasted many that just weren't there. Yes, they were supposed to be pinot noir or a chardonnay, and some even had popular brand labels and impressive price tags, but the unique beauty that separates these wines from the rest was not to be found. The Oregonian versions of this variety that I recently sampled, however, were all fine examples of what these varieties could and should be like.

**Planet Oregon 2022 Pinot Noir (\$24)**

I must say that this wine is a fine

example of a well-made yet affordable pinot noir. Good grapes make good wines no matter where they come from or what they cost.

This wine accents all of the flavors and aromas that make for a good pinot noir: cherries and rose petals in the aroma and cherries and vanilla in the flavor. It is a bright and open wine with a soft fruit flavor and an interesting aftertaste.

While this wine has not been made to be an imitation or rival to the great and super expensive Burgundian pinot noirs of France, it is most certainly a fine example of a well-made domestic pinot noir that offers everything that has made the variety so popular.

**Soter Estates 2021 Pinot Noir (\$60)**

Where most winemakers struggle with this grape, Soter Estates has made it a star.

The traditional aromas of cherries and rose petals that are the signature of wines made from this grape are prominent and are joined by the aromas of cranberries. The cranberry aroma carries over to the flavor where it mingles with cherry and plum. The background of this wine proves to be just as interesting, displaying cinnamon, clove, dark chocolate, oak, and vanilla, which carry over to the finish, where they slowly trail off, ending in a smoky sensation. It is about as enjoyable as they come.

# Ashcroft accuses auditor of political attack over criticism in report

An audit accusing his office of illegally withholding information and failing to document withdrawal from a national elections clearinghouse is a “deep state” political attack, Missouri Secretary of State Jay Ashcroft told reporters Tuesday.

On Monday, State Auditor Scott Fitzpatrick issued an audit of Ashcroft’s office and gave his administration a “fair” rating, the second-lowest rating and a downgrade from a previous audit. The reasons, Fitzpatrick said, were that Ashcroft illegally withheld documentation of cybersecurity checks for local election authorities.

“The law clearly provides our audit staff with the authority to receive and review this information, and it’s disappointing the Secretary of State’s Office stood in the way of our efforts to perform a thorough analysis of how the new cyber security reviews have been implemented,” Fitzpatrick said in a news release. “Going forward I hope the office, and all governmental entities, will follow the law and respect the duty we have to provide taxpayers with a better understanding of how government is operating and that their tax dollars are being used efficiently.”

The audit also said Ashcroft “refused” to provide reports from the elections clearinghouse known as the Electronic Registration Information Center, or ERIC, which checks voter registration in several states.

At a news conference, Ashcroft accused Fitzpatrick of stepping outside his authority in seeking the cybersecurity information. Instead, Ashcroft said, Fitzpatrick is chasing headlines.

“These are political opinions under the guise of an audit report that are being put forth by an agency that doesn’t even understand the issues that they’re talking about,” Ashcroft said.

Both Ashcroft and Fitzpatrick are Republicans.

The audit comes as Ashcroft is trying to use his eight-year tenure in the secretary of state’s office as a springboard to the governorship. He is opposed in the GOP primary by Lt. Gov. Mike Kehoe of Jefferson City and state Sen. Bill Eigel of Weldon Spring.

In addition to questioning Fitzpatrick’s motives for the audit’s statements, Ashcroft also suggested he doesn’t have control of his staff.

“It’s understandable why the people of this country and the people of Missouri can think that’s just the deep state when things like this happen,” Ashcroft said.

Asked to clarify what he meant, Ashcroft added: “I don’t know how much the state auditor actually had to do with this. This audit, reasonably, we could expect that this was done by bureaucrats in his office.”

A spokesman for the auditor’s office did not immediately respond to a request for comment on Ashcroft’s accusations.

In the audit, Fitzpatrick pointed to a 2022 elections bill as the source of the requirement for a cyber security review by the secretary of state’s office or a firm specializing in cyber security reviews once every 2 years.

“Because the (secretary of state) refused to cooperate, audit staff were unable to obtain sufficient evidence to evaluate the steps taken by the (secretary of state) to comply with the new state law,”

Fitzpatrick’s release about the audit stated.

Ashcroft, however, said his office signed non-disclosure agreements with local election authorities and could not legally release the information.

“We were quite happy to go before the courts, to go before a judge, which is what you’re supposed to do when you have a disagreement about the law,” Ashcroft said. “Their office did not want to do that.”

In addition, Ashcroft noted that the law did not take effect until after the period covered by the audit, the two fiscal years ending June 30, 2022.

In the section of the audit about ERIC, Fitzpatrick said Ashcroft’s

office failed to evaluate the benefits of membership in the organization

that helps identify duplicate registrations and deceased voters.

“The data shows during the five years the state was a member of ERIC, the (secretary of state) and local election authorities (LEAs) were provided information on over 770,000 potentially duplicate voter registration records and over 21,000 deceased voter registration records,” the audit news release stated. “Election administrators in Missouri’s largest election jurisdiction, St. Louis County, used ERIC reports to remove thousands of deceased voters from their voter rolls alone.”

Ashcroft, however, argued that the benefits of ERIC were outweighed by its partisan board and tilt. It wasn’t efficient for Missouri, he said, in part

because only three of the eight neighboring states were members.

“It just wasn’t providing what it should,” Ashcroft said. “Frankly, it was a somewhat partisan organization. It’s not right to use taxpayer dollars for partisan purposes.”

Ashcroft said Fitzpatrick is making judgments about how the secretary of state’s office should operate without full knowledge.

“This isn’t about money disappearing,” Ashcroft said. “This isn’t about the books not adding up. This is a political judgment by the state auditor about something that he really doesn’t have expertise on about how Missouri should run its elections.”

than 300 miles south for her graduate degree at Indiana University Bloomington. While being a student beyond the teacher's desk, Platt also began getting behind one herself, as she taught painting, color theory and design during her two years at IU.

Platt would spend more than a decade working as an independent visual artist, a part-time faculty member at Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis, and an instructor at The Smithsonian Associates in Washington, D.C. But, she wanted to go back to school.

In January 2019, Platt's next educational escapade took her further east. She traveled to Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia, to be its gallery director. Throughout her four years there, Platt pushed through the hardships brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic and worked to broaden the art community in Huntington.

"I was doing things that were way out of my comfort zone," Platt said. "I felt like I was learning to be nimble in a way that I had never been before."

But, she sought something bigger.

That something was an opportunity to be the Gallery and Events Director at the University of Central Missouri. Now, having been at UCM for a year, Platt has built an albeit short but impressive line of work in Warrensburg.

First impressions

UCM Art & Design Associate Professor Marco Rosichelli was on the committee that hired Platt last January. He had a visual of what was needed for the position of gallery director.

"I would say someone who's really organized was high on my list. Someone that presented well, that could speak well, had a vision for the gallery, and someone that could look at things creatively and bring some energy to the position," Rosichelli said.

First impressions are key to landing any job. For Platt, it seems like she made a good impression on everyone she met.

"From the very beginning, she had sort of a vision of what she wanted to do with the gallery. Some of those things I think are common a lot among a lot of applicants," Rosichelli said. "But her vision was unique."

Rosichelli said Platt brought a sense of "energy and enthusiasm" for the position that set her apart from other candidates.

"My first impression was her sincerity and her ability to really

connect with people individually," UCM Art Education Professor Rahila Weed said. "In addition to that, she had a very strong representation of what she had done at other institutions in a similar position and ideas for the future."

Weed was Platt's supervisor for eight months as the Chair of the Department of Art and Design. She has spent 18 years in the UCM Art & Design department.

"I would say enthusiastic, outgoing, organized, efficient," Mid-Missouri Artists President Rebecca Limback said. "She already has us on the schedule for the summer exhibition in June."

Flourishing future

Building a sense of community in the art program has been a goal for Platt since day one in Warrensburg.

To foster that, Platt has taken a page out of her time at Marshall. When Platt first stepped into the gallery director role in Huntington, the "Art Lease" program was already up and running. The program allowed local businesses, like law firms or banks, to lease artwork to hang in their workplaces. Made by faculty, students and staff, the art allowed the everyday citizen to see works made in their community and encouraged them to further support the schools.

"When you have a small town with a university (with) an art

program, it's really great if they can find a way to partner with each other so that the students can feel more grounded in the community," Platt said.

Upon joining UCM, Platt recognized the program was at her disposal and anticipated a positive response from the community.

"When you have people who are not necessarily connected to the arts, (they) feel a little bit intimidated about going into a gallery space," Platt said. "People have a chance to look at it on their own time and form their own feelings, without the pressure of being in the gallery."

In addition to the "Art Lease" program, exhibitions and workshops have also allowed people to connect with the art at UCM. Recently, the "Empowered by Design" exhibition and the Gallery Kids and Gallery Grownups workshops have showcased the fun of art to the community.

"She has a really great way of making those connections with people who walk in the door and look at the art or the artists who are coming to drop off their work or the students who show up for a show," Weed said. "That's a real talent to make people feel comfortable in an art space, because that's not always the case."

"She's been curating some interesting shows, and filling all of the gallery spaces," Rosichelli

"The legacy of Gov. Parson is riddled with a lot of unfortunate events," she said. "He talked about a lot of really great things that he accomplished, but we didn't talk about the (Department of Revenue) director who had to get fired for fumbling the tax tables and charging Missourians too much in their taxes. We didn't talk about a Department of Health director who tracked women's periods."

She added: "There are a lot of things that we could talk about that have not been great within this administration."

said. "She's also been doing this art loan program that she started, lending out artworks or renting out artworks to local businesses where they can have them up in their offices. And so all of that's been really great to see."

While her job title is with UCM, Platt has also reached out to and impacted local organizations like the Mid-Missouri Artists.

"The exhibitions have just really been a nice, wonderful variety of different kinds of mediums and artists. It's accessible right here in Warrensburg, so it's a great thing for the community," Limback said.

As for what the future holds for Platt, only time will truly tell the impact she makes in Warrensburg.

"She's really trying to touch on all of our majors, touch on all of our students, whether they be men or women, people of color," Weed said. "Making it broader and more diverse. I'm excited about all of the different things that she's doing to bring the community in because I think that's just going to make this a more vibrant place."

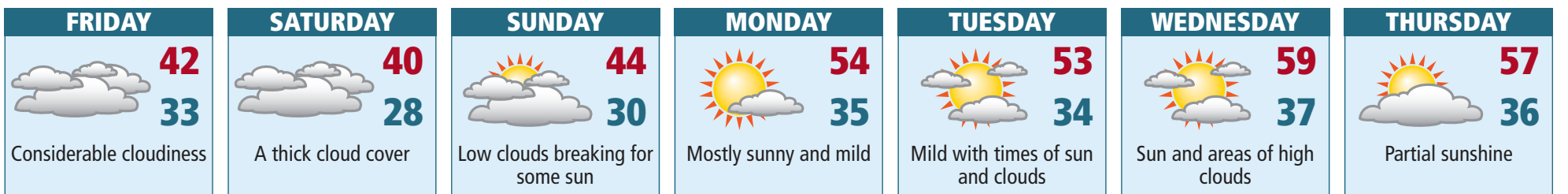

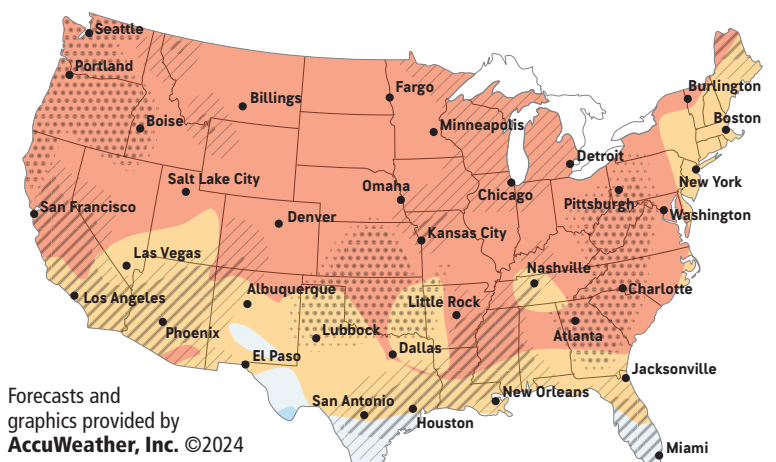
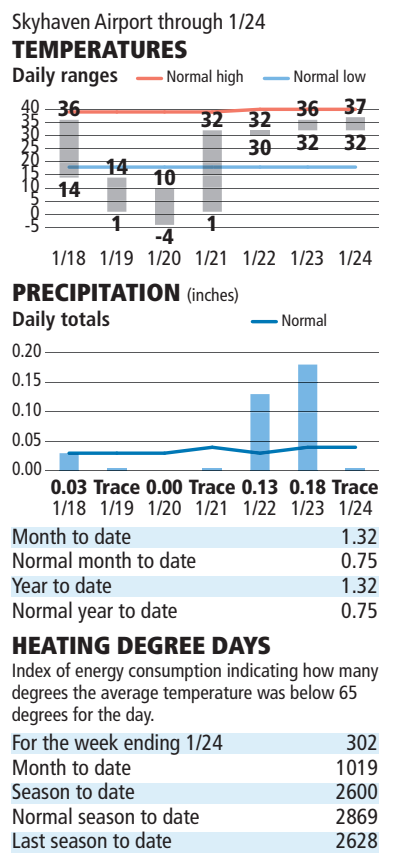

**CENTERVIEW** — The final moments of the fourth quarter allowed Leeton boys basketball to close out a 54-49 win against Concordia in the F&C Bank Cougar Classic consolation semifinal round Wednesday, Jan. 24, at Crest Ridge Middle School.

The Bulldogs led by six points heading into the final eight minutes. They used the free-throw line along with shooting success from senior Camden Uptegrove that carried pretty much game-long, to ice their first win in five games.

“We’ve been in these close games all year,” Leeton head coach Ross Shull said. “This is the first one that has been under three points, four points at the end that we pulled through. It was just nice that we were able to pull one out. Even though it wasn’t very great execution down the stretch, we executed OK but we just didn’t hit our free throws when they were fouling. That makes it look like we didn’t execute, but we actually did a decent job of it.”

The Bulldogs (6-12) sank 4-of-8

attempts at the charity stripe in the fourth quarter to go along with three triples from Uptegrove and a jumper from freshman Harper Shaffer.

Uptegrove’s scoring helped Leeton’s advantage develop into fruition. He had a game-high 26 points, and sank a total of five triples.

Junior Reyd Johnson elevated Leeton further, posting 14 points. Sophomore Anthony Guttridge had nine.

“We shot the ball at a higher percentage than we have the last week and a half, so it made it look like we played better,” Shull said. “We had a little more intensity on defense and rebounding. That helped us clear a bunch of their missed shots. We played pretty good defense for the most part.”

The Bulldogs initially trailed 14-9 at the end of the first quarter, but led 24-19 at halftime and 39-33 at the end of the third quarter.

Sophomore Carson Droege led the Orioles (5-10) with 13 points, just ahead of sophomore Caleb Fuehring’s 12, junior Kellen Fiene’s 11 and junior Aaron Brown’s 10.

Fuehring had six of Concordia’s

14 points in the first quarter, but proceeded to only sink one shot in the second, third and fourth.

“They’re a good team for us to play and good competition with the way they play,” Shull said. “They’re physical and they try to go to the basket and score. It was nice, we were getting to spots where we were cutting drives off and forcing them out of their rhythm and what they wanted to do. That was big in the second quarter on keep holding them there.”

Leeton moves on to face Holden in the consolation championship game at 8:45 p.m. Friday, Jan. 26, at Crest Ridge High School.

“It’s just nice to get a win,” Shull said. “We have been on the struggle bus hardcore on this,” Shull said. “It lifted the boys’ spirit, so maybe the season won’t drag on a couple of weeks before we find another spot where we can find a win. I’m proud of how they came back after last night’s ugliness that we dealt with. They didn’t give up. They came out, played hard. That’s all I can really ask for.”

# Central Missouri softball picked sixth in preseason MIAA poll

Central Missouri softball was picked to finish in the middle of the pack in the MIAA Preseason Coaches’ Poll.

The list ranked the Jennies sixth out of 14 teams, two spots lower than they finished last season. UCM went 33-21 last season, including 16-10 in MIAA play.

Returning members of Central Missouri’s lineup include redshirt senior outfielder MaKenzie Cooper, senior outfielder/first baseman Abby Allnutt, sophomore infielder/outfielder Jadyn Sheffield, senior infielder/outfielder Aubrie McRoberts, junior catcher/infielder Halle Howes and junior catcher/outfielder Laney Killpack.

Cooper is the lone returner to have earned All-MIAA status last season, collecting honorable mention at utility with a .348 batting average and .543 slugging percentage in 48 games.

UCM averaged five runs per game last season, posting a .299 batting average and .423 slugging percentage.

The Jennies also return the majority of their pitching support from a year

ago, including sophomore Andi Siebeneck, redshirt junior Paige Petefish, junior Amanda Hansen, junior Kaylee Diggs and Sadie Parks.

Siebeneck anchored the group, compiling a 2.95 ERA and 9-4 record through 22 appearances. Of those included 16 starts.

The Jennies are heading into their 18th season under Susan Anderson, who has a 500-371 at the helm, 273-163 in the MIAA.

## The rest of the crew

Defending MIAA regular season and postseason champion Central Oklahoma received the top spot, collecting 11 out of 14 first place votes to earn 167 points.

Rogers State came in second with two first place votes and 153 points Missouri Southern was third with one first place votes and 139 points.

Washburn finished fourth with 136 points, Missouri Western finished fifth with 124 points, Pittsburg State finished seventh with 90 points, Fort Hays State finished eighth with 83 points, Emporia State finished ninth with 75 points, Northwest Missouri finished 10th with 60 points, Northeastern State finished 11th with

49 points, Nebraska Kearney finished 12th with 44 points, Newman finished 13th with 27 points and Lincoln finished 14th with 14 points.

## New face

The MIAA has one new head coach in Rachel Rhode, who was hired in September. She was previously an assistant at Truman State.

## Local talent

Outside of the Jennies’ local talent in Allnutt, a Warrensburg grad, and Parks, a Knob Noster grad, the MIAA also features Holden’s Maddie Sechrest.

Sechrest is one of seven pitchers on Lincoln’s roster.

## Road Warriors

Central Missouri begins its season in the Alvy Memorial Classic, slated for Feb. 9 through Feb. 11 in Bentonville, Arkansas.

If the schedule goes to plan, the Jennies will play their first 20 games on the road. They won’t be at the South Rec until a doubleheader against Southwest Baptist on March 12.

That doubleheader will start a 12 game stretch at home.

## New faces, but old friends

There are three new head coaches in the MIAA this year, highlighted by Northeastern State's Sunny Golloway, Emporia State's Brad Hill and Missouri Western's Damian Stammersky.

Hill and Stammersky have ties to the Mules. A UCM Hall of Famer and the Mules' all-time winning head coach, Hill coached in Warrensburg from 1995-2003, leading the Mules to the NCAA tournament in all nine years. UCM advanced to the DII College World Series, in seven.

Hill's tenure was capped by a national title in 2003. He moved on to Kansas State that offseason. He led the Wildcats from 2004-18, claiming a Big 12 title in 2013, and had a 462-383-3 record in Manhattan.

Hill had a short stint as an assistant for former Mules pitcher Josh Reynolds, the 1998 MIAA Freshman of the Year and 1999 MIAA MVP, at Northwestern University in 2021. The staff was not retrained upon the season's conclusion.

Stammersky was an assistant for current Mules skipper Kyle Crookes from 2014-2020, recruiting and coaching names that include 2019 Central Region Player of the Year Erik Webb, along with Warrensburg native Mason Janvrin, who was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the 14th round of the 2019 MLB Draft.

Stammersky went on to serve as the head coach at Colorado State Pueblo in 2021 before moving on to a recruiting coordinator position at Radford University in 2022. He served as an assistant under former Western head coach Buzz Verduzco in 2023.

Hill's Hornets will be in Warrensburg April 12-14, while Stammersky's Griffons visit March 26.

Missouri Southern is the only other team in the rankings, sitting at No. 23.

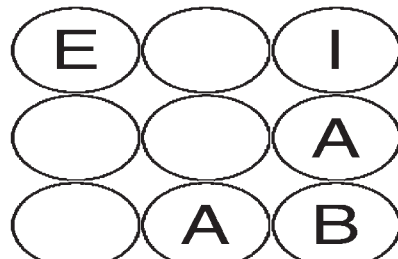

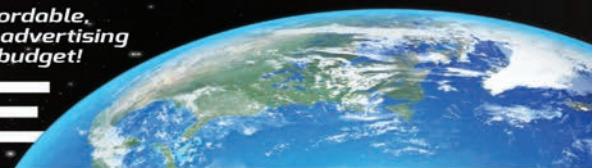
### "Feud: Capote vs. The Swans"

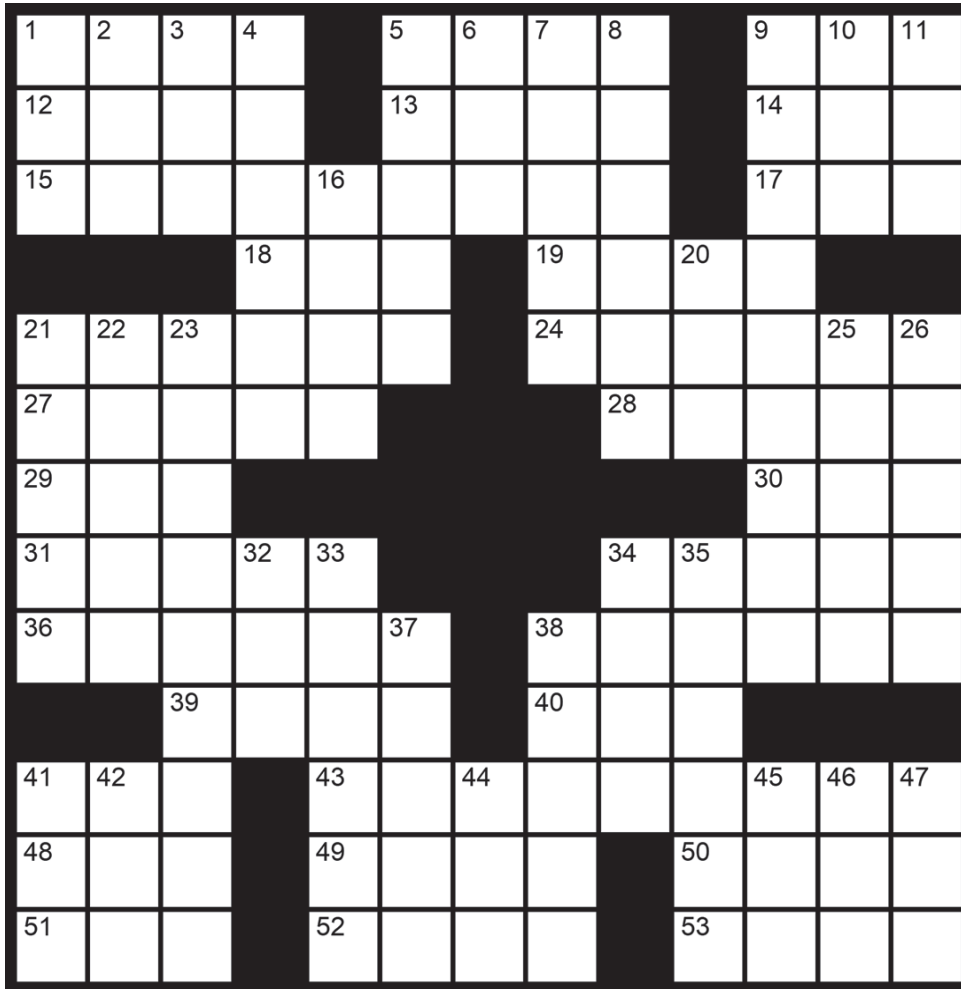
