Kristen Dorman to serve as Warrensburg Interim City Manager

WARRENSBURG — The City of Warrensburg has appointed Kristen Dorman to serve as its Interim City Manager, according to a press release from the city on Wednesday, Oct. 2.

The appointment, filling a need following the departure of former City Manager Danielle Dulin at the end of September, took effect Wednesday.

Dorman has been with Warrensburg since August as Assistant City Manager/Administrative Services Director, overseeing overseeing finance, information technology, human resources, municipal court and public works.

Before joining the City, Dorman served as the National Member Relations Director at the Alliance for Innovation from 2022-24. She also previously worked for the cities of Independence and Pleasant Hill from 2020-22. She holds a Master of Public Administration degree from Arizona State University.

Dorman will serve as Interim City Manager until a permanent replacement is appointed. The City of Warrensburg issued a request for proposals for executive recruitment services in August and is moving forward in this process to select a firm for the city manager search.

Warrensburg Management Analyst Jessica Ververtloh told the Star-Journal that the city is still in the early stages of its city manager recruitment process. A contract for recruitment services has not been approved, but the Warrensburg city council will look to approve one at a future meeting.

"Part of the role of the recruitment firm will be to help the City Council define what they are looking for in a manager along with input from the community," Ververtloh said via email.

After the approval of a contract, more detail will be available concerning what the City is looking for in its next city manager and what the process of selecting candidates and eventual finalists will look like.

On its anniversary, Mary Jane's Café to give back to JoCo Cancer Foundation

WARRENSBURG — As it celebrates 24 years of business, Mary Jane's Café wants to thank the community that has contributed to its success and give back to those that need it most.

The breakfast and lunch diner will offer \$5 cheeseburger meals on Friday, October 4, the day the café celebrates its 24th birthday. The meals include french fries and a drink and will be served from 10:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. All proceeds will go to the Johnson County Cancer Foundation.

"What they do is amazing," Mary Jane's Café Manager Brandy Wormsley said. "They've supported my family, supported so many of

our customers and friends that we know of who are battling cancer and they need a little extra income. They help pay bills, pay for travel and food, and it stays in Johnson County, so it's your friends, families, your neighbors, who are getting the support that they need."

Mary Jane's Café began donating to the JoCo Cancer Foundation in 2020 when it raised \$2,600 for the foundation.

For Wormsley, donating to the foundation is a way to honor her grandmother Mary Jane, who passed away from cancer in 1995 before the restaurant that bears her name could open.

"We'll try to push for more donations throughout the day from our customers, and just try to support their organization, because it means

a lot to us and a lot of other people," Wormsley said.

Founded in 2000, Mary Jane's Café is known for bringing love and comfort to the dining experience.

It was the dream of Mary Jane Zellmer to open a kind of café where people can enjoy the food and community served on a platter to them. When she passed at the age of 57, her husband William "Bill" Harper took over that dream and made it a reality by opening the café on North Charles Street.

Harper enrolled his daughter Gwendolyn Codilla and her husband Wilfredo to help him operate the restaurant. Harper would work at Mary Jane's until he died in 2005 at the age of 69.

11th annual Burg Fest to take over downtown next week

WARRENSBURG — Warrensburg Main Street will host its 11th annual Burg Fest on Friday, Oct. 11 and Saturday, Oct. 12 on the streets of downtown Warrensburg.

Kicking off the festivities, the University of Central Missouri Drumline and Cheerleaders will perform at 5:30 p.m. on Friday on the Johnson County Courthouse lawn.

Remarks will be made by Warrensburg Mayor Bruce Uhler, Johnson County Presiding Commissioner Troy Matthews and Main Street Executive Director Jamie DeBacker at the event's opening ceremony at 6 p.m. at its main stage on West Pine Street. UCM ROTC will present the nation's colors, with Jess Yarborough singing the national anthem.

The Evans Midland Empire Shows carnival returns to Burg Fest for its second year of fun on the courthouse parking lot. The carnival will be open to the public for three sessions from 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. on Friday evening, from noon to 5 p.m.

on Saturday afternoon and from 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. on Saturday evening.

"The community's excitement made Warrensburg Main Street bring back the Carnival to Burg Fest Street fair once again," DeBacker said. "Although last year

the carnival happened by luck and chance, the Burg Fest committee decided to work alongside Evans Midland Empire Shows to adjust Burg Fest weekend to allow for the carnival to return each year."

DeBacker said last year's festival drew

"around 30,000 people" over the two days, tripling the attendance for previous years.

Wristbands are \$25 each and new wristbands are required for each session. Tickets are \$1.00 per ticket, with each ride costing three to four tickets. Tick-

ets can be purchased from the carnival ticket booth located on Market Street by the Justice Center. Attendees can purchase 40 tickets for \$37.00 and 80 tickets for \$70.


Burg Fest offers over 120 vendors that will open at 4:30 p.m. on Friday and open again at 10 a.m. on Saturday. All vendors close at 8 p.m. on both days.

The beer garden on Pine Street will open at 4:30 p.m. on Friday and 1:30 p.m. on Saturday. The beer garden closes at 11 p.m. on both days.

Main Street is celebrating its 30th birthday on Saturday at Burg Fest, with activities including a Happy Hour from 2 pm until 4 pm at the beer garden, free cake and merchandise giveaways for the organization created in 1994. Main Street became the primary organization to head Burg Fest around 2017 and is excited to celebrate its birthday at the festival.

Throughout the two-day festival, local music will headline the main stage on Pine Street. The Nobodies and The Cedar Creek

US Department of Education begins testing of new FAFSA form

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Department of Education is launching the first testing period for its phased rollout of the 2025-26 form to apply for federal financial student aid on Tuesday, with more students set to partake in this beginning testing stage than initially expected.

The department announced in August it would be using a staggered approach to launch the 2025-26 Free Application for Federal Student Aid — or FAFSA — in order to address any issues that might arise before the form opens up to everyone by Dec. 1. The number of students able to complete the form will gradually increase throughout four separate testing stages, with the first one beginning Oct. 1.

The phased rollout makes the form fully available two months later than usual and comes as

the 2024-25 form — which got a makeover after Congress passed the FAFSA Simplification Act in late 2020 — faced a series of highly publicized hiccups that the department has worked to fix.

Earlier in September, the department announced six community-based organizations chosen to participate in the first testing period: Alabama Possible; Bridge 2 Life, in Florida; College AIM, in Georgia; Education is Freedom, in Texas; the Scholarship Foundation of Santa Barbara, in California; and the Scholarship Fund of Alexandria, in Virginia.

"Thanks to the wonderful organizations, we expect closer to 1,000 students in Beta 1 as opposed to the 100 we initially thought," FAFSA executive adviser Jeremy Singer said on a call with reporters Monday regarding the 2025-26 form.

During this first testing stage, U.S. Under Secre-

tary of Education James Kvaal said the department will process students' FAFSAs, "give students an opportunity to make corrections, if needed, and send the records to colleges and state agencies."

"Colleges will be able to use these same records when it's time for them to make financial aid offers," said Kvaal, who oversees higher education and financial aid, including the Office of Federal Student Aid.

Three more testing periods

The department on Monday also named 78 community-based organizations, governmental entities, high schools, school districts and institutions of higher education to participate in its three subsequent testing periods for the 2025-26 form.

Three of the community-based organizations chosen to take part in the first testing period — Flor-

ida's Bridge 2 Life; Texas' Education is Freedom; and Virginia's Scholarship Fund of Alexandria — will also participate in subsequent testing stages.

To help students and families prepare for the 2025-26 application cycle, the department said this week it's releasing a revised Federal Student Aid Estimator, updated resources for creating a StudentAid.Gov account, including a "parent wizard," as well as an updated prototype of the 2025-26 FAFSA.

Last week, the department released a report outlining 10 steps it's taking to improve the FAFSA application process. Part of those efforts include the department strengthening its leadership team and working to address issues for families without Social Security numbers when completing the form, in addition to vendors adding more than 700 new call center agents.

GARDEN CORNER

Now is the time to evaluate your garden

There is still a lot going on in the garden at this time of year. Many flowers are still blooming and the vegetable garden is still producing.

Now is a good time to evaluate and plan. Gardening teaches you something every year and many of those lessons are learned through failure. Some plants perform less well than expected and some much better. Some plants completely die and some are so successful that they become weedy.

In the early spring days, it is easy to look through rose-colored glasses and forget the failures. Now is the time to look at the garden(s) with clear eyes and objectivity.

A simple two-column method, labeled successes/likes and failures/dislikes, can work as can a more elaborate narrative style.

You simply walk about and note things in your garden(s) in each column. Also, note any available planting spaces or plants you want to move and divide. I name each of my gardens, such as birdbath garden, pond garden and circle garden.

This makes my notes much easier to decipher later. Sketches can also be added to your notes, or include a few pictures. Remember to add a note with the date the photos were taken so you can find them later.

A few things I have learned this year: my mop-head hydrangeas bloom better with more consistent moisture, I struggle to water hanging baskets so I may let that idea go, and small purchased plants benefit from potting in a larger pot for a couple of weeks before being put into the garden or containers.

I have also decided I want more shrubs so some research will be necessary to choose the right ones.

I want cleome and cosmos back in the garden so they are added to my seed list. The Arkansas Traveler tomato seeds were used up this year and an open-pollinated variety that produces larger tomatoes is needed. I missed growing huckleberries this year so they are back on the list for next year.

If you experience a garden failure, also known as a learning event, remember to ask yourself why. Were the growing conditions right? Was there enough water, drainage, food, light or too much of something?

Full sun in Oregon or full sun in Missouri is very different. Missouri has high temperatures and humidity so a bit less sun may make the difference. If the plant is still alive but struggling, do not be afraid to move it in the spring.

If a plant is on your must-have list, then experiment with placement. If a plant struggles to bloom but has plenty of light it may require more potassium which helps fruiting and flowering plants. Do not be tempted to fertilize now as that encourages lots of new growth that will be damaged by frost. Do write it in your notes for next year.

There are successes also: green peppers and cantaloupe grew well. The hydrangea had the most blooms ever and is still going strong. The lisianthus were a joy all summer. We usually get a handful of figs, but this year we have picked over three dozen with many more almost ready.

As you evaluate your garden in real time, it is natural to plan for the future. The Missouri Botanical Garden Plant Finder has a database of over 7,500 plants that you can search for by name or attribute. Photos and cultural information are given to see if it is the right plant for your garden.

If early spring color is desired then bulbs are your answer. They are available in garden centers now and can be planted any time before the ground freezes. They often thrive in the dry shade under deciduous trees as they prefer drier growing conditions and will get the sun they need before the tree leaves out. Planting bulbs now will bring you a colorful display after the winter months.



Low prices do not always neglect quality

If you have not sampled wines from the Iberian Peninsula, Spain and Portugal, you are missing some very excellent wines that sell for even better prices.

I have often indicated, there are no longer any bad wines being made, only wines that you may not like. Modern technology has lifted winemaking from a hit and miss endeavor to a science. Among the beneficiaries for this change were the wineries of Spain and Portugal.

In the years after World War II, the wines of Iberia tried to fill the gap in the supply of wines affected by the war but unfortunately, their wines were waning.

It did not take long for help to arrive in the form of modern winemaking techniques and improved sanitation. With those in place, their wines took a quantum leap in quality.

Today the Spanish and Portuguese wines are the equal to wines made anywhere in the world. There is one Sword of Damocles that is still hanging over the heads of their wines, price. Wine customers often associate price with quality.

This casted a deep dark shadow on the wines of Iberia as their economy and cost of living permits their wines to sell at, shall we say, very attractive prices. Please, please, please do not judge quality by price anymore.

I have sampled and enjoyed a Gallo Hearty Burgundy at \$9.99 for a magnum and poured a \$127 bottle of cabernet sauvignon wine from a famous name producer, down the drain, with witnesses to both events.

La Capilla 2019 Crianza (\$24)

This full bodied red wine comes from the Ribera del Duero grape growing district in the north central part of Spain and is made from a grape variety indigenous to that specific region, the Tinta del País.

Going even further, the wine was aged in oak barrels, allowing the wine to pick up the best attributes of the wood and also soften the wine.

The wine displays a deep, ruby color and an aroma of black fruits, oak and just a hint of pepper and vanilla while the flavor offers blackberries, blueberries with hints of vanilla and spice in the background.

This is an excellent wine and to me, was reminiscent of a fine Cabernet Sauvignon.

Marques de Caceres 2018 Rioja Reserva (\$18.50)

Here is another Spanish wine that is made from mostly tempranillo grapes.

In this example, there is a balsamic background that adds a very interesting extra layer of enjoyment to the flavor of this wine. The finished wine has spent two years aging in oak barrels resulting in a dark wine offering the aromas black fruits, co-

conut, mocha and oak.

These aromas join the flavor and carry right through to the very long and flavorful finish and is a wine that leaves nothing to be desired and an excellent example of the quality that Spanish wines have achieved.

Marques de Caceres 2020 Crianza (\$15)

This wine was also made from 100% tempranillo grapes from the Rioja district of Spain and displays its traditional dark red color which acts as an introduction to the flavors and aromas of strawberry, raspberry, vanilla and just the right amount of oak.

The Marques de Caceres 2020 Crianza is an excellent ambassador for tempranillo wines and the Crianza style.

Symington 2021 Altano Douro Red (\$14.99)

Here is a wine that has been made from a blend of the most popular of the Portuguese wine grapes; 40% touriga, 30% tinta barroca, 30% tinta roriz.

What resulted is a wine that offers a prominent black fruit flavor and aroma accented by a hint of oak.

To eliminate one question that might arise, this wine is not a sweet port and the only thing that they have that is common is its very dark color courtesy of the indigenous touriga grapes, which in this case have been made as a dry wine to accompany a meal and not for or as a dessert.

Do you really know your nose?

Regardless of age or level of education, sometimes we think we know things only to find out we were wrong or knew only a fraction of the facts. That's what happened last week when I discovered details about the human nose that blew my mind (and my nose). Since we're at the beginning of cold and flu season, I'll share a story that your nose knows, which perhaps you don't.

I owe this revelation to a writer named Sarah Zhang, who wrote an article for The Atlantic about a year ago titled "Everything I Thought I Knew About Nasal Congestion Is Wrong." I was skeptical when I saw the headline because I didn't think there was much to know about congestion. Your nose is stuffy. You blow it. End of story.

But according to Sarah's article and the experts she interviewed, the nose is so much more complex than that. When I noticed that the subtitle of her article was "You really have two noses," I knew I needed to sniff out the truth.

I've been a nose owner for five decades, so I assumed I knew how this thing works. And even though I'm not great at math, I was convinced I had precisely one nose. But that's because I was foolishly judging my nose by its cover. It might look singular, but those two nostrils are the entry points for completely separate structures.

You know that tiny piece of the nose located between your nostrils? Think of it like a wall separating two hallways that lead to side-by-side rooms. For various reasons ranging

from genetics to injury, sometimes the wall is crooked or curved, and that's okay because, usually, it's harmless. But sometimes the crooked wall partially blocks one of the passageways. That crooked wall is called a "deviated septum."

Regardless of whether the wall is straight or not, those separate passageways are like twins who look alike but work different schedules. At any given time, one half of your nose is more open than the other half. Most of us don't notice it, but those nasal twins are trading off on handling the work. The "dominant nostril" switches sides every couple of hours in what doctors call the "nasal cycle." (When we're sick and hosting gobs of mucus, we can more easily feel which nose twin is open for business and which one is currently a dead end.)

Why do our nose twins operate on this back-and-forth schedule? No one is exactly sure, except for God, who probably has a good reason. Maybe they trade off because the nose has to work around the clock while the other facial organs get to relax. The

eyes mostly shut down during sleep, and the mouth often goes slack. But the nose keeps breathing in and out, filtering air, and detecting smells.

Your nose twins are like two bouncers standing in front of a busy nightclub. Sometimes they get irritated because they're dealing with everything trying to get into the club, including dirt, allergens, and viruses. Most of the time, the bouncers kick them out with a sneeze. But occasionally, a troublemaker slips through and inflames the linings inside our twin noses.

When those linings get angry, they swell up like the Incredible Hulk. The more they swell, the more congested we feel. Blowing the nose helps get the extra gunk out, which is great, but it won't help with swelling. That's why decongestants are designed to temporarily reduce swelling inside the nose.

But suppose all the swelling and mucus back up into the sinuses (which are usually pockets filled with air). In that case, you may feel like a solid brick of gunk has formed behind your face, causing pain and (in my experience) chronic crankiness.

We're at the time of year when ragweed gets rowdy and Covid cranks up, so it's important to know what's happening right under your eyes. Your nose twins are partnering in an intricate dance to help you breathe, and breathing – according to 100 percent of doctors – is good. It's as plain as the nose on your face.

Area woman warns of fake check scam

Sedalia resident Elizabeth Castillo recently came across a listing that turned out to be a scam.

"I came across this ad that said you could make \$700 a week," Castillo said. "So I just entered my name."

People frequently look online for jobs to from home and make good money. With that draw, many online scammers exploit.

Castillo was looking for job on an employment web site and saw an ad saying there was easy money to be made by simply by allowing an advertiser to wrap your car.

"I got a text after I filled out my name that I was interested in the job," Castillo said. "He asked, 'Are you still interested?' and I said well, 'I am, but I would like to get more details', and I asked him a variety of questions."

Simple questions like where she would get the wrap done, does she have to pay anything, how much does the wrap cover?

"Is this a half-wrapped?" Castillo asked. "Does it last a certain amount of time? He said basically, all you have to do is just put the wrap on your car and you just drive around, and you get paid for it."

The 'employer' texted Castillo something it about it being a Frito Lay wrap.

"He said, 'Are you interested?'" Castillo said. "Then he would just randomly text me with all caps and I'd say, 'Well, again, I just I'm not getting my questions answered.'"

Castillo was ready to move on, suspecting the job offer might be a scam, put off by the employer's poor communication and use of bad English. A few days went by then Castillo

went to her mailbox to find a check for \$3,670.60.

"I got a package in the mail even though I said I wasn't interested," Castillo said. "It was a payment for doing the jobs and then they said what you need to do is just cash this today at your ATM and then you will transfer the funds to us via cell or cash app."

The Federal Trade Commission's consumer advice web page has a list of common scams like the 'fake check' scam someone tried on Castillo.

"In a fake check scam, where you deposit a check from your new employer, the employer then asks you to send some money back due to 'overpayment,'" the FTC warns. "The check will ultimately bounce, and the bank will want you to repay the full amount of the fake check, while the scammers keep the real money you sent them."

Castillo had a seemingly real check for over \$3,600 in her hands and if all she had to do was cash it and transfer a portion back, it seemed like a good way to get started and put some change in your pocket.

"I hadn't gone through the entire process," Castillo said. "I'm pretty positive that I would have kept \$700."

Castillo could have been out \$2,900, but a little voice in her head told her not to trust the scammer's lies.

"It was kind of weird anyway," Castillo said. "Of course \$700 a week was alarming but I used to work in advertising so you can get paid quite a bit for some advertising. But it was just weird, and I even called Frito Lay to verify this information of course I didn't get a hold of anyone."

The FTC recommends job seekers search for the name of the company and

the words 'scam, review or complaint.'

They said never pay for the promise of a job. People who do are likely scammers.

"The original deal was you would wrap your car and get paid for driving it around," Castillo said. "I've heard of these jobs before, but I don't know if any of them are legitimate."

The FTC suggests you run the offer past someone

you trust before you act. That will also give you more time to think it over.

With many people needing extra money, work from home offers are especially attractive.

"So many people have a hard time getting jobs, I mean, luckily I have a job," Castillo said. "It's frustrating when something like this happens to a person. If they did cash that check, they're out \$2,000 or \$3,000 or more

because now they have to pay fees."

The FTC warns that 'No honest potential employer will ever send you a check to deposit and then tell you to send on part of the money or buy gift cards with it. That's a fake check scam. The check will bounce, and the bank will want you to repay the amount of the fake check.'

"We went to the Police Department and there was nothing they could do and

that's frustrating," Castillo said. "In fact she said that there were already two or three other people that had come in about similar incidents. It's just really upsets me that it's like that. But I guess it's more up to us to just be conscientious and like alert each other."

Budget restrictions, staff issues and AI are threats to states' cybersecurity

Many state chief information and security officers say they don't have the budget, resources, staff or expertise to feel fully confident in their ability to guard their government networks against cyber attacks, according to a new Deloitte & Touche survey of officials in all 50 states and D.C.

"The attack surface is expanding as state leaders' reliance on information becomes increasingly central to the operation of government itself," said Srini Subramanian, principal of Deloitte & Touche LLP and the company's global government and public services consulting leader. "And CISOs have an increasingly challenging mission to make the technology infrastructure resilient against ever-increasing cyber threats."

The biennial cybersecurity report, released today, outlined where new threats are coming from, and what vulnerabilities these teams have.

Governments are relying more on servers to store information, or transmit it through the Internet of Things, or connected sensor devices. Infrastructure for systems like transit and power is also heavily reliant on technology, and all of the connected online systems create more opportunities for attack.

The emergence of AI is also creating new ways for bad actors to exploit vulnerabilities, as it makes phishing scams and audio and visual deep fakes easier.

Deloitte found encouraging data that showed the role of state chief information and security officer has been prioritized in every state's government tech team, and that statutes and legislation have been introduced in some states which give CISOs more authority.

In recent years, CISOs have taken on the vast majority of security management and operations, strategy, governance, risk management and incident response for their state, the report said.

But despite the growing weight on these roles, some of the CISOs surveyed said they do not have the resources needed to feel confident in their team's ability to handle old and new cybersecurity threats.

Nearly 40% said they don't have enough funds for projects that comply with regulatory or legal requirements, and nearly half said they don't know what percent of their state's IT budget is for cybersecurity.

Talent was another issue, with about half of CISOs saying they lacked cybersecurity staffing, and 31% saying there was an "inadequate availability" of professionals to complete these jobs. The survey does show that CISOs reported better staff competencies in 2024 compared to 2020, though.

Staffing of CISOs themselves, due to burnout, has been an increasing issue since the pandemic, the report found. Since the 2022 survey, Deloitte noted that nearly half of all states have had turnover in their chief security officers, and the median tenure is now 23 months, down from 30

months in the last survey.

When it came to generative AI, CISOs seemed to see both the opportunities and risks. Respondents listed generative AI as one of the newest threats to cybersecurity, with 71% saying they believe it poses a "high" threat; 41% of respondents said they don't have confidence in their team to be able to handle them.

MSHP issues warning about scam

The Missouri State Highway Patrol would like to make the public aware of a telephone scam. In the past month, some incidents have been reported across the state.

In each case, a suspect contacted an individual associated with someone who was involved in a motor vehicle crash, identified themselves as the investigating trooper and attempted to solicit money from the victim. The suspect may intimidate the victim with false claims of impending or nonexistent court charges/proceedings.

The public should under-

stand Patrol employees will not contact individuals and solicit funds or demand any form of payment. Furthermore, the Patrol employees do not process bonds or accept money to prevent or dispose of charges.

If a person asks you to send your money anywhere, you should assume it's a scam. Take your time verifying the information by calling

phone numbers you locate yourself on verified websites. You should not confirm any identifying information about yourself to the scammer.

If you or someone you know have been contacted in a similar manner, please report the incident to your local Troop Headquarters.





Missouri Supreme Court rejects request for ethics investigation into AG Andrew Bailey

The Missouri Supreme Court declined to force an investigation into donations to Attorney General Andrew Bailey connected to a witness in a case his office was handling.

In a filing Tuesday evening, the judges denied a request from Lucas Cierpiot — son of state Sen. Mike Cierpiot — to require the disciplinary arm of the court to investigate donations from Micheal Ketchmark and his law firm to a political action committee supporting Bailey.

Ketchmark, a prominent attorney and large political donor, was called as a witness in a disability discrimination case filed by Lucas Cierpiot's brother, Patrick, against the Missouri Department of Economic Development. Bailey's office was defending the state.

After Ketchmark's law firm donated to the pro-Bailey Liberty and Justice PAC, Lucas Cierpiot filed a complaint with the Office of Chief Disciplinary Counsel,

accusing Bailey of using his position as attorney general for personal political gain.

"No attorney can ever collect money from a case witness," Cierpiot's filing says. "The fact that there is not a rule spelling this out in-letter is due to the fact that it is so obvious."

Cierpiot's complaint was dismissed in March. He asked for further review, but it was dismissed again in May. He then sought an order from the state Supreme Court to force an investigation.

In an email, Bailey's spokeswoman, Madeline Sieren, said the court "rightfully denied the frivolous petition" and that Bailey had not violated the rules of professional conduct for attorneys.

Cierpiot said in a text message that he was "very disappointed" by the court's decision.

"Missouri really is the 'Show Me State,' Cierpiot said. "Isn't it? 'Show Me' just how unethical the Missouri courts can be."

Cierpiot's was one of several accusations of unethical behavior by Bailey, who took

office last year after being appointed by Gov. Mike Parson. Bailey is now running for a full term.

This summer, he narrowly avoided being questioned under oath about his contact with a defendant in his own case against Jackson County. One of Bailey's deputies lost his license because of the meetings, according to the filings, a filing from the county's attorneys.

Last year, Bailey withdrew from defending the Missouri State Highway Patrol in a lawsuit filed by Warrenton Oil and Torch Electronics regarding video game machines that offer cash prizes. The attorney general's office bowed out of the case following donations from PACs connected to the companies' lobbyist. The patrol investigated the machines, believing that they were illegal means of gambling.

Bailey was also the focus of a formal complaint about the behavior of his office after he falsely blamed the Hazelwood School District's diversity, equity and inclusion program for the off-campus

assault of a student.

Patrick Cierpiot named Ketchmark as a witness in the underlying lawsuit in May 2022, saying he had urged a Parson staffer not to fire Cierpiot, who was recovering from a bicycle wreck and struggling to keep up with his workload.

The following January, Ketchmark donated \$2,825, the maximum that an individual can give, to Bailey's campaign. Bailey received a combined \$16,950 from individuals with the last name Ketchmark or employed by the law firm Ketchmark & McCreight P.C. by the end of the month.

Later in the spring of 2023, Ketchmark's firm donated \$125,000 to the pro-Bailey Liberty and Justice PAC. The firm then gave an in-kind donation of \$9,216.53.

In August 2023, Bailey's office withdrew from defending the Department of Economic Development and allowed the agency to hire a private law firm to handle the case. At the time, Sieren told the St. Louis Post-Dispatch that the office was looking to outside firms to

handle "complex litigation." She said Bailey didn't have a conflict of interest in the case.

In rejecting Lucas Cierpiot's ethics complaint, the Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel said he failed to allege any violation of the rules of professional conduct. The complaint only outlined the donations from Ketchmark's law firm to the pro-Bailey PAC, not the donation from Ketchmark to Bailey's campaign committee. The ethics office drew a distinction between those.

"Corporations are legal entities separate and distinct from their officers and shareholders," the office said in a court filing responding to Cierpiot's petition to the Missouri Supreme Court.

The Office of Chief Disciplinary Counsel said that before declining to investigate, officials verified that Ketchmark hadn't contributed to Bailey's campaign committee, apparently missing the January 2023 donations.

The Supreme Court's order did not say why it was denying Cierpiot's request.

Missourians with disabilities and seniors could lose at-home care under new eligibility algorithm

Nearly 8,000 seniors and Missourians with disabilities could lose at-home care over the next year after a new eligibility algorithm went into effect this week, a spokesperson for the state health department told The Independent.

Starting Oct. 1, Missouri's Department of Health and Senior Services implemented a change in the scoring algorithm they use to determine eligibility during annual reviews and enrollment for those receiving help with everyday tasks, getting dressed and taking their prescriptions. The assistance is part of a Medicaid-funded program called home and community based services designed to provide an alternative to those who would otherwise need to receive institutional care.

That change, according to the department, is designed to help ensure those who truly need the services receive them, and those who don't — for instance, because their conditions have improved or they're not severe enough to qualify — are removed.

"We want to ensure those with higher acuity needs are receiving the care they need," said DHSS spokesperson Lisa Cox. "That is what this transformation is about—to ensure we are providing the right services, in the right setting, at the right time to those who would go into a facility placement if not for [home and community based services]."

But advocates are raising alarm that certain people who still need services will lose them, causing their health to decline or forcing them into institutional settings like nursing homes.

Jennifer Gundy, who runs a center for independent living in southwest Missouri, which provides in-home care support for 370 people, estimates 18% of her clients will fall off the rolls.

And most of them will still be in need of services, she said, including cases of those with severe diabetes, mobility issues, complicated medication regimes and other issues that are eased by current assistance but will worsen without it.

"So that's our concern," she said. "And we've been voicing that concern with the state for probably the last two years," she said.

Joel Ferber, director of advocacy at Legal Services

of Eastern Missouri, said there are "truly needy folks who are going to lose services."

Legal Services of Eastern Missouri has been working with national advocacy groups to analyze the new algorithm and its effects, and provide guidance. One client they identified, a 70-year-old woman who receives 40 hours of weekly paid help, won't be eligible after her review, according to LSEM. She weighs under 100 pounds and has had a stroke.

Without a caretaker, she won't be able to make herself meals or bathe, and has no family in the area. She may have to be hospitalized or go to a nursing home.

State Rep. Deb Lavender, a Democrat of Manchester, said thousands will lose services, "without any support from the state" to fill in the gap.

"They're going to be people who have received services for years," she said, "and we have provided that for them — to then drop them because they don't meet the new algorithm doesn't seem right."

Cox said 7,818 people are at risk of losing services, but she didn't provide an estimate of any possible net change, saying the program will "continue to add more participants every month due to the increase in needs of our population." New people will also qualify based on the new algorithm, adding to the population, she said.

From 2021 to last month, the department used both the new and old algorithm, so that anyone who qualified on either basis could qualify for the program. Cox said thousands of people have gained access to services under the new algorithm who wouldn't have qualified on the old calculation: She said 7,708 people have gained eligibility under the new algorithm since it was introduced in Nov. 2021.

There were around 68,000 people monthly on the program last fiscal year, Cox said.

The new algorithm has been years in the making.

The legislature in 2017 grew concerned with the home and community based services program "just blossoming" in participation and cost, said Jessica Schaefer, program director for home and community based services in a recent training.

To cut the budget, the legislature in 2017 raised the threshold for eligibility. It also capped costs for services at a lower level.

The program is jointly funded by the state and federal government, and states vary widely in how they run the programs.

The department found those changes weren't entirely effective, Schafer said — that some people who needed services most didn't qualify anymore — so they launched a "transformation" of the eligibility criteria. It was designed to be more accurate at directing limited services to the correct people.

The "transformation is about ensuring those most in need of care receive the services needed to remain independent in their community," Cox said.

There have been several delays in implementing the new algorithm — most recently because of federal rules tied to accepting American Rescue Plan Act funds.

The state has generally characterized those who will lose coverage as people who don't have needs significant enough to qualify in the first place.

In a slideshow for providers during a recent training, the state recommended when delivering the news of ineligibility to individuals, that they "exude confidence" and "put a positive spin on ineligibility," along with connecting them to other resources and expressing sympathy.

Because the department has been providing two scores, advocates can see which clients will not qualify under the new algorithm and have been able to track it.

Advocates say they've repeatedly brought up concerns with the state based on clients they see are desperately in need of services who will no longer qualify.

"The only thing that we can do is just go ahead and allow them to do this, and then if there's enough people that fall off the services and end up going to the nursing home, going in the hospital, having lots of problems because they're not getting the services, then we can look at doing a class action lawsuit," said Gundy, the southwest Missouri advocate.

"Which is really sad, because those people have to get hurt or have really bad health problems for something to get done."

States across the country have made similar cuts to the program, based on automated decisions, including in Arkansas, where the algorithm was successfully

challenged in court.

Legal Services of Eastern Missouri and a group of national advocates published a toolkit for providers and participants to understand the changes and track those who lose services.

Emily Paul, project director at Upturn, a national organization that advocates for equity and justice in

technology, has been involved in that analysis.

"What we understand in general is that automation is a tool that states are using to deal with inadequate funding for these programs, and to create a rationale for who doesn't get services," Paul said.

"Underfunding really drives the need to have this

whole rationale for trying to distribute the resources and trying to make claims to fairness and objectivity within a system that is not really set up to actually meet people's needs," she said. "And so that's the fundamental issue. States can still try to make better or worse choices about how they allocate the resources."

Cost to enforce ban on intoxicating hemp products in Missouri estimated at nearly \$900K

While a large part of Missouri Gov. Mike Parson's ban on intoxicating hemp products may be on pause, plans are underway to kick it back up next summer, according to a preliminary budget request by the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

The department has asked for \$877,000 to fund "food inspection and litigation requirements" to implement Parson's Aug. 1 executive order to ban unregulated psychoactive products.

Those funds would become available on July 1, if lawmakers approve the request as part of the state budget by May.

Parson's executive order "prohibits the sale of foods containing psychoactive cannabis compounds in Missouri, unless originating from an 'approved source,'" the budget request states.

When the order went into effect on Sept. 1, the governor was hoping to utilize compliance officers at both the state's Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control and DHSS' Bureau of Environmental Health Services to implement the ban.

However, those plans quickly

came to a halt when the Secretary of State Jay Ashcroft rejected the emergency rules that would have given the alcohol division the authority to conduct inspections.

That meant that the state's food inspectors were left to handle compliance on their own.

Then the governor asked Missouri Attorney General Andrew Bailey to create a new specialized unit to assist the state's alcohol and tobacco regulators in cracking down on intoxicating hemp products, Parson announced at a Capitol press conference on Sept. 10.

However the next day on Sept. 11, state food inspectors showed up to Franklin County VFW Post after receiving a tip that the veterans were serving hemp-derived THC drinks at their bar.

Commander Jason Stanfield took to social media, saying the state's "raid" of the VFW Post on 9-11 was disrespectful.

The incident gave the Missouri Hemp Trade Association a window to request a temporary restraining order, as part of a lawsuit filed in late August to halt the governor's order.

While the association didn't get the restraining order, it got assurance from the state that regulators will essentially stop

its enforcement efforts.

In response to the temporary restraining order request, Richard Moore, general counsel for DHSS, said in a letter that the state's health regulators will stop embargoing — or tagging — products simply because they contain hemp-derived THC.

"In regard to psychoactive cannabis products, the department will focus its efforts on the identification of 'misbranded' products," Moore wrote to the Missouri Hemp Trade Association's attorney, Chuck Hatfield.

Currently, the compliance effort focuses on just THC products that children could mistake for regular food or candy — not banning all intoxicating hemp products like Delta-8 beverages sold at bars or liquor stores.

When Parson signed his executive order, he said his primary focus was to protect children consuming the products that resemble popular candy, like Lifesavers, or fruity drinks.

"If the department identifies any such misbranded products, it will refer those products to the Missouri Attorney General's Office for potential enforcement under the State's Merchandising Practices Act..." Moore wrote in his letter.

That is expected to change next summer, if the department's budget request goes through.

The requested funding would allow the department to hire two full-time public health environmental specialists at \$125,000 and to contract five more inspectors at \$400,000. Of that, two of the contracted positions would be funded on a one-time basis "to stand up the program" at \$150,000.

"The use of contractors for a portion of this work is preferred due to the expected decrease in market availability of this product over time," it states, "with their services not expected to be needed more than two or three years."

The total seven inspectors will conduct site visits statewide "to assess retailer and wholesaler inventory for unregulated psychoactive cannabis in foods," it states.

The department estimates that 40,000 food establishments and smoke shops and 1,800 food manufacturers could potentially be affected by the governor's order, the request states, "but the majority of these facilities are at low-risk of requiring investigation."

"It is estimated that all seven inspection staff can conduct 2,900-3,500 site visits annually," it states.

The department also budgeted \$160,000 to hire two full-time attorneys, in the event that business owners challenge enforcement actions.

Meanwhile, the Missouri Hemp Trade Association's ongoing lawsuit might impact the plan, as well as potential legislation that could give the state even more authority — or, on the other end, loosen regulation on intoxicating hemp products.

Because hemp isn't a controlled substance like marijuana, there's no state or federal law saying teenagers or children can't buy products, such as delta-8 drinks, or that stores can't sell them to minors.

And there's no requirement to list potential effects on the label or test how much THC is actually in them. State lawmakers have failed to pass such requirements the last two years.

MU Extension takes to the skies to stamp out invasive weeds

University of Missouri Extension is taking to the skies to identify and map invasive weed species in one of mid-Missouri's prized native prairie areas.

MU Extension state natural resource specialist Michael Sunde is using drone-based lidar and imagery along with satellite imagery and machine learning to make 3D maps of vegetation and land cover at Prairie Fork Conservation Area, which is in eastern Callaway County near Williamsburg.

Data gathered during the two-year project will be extrapolated to create maps and 3D forest models to locate unwanted plant species.

This is the first time a drone has been used to make precision maps at the location, Sunde says. Aerial photos previously taken provided good information but lacked the detail that a drone flying closer to the ground can provide.

The information will help conser-

vationists rid the natural prairie grasslands of two invasive weeds

— bush honeysuckle and sericea lespedeza — that edge out preferred grasses.

MU Extension's Missouri Resource Assessment Partnership (MoRAP) assists with the Prairie Fork project to develop, analyze and deliver geospatial data for environmental resource planning and management.

The Prairie Fork Charitable Endowment supports the 711-acre Prairie Fork Conservation Area. It is managed by the MU School of Natural Resources and the Missouri Department of Conservation.

Prairie Fork's grasslands are treasured by conservationists and educators because only 5% of Missouri land remains as a natural prairie with diverse plants, wildlife and insect life. Prior to statehood in 1821, Missouri had at least 15 million acres of prairie grass, according to the Missouri Prairie Foundation.

Biden's student loan cancellation free to move forward as court order expires

WASHINGTON — President Joe Biden's latest attempt at student loan cancellation is free to move ahead — at least temporarily — after a judge in Georgia decided that a legal challenge should be handled by a court in Missouri.

Biden's plan has been on hold since September after seven Republican-led states challenged it in federal court in Georgia. But on Wednesday, a federal judge decided not to extend the pause and instead dismissed Georgia from the lawsuit, finding that it lacked the legal right, or standing, to sue.

U.S. District Court Judge J. Randal Hall opted to send the suit to Missouri, one of the remaining states in the case. On Thursday, those states filed a request asking the Missouri court to block the plan.

Without a new obstacle, the Biden administration could push the proposal toward the finish line as soon as Friday. The Education Department would be free to finalize a rule paving the way for cancellation, though it

would likely take days or weeks to carry out.

Biden's plan would cancel at least some student loan debt for an estimated 30 million borrowers.

It would erase up to \$20,000 in interest for those who have seen their original balances increase because of runaway interest. It would also provide relief to those who have been repaying their loans for 20 or 25 years, and those who went to college programs that leave graduates with high debt compared to their incomes.

Biden told the Education Department to pursue cancellation through a federal rulemaking process after the Supreme Court rejected an earlier plan using a different legal justification. That plan would have eliminated up to \$20,000 for 43 million Americans.

The Supreme Court rejected Biden's first proposal in a case brought by Republican states including Missouri, which now takes the lead in the latest lawsuit.

In his order Wednesday, Hall said Georgia failed to prove it was significantly harmed by

Biden's new plan. He rejected an argument that the policy would hurt the state's income tax revenue, but he found that Missouri has "clear standing" to sue.

Missouri is suing on behalf of MOHELA, a student loan servicer that was created by the state and is hired by the federal government to help collect student loans. In the suit, Missouri argues that cancellation would hurt MOHELA's revenue because it's paid based on the number of borrowers it serves.

In their lawsuit, the Republican states argue that the Education Department had quietly been telling loan servicers to prepare for loan cancellation as early as Sept. 9, bypassing a typical 60-day waiting period for new federal rules to take effect.

The courts are now asking the Missouri court to act quickly saying the Education Department could "unlawfully mass cancel up to hundreds of billions of dollars in student loans as soon as Monday."

Also joining the suit are Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, North Dakota and Ohio.

No. 12 Central Missouri football continuing to connect pieces

WARRENSBURG — A pair of one-point wins has No. 12 ranked Central Missouri football focussed on cleaning up the details ahead of its trip to Fort Hays State.

The latest, a 36-35 victory over Nebraska-Kearney on Sept. 28, gave the Mules a taste of just how tight the margin of error is in the MIAA this year.

"All of the experiences that you get throughout the entire year add to the cumulative effect of your next opportunity," Central Missouri head coach Josh Lamberson said. "For us, this is something that we can put in our tool bag. There are so many things we can learn from this game."

For the Mules (3-1, 1-1 MIAA), the root of the problem against UNK came down to both sides of the ball.

On the offensive side, it was a red zone offense and fine tuning the minor details. On defense, it was limiting the large gains.

Central Missouri scored on 5-of-8 redzone chances. Four resulted in a touchdown, one resulted in a field goal, one re-

sulted in a pick-six, and one resulted in a turnover on downs.

The offense still produced 633 yards game-wide, with redshirt senior quarterback Zach Zebrowski posting his second MIAA Offensive Player of the Week performance, completing 45-of-69 passes for 526 yards and five touchdowns while running for 35 yards on nine carries.

"We're showing we're a team with a lot of grit," Zebrowski said. "We probably

haven't put all of the pieces together yet. We've shown we're not going to be a pushover. We've shown what we're made of early. We haven't proved it totally yet, but I think we're just showing we're not just a team that thinks we're good. When we need to score, when we need to get stops, our defense and offense can hold it down and do something when it matters."

Redshirt junior wide receiver Jack Pospisil, who hauled

in 10 catches for 100 yards, said winning in the last two close-game scenarios ultimately comes down to UCM's belief in itself, and continuing to connect on the field.

UCM welcomed 30 transfers and 37 freshmen into its program this fall.

"We've kind of replaced some guys from last year," Pospisil said. "We lost some. The mentality of the team is the same from the past. We continue to focus on us and do our job. We don't panic, we just continue to do what we are supposed to do, apply pressure to the other team and not feel pressure ourselves. Usually it works out good, the last couple of weeks."

Close games have not been a common theme for just the MIAA.

The league's 10 members have had 14 contests decided by one possession this season, seven arriving in the last two weeks.

Central Oklahoma is the last undefeated team in the MIAA while Emporia State, Northwest Missouri, Pittsburg State and UCM each have one loss in league play



their breasts are not cancerous, it's important to report them to your doctor. Self-exams are an integral part of creating breast familiarity and awareness, and identifying breast cancer in its early stages can often lead to more successful, less invasive treatment.

According to Lillie D. Shockney, Johns Hopkins University Distinguished Service Professor of Breast Cancer, as reported on the National Breast Cancer Foundation website, **forty percent of breast cancers diagnosed are detected by women who identify a lump.**

Using a methodical technique like the patterns outlined here will help ensure you examine your entire breast. →



Tip From the National Breast Cancer Foundation:

For women who are still menstruating, a breast self-exam should be performed several days after her period ends. For post-menopausal women, a breast self-exam is best performed on the same day of each month.

Women of all ages can follow these steps outlined by the Cleveland Clinic to perform a monthly self-examination of the breasts:

Begin with a visual inspection of your breasts, standing with your arms at your sides.

Look for any swelling, changes in breast shape or position of the nipples, or dimpling or changes on the skin.

Next, place both hands on your hips and flex your chest muscles, repeating your visual inspection of both breasts. Breast tissue extends to the armpit, collarbone and top of the abdomen, so include all of these areas in your exam.

While standing, examine each breast with the pads of your three middle fingers. Use your right hand to examine your left breast, then vice versa.

Press on every part of the breast, beginning with light pressure and increasing to firm. Feel for any lumps, thick spots or other changes, being sure to check the areas by your armpit and under your areola.

Squeeze the nipple to check for any discharge.

Lie down to complete the breast self-exam. Begin by placing a pillow under your right shoulder and placing your right arm behind your head. Using your left hand, follow the same technique described while standing, then change the pillow to the other shoulder to check the other breast and armpit.




"Citadel: Diana" - Season 1
